A RESOLUTION AND ORDER ESTABLISHING PROCEDURE FOR THE 2017 CITY OF LAMESA GENERAL ELECTION.

On this the 17th day of January, 2017, there came on and was held at the regular meeting place, the City Hall, an open meeting of the City Council of the City of Lamesa, Texas held pursuant to the provisions of the Texas Open Meetings Act; there being a quorum present and acting throughout the meeting, the following resolution was formally submitted by motion and duly seconded for the consideration and action of the meeting, to wit:

WHEREAS, the laws of the State of Texas and the Charter of the City of Lamesa, Texas, provide that on May 6, 2017, there shall be elected the following officials for this City:

The City of Lamesa will be using the ES&S AutoMARK voter assist terminal. This AutoMARK is an optical scan ballot marking system designed to provide privacy and accessibility to voters who are visually impaired, or have a disability or condition that would make it difficult or impossible to mark a ballot in the usual way. In addition, the technology provides language assistance to voters who are more comfortable speaking an alternative language or who have reading difficulties.

That early voting by personal appearance for said designated election shall be at City Hall, 601 South First, Lamesa, Texas, in the office of the City Secretary and said place of early voting shall remain open during the hours that the secretary's office is regularly open for business, which is not a Saturday, a Sunday, or an official State Holiday, beginning on the 12th day before and continuing through the 4th day preceding the date of said election; and

The applications for ballot by mail shall be mailed to the Office of the City Secretary, 601 South First, Lamesa, Texas 79331. Applications for ballots by mail must be received no later than the close of business on the 25th day of April, 2017; and

That all early voting ballots cast in said election shall be counted by an Early Voting Ballot Board in accordance with the provisions of Section 87.001 of the Election Code; and that said Early Voting Ballot Board shall be appointed by the city council. The early voting ballots shall be counted separately from the ballots cast in that polling place and a separate set of records be prepared for them; and

That said election shall be held in accordance with the Election Code of this State; and only qualified voters being residents of said City shall be eligible to vote at said election; and

That the canvassing of said election shall take place at the regularly scheduled meeting of the city council on Tuesday, May 16, 2017, at five-thirty p.m.; and that the council shall certify the results of said canvass at that meeting.

That for the purposes of holding the election for Mayor held on May 6th, 2017, that all City Council member districts shall be consolidated into one district.

I. PROBLEM

A. Water System

The City of Lamesa has selected to undertake a water systems improvement project as its 2017 TxCDBG grant application. Due to the age and deterioration of the current water lines, the City of Lamesa has experienced numerous leaks throughout their water system. The maintenance required for these repairs has become a major problem for many residents who are continually without adequate water while full repairs are being made. Patching the leaks provides a temporary fix, but does not alleviate the problem.

B. Sewer System

The City of Lamesa has also selected to undertake a sewer systems improvement project. The sewer lines selected for replacement were constructed of clay tile and due to age are deteriorating. These lines need to be replaced with new PVC to eliminate cracks and leaks. City crews are annually having to excavate and repair sections of pipe that have failed. These failures can cause sewage to contaminate and are a threat to health and safety.

II. SOLUTION

A. Water System

The City of Lamesa is proposing to replace 6-inch waterline in areas that have experienced multiple leaks. This project would include replacing approximately 2,030 linear feet of 6-inch waterline with 8-inch waterline along Northeast 4th Street. The work performed will include, but is not limited to, the removal and replacement of the 6-inch waterline, removing and replacing fire hydrants, and the reconnection of existing services to the new 8-inch line. All work will be designed and constructed in accordance with current TCEQ regulations at the time of the project.

B. Sewer System

The City is also proposing to replace 10-inch and 12-inch sewer line in areas shown on the attached exhibit at Court C and 10th Street. This project would include replacing approximately 500 linear feet of 12-inch sewer line and approximately 1,000 linear feet of 10-inch sewer line at Court C. This work performed will include, but is not limited to, the removal and replacement of sewer line, connecting to existing manholes, and installing new manholes. All work will be designed and constructed in accordance with current TCEQ regulations at the time of the project.

1ST PUBLIC HEARING - AD VALOREM TAX RATE – 2016: 1ST Public Hearing on a proposed property tax rate of \$<u>.827521</u> for 2016. This tax rate will raise <u>\$2,213,533</u> which is <u>\$240,458</u> more than taxes imposed last year.

THIS TAX RATE WILL RAISE MORE TAXES FOR MAINTENANCE AND OPERATIONS THAN LAST YEAR'S TAX RATE. THE TAX RATE WILL EFFECTIVELY BE RAISED BY 7.99 PERCENT AND WILL RAISE TAXES FOR MAINTENANCE AND OPERATIONS ON A \$100,000 HOME BY APPROXIMATELY \$56.19 {Section 26.05(b)1(A&B) OF THE PROPERTY TAX CODE}.

Mayor Stevens announced the opening of a public hearing on a proposed hearing on a proposed property tax rate of 0.827521 for 2016. This tax rate will raise 2.213,533 which is 240,458 more than taxes imposed last year.

City agreed to try to accomplish the following:

- City will clean out scorekeeper boxes after tournaments and weekend use by out-oftown leagues.
- 2. City staff to open gates of the complex at 4 p.m. (Monday Friday) during season.
- 3. City will provide each league 1 key to the complex (with President/Chair person responsible for the key).
- 4. City staff will blade practice fields in front of complex several more times to level.
- 5. City will try to purchase a mower that cuts grass closer to the ground for better playing surface.
- 6. City will try to purchase and/or build portable/mobile back stops for practice fields around town.
- 7. City will try to provide one golf cart with utility bed for league use inside the complex, eliminating vehicles inside the park. Only one vehicle for Cal Ripkin and one vehicle for Lamesa Girls Fast Pitch will be allowed inside the park.
- 8. City to post a list of rules for usage of sports complex at front gate (see attached).
- 9. City will allow use of 1 grill per league on Opening Day only.
- 10. City will line out-fields.

