A regular meeting of the Ladue Board of Fire and Police Commissioners was held on Monday, June 13<sup>th</sup>, 2022, at 4:00 p.m., at Ladue City Hall, 9345 Clayton Road.

Chairman Francis called the meeting to order at 4:05 pm.

#### **APPROVAL OF AGENDA**

The agenda was approved upon motion by Commissioner Schaperkotter and second by Commissioner Hermann.

#### **APPROVAL OF MINUTES**

The minutes of the April 11<sup>th</sup>, 2022, meeting were approved unanimously upon motion by Commissioner Jones and second by Commissioner Hermann.

### **PUBLIC COMMENT**

During an opportunity for public comment none was offered.

### **FIRE DEPARTMENT**

### **Recognition of Tom Marischen**

Chief Lynn offered special recognition to Fire Fighter/Paramedic Tom Marischen for providing lifesaving measures on May 28<sup>th.</sup> Off duty, swimming with his family, he observed a lifeguard attempting to save an 8-year-old boy. The boy had been underwater, was unconscious, and did not have a pulse. Mr. Marischen began CPR; upon arrival of the First Responders the boy was breathing. Chief Lynn praised the effort stating that the outcome was due to Mr. Marischen stepping up without hesitation. A formal letter of recognition will be presented at the City Council meeting on Monday. Chairman Francis reported that a resolution approving the commendation would be noted in the meeting minutes.

### Monthly Report Review

Chief Lynn added the following:

- The monthly report provides a limited picture of the department activity
- The Department trains between 350-750 hours monthly
- Ideally the department will have 2 additional Fire Fighter/Paramedics trained on Car seat installation
- The department created a map of all the hydrants in the City

- Hydrants are flush tested annually tested, and 20% are flow tested each year
- Fire Marshall Johnson completes inspections and assists those contractors that did not pass with information to ensure future success.

### **POLICE DEPARTMENT**

## Review of NIBRS Report

Chief Andreski asked if there were questions regarding the report, seeing none the meeting proceeded.

### Update on License Plate Reader

Chief Andreski shared the request for license plate readers and cameras on both fire houses; he introduced Sergeant Lucas. Sergeant Lucas presented information on the benefits of additional cameras installed by Flock Group. Initial cameras were installed in late 2021. The Police Department has found this system to be an effective tool in preventing and solving crimes.

Chief Andreski requested the Commissioners consideration for an additional four cameras to be installed on both Firehouses focusing on East and Westbound Clayton Road. Two replacement cameras on Fire House 1, and two remote archivers will be installed at Firehouse 1 and 2. The archivers will record video from cameras located at both locations. Designated personnel will have remote and local access. The proposal includes training, and complies with all local, state, and federal regulations. Will Electronics came in with the low bid at a proposed cost of \$32,632.39.

Commissioner Stupp moved approval of the proposal, which passed unanimously upon second by Commissioner Jones.

### Discussion on Citywide Tattoo/Branding Policy

Chief Andreski reported on the possible update of the personnel policy regarding visible tattoos. Non-offensive tattoos would potentially be allowed with restrictions. The department heads would coordinate standards. This change could potentially help with recruiting.

Discussion ensued; no action was taken.

### **Discussion on Mandatory Body Armor**

Chief Andreski informed the Commission on the upcoming necessity of replacing of Body Armor. In the next two years replacement will necessary. A matching Federal Grant in the amount \$15,000 is available, only if the Department has a policy in place mandating wearing body armor.

Discussion ensued; no action was taken.

Chief Andreski will be attending 10-week F.B.I Leadership Training. In his absence, Captain Dieckmann will fill in as the Acting Chief of Police.

Chairman Francis commended Chief Andreski on a comprehensive and well-organized annual report.

Chief Andreski provided an update on the recent shooting on Highway 170, near the Ladue and Olivette boundary. Chief Andreski provided an update on the Flock system and explained how it has been beneficial in their investigations.

