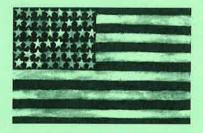

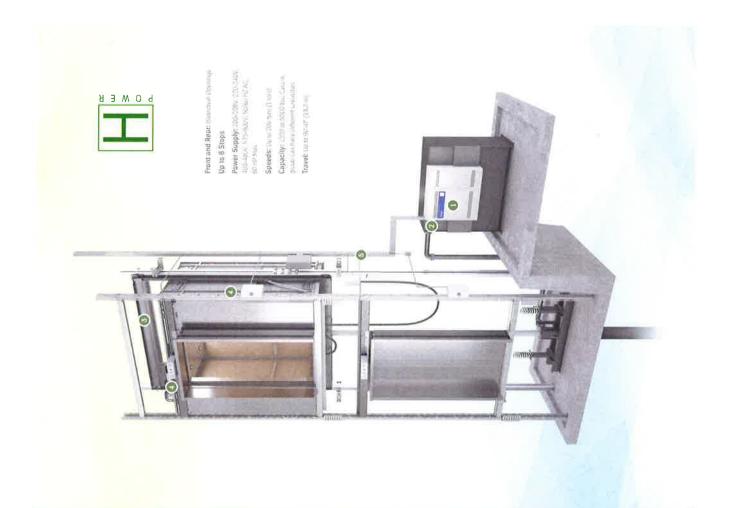

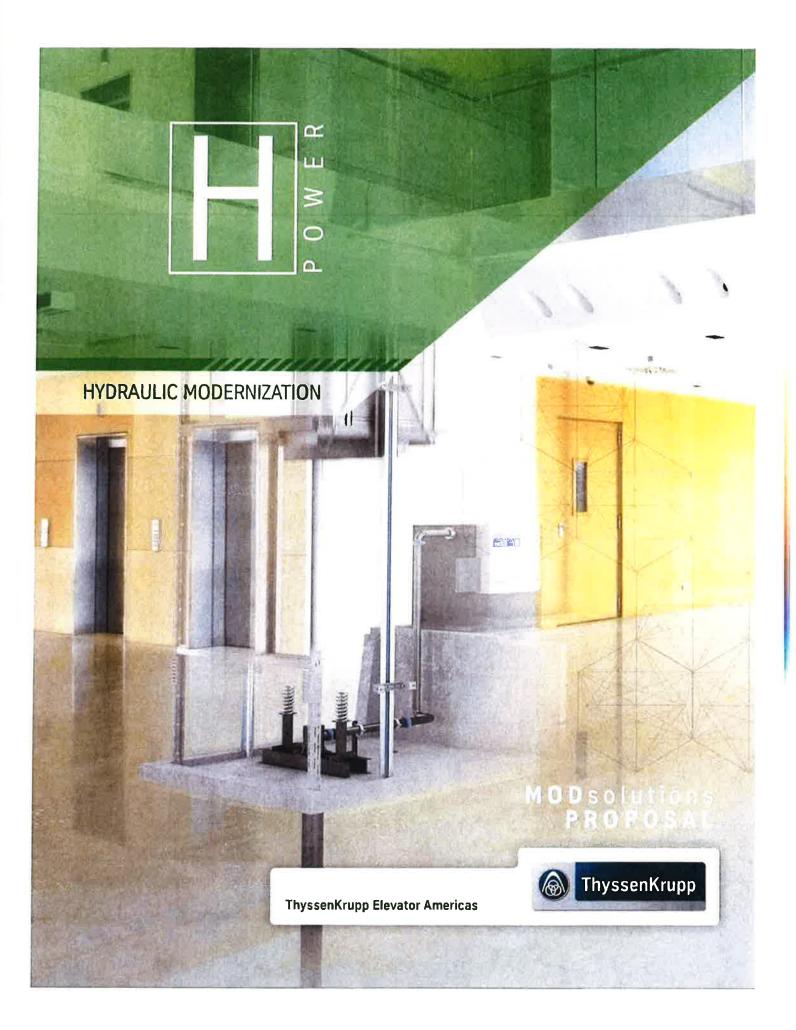

- b. the wiring to the controller for car lighting per N.E.C. Articles 620-22 and 620-51;
- c. a means to automatically disconnect the main line and the emergency power supply to the elevator prior to the application of water in the elevator machine room that shall not be self-resetting;
- d. wiring and conduit from life safety panel or any other monitor station to the elevator machine room or a suitable connection point in hoistway;
- e. a bonded ground wire, properly sized, from the elevator controller(s) to the primary building ground; and all remote wiring to the outside alarm bell as requested by all applicable code provisions
- f. a dry set of contacts which close 20 seconds prior to the transfer from normal power to emergency power or from emergency power to normal power whether in test mode or normal operating conditions in the event that an emergency power supply will be provided for the elevator;