- No obscene behavior or profane language will be tolerated.
- No athletic field use without prior approval from the City of Lamesa Water Department and Parks Director.
- Smoking and all tobacco products are prohibited.
- Glass bottles or containers are prohibited in the park.
- No pets allowed on the fields or inside the Weaver Sports Complex, except service animals.
- Players, coaches and officials only on playing fields on game days.
- No food or beverages are permitted outside of dugouts on playing fields.
- No cooking or food preparation is allowed in the Weaver Sports Complex without approval from the City of Lamesa.
- Drugs are strictly prohibited. The law will be enforced.
- No person shall engage in the sale of merchandise or operate any concessions without prior approval of the City of Lamesa.
- All postings and field markings must be pre-arranged and approved by the Parks Director
- Weaver Sports Complex fees may apply.
- Specific permission is required prior to posting any signs or decorations.
- Loud speakers are prohibited unless prior consent is given by the City of Lamesa.
- Private vehicles are prohibited on turf surfaces, sidewalks, service driveways and emergency zones. Any vehicle found in unauthorized parking areas will be ticketed and towed at owner's expense.
- Overnight parking is prohibited including RV's and campers.
- Park may be closed at any time due to safety related concerns.
- Littering and dumping trash is strictly prohibited.
- No loitering or soliciting is allowed at the Weaver Sports Complex.
- No firearms, fires, fireworks, flammable liquids, open burning, or use of any device with an open flame will be allowed unless permit given for special events.
- Speed limit in the park is 5 mph.
- Cars parked in handicapped parking spaces without a handicap sticker will be fined.
- All tournament and league participants, spectators, coaches, and players are at risk to be hit with a baseball/softball. Be alert at all times.
- Failure to comply with these rules will result in immediate removal from park.

Lessee agrees that the rental fee and deposit will be refunded only if a cancellation is made at least 7 days prior to the scheduled use and that a request for change of date or cancellation of a reservation may only be made the person originally making the reservation.

- 5. The above described premises shall be occupied by Lessee for the purpose of operating, on a non-profit basis, a softball/baseball tournament and not otherwise. Lessee, its agents, employees, successors and assigns, shall not permit waste or injury to the leased premised during the time hereof, nor use the premises for any illegal purpose. Lessee agrees to the following conditions with respect to scheduling of games at said facilities:
 - A. **Furnishing of Schedule.** Lessee agrees to furnish the Park Superintendent with a schedule of all games to be played during the term of the contract, and to give notice of any subsequent change in the schedule.
 - B. **Conflict in Schedule**. Lessee agrees that in the event of any conflict of scheduling of events, lessee shall work with all parties in a joint spirit of cooperation. In

the event any conflict cannot be resolved, lessee agrees that the City Manager, or his designee shall make a final determination of scheduling and that lessee agrees to be bound by that determination.

- C. **Availability**. Lessee agrees that the right to use any athletic fields is limited by the availability of the fields. Lessee further agrees that the City reserves the right to deny any person the use of any athletic field whenever such fields are unavailable because it is being utilized by others.
- 6. The use of the above-described property is subject to all ordinances, resolutions and restrictions, which may have been, or may be, imposed by the City Council of the City of Lamesa.
- 7. Lessee shall have no right to assign or sub-let the above-described property without the prior written consent of the Lessor. It is understood that no individual, group or organization shall transfer or assign their contractual use of any athletic field, concession stand, or other facility associated with an athletic field except as specified in a contract duly executed with the City Manager.
- 8. It is further a part of the consideration that the Lesser will not change, modify or make any additions to any athletic field, concession stand, or other facility associated with an athletic field except as specified in a contract duly executed with the City Manager.
- 9. In connection with Lessee's operations of said athletic field on the above described property, it shall be Lessee's responsibility to furnish said premises in a manner necessary to achieve such objective, and Lessee shall maintain same in a clean and health manner and in compliance with all Government regulations incident to the operation such a facility. Lessee further agrees to assume the following responsibilities and conditions with respect to this agreement:
 - A. Clean-up Responsibilities. Lessee agrees to be responsible for clean-up of the ball field, grounds around the athletic field, around the concession stand, and the parking lots. Lessee further agrees to pay a minimum fee of \$100 each time City crews are required to clean up after an event.
 - B. Damage Responsibilities. Lessee agrees to be responsible for any damage to any part of the grounds, buildings, irrigation systems and fences that occurs during such use or during the term of the contract for such use. Lessee further agrees that any repairs required, as a result of such damage shall be made at the direction of the Park Superintendent and that any such repairs performed by the City shall be paid by the lessee.

- C. Furnishing of Equipment. Lessee agrees that the City will not furnish any equipment. Bases, balls, bats, and other playing equipment will be furnished by the party using the field.
- D. Conditioning of Field. Lessee agrees that final conditioning of the field and arrangement of the-athletic field and adjacent areas will be the responsibility of the lessee and that no fences, backstops, or other permanent fixtures will be moved or altered without permission of the Park Superintendent.
- E. Use During Maintenance or Watering. Lessee agrees that no game, practice, or any other activity will be scheduled or allowed on any athletic field during periods in which the field is being watered or otherwise maintained by the Park Department. Lessee also agrees to be responsible for any expense incurred by the City in moving irrigation pipe removed or moved during and such watering period and further agrees to pay a minimum fee of \$25 each time such occurs.
- F. Lighting. Lessee agrees to be responsible for turning the lights off after the completion of play. Lessee further agrees to pay a fee of \$100 when City personnel are required to turn off lights that have been left on.
- G. Conduct at Games. Lessee agrees that when, in the judgment of the Police Chief of the City of Lamesa, Texas, extra police personnel are required at ball games conducted by lessee, that the expense thereof shall be paid by lessee. Lessee further agrees that the Police Chief of the City of Lamesa, Texas, shall have the right to require a deposit in an amount sufficient to pay the expense of extra police personnel at such ball games prior to commencement of the ball games.
- H. **Public-address System**. Lessee agrees to control and limit the volume of public-address systems at all ball parks in a manner that will not allow the sound therefrom to emanate beyond a distance of fifty feet (50') from the fence lines of said ball parks.
- I. Concessions and sales at leased facilities. It is agreed that this contract shall constitute a concession contract between the City and the lessee as provided in Section 43.010 of the Code of Ordinance of the City of Lamesa and shall be effective only for events conducted by the lessee under the terms of this contract. And it is understood that it is unlawful for any other person to offer or exhibit for sale any goods, wares, merchandise or other commodities on or at any public park or upon any other property owned by the City of Lamesa, unless such person has previously applied to the City Council for a permit to do so. It is further agreed that said concession contract shall be subject to the following provisions:

