Since January 1, 2002, the Lamesa Police Department in accordance with the Texas Racial Profiling Law (S.B. No. 1074), has been collecting police contact data for the purpose of identify and responding (if necessary) to concerns regarding racial profiling practices. It is my hope that the findings provided in this report will serve as evidence that the Lamesa Police Department continues to strive towards the goal of maintaining strong relations with the community.

In this report, the reader will encounter several sections designed at providing background information on the rationale and objectives of the Texas Racial Profiling Law. Other sections contain information relevant to the institutional policies adopted by the Lamesa Police Department banishing the practice of racial profiling among its officers.

The final components of this report provide statistical data relevant to the public contacts made during the period of 1/1/18 and 12/31/18. This information has been analyzed and compared to the Department of Public Safety data on motorists residing in the Dawson County area. The analysis of the data and recommendations for future areas of research are also included. It is my sincere hope that the channels of communication between community leaders and the Lamesa Police Department continue to strengthen as we move forward to meet the challenges of the near future.

The purpose of the policy is to reaffirm the Lamesa Police Department's commitment to unbiased policing in all its encounters between officer and any person; to reinforce procedures that serve to ensure public confidence and mutual trust through the provision of services in a fair and equitable fashion; and to protect our officers from unwarranted accusations of misconduct when they act within the dictates of departmental policy and the law.

### POLICY:

It is the policy of this department to police in a proactive manner and to aggressively investigate suspected violations of law. Officers shall actively enforce state and federal laws in a responsible and professional manner without regard to race, ethnicity or national origin. Officers shall conduct themselves in a dignified and respectful manner at all times when dealing with the public. Two of the fundamental rights guaranteed by both the United States and Texas Constitutions are equal protection under the law and freedom unreasonable searches and seizures by government agents. The rights of all persons to be treated equally and to be free from unreasonable searches and seizures must be respected. Racial profiling is an unacceptable patrol tactic and will not be condoned. This policy shall not preclude officers from offering assistance, such as upon observing a substance leaking from a vehicle, a flat tire, or someone who appears to be ill, lost or confused. Nor does this policy prohibit stopping someone suspected of a crime based upon observed actions and/or information received about the person.

## **DEFINITIONS:**

Racial Profiling – A law enforcement initiated action based on an individual's race, ethnicity, or national origin rather than on the individual's behavior or on information identifying the individual as having engaged in a criminal activity.

Racial profiling pertains to persons who are viewed as suspects or potential suspects of criminal behavior. The term is not relevant as it pertains to witnesses, complainants or other citizen contacts.

The prohibition against racial profiling does not preclude the use of race, ethnicity or national origin in a detention decision. Race, ethnicity or national origin may be legitimate factors in a detention decision when used as part of an actual description of a specific suspect for whom an officer is scarching. Detaining an individual and conducting an inquiry into that person's activities simply because of that individual's race, ethnicity or national origin is racial profiling. Examples of racial profiling include but are not limited to the following:

- Citing a driver who is speeding in a stream of traffic where most other drivers are speeding because of the cited driver's race, ethnicity or national origin.
- Detaining the driver of a vehicle based on the determination that a person of that race, ethnicity or national origin is unlikely to own or possess that specific make or model of vehicle.
- Detaining an individual based upon the determination that a person of that race, ethnicity or national origin does not belong in a specific part of town or a specific place.

Race or Ethnicity - Of a particular descent, including Caucasian, African, Hispanic, Asian, or Native American.

**Pedestrian Stop** – An interaction between a peace officer and an individual who is being detained for the purpose of a criminal investigation in which the individual is not under arrest.

**Traffic Stop** - A peace officer who stops a motor vehicle for an alleged violation of a law or ordinance regulating traffic.

#### **TRAINING**

Officers are responsible to adhere to all Texas Commission on Law Enforcement Officer Standards and Education (TCLEOSE) training and the Law Enforcement Management Institute of Texas (LEMIT) requirements as mandated by law.