## **Operations**

Attached you will find data pertaining to calls responded to in the month of June 2022. Data shows that the Ladue Fire Department responded to 56 EMS calls and 94 Fire related calls for a total of 150. Additionally, you will find a summary report of the Fire Marshal. This report reflects inspections performed in the field as well as plan reviews conducted at the fire house. However, this report does not reflect code review time nor contractor communications.

For the month of June crews completed a total of 638 hours of fire training and numerous hours of EMS training. Fire training consists of incident command review, search and rescue, technical rescue awareness, Active Shooter training, etc.

All Ladue Fire Department Officer and Acting Officers were required to attend the MACTAC training or Active Shooter training. This is a County wide accepted policy that requires thorough understanding and practice. Special thanks to Horton Watkins High School for allowing us to use their facility for this training.

Another metric the Fire Department monitors is overlapping calls. In June there were 25 events that overlapped initiating the use of mutual aid or 17% of calls were overlapping.

Crews are beginning their yearly commercial building company inspections in which crews inspect compliance with the adopted IFC and general fire hazards. Every attempt is made to communicate with the business owner prior to inspection.

### **Public Relations**

Child Safety Seat Installation resumed yielding four installations. Additionally, crews provided education and truck tour for Conway School 1<sup>st</sup> grade.

### Administration

In conjunction with daily operational needs, Administration continues to work on process improvement opportunities. The two main areas of focus are compliance with standards of coverage policy and would a quint apparatus benefit the city at house #2. The administration continues to evaluate alternative options to deliver better service in a fiscally responsible manner.

The ISO review has been set for August 2<sup>nd</sup> and preparations are almost complete. This complex evaluation of the fire departments operations, water supply, and communications requires significant prep with data collection and analysis. The last piece of the evaluation is the completion of Community Risk Assessment and Standard of Coverage document. This document evaluates high, medium, and low risk properties and determines the response necessary.

Although limited in everything we do, I hope you find this summary useful in hopes of providing this each month. Please let me know if you have any questions or concerns.



On June 21st, the City of Ladue Fire Department responded to Maryhill subdivision for a structure fire. Upon arrival, this was declared a working fire and a second alarm was struck. As with any given summer day, temperatures range between 85 and 95 degrees. However, this day was extremely warm with temperatures reaching low 90's during the morning hours with high humidity. Hydration became an important role during this event. In June of 2018 the FVFPD started a canteen program to support their fire department. The program started small, but not long after the program kicked off they were given the freedom to respond to any fire/incident that a Florissant truck was involved with. The mission of the canteen was to provide water, Gatorade, and snacks as well as cooling towels for crews and some victim support. Even partnering with a Florissant group to provide some immediate assistance of victim needs (clothing, toiletries, etc...). During 2018 the canteen responded to 19 incidents. Fast forward to 2021, and as of the end of December we responded to 88 incidents in 2021.

So far in 2022 as of the end of May we have responded to 50 incidents. Here is a break down by district currently in 2022:

15 – FVFPD 3 - Berkeley 7 – Black Jack 7 – Ferguson 2 – Hazelwood 4 – Metro North 2 – Metro West 5 – North County

2 – Northeast 1 – Pattonville 2 – Spanish Lake

At the conclusion of 2019, after talking with Chief Hoevelmann, the canteen made plans to establish itself as a nonprofit in order to take some of the burden off of Florissant, and give an outlet for the canteen to organically grow and expand the program. What does that mean for your department? We are available to provide support to your response area when needed. If you are on the scene of an incident, and can use our service we can be reached through Central County dispatch who will contact us via 4002.

As mentioned, we are an stand alone 501(c)3 nonprofit organization staffed 100% by volunteers 24/7/365. We are funded by fire departments/districts, department/district shops, outreach and flower funds, and corporate and individual supporters. Funds received will continue to support the program, and allow us to grow and cover more areas more consitantly.

Please find attached five separate policies that I am presenting for your approval.