- (1) Sales tax permit. If lessee sells any goods, including food, drinks, or other concessions, lessee agrees to hold a valid sales tax permit issued by the office of the Comptroller of Public Accounts of the State of Texas and to collect and remit said a sales and use tax paid upon the purchased of such goods.
- (2) Minimum food sanitation standards. If lessee proposes to sell or offer for sale, under the provisions of this contract, good consisting of any raw, cooked, prepared or processed edible substance, ice, beverage, or ingredient used or intended for use or for sale in whole or in part for human consumption lessee agrees to secure, on a form to be provided, the signature of the Health Officer/Environmental Health Officer indicating that such goods meet minimum food sanitation standards of the city and state. This provision does not apply if lessee sells only non-refrigerated food items packaged and sealed in individual servings, such as candies and similar confectioneries.
- (3) **Use of concession stand**. It is agreed that the provisions of this contract do not entitle the lessee the use of the concession stand building on the premises to be leased unless aforementioned requirements are met and a separate deposit is made.
- 10. Lessee agrees to assume the following responsibilities and conditions with respect to this agreement:
 - A. Release of City from Damages. Lessee's use of City owned athletic fields is conditioned that, by the acceptance and use of such facilities, any and all persons participating in play, spectating, or otherwise engaged in or around said athletic fields therefore releases the City fully and completely from any and all damages that may be sustained by such persons. Use of the athletic fields constitutes acceptance of this release.
 - B. General Liability: At all times during tournament, lessee shall provide and keep in force liability insurance covering the lessee and shall name the City as an additional insured. Insurance policy shall protect against any and all liability for death, injury, loss or damage arising out of, or connected with condition, occupation, or use of the facilities by the lessee, invitees, guests, participants, assigns or other persons admitted by lessee to the facilities. A copy of Certificate of Insurance shall be furnished to the City Manager.
- 11. It is specifically understood that in the event that any section, subsection, sentence, clause, or phrase of this agreement is, for any reason, held to be invalid, such holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this agreement.



Dear Council Members.

Since January 1, 2002, the Lamesa Police Department in accordance with the Texas Racial Profiling Law (S.B. No. 1074), has been collecting police contact data for the purpose of identify and responding (if necessary) to concerns regarding racial profiling practices. It is my hope that the findings provided in this report will serve as evidence that the Lamesa Police Department continues to strive towards the goal of maintaining strong relations with the community.

In this report, the reader will encounter several sections designed at providing background information on the rationale and objectives of the Texas Racial Profiling Law. Other sections contain information relevant to the institutional policies adopted by the Lamesa Police Department banishing the practice of racial profiling among its officers.

The final components of this report provide statistical data relevant to the public contacts made during the period of 1/1/16 and 12/31/16. This information has been analyzed and compared to the Department of Public Safety data on motorists residing in the Dawson County area. The analysis of the data and recommendations for future areas of research are also included. It is my sincere hope that the channels of communication between community leaders and the Lamesa Police Department continue to strengthen as we move forward to meet the challenges of the near future.

relating to the prevention of racial profiling by certain peace officers.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF

TEXAS:

SECTION 1. Chapter 2, Code of Criminal Procedure, is amended by adding Articles 2.131 through 2.138 to read as follows:

Art. 2.131. RACIAL PROFILING PROHIBITED. A peace officer may not engage in racial profiling.

Art. 2.132. LAW ENFORCEMENT POLICY ON RACIAL

PROFILING. (a) In this article:

(1) "Law enforcement agency" means an agency of the state, or of a county, municipality, or other political subdivision of the state, that employs peace officers who make traffic stops in the routine performance of the officers' official duties.

(2) "Race or ethnicity" means of a particular descent, including Caucasian, African, Hispanic, Asian, or Native American descent.

(b) Each law enforcement agency in this state shall adopt a detailed written policy on racial profiling. The policy must:

- (1) clearly define acts constituting racial profiling:
- (2) strictly prohibit peace officers employed by the agency

from engaging in racial profiling;

(3) implement a process by which an individual may file a complaint with the agency if the individual believes that a peace officer employed by the agency has engaged in racial profiling with respect to the individual;

(4) provide public education relating to the agency's

complaint process;

(5) require appropriate corrective action to be taken against a peace officer employed by the agency who, after an investigation, is shown to have engaged in racial profiling in violation of the agency's policy adopted under this article;

(6) require collection of information relating to traffic stops in which a citation is issued and to arrests resulting from those traffic stops, including information relating to:

(A) the race or ethnicity of the individual detained;

and

(B) whether a search was conducted and, if so, whether the person detained consented to the search; and

(7) require the agency to submit to the governing body of each county or municipality served by the agency an annual report of the information collected under Subdivision (6) if the agency is an agency of a county, municipality, or other political subdivision of the state.

(c) The data collected as a result of the reporting requirements of this article shall not constitute prima facie evidence of racial profiling.

(d) On adoption of a policy under Subsection (b), a law enforcement agency shall examine the feasibility of installing video camera and transmitter-activated equipment in each agency law enforcement motor vehicle regularly used to make traffic stops and transmitter-activated equipment in each agency law enforcement motorcycle regularly used to make traffic stops. If a law enforcement agency installs video or audio equipment as provided by this subsection, the policy adopted by the agency under Subsection (b) must include standards for reviewing video and audio documentation.

(e) A report required under Subsection (b)(7) may not include identifying information about a peace officer who makes a traffic stop or about an individual

who is stopped or arrested by a peace officer. This subsection does not affect the collection of information as required by a policy under Subsection (b)(6).

(f) On the commencement of an investigation by a law enforcement agency of a complaint described by Subsection (b)(3) in which a video or audio recording of the occurrence on which the complaint is based was made, the agency shall promptly provide a copy of the recording to the peace officer who is the subject of the complaint on written request by the officer.

Art. 2.133. REPORTS REQUIRED FOR TRAFFIC AND

PEDESTRIAN STOPS. (a) In this article:

2.132(a).

(1) "Race or ethnicity" has the meaning assigned by Article

(2) "Pedestrian stop" means an interaction between a peace officer and an individual who is being detained for the purpose of a criminal investigation in which the individual is not under arrest.

(b) A peace officer who stops a motor vehicle for an alleged violation of a law or ordinance regulating traffic or who stops a pedestrian for any suspected offense shall report to the law enforcement agency that employs the officer information relating to the stop, including:

(1) a physical description of each person detained as a result of the stop, including:

(A) the person's gender; and

(B) the person's race or ethnicity, as stated by the person or, if the person does not state the person's race or ethnicity, as determined by the officer to the best of the officer's ability;

(2) the traffic law or ordinance alleged to have been violated or the suspected offense;

(3) whether the officer conducted a search as a result of the stop and, if so, whether the person detained consented to the search;

(4) whether any contraband was discovered in the course of the search and the type of contraband discovered;

(5) whether probable cause to search existed and the facts supporting the existence of that probable cause;

(6) whether the officer made an arrest as a result of the stop or the search, including a statement of the offense charged;

(7) the street address or approximate location of the stop;

and

(8) whether the officer issued a warning or a citation as a result of the stop, including a description of the warning or a statement of the violation charged.