If there is more than one unit that is the subject of this Proposal, final payment shall be made separately as each unit is completed.

ThyssenKrupp Elevator makes no warranty of merchantability and no warranties which extend beyond the description in this Proposal, nor are there any other warranties, expressed or implied, by operation of law or otherwise. Like any piece of fine machinery, this equipment should be periodically inspected, lubricated, and adjusted by competent personnel. This warranty is not intended to supplant normal maintenance service and shall not be construed to mean that ThyssenKrupp Elevator will provide free service for periodic examination, lubrication, or adjustment, nor will ThyssenKrupp Elevator correct, without a charge, breakage, maladjustments, or other trouble arising from normal wear and tear or abuse, misuse, improper or inadequate maintenance, or any other causes other than defective material or workmanship. In order to make a warranty claim, Purchaser must give ThyssenKrupp Elevator prompt written notice at the address listed on the cover page of this Proposal and provided all payments due under the terms of this Proposal and any mutually agreed to written change orders have been made in full, ThyssenKrupp Elevator shall, at its own

In the event ThyssenKrupp Elevator's employees, or those of its subcontractors, are exposed to an asbestos hazard, PCB's or other hazardous substances resulting from work of individuals other than ThyssenKrupp Elevator or its subcontractors, Purchaser agrees to indemnify, defend, and hold ThyssenKrupp Elevator harmless from any and all claims, demands, lawsuits, and proceedings brought against ThyssenKrupp Elevator or its employees or subcontractors resulting from such exposure. Purchaser recognizes that its obligation to ThyssenKrupp Elevator under this clause includes payment of all attorneys' fees, court costs, judgments, settlements, interest and any other expenses of litigation arising out of such claims or lawsuits. Removal and disposal of asbestos containing material is solely Purchaser's responsibility.

Miscellaneous:

This Proposal does not include any maintenance, service or repair of the equipment or any other work not expressly described herein. ThyssenKrupp Elevator will submit a separate proposal to Purchaser covering the maintenance and repair of this equipment to be supplied to Purchaser at an additional cost.

ThyssenKrupp Elevator's performance of this Proposal is contingent upon Purchaser furnishing ThyssenKrupp Elevator with any necessary permission or priority required under the terms and conditions of any and all government regulations affecting the acceptance of this Proposal or the manufacture, delivery or installation of any equipment described in this Proposal

Purchaser shall bear all cost(s) for any re-inspection of Thyssen Krupp Elevator's work due to items outside the scope of this Proposal or for any inspection arising from the work of other trades requiring the assistance of ThyssenKrupp Elevator.

If any drawings, illustrations or other descriptive materials were furnished in conjunction with this Proposal, they were intended solely as approximations and to illustrate the general style and arrangement of equipment being offered and should, under no circumstances, be relied upon for their accuracy.

Unless otherwise agreed, it is understood that the work described above will be performed during regular working hours of the trades involved. If overtime is mutually agreed upon, an additional charge at ThyssenKrupp Elevator's usual rates for such work shall be added to the price of this Proposal.

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS:

THAT THIS IS EVIDENCE IN WRITING of an agreement this day entered into by and between the CITY OF LAMESA, a municipal corporation organized and existing under and by virtue of the laws of the State of Texas, hereinafter called City, and the LAMESA INDEPENDENT SCHOOL DISTRICT, a political subdivision of the State of Texas, hereinafter called School District.