- 1. The first policy, 1.18 Uniform Dress Code Policy, has been modified to had duty shorts to the approved apparel. The addition is highlighted in yellow. This change come from the annual review of policy and review of current practices in neighboring departments. It was found that duty short are widely accepted in the fire service.
- 2. The second policy, 1.41 Asset Replacement Cycle Policy, has been developed to reflect current practice of maintaining adequate and safe equipment. This replacement cycle also aids in the development of long-term capital planning.
- 3. The third policy, 1.40 Assigned Staff Vehicle Use, has been developed to reflect current practice and more clearly defines when, where, and how the staff vehicle can be utilized.
- 4. The fourth policy, 4.06 Wellness/Fitness Initiative, is a good faith policy to show continual support of promoting healthy work environment and fitness goals.
- 5. The fifth policy, 5.01 Facility Inspection, Maintenance, and Repair Policy, has been developed to meet the National Fire Protection Agency (NFPA) standard 1500 for facility maintenance and repair. Although the Ladue Fire Department has not officially adopted NFPA 1500, we strive to comply as the primary goal of NFPA 1500 is firefighter safety.

# **Purpose:**

To establish for all Fire Department personnel a uniformed dress code to adhere to while onduty, and when conducting all other official department or City sponsored functions.

# Scope:

The intent of this guideline is to outline the appropriate uniform and grooming requirements for all personnel. All department supervisory personnel are responsible for the enforcement of these guidelines. Questions regarding the application of any guideline to a particular situation should be directed to the Fire Chief or the Assistant Fire Chief for interpretation.

### **General:**

The following approved uniforms items will be assigned to all personnel. It is the responsibility of all personnel to maintain ALL uniform items in a ready state and available for use. Uniform apparel and accessories will only be worn while performing department or City sponsored activities.

### **Uniform Classification**

# **Class "A" Formal Dress Uniform**

The Class "A" uniform represents the highest level of dress uniform. The Class "A" Uniform shall be worn at all City or Department functions as determined by the Company Officer or higher-ranking Officer.

- Dress long-sleeve shirt, as assigned, White for officer or Blue for Firefighter/Paramedics
- Rank assigned insignia, name plate, badge, and award/merit ribbons
- Dress pant, navy blue
- Dress belt, smooth 1 3/4", black with appropriate buckle, gold for Officers, silver for firefighter/paramedic.
- Dress shoes with black socks
- Black dress tie

- Leon 5-star navy cap
- Dress coat with name plate, badge, and rank assigned insignia
- Dress coat to be double breasted for officers with gold buttons/ single breasted coat with silver buttons for Firefighter/Paramedics
- Rank assigned ribboning on both cuffs for officers
- Years of service cross on left sleeve; 1 cross for every 5 years of total fire service experience
- Military Pin/Bar if applicable

Class "A" uniforms are to be worn at all formal Fire Department functions, funerals, or such times at the direction of the Fire Chief.

# Class "B" Dress Uniform

The Class "B" uniform should be used for presentations where a formal uniform is warranted but not to the extent of Class "A".

Class "B" uniforms include items listed below. The use of long sleeves or short sleeves will be decided on by the Officer in Charge for Class "B" uniforms.

- Dress shirt, short or long sleeve
- Black tie, optional with long sleeve shirt
- Rank assigned insignia, name plate, badge, and award/merit ribbons
- Dress pant, navy blue
- Dress belt, smooth 1 3/4", black with appropriate buckle.
- Black dress shoes with black socks
- Military Pin/Bar if applicable

# Class "C" Station Duty Uniform / Daily Work Uniform

The Class "C" uniform is considered the regular duty work uniform. All personnel shall remain in a minimum of a Class "C" uniform during all duty hours unless otherwise indicated in this guideline.