Art. 2.134. COMPILATION AND ANALYSIS OF INFORMATION

COLLECTED. (a) In this article, "pedestrian stop" means an interaction between a peace officer and an individual who is being detained for the purpose of a criminal investigation in which the individual is not under arrest.

(b) A law enforcement agency shall compile and analyze the information contained in each report received by the agency under Article 2.133. Not later than March 1 of each year, each local law enforcement agency shall submit a report containing the information compiled during the previous calendar year to the governing body of each county or municipality served by the agency in a manner approved by the agency.

(c) A report required under Subsection (b) must include:

(1) a comparative analysis of the information compiled

under Article 2.133 to:

(A) determine the prevalence of racial profiling by

peace officers employed by the agency; and

(B) examine the disposition of traffic and pedestrian stops made by officers employed by the agency, including searches resulting from the stops; and

(2) information relating to each complaint filed with the agency alleging that a peace officer employed by the agency has engaged in racial profiling.

identifying information about a peace officer who makes a traffic or pedestrian stop or about an individual who is stopped or arrested by a peace officer. This subsection does not affect the reporting of information required under Article 2.133(b)(1).

(d) A report required under Subsection (b) may not include

(e) The Commission on Law Enforcement Officer Standards and
Education shall develop guidelines for compiling and reporting information as required by this article.

(f) The data collected as a result of the reporting requirements of this article shall not constitute prima facie evidence of racial profiling.

Art. 2.135. EXEMPTION FOR AGENCIES USING VIDEO AND AUDIO EQUIPMENT. (a) A peace officer is exempt from the reporting requirement under Article 2.133 and a law enforcement agency is exempt from the compilation, analysis, and reporting requirements under Article 2.134 if:

(1) during the calendar year preceding the date that a report under Article 2.134 is required to be submitted:

(A) each law enforcement motor vehicle regularly used by an officer employed by the agency to make traffic and pedestrian stops is equipped with video camera and transmitter-activated equipment and each law enforcement motorcycle regularly used to make traffic and pedestrian stops is equipped with transmitter-activated equipment; and

(B) each traffic and pedestrian stop made by an officer employed by the agency that is capable of being recorded by video and audio or audio equipment, as appropriate, is recorded by using the equipment; or

by the law enforcement agency, in conjunction with the law enforcement agency, certifies to the Department of Public Safety, not later than the date specified by rule by the department, that the law enforcement agency needs funds or video and audio equipment for the purpose of installing video and audio equipment as described by Subsection (a)(1)(A) and the agency does not receive from the state funds or video and audio equipment sufficient, as determined by the department, for the agency to accomplish that purpose.

(b) Except as otherwise provided by this subsection, a law enforcement agency that is exempt from the requirements under Article 2.134 shall retain the video and audio or audio documentation of each traffic and pedestrian stop for at least 90 days after the date of the stop. If a complaint is filed with the law enforcement agency alleging that a peace officer employed by the agency has engaged in racial profiling with respect to a traffic or pedestrian stop, the agency shall retain the video and audio or audio record of the stop until final disposition of the complaint.

(c) This article does not affect the collection or reporting requirements under Article 2.132.

Art. 2.136. LIABILITY. A peace officer is not liable for damages arising from an act relating to the collection or reporting of information as required by Article 2.133 or under a policy adopted under Article 2.132.

Art. 2.137. PROVISION OF FUNDING OR EQUIPMENT. (a) The Department of Public Safety shall adopt rules for providing funds or video and audio equipment to law enforcement agencies for the purpose of installing video and audio equipment as described by Article 2.135(a)(1)(A), including specifying criteria to prioritize funding or equipment provided to law enforcement agencies. The criteria may include consideration of tax

effort, financial hardship, available revenue, and budget surpluses. The criteria must give priority to:

(1) law enforcement agencies that employ peace officers whose primary duty is traffic enforcement;

- (2) smaller jurisdictions; and
- (3) municipal and county law enforcement agencies.

institution of higher education to identify law enforcement agencies that need funds or video and audio equipment for the purpose of installing video and audio equipment as described by Article 2.135(a)(1)(A). The collaboration may include the use of a survey to assist in developing criteria to prioritize funding or equipment provided to law enforcement agencies.

(c) To receive funds or video and audio equipment from the state for the purpose of installing video and audio equipment as described by Article 2.135(a)(1)(A), the governing body of a county or municipality, in conjunction with the law enforcement agency serving the county or municipality, shall certify to the Department of Public Safety that the law enforcement agency needs funds or video and audio equipment for that purpose.

(d) On receipt of funds or video and audio equipment from the state for the purpose of installing video and audio equipment as described by Article 2.135(a)(1)(A), the governing body of a county or municipality, in conjunction with the law enforcement agency serving the county or municipality, shall certify to the Department of Public Safety that the law enforcement agency has installed video and audio equipment as described by Article 2.135(a)(1)(A) and is using the equipment as required by Article 2.135(a)(1).

Art. 2.138. RULES. The Department of Public Safety may adopt rules to implement Articles 2.131-2.137.

SECTION 2. Chapter 3, Code of Criminal Procedure, is amended by adding Article 3.05 to read as follows:

Art. 3.05. RACIAL PROFILING. In this code, "racial profiling" means a law enforcement-initiated action based on an individual's race, ethnicity, or national origin rather than on the individual's behavior or on information identifying the individual as having engaged in criminal activity.

SECTION 3. Section 96.641, Education Code, is amended by adding Subsection (j) to read as follows:

(j) As part of the initial training and continuing education for police chiefs required under this section, the institute shall establish a program on racial profiling. The program must include an examination of the best practices for:

(1) monitoring peace officers' compliance with laws and internal agency policies relating to racial profiling;

(2) implementing laws and internal agency policies relating to preventing racial profiling; and

(3) analyzing and reporting collected information.