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the School District in cooperation with the City join together in this agreement to provide a safe orderly environment free from the temptation and threat of drugs and violence; and

WHEREAS, the School District seeks assistance from law enforcement authorities to monitor and prevent unlawful drugs and drug related activity; and

WHEREAS, the School District recognizes the value of the presence of uniformed officers at each campus; and

WHEREAS, Section 21.308(a) of the Education Code provides that the governing board of any school district may employ security personnel for use in any school within its district when the board in its discretion determines that the personnel are necessary; and

WHEREAS, the School District and the City would like to employ the services of a full-time officer for said purposes; and

WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of the public health and welfare of the people of the respective jurisdiction to have such security services available in the schools of this community.

NOW, THEREFORE, the City and School District, acting herein by and through their respective governing bodies, agree as follows:

1.

As used in this agreement:

- (a) "Police department" shall be the police department of the City of Lamesa, Texas.
- (b) "Peace officer" shall be a commissioned police officer of the Lamesa Police Department but employed by the Lamesa Independent School District to be assigned as a Student Resource Officer.
- (c) "Security services" shall be specified security services performed by the police department of the City on behalf of the School District.

2.

The city agrees to commissioned a peace officer to perform such duties as are allowed by a school district peace officer under Section 21.483 of the Education Code; to perform administrative and law enforcement duties for the school district as determined by the board of trustees; and to protect the safety and welfare of any person in the jurisdiction of the peace officer and the property, both real and personal, of the school district.

The City agrees to make available to the School District said peace officer on the terms and conditions hereinafter set out:

- (a) the peace officer will be and shall remain an employee of the School District, and shall work under the direction of the Police Department while performing the duties involving criminal matters under this agreement;
- (b) selection of the peace officer to provide said security services will be by mutual consent of the School District and the City. The peace officer will meet the employment standards of the City, the State certification standards for peace officer, and any additional professional, educational or certification standards as may be required by the School District;
- (c) the peace officer will abide by the School District's and the Police Department's rules and regulations;
- (d) the peace officer will attend staff development education and training programs and activities as deemed necessary by the School District and the City subject to other limitations contained in this agreement;
- (e) the peace officer will be responsible for presenting educational programs on drug education when requested by the School District;
- (f) the peace officer will visit all campuses of the School District on a regular basis;
- (g) the peace officer shall inform the Lamesa Police Department of any criminal activity and/or investigations that occur in the School District. The peace officer will enter cal sheets and reports into the Police Department records management system during the course of his daily duties
- (h) it is understood that the peace officer has the powers, privileges, and immunities of a peace officer; and that said officer may enforce all laws, including municipal ordinances and state laws; and may, in accordance with Chapter 52.01(a), Family Code, take a juvenile into custody;
- (i) the peace officer may provide assistance to the Police Department or to another law enforcement agency if requested by the Police Department or other law enforcement agency; and
- (j) the City Manager of the City and the Superintendent of the School District may enter into a memorandum of understanding that outlines reasonable communication and coordination efforts to effect the provision of such services provided in this agreement; and it is understood that said memorandum shall be incorporated by reference as part of this agreement.

4.

The term of this agreement shall commence on August 01, 2018, or upon approval of this agreement by both parties and selection of the designated officer, and shall automatically terminate at 12 midnight on July 31, 2019, with no further notice to either party hereto required.

5.

The School District agrees to pay to the City the sum of \$5,500.00 upon execution of this agreement to assist in the cost of, and to allow access to the Student Resource Officer to, the records management system used by the Lamesa Police Department.

6.

It is expressly understood and agreed by and between the parties hereto that the security services hereinabove provided shall not include the provision of additional peace officers for security services at events sponsored or conducted by the School District. Such security services requiring additional personnel shall be provided at a compensation rate set by the City.

It is agreed that the School District and the City each shall maintain liability insurance that will cover any claim, cause of action, or suit for damage to the maximum limits under the Texas Tort Claims Act as it now exists and as it may be amended from time to time.

8.

It is expressly understood and agreed by and between the parties hereto that the operation of the City's Police Department, its equipment and personnel, and the manner of its operation shall at all times be under the discretion of the City.

9.

It is specifically understood that any dispute over technical or policy issues relating to the terms of this agreement that may occur during the term of this agreement, shall be resolved by mutual consent of the City Manager of the City and the Superintendent of the School District. Any such resolution shall be committed to written form, distributed to the City Council of the City and the School Board of the School District, and included as an attachment to this agreement.

10.

Notwithstanding any other provision herein regarding the term of this agreement, either party hereto shall have the right to terminate this agreement upon thirty (30) days written notice to the other party. In the event of such termination, neither party hereto shall have any further obligation hereunder.