- Department issued T-shirt (short or long sleeve) or "Polo-style" shirt
- Department issued black pants
- Department approved footwear, black
- Duty belt, 1 3/4", black with appropriate buckle
- Department issued job-shirt
- Department issued hat or knit cap

Protective clothing SHALL be worn during situations where potential of contamination or injury is present. Examples include all scenes where structure firefighting clothing is required, treatment of trauma patients, vehicle accidents, extrications and hazardous materials scenes.

# Class "C" Uniform – Duty Shorts

Due to geographical location of our service area and prevailing climate patterns, heat exposure and associated heat-related illnesses are a concern for personnel conducting fire/EMS activities. In an effort to reduce the likelihood of excessive heat exposure and heat-related illness/injury the Ladue Fire Department has adopted a policy to dictate the use of approved uniform shorts. Guidance for the wearing of uniform shorts is as listed below:

- Uniform shorts (hereinafter referred to as "shorts") shall be department issued (purveyor and style TBD) and solid black in color. Class D shorts, otherwise known as "gym shorts", shall not be acceptable as it pertains to this policy.
- Uniform shorts may be worn while on duty from April 1<sup>st</sup> to October 31<sup>st</sup>. At the discretion of the Fire Chief, the stated time frame may be extended due to unseasonably warm weather.
- An approved department issued uniform belt (black in color) shall be worn at all times with shorts.
- Approved department issued footwear which is solid black in color and equipped with a safety toe must be worn at all times. All other footwear is prohibited while in public view or conducting department business.
- Socks will be solid black in color and free of any visible logos or designs.
- A department issued uniform t-shirt or polo must be worn at all times and remain tucked in accordance with the Class C uniform policy.
- The wearing of uniform shorts is otherwise left to individual member preference and shall not be mandatory.
- This policy shall in no way supersede any policy regarding the appropriate use of firefighting and EMS PPE.
- Certain events or circumstances may dictate that uniform shorts are not appropriate. The company officer and/or administration may dictate that traditional uniform pants be worn under such circumstances. Guidance for consideration of such is as follows:
  - o The type and/or formality of the event
  - o The length and environment of the event (e.g., outdoors vs. indoors)
  - o The prevailing and forecasted weather conditions during the event
  - o Level of activity expected from LFD personnel (e.g., social presence vs. the probability of performing fire/EMS activities)

## Class "D" Uniform – Physical Fitness - Training Exercises

The Class "D" uniform is designed for use during physical fitness activities and special training programs. It will remain the option of the Company Officer as to the dress required for any training exercise. The Class "D" uniform can be worn between the hours of 1800 and 0800 hours during rest periods when out of the public view.

- T-shirt Department issued t-shirt
- gym shorts Department issued gym shorts
- Athletic socks
- Athletic shoes

In the event of an emergency call, a member wearing the Class "D" uniform is required to don structural firefighting gear prior to leaving engine house.

# **Hair Guidelines**

The style of grooming shall present a neat appearance and will not interfere with the proper wearing of regulation headgear nor impede the donning / utilization of any equipment and/or accomplishing any function that a firefighter may be required to perform.

### Male Personnel

- Hair shall be worn to the general shape of the head and may be worn to the top of but not to extend beyond the top of the collar.
- Sideburns shall be neatly trimmed and not interfere with personal protective equipment.
- Mustaches shall be neatly trimmed not to exceed greater than one inch above the jaw line as well as shall not extend over the top lip.
- At no time, will the seal of an SCBA mask be impeded by facial hair.

#### Female Personnel

- Hair ornaments such as ribbons shall not be worn. Pins, combs, or barrettes may be worn as long as they are of black or dark blue in color and do not interfere with personal protective equipment.
- Hair shall be worn to a maximum length that does not extend below the shoulder under any condition.
- All fingernails shall be trimmed not to exceed the end of the finger.