SECTION 4. Section 1701.253, Occupations Code, is amended by adding Subsection (e) to read as follows:

(e) As part of the minimum curriculum requirements, the commission shall establish a statewide comprehensive education and training program on racial profiling for officers licensed under this chapter. An officer shall complete a program established under this subsection not later than the second anniversary of the date the officer is licensed under this chapter or the date the officer applies for an intermediate proficiency certificate, whichever date is earlier.

SECTION 5. Section 1701.402, Occupations Code, is amended by adding Subsection (d) to read as follows:

(d) As a requirement for an intermediate proficiency certificate, an officer must complete an education and training program on racial profiling established by the commission under Section 1701.253(e).

SECTION 6. Section 543.202, Transportation Code, is amended to

read as follows:

Sec. 543.202. FORM OF RECORD. (a) In this section, "race or ethnicity" means of a particular descent, including Caucasian, African, Hispanic, Asian, or Native American descent.

- (b) The record must be made on a form or by a data processing method acceptable to the department and must include:
- (1) the name, address, physical description, including race or ethnicity, date of birth, and driver's license number of the person charged;
 - (2) the registration number of the vehicle involved;
- (3) whether the vehicle was a commercial motor vehicle as defined by Chapter 522 or was involved in transporting hazardous materials;
- (4) the person's social security number, if the person was operating a commercial motor vehicle or was the holder of a commercial driver's license or commercial driver learner's permit;
- (5) the date and nature of the offense, including whether the offense was a serious traffic violation as defined by Chapter 522;
- (6) whether a search of the vehicle was conducted and whether consent for the search was obtained;
 - (7) the plea, the judgment, and whether bail was forfeited;
 - (8) (7) the date of conviction; and
 - (9) [(8)] the amount of the fine or forfeiture.

SECTION 7. Not later than January 1, 2002, a law enforcement agency shall adopt and implement a policy and begin collecting information under the policy as required by Article 2.132, Code of Criminal Procedure, as added by this Act. A local law enforcement agency shall first submit information to the governing body of each county or municipality served by the agency as required by Article 2.132, Code of Criminal Procedure, as

added by this Act, on March 1, 2003. The first submission of information shall consist of information compiled by the agency during the period beginning January 1, 2002, and ending December 31, 2002.

SECTION 8. A local law enforcement agency shall first submit information to the governing body of each county or municipality served by the agency as required by Article 2.134, Code of Criminal Procedure, as added by this Act, on March 1, 2004. The first submission of information shall consist of information compiled by the agency during the period beginning January 1, 2003, and ending December 31, 2003.

SECTION 9. Not later than January 1, 2002:

(1) the Commission on Law Enforcement Officer Standards and Education shall establish an education and training program on racial profiling as required by Subsection (e), Section 1701.253, Occupations Code, as added by this Act; and

(2) the Bill Blackwood Law Enforcement Management Institute of Texas shall establish a program on racial profiling as required by Subsection (j), Section 96.641, Education Code, as added by this Act.

SECTION 10. A person who on the effective date of this Act holds an intermediate proficiency certificate issued by the Commission on Law Enforcement Officer Standards and Education or has held a peace officer license issued by the Commission on Law Enforcement Officer Standards and Education for at least two years shall complete an education and training program on racial profiling established under Subsection (e), Section 1701.253, Occupations Code, as added by this Act, not later than September 1, 2003.

SECTION 11. An individual appointed or elected as a police chief before the effective date of this Act shall complete a program on racial profiling established under Subsection (j), Section 96.641, Education Code, as added by this Act, not later than September 1, 2003.

SECTION 12. This Act takes effect September 1, 2001.

Guidelines for Compiling and Reporting Data under Senate Bill 1074

Background

Senate Bill 1074 of the 77th Legislature established requirements in the Texas Code of Criminal Procedure (TCCP) for law enforcement agencies. The Commission developed this document to assist agencies in complying with the statutory requirements.

The guidelines are written in the form of standards using a style developed from accreditation organizations including the Commission on Accreditation for Law Enforcement Agencies (CALEA). The standards provide a description of *what* must be accomplished by an agency but allows wide latitude in determining *how* the agency will achieve compliance with each applicable standard.

Each standard is composed of two parts: the standard statement and the commentary. The *standard statement* is a declarative sentence that places a clear-cut requirement, or multiple requirements, on an agency. The commentary supports the standard statement but is not binding. The commentary can serve as a prompt, as guidance to clarify the intent of the standard, or as an example of one possible way to comply with the standard.

Standard 1

Each law enforcement agency has a detailed written directive that:

- clearly defines acts that constitute racial profiling;
- strictly prohibits peace officers employed by the agency from engaging in racial profiling;
- implements a process by which an individual may file a complaint with the agency if the individual believes a peace officer employed by the agency has engaged in racial profiling with respect to the individual filing the complaint;
- provides for public education relating to the complaint process;
- requires appropriate corrective action to be taken against a peace officer employed by the agency who, after investigation, is shown to have engaged in racial profiling in violation of the agency's written racial profiling policy; and
- requires the collection of certain types of data for subsequent reporting.

Commentary

Article 2.131 of the TCCP prohibits officers from engaging in racial profiling, and article 2.132 of the TCCP now requires a written policy that contains the elements listed in this standard. The article also specifically defines a law enforcement agency as it applies to this statute as an "agency of the state, or of a county, municipality, or other political subdivision of the state, that employs peace officers who make traffic stops in the routine performance of the officers' official duties."

The article further defines race or ethnicity as being of "a particular descent, including Caucasian, African, Hispanic, Asian, or Native American." The statute does not limit the required policies to just these ethnic groups.

This written policy is to be adopted and implemented no later than January 1, 2002.

Standard 2

Each peace officer who stops a motor vehicle for an alleged violation of a law or ordinance regulating traffic, or who stops a pedestrian for any suspected offense reports to the employing law enforcement agency information relating to the stop, to include:

- a physical description of each person detained, including gender and the person's race or ethnicity, as stated by the person, or, if the person does not state a race or ethnicity, as determined by the officer's best judgment;
- the traffic law or ordinance alleged to have been violated or the suspected offense;
- whether the officer conducted a search as a result of the stop and, if so, whether the person stopped consented to the search;
- whether any contraband was discovered in the course of the search, and the type of contraband discovered;
- whether probable cause to search existed, and the facts supporting the existence of that probable cause;
- whether the officer made an arrest as a result of the stop or the search, including a statement of the offense charged;
- the street address or approximate location of the stop; and
- whether the officer issued a warning or citation as a result of the stop, including a description of the warning or a statement of the violation charged.