11.

It is specifically understood that in the event that any section, subsection, sentence, clause or phrase of this agreement is, for any reason, held to be invalid, such holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this agreement.

12.

The provisions of the agreement are to be cumulative and all other contracts, agreements, or parts of contracts or agreements, whether written or oral, governing or regulating the same subject matter as that covered herein are hereby expressly repealed.

13.

This agreement contains the entire agreement. There are no other agreements, oral or written, and the terms of this agreement can be amended only by written agreement signed and ratified by both parties or as otherwise provided herein.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

- 1. A membership includes all members of an immediate family residing in the home of the member parent.
 - a) Exception to rule #1: an offspring who is twenty-one years of age or older is not covered by this rule regardless of his/her place of residence or his/her marital status.
 - b) Exception to the exception: An unmarried college student whose home residence is with a parent member is exempt from the twenty-one (21) rule.
- 2. Monthly membership dues are \$60.00 plus \$2.00 mailing fee. If member signs a bank draft form with the City, then the \$2.00 fee will be waived.
- 3. Yearly cart fee for member/non-member is \$70.00 per cart.
- 4. Green rental fees- Weekday 9 or 18 holes - \$15.00 Weekends & Holidays-9 or 18 holes is \$20.00 Cart Fees 9 holes \$7.50 18 holes \$20.00
- Members with cart sheds and have a golf cart will be charged \$10.00 for electricity.
 Members who owned more than one shed but not occupied will not be charged.
- a) Any active member in good standing may use or borrow a golf cart of another member in good standing
 - b) A non-member may use a golf cart of an active member in good standing.
- A membership that is more than two (2) but not more than three (3) months in arrears may become current by paying the amount of arrears plus \$5.00 per month penalty for the number of months in arrears. (This rule applies to membership, cart fees, and electricity)
- 8. A member more than three months in arrears is automatically terminated.
- 9. A membership that cancels his membership and then wants to join again must pay the unpaid balance and any back pay within twelve months.
- 10. There are no inactive memberships, unless due to serious illness or accident, major surgery and will be out for three (3) months and approved by the City Manager.

- 11. Players twelve (12) years of age or under must be accompanied by an Adult. Children of members and non-members are covered by this rule.

- 5 Members with cart sheds and have a golf cart will be charged \$10.00 for electricity. Members who owned more than one shed but are unoccupied will not be charged.
- 6 a) Any active member in good standing may use or borrow a golf cart of another member in good standing
 - b) A non-member may use a golf cart of an active member in good standing.
- 7. A membership that is more than two but not more than three months in arrears may become current by paying the amount of arrears plus \$5.00 per month penalty for the number of months in arrears. (This rule applies to membership, cart fees, and electricity.)
- 8. A membership more than three months in arrears is automatically terminated. A person who has a membership terminated has one year waiting period before that person will be considered for membership by the City Golf Course Manager and City Manager.

Commented [CS1]: DELETED

- A member that cancels his membership and then wants to- join again, must pay the unpaid balance and any back pay within twelve months.
- There are no inactive memberships, unless due to serious illness or accident, major surgery and will be out for 3 months and approved by the City Manager.

Commented [CS2]: ADDED

- Players twelve years of age or under must be accompanied by an adult. Children of members and non-members are covered by this rule.
- 12. Each player must sign in and have a set of golf clubs and bag.
- All play begins at No. 1 tee box unless permission by Golf Superintendent.
- 14. Practice green is to be used for short chipping and putting only. Regular greens are <u>NOT</u> to be used for practice at any time.
- 15. Players should repair all ball marks, repair divots and rake Sand traps
- 16. All carts must observe 90-degree rule.
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- 18. Soft spikes or tennis shoes only
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- 20. Slow players must allow faster players to play through.
- 21. Proper golf clothing required at all times. (no cut offs, tank tops, boots)
- 22. Non-members who own a cart shed with a cart are required to pay a ten-dollar monthly fee. Non-members who own a shed without a cart do not pay a fee.
- The Lamesa Municipal Golf Advisory Board may modify or amend rules as deemed necessary.
- **All members need to respect course and take_care_-of_our course, and we are doing everything we can to make it a nice golf course.