## **Department Emblem/Patch**

The Ladue Fire Department logo and/or patch shall be displayed on the following items

### **Dress Coat/Dress Shirt SS/LS**

Patch on left shoulder

### Polo Style Shirt/ Job Shirt

• Emblem on left chest

### **T-Shirt**

- Emblem on left chest
- Department lettering on back

# Hat/ Knit Cap

• Emblem on the front and centered

# **Personal Appearance**

All personnel shall maintain a clean, neat, and professional appearance. At no time while on duty shall any tattoos be displayed

### 1. Tattoos, Branding, Scarring or Other forms of Body Art

Personnel are prohibited from having tattoos or any other form of body art such as branding and /or scarring that is visible while at work or on duty. This should be accomplished by selecting business attire or uniform items that obscure the tattoo/body art from view at all times.

**Exemptions:** Tattooed wedding rings and incidental displays of tattoos during workouts while on duty. Fire department personnel may request exemptions from this policy with the approval of the Fire Chief. (Reasonable Accommodations)

No person shall wear jewelry that presents a safety risk. Earrings may be worn, but limited to one per ear. No large loops, gauges, pendants or large dangling jewelry shall be worn. Other visible body piercing jewelry is not permitted to be displayed while on duty.

The Fire Chief or his designee shall have the discretion to determine whether or not a person's appearance complies with these guidelines.

**Purpose:** The purpose of this policy is to give guidelines on replacing aging equipment. During an emergency, it is critical that all equipment and apparatus work in the manner in which they were designed. Having aging equipment and apparatus places firefighters and patients at risk. It is the intent of the Fire Chief's Office to provide a framework for replacement of equipment. This framework is developed using standards and best practices provided by the International Association of Fire Chief, International Association of Fire Fighters, and the National Fire Protection Association.

Additionally, this policy will assist in providing a framework for the Capital Improvement Plan or long-term Capital Outlay. Having a structure that will assist in the replacement of equipment and apparatus will provide fiscal responsibility to planning and securing future funds.

**Scope:** This policy shall be used by Chief Officers to assist in short- and long-term planning of purchases and budgets preparation.

**Policy:** Below is the established replacement schedule of listed equipment. This policy shall be followed unless budgetary restraints prevent the replacement. All service life years listed below are based on best practice and recommendations of above-mentioned governing bodies.

**Purpose:** Because of the nature of their employment with the fire department, chief officers are assigned a fire department vehicle equipped with warning lights and siren and radio equipment. The fire chief shall determine which vehicle is assigned to each chief officer.

**Scope:** This Policy applies to all Chief Officers and Staff members assigned or temporarily using a staff vehicle.

**Policy:** The assigned vehicle is used to transport the chief officer and his related equipment to activities of the fire district such as, but not limited to, meetings, training, community events and emergency incidents. These activities may occur not only within the fire department, but in neighboring communities, the St. Louis metropolitan area and neighboring states. Training, education, conferences, and planning events may occur anywhere in the United States and use of the assigned staff vehicle for attendance at these events is permitted with the approval of the Fire Chief or Mayor.

Because of the work schedule of a chief officer and the need to respond to such activities at any time, a chief officer is permitted to use his assigned staff vehicle for reasonable personal use as such use will permit his timely response. The guiding factor of whether such use is reasonable is not the distance from the fire department but rather whether the chief officer will be able to respond promptly to an official activity with the assigned staff vehicle when requested. If the chief officer is not able to respond, then the use may not be reasonable.

When operating an assigned staff vehicle, the chief officer will adhere to all applicable laws, remain unimpaired and not under the influence of drugs or alcohol as required by fire department rules and regulations, and observe the operational guidelines of the fire district for vehicle operation.

A chief officer may respond to any emergency incident regardless of whether he is assigned to respond by the dispatch center. When responding to an unassigned incident, the chief officer will notify the dispatching center.

Assigned vehicles are supplied with fuel keys, proper registration, and insurance. Regular maintenance and repairs are covered by the fire department.