Commentary

The information required by 2.133 TCCP is used to complete the agency reporting requirements found in Article 2.134. A peace officer and an agency may be exempted from this requirement under Article 2.135 TCCP Exemption for Agencies Using Video and Audio Equipment. An agency may be exempt from this reporting requirement by applying for the funds from the Department of Public Safety for video and audio equipment and the State does not supply those funds. Section 2.135 (a)(2) states, "the governing body of the county or municipality served by the law enforcement agency, in conjunction with the law enforcement agency, certifies to the Department of Public Safety, not later than the date specified by rule by the department, that the law enforcement agency needs funds or video and audio equipment for the purpose of installing video and audio equipment as described by Subsection (a) (1) (A) and the agency does not receive from the state funds for video and audio equipment sufficient, as determined by the department, for the agency to accomplish that purpose."

Standard 3

The agency compiles the information collected under 2.132 and 2.133 and analyzes the information identified in 2.133.

Commentary

Senate Bill 1074 from the 77th Session of the Texas Legislature created requirements for law enforcement agencies to gather specific information and to report it to each county or municipality served. New sections of law were added to the Code of Criminal Procedure regarding the reporting of traffic and pedestrian stops. Detained is defined as when a person stopped is not free to leave.

Article 2.134 TCCP requires the agency to compile and provide and analysis of the information collected by peace officer employed by the agency. The report is provided to the governing body of the municipality or county no later than March 1 of each year and covers the previous calendar year.

There is data collection and reporting required based on Article 2.132 CCP (tier one) and Article 2.133 CCP (tier two).

The minimum requirements for "tier one" data for traffic stops in which a citation results are:

- 1) the race or ethnicity of individual detained (race and ethnicity as defined by the bill means of "a particular descent, including Caucasian, African, Hispanic, Asian, or Native American");
- 2) whether a search was conducted, and if there was a search, whether it was a consent search or a probable cause search; and
- 3) whether there was a custody arrest.

The minimum requirements for reporting on "tier two" reports include traffic and pedestrian stops. Tier two data include:

- 1) the detained person's gender and race or ethnicity;
- 2) the type of law violation suspected, e.g., hazardous traffic, non-hazardous traffic, or other criminal investigation (the Texas Department of Public Safety publishes a categorization of traffic offenses into hazardous or non-hazardous);
- 3) whether a search was conducted, and if so whether it was based on consent or probable cause;
- 4) facts supporting probable cause;
- 5) the type, if any, of contraband that was collected;
- 6) disposition of the stop, e.g., arrest, ticket, warning, or release;
- 7) location of stop; and
- 8) statement of the charge, e.g., felony, misdemeanor, or traffic.

Tier one reports are made to the governing body of each county or municipality served by the agency an annual report of information if the agency is an agency of a county, municipality, or other political subdivision of the state. Tier one and two reports are reported to the county or municipality not later than March 1 for the previous calendar year beginning March 1, 2003. Tier two reports include a comparative analysis between the race and ethnicity of persons detained to see if a differential pattern of treatment can be discerned based on the disposition of stops including searches resulting from the stops. The reports also include information relating to each complaint filed with the agency alleging that a peace officer employed by the agency has engaged in racial profiling. An agency may be exempt from the tier two reporting requirement by applying for the funds from the Department of Public Safety for video and audio equipment and the State does not supply those funds [See 2.135 (a)(2) TCCP].

Reports should include both raw numbers and percentages for each group. Caution should be exercised in interpreting the data involving percentages because of statistical distortions caused by very small numbers in any particular category, for example, if only one American Indian is stopped and searched, that stop would not provide an accurate comparison with 200 stops among Caucasians with 100 searches. In the first case, a 100% search rate would be skewed data when compared to a 50% rate for Caucasians.

Standard 4

If a law enforcement agency has video and audio capabilities in motor vehicles regularly used for traffic stops, or audio capabilities on motorcycles regularly used to make traffic stops, the agency:

- adopts standards for reviewing and retaining audio and video documentation; and
- promptly provides a copy of the recording to a peace officer who is the subject of a complaint on written request by the officer.

Commentary

The agency should have a specific review and retention policy. Article 2.132 TCCP specifically requires that the peace officer be promptly provided with a copy of the audio or video recordings if the officer is the subject of a complaint and the officer makes a written request.

Standard 5

Agencies that do not currently have video or audio equipment must examine the feasibility of installing such equipment.

Commentary

None

Standard 6

Agencies that have video and audio recording capabilities are exempt from the reporting requirements of Article 2.134 TCCP and officers are exempt from the reporting requirements of Article 2.133 TCCP provided that:

- the equipment was in place and used during the proceeding calendar year; and
- video and audio documentation is retained for at least 90 days.

Commentary

The audio and video equipment and policy must have been in place during the previous calendar year. Audio and video documentation must be kept for at least 90 days or longer if a complaint has been filed. The documentation must be retained until the complaint is resolved. Peace officers are not exempt from the requirements under Article 2.132 TCCP.

Standard 7

Agencies have citation forms or other electronic media that comply with Section 543.202 of the Transportation Code.

Commentary

Senate Bill 1074 changed Section 543.202 of the Transportation Code requiring citations to include:

- race or ethnicity, and
- whether a search of the vehicle was conducted and whether consent for the search was obtained.

Lamesa Police Department Racial Profiling Policy

I. PURPOSE

The purpose of the policy is to reaffirm the Lamesa Police Department's commitment to unbiased policing in all its encounters between our officers and any person; to reinforce procedures that serve to ensure public confidence and mutual trust through the provision of services in a fair and equitable fashion; and to protect our officers from unwarranted accusations of misconduct when they act within the dictates of departmental policy and the law.

II. POLICY

It is the policy of this department to police in a proactive manner and to aggressively investigate suspected violations of law. Officers shall actively enforce state and federal laws in a responsible and professional manner, without regard to race, ethnicity or national origin. Officers are strictly prohibited from engaging in racial profiling as defined in this policy. This policy shall be applicable to all persons, whether drivers, passengers or pedestrians.

Officers shall conduct themselves in a dignified and respectful manner at all times when dealing with the public. Two of the fundamental rights guaranteed by both the United States and Texas Constitutions are equal protection under the law and freedom from unreasonable searches and seizures by government agents. The right of all persons to be treated equally and to be free from unreasonable searches and seizures must be respected. Racial profiling is an unacceptable patrol tactic and will not be condoned.

