







You get the subtle sense of Spain as soon as you enter La Hacienda. The entrance, at Price and Ladue Roads, is guarded by towers suggestive of the Alhambra, to lend the Moorish touch so typical of Spain. Soft colored lights will play on running water in which is reflected the delicate forms and tints of abounding flowers ''' This same natural beauty will become even more impressive as you stroll or drive along the gracefully curved calles of La Hacienda. Landscape artists are developing community parkways with an artistic symmetry. Horticulturists are providing floral displays of rosas and maripolas—so that all La Hacienda will seem to be a breath of Old Granada.

The homes will be in keeping with the Spanish style. Each will be placed on an estate large enough to give it individuality—free access to pleasing views, to sunlight and the breezes. These estates will vary from 100 to 160 feet in frontage and average about 225 feet in depth. All, except those facing Ladue Road, will look into La Hacienda's drives, parkways and prado—its pleasing charm of Aragon \*\* There will be but 86 of these estates. Imagine your supreme pleasure after leaving behind the toils and cares of the city each evening, to enter this tranquil spot, so different from the rest.