# FITNESS/WELLNESS PROGRAM

# FITNESS PROGRAM

### **Goals**

The City of Ladue Fire Department operates a Wellness and Fitness Program to enhance the physical and mental health of our workforce, thus minimizing occupational injuries, disability retirements, and workers' compensation costs, while complying with occupational health and safety regulatory requirements. This program's focus will be educational and rehabilitative, not punitive. This program applies to all Fire personnel.

# **Wellness and Fitness Program Support**

The working conditions of the City of Ladue Fire Department personnel can place them in emergency situations requiring the utmost in mental concentration and physical strength. In life-threatening circumstances, firefighters may need all of their skills, both mental and physical, to deal with the situations successfully. Fire personnel must be able to move heavy equipment and hoses, as well as climb ladders, while wearing bulky and weighty gear. They must recognize dangers at emergency scenes, such as toxic vapors and smoke, and immediately employ proper safety procedures and systems to maximize personal protection. Fire personnel must be able to evaluate situations and, as necessary, move individuals of considerable weight to safer locations and to ambulances. The City of Ladue Fire Department continually is reviewing these requirements and considering new and improved means for enhancing the health and safety of its most valuable assets - the employees!

# **Objectives:**

- 1. Provide easily accessible fitness program opportunities.
- 2. Conduct an annual fitness evaluation to determine a baseline level of fitness for each employee and to evaluate progress from year to year.
- 3. Provide a qualified wellness professional and/or qualified peer-fitness trainer who can design fitness programs for employees and monitor their progress.

# **Fitness Opportunities:**

Provision of multiple fitness opportunities for Fire personnel demonstrates, in a tangible manner, the City of Ladue Fire Department's commitment to ensuring a well-balanced Wellness and Fitness Program and maximizes opportunities for the Department to have a more motivated, safer, and capable workforce. Fitness opportunities provided to Fire personnel are detailed below.

Equipment in place in the Fitness Center provides hardware necessary for the development and implementation of individualized fitness programs to achieve high levels of: (1) aerobic and anaerobic fitness, and (2) muscular strength, endurance, and flexibility. Equipment purchases and placement has been carefully reviewed to allow an orderly flow of activity and facilitate appropriate circuit training procedures. The facility is available for use by all Fire personnel.

An employee shall be allowed use of the equipment when off-duty to maintain physical readiness to respond to a call.

**Purpose:** The purpose of this policy is to establish guidelines on how we maintain, inspect, and repair the City of Ladue Fire Department facilities. This policy will also cover how we maintain facility safety.

# **Policy:**

- 1. Facility inspections will be done annually and are to be performed by the Ladue Building Inspector or a qualified contractor in conjunction with the City of Ladue Fire Marshal.
- 2. The facility inspections will be documented in our electronic documentation software utilizing a standard form created by the Fire Marshal. These inspection records will be kept for the life of the facility.
- 3. Facility repair requests shall be reported as soon as possible.
- 4. Facility repair requests will be documented in our electronic documentation software by the on-duty officer at the facility requiring the repair.
- 5. After documenting the needed repair, the on-duty officer will contact the appropriate vendor for the needed repair and schedule a time for the repair. The vendor will be chosen from the vendor list, which will be posted on the bulletin board at each facility. This list will also be located at the end of this policy.
- 6. Minor building maintenance will be performed by the on-duty crew members as needed.
- 7. Minor building maintenance would include changing light bulbs, cleaning the facilities, changing furnace filters, or other minor maintenance that does not require a professional to perform.
- 8. Facility Safety our goal is to follow the guidelines set forth by NFPA 1500 for facility safety as close as possible.
- 9. The implementation of the facility safety guidelines will be overseen by the Authority having Jurisdiction over the facilities.
- 10. The day-to-day facility safety will be the responsibility of the officer in charge at the facility.
- 11. Disinfecting, cleaning and storage at our facilities will be in accordance with NFPA 1581 when possible.
- 12. Any injuries or deaths in our facilities will be handled and documented as with any other on duty injury or death.
- 13. Our goal is to follow the NFPA guidelines set forth as closely as possible to create a safe work environment for everyone in our facilities.