This policy shall not preclude officers from offering assistance to any person, nor does this policy prohibit stopping someone suspected of a crime based upon observed actions and/or information received about the person.

III. DEFINITIONS

Racial Profiling – A law enforcement-initiated action based on an individual's race, ethnicity, or national origin rather than on the individual's behavior or on information identifying the individual as having engaged in criminal activity.

Racial profiling pertains to persons who are viewed as suspects or potential suspects of criminal behavior. The term is not relevant as it pertains to witnesses, complainants or other citizen contacts.

The prohibition against racial profiling does not preclude the use of race, ethnicity or national origin as factors in a detention decision when used as part of an actual description of a specific suspect for whom an officer is searching. Detaining an individual and conducting an inquiry into that person's activities simply because of that individual's race, ethnicity or national origin is racial profiling. Examples of racial profiling include, but are not limited to, the following:

- 1. Citing a driver who is speeding in a stream of traffic where other drivers are speeding because of the cited driver's race, ethnicity or national origin.
- 2. Detaining the driver of a vehicle based on the determination that a person of that race, ethnicity or national origin is unlikely to own or possess that specific make or model of vehicle.
- 3. Detaining an individual based upon the determination that a person of that race, ethnicity or national origin does not belong in a specific part of town or a specific place.

A law enforcement agency can derive at least two principles from the adoption of this definition of racial profiling:

- 1. Police may not use racial or ethnic stereotypes as factors in selecting whom to stop and search, while police may use race in conjunction with other known factors of the suspect.
- 2. Law enforcement officers may not use racial or ethnic stereotypes as factors in selecting whom to stop and search. Racial profiling is not relevant as it pertains to witnesses, etc.

Race or Ethnicity – Of a particular descent, including Caucasian, African, Hispanic, Asian or Native American.

Pedestrian Stop- An interaction between a peace officer and an individual who is not operating a motorized vehicle and is being detained for the purpose of a criminal investigation in which the individual is not under arrest.

Traffic Stop- A peace officer who stops a motor vehicle for an alleged violation of a law or ordinance regulating traffic.

IV. TRAINING

Officers are responsible for adhering to all Texas Commission of Law Enforcement Officer Standards and Education (TCLEOSE) training and the Law Enforcement Management Institute of Texas (LEMIT) requirements as mandated by law.

All officers shall complete a TCLEOSE training and education program on racial profiling not later than the second anniversary of the date the officer is licensed under Chapter 1701 of the Texas Occupations Code or the date the officer applies for an intermediate proficiency certificate, whichever date is earlier. A person who on September 1, 2001, held a TCLEOSE intermediate proficiency certificate, or who had held a peace officer license issued by TCLEOSE for at least two years, shall complete a TCLEOSE training and education program on racial profiling not later than September 1, 2003.

The chief of police, as part of the initial training and continued education for such appointment, will be required to attend the LEMIT program on racial profiling.

An individual appointed or elected as a police chief before the effective date of this Act shall complete the program on racial profiling established under Subsection (j), Section 96.641, Education Code, as added by this Act, not later than September 1, 2003.

V. COMPLAINT INVESTIGATION

- 1. The department shall investigate all complaints from any person who believes he or she has been stopped or searched based on racial, ethnic or national origin profiling. No person shall be discouraged, intimidated or coerced from filing a complaint, nor discriminated against because he or she filed such a complaint.
- 2. Any employee who receives a complaint of racial profiling, including the officer who initiated the stop, shall record the person's name, address and telephone number, and forward the complaint through the appropriate channel, or instruct the individual as to the procedure for filing a complaint. Any employee contacted shall provide to that person a copy of a complaint form or instruct the person of the department process for filing a complaint. All employees will report any allegation of racial profiling to their superior before the end of their shift.
- 3. Investigation of a complaint shall be conducted in a thorough and timely manner. All complaints will be acknowledged in writing to the initiator, and the initiator will be informed of the disposition of the complaint within a reasonable period of time after the complaint is investigated. The investigation shall be documented in writing and any reviewer's comments or conclusions shall be filed with the police chief. When applicable, findings and /or suggestions for disciplinary action, retraining, or changes in policy shall be filed with the chief.
- 4. If a racial profiling complaint is sustained against an officer, it will result in appropriate corrective and/or disciplinary action, up to and including termination.
- 5. If a departmental video or audio recording of the events upon which a complaint of racial profiling is based exists, upon commencement of an investigation by this department into the complaint, the department shall promptly provide a copy of the recording to any officer or complaining party who shall make written request for such copy.

VI. PUBLIC EDUCATION

This department will inform the public of its policy against racial profiling and the complaint process. Methods that may be utilized to inform the public are the news media, radio, service or civic presentations, the Internet, as well as presentations at governing board meetings. Additionally, information will be made available as appropriate in languages other than English.

VII. CITATION DATA COLLECTION & REPORTING

An officer is required to collect information relating to traffic stops in which a citation is issued. On the citation officer must include:

- 1. the violators race or ethnicity;
- 2. whether a search was conducted;

- 3. whether the search was consensual; and
- 4. whether an arrest was made for this cited violation or any other violation.

By March 1 of each year, the department shall submit a report to it's governing board that includes the information gathered by the citations. The report will include:

- 1. a breakdown of citations by race or ethnicity;
- 2. number of citations that resulted in a search;
- 3. number of searches that were consensual; and
- 4. number of citations that resulted in custodial arrest for this cited violation or any other violation.

Not later than March 1st of each year, this department shall submit a report to our governing body containing this information from the preceding calendar year.

VIII. USE OF VIDEO AND AUDIO EQUIPMENT

Each motor vehicle regularly used by this department in making traffic and pedestrian stops shall be equipped with a video camera and transmitter-activated equipment.

Each traffic and pedestrian stop made by an officer of this department that is capable of being recorded by video and audio, or audio, as appropriate, shall be recorded.

This department shall retain the video and audiotapes of each traffic and pedestrian stop for at least ninety (90) days after the date of the stop. If a complaint is filed with this department alleging that one of our officers has engaged in racial profiling with respect to a traffic or pedestrian stop, this department shall retain the video and audiotapes, or the audiotape of the stop until final disposition of the complaint.

Supervisors will ensure officers of this department are recording their traffic and pedestrian stops. A recording of each officer will be reviewed at least one every ninety (90) days.

If the equipment used to record audio and/or video of traffic or pedestrian stops is malfunctioning or otherwise not operable, the officer shall record and report the following information:

- 1. A physical description of each person detained as a result of the stop, including:
 - a) The person's gender;
 - b) The person's race or ethnicity, as stated by the person or as determined by the officer to the best of his/her ability.
- 2. The street address or approximate location of the stop. The suspected offense or the traffic law or ordinance alleged to have been violated.
- 3. Whether the officer conducted a search as a result of the stop and, if so, whether the person detained consented to the search.
- 4. Whether probable cause to search existed and, if so, the fact(s) supporting the existence of that probable cause.

- 5. Whether any contraband was discovered in the course of the search and, if so, the type of contraband discovered.
- 6. Whether the officer made an arrest as a result of the stop and/or search, and, if so, a statement of the offense charged.
- 7. Whether the officer issued a warning or a citation as a result of the stop and, if so, a statement of the offense charges.

Informing the Public on the Process of Filing a Complaint with The Lamesa Police Department

(I) Educational Campaign:

In accordance to Senate Bill 1704, the Lamesa Police Department has made significant efforts to launch an educational campaign aimed at informing the public on issues relevant to the complaint process. Special emphasis has been placed on informing community members on filing a complaint relevant to racial profiling practices.

The command staff of the Lamesa Police Department has publicized the racial profiling complaint process in the Lamesa Press Reporter where community members have been informed on efforts being made by the police department to continue banning racial profiling practices among its officers.

(II) Filing a Complaint Based on Violations of the Texas Law on Racial Profiling

The following information has been distributed to residents of the city of Lamesa:

This department supports the 77th Texas Legislature's mandate prohibiting racial profiling in Texas. Our police officers work under a departmental policy that is consistent with all state and federal laws. The policy includes provisions for citizens to contact us if they have a conflict with a(n) Lamesa police officer.

The Lamesa Police Department realizes that there will be disagreements, from time to time, with individuals that come in contact with our officers. We realize that confusion, different perceptions or possibly the timeliness of information could result in information that may produce different accounts of the same incident. These disagreements between citizens and officers need to be addressed. We trust that the vast majority of contacts between citizens and officers are conducted in a positive, professional manner. The relationship between the community and our officers is based on confidence and trust. We cannot be effective without both the community and our officers working together to achieve this goal.

Citizens feeling that they have a legitimate concern may make a formal complaint to the Lamesa Police Department at any time by contacting any member of this department for

information on the complaint process. Additional information about this process may be obtained by calling us at (806)872-2121.

The Lamesa Police Department would like to know about positive police contacts. Please write the Chief a letter or note to let him or her know about a positive contact with our officers. Chief Dale E. Alwan, Sr. will let the officer know about your letter a copy will be placed in the officer's personnel folder.

We are very proud of the relationship the Lamesa Police Department shares with the community. Our longstanding goal is to provide our citizens with a safe community where all may live without the fear of crime.

Training

In compliance with the Texas Racial Profiling Law, the Lamesa Police Department has asked that all its officers adhere to all Texas Commission on Law Enforcement Officer Standards and Education (TCLEOSE) training and the Law Enforcement Management Institute of Texas (LEMIT) requirements as mandated by law.

All officers from the Lamesa Police Department have been asked to complete a TCLEOSE training and education program on racial profiling not later than the second anniversary of the date the officer is licensed under Chapter 1701 of the Texas Occupations Code or the date the officer applies for an intermediate proficiency certificate, whichever date is earlier. A person who on September 1, 2001, held a TCLEOSE intermediate proficiency certificate, or who had held a peace officer license issued by TCLEOSE for at least two years, will complete a TCLEOSE training and education program on racial profiling not later than September 1, 2003.

The chief of police, as part of the initial training and continued education for such appointment, attended the LEMIT program on racial profiling. This fulfills the training requirement as specified in the Education Code (96.641) of the Texas Racial Profiling Training law.

Corrective Action

It is the policy of the Lamesa Police Department that any officer who, after an internal investigation, has been found guilty of engaging in racial profiling, that one of the following series of disciplinary measures is taken (as per the recommendation of the chief of police):

- 1) Officer is retrained in racial sensitivity issues
- 2) Officer is suspended and as a condition of further involvement with the police department is asked to undergo racial sensitivity training
- 2) Officer is terminated

Data on Corrective Action

The following table contains data regarding officers that have been the subject of a complaint, during the time period of 1/1/16---12/31/16, based on allegations outlining possible violations related to the Texas Racial Profiling Law. The final disposition of the case is also included.

Analysis

The data presented in this report contains valuable information regarding police contacts with the public between 1/1/16 and 12/31/16. Despite its value, the raw data does not present much information relevant to racial profiling trends.

Thus, it is felt that further analysis of the data is warranted. As such, data was obtained through the Texas Department of Public Safety (DPS), via a public information request. The data obtained from DPS included the race and gender of drivers in the city of Lamesa during the 2016 calendar year. The decision to obtain DPS data was made since, according to experts, census data presents challenges to any effort made at establishing a fair and accurate analysis. That is, census data contains information of all residents of a particular community, regardless of the fact they may or may not be among the driving population. Further, census data, when used as a benchmark of comparison, presents the challenge that it captures information related to city residents only. Thus, excluding individuals who may have come in contact with the Lamesa Police Department, but reside outside city limits. This has a tendency of inflating the overall figures; thus, providing an inaccurate representation of police contacts with the public. Therefore, it is felt that DPS data relevant to city residents, if compared only to the portion of individuals who reside in the city of Lamesa and have come in contact with the police during a given year, will offer a more accurate representation and provide further insights than other sources including census data.

When comparing the city residents who came in contact with the Lamesa Police Department during 2016 with those who, according to DPS, were residents of the city during that time and held a valid driver's license, the data produced interesting findings. That is, the number of police contacts with White drivers, when compared to the number of White city residents who held a valid drivers license, demonstrated that the number of contacts with the police were under-represented. It must be noted that Hispanics were grouped with Caucasians for purposes of this analysis since DPS does not collect information related to the ethnicity of drivers. In fact, according to their own language, DPS considers Hispanics, in their data collection process, as Caucasians.

Summary Statement

The findings suggest that the Lamesa Police Department does not currently experience a problem regarding racial profiling practices. This is supported by the fact that it has not received complaints from community members regarding officers misconduct associated with racial profiling practices.

The continuing effort to collect police contact data will assure an on-going evaluation of the Lamesa Police Department practices. Thus, allowing for the citizens of the Lamesa community to benefit from professional and courteous service from their police department.