All officers shall complete a TCLEOSE training and education program on racial profiling not later than the second anniversary of the date the officer is licensed under Chapter 1701 of the Texas Occupations Code or the date the officer applies for an intermediate proficiency certificate. whichever date is earlier. A person who, on September 1, 2001, held a TCLEOSE intermediate proficiency certificate, or who had held a peace officer license issued by TCLEOSE for at least two years, shall complete a TCLEOSE training and education program on racial profiling not later than September 1, 2003.

The Chief of Police shall complete the LEMIT program on racial profiling established under Subsection (j), Section 96.641, Education Code, as added by this act, not later than September 1, 2003.

#### COMPLAINT INVESTIGATION

The department shall accept complaints from any person who believes he or she has been stopped or searched based on racial, ethnic or national origin profiling. No person shall be discouraged, intimidated or coerced from filing a complaint, nor discriminated against because he or she filed such a complaint.

- Any employee who receives an allegation of racial profiling, including the officer who initiated the stop, shall record the person's name, address and telephone number, and forward complaint information through the department's chain of command. Any employee contacted shall provide to that person a brochure detailing the department's process for filing a complaint. employees will report anv allegation of racial profiling to their supervisor before the end of their shift.
- Investigation of a complaint shall be conducted in a thorough and timely manner. All complaints will be acknowledged in writing to the initiator who will receive disposition regarding said complaint within a reasonable period of time. The investigation shall be reduced to writing and any reviewer's comments or conclusions shall be filed with the Chief of Police.
- If a racial profiling complaint is sustained against an officer, it will result in appropriate corrective and/or disciplinary action, up to and including termination.
- If there is a departmental video or audio recording of the events upon which a complaint of racial profiling is based, upon commencement of an investigation by this department into the complaint and written request of the officer made the subject of the complaint, this department shall promptly provide a copy of the recording to that officer.

### PUBLIC EDUCATION

This department will inform the public of its policy against racial profiling and the complaint process. Methods that may be utilized to inform the public are the news media, radio, service or civic presentations, the Internet, as well as Lamesa City Commission meetings. Additionally, information will be made available as appropriate in languages other than English.

## CITATION DATA COLLECTION & REPORTING

An officer is required to collect information relating to traffic stops in which a citation is issued. In the citation officers must include:

- The violators race or ethnicity;
- Whether a search was conducted
- Was the search consensual; and
- Arrest for this cited violation or any other violation.

By March of each year, the department shall submit a report to the Lamesa City Commission that includes the information gathered by the citations. The report will include:

- A breakdown of citations by race or ethnicity;
- Number of citations that resulted in a search;
- Number of searches that were consensual; and
- Number of citations that resulted in custodial arrest for this cited violation or any other violation.

Not later than March 1st of each year, this department shall submit a report to the Lamesa City Commission containing this information from the preceding calendar year.

## **USE OF VIDEO AND AUDIO EQUIPMENT**

Each motor vehicle regularly used by this department to make traffic and pedestrian stops is equipped with a video camera and transmitter-activated equipment, and each motorcycle regularly used by this department to make traffic and pedestrian stops is equipped with transmitter-activated equipment; and

Each traffic and pedestrian stop made by an officer of this department that is capable of being recorded by video and audio, or audio, as appropriate, is recorded. This department shall retain the video and audiotapes, or the audiotapes of each traffic and pedestrian stop for at least (90) days after the date of the stop. If a complaint is filed with this department alleging that one of our officers has engaged in racial profiling with respect to a traffic or pedestrian stop, this department shall retain the video and audiotapes, or the audiotape of the stop until final disposition of the complaint. Supervisors will ensure officers of this department are recording their traffic and pedestrian stops. A recording of each officer will be reviewed at least once every (90) days.

If the equipment used to record audio and/or video of traffic or pedestrian stops is malfunctioning or otherwise not operable, the officer making the stop may properly record and report the information as required.

- 4.) provides public education relating to the agency's complaint process;
- 5) requires appropriate corrective action to be taken against a peace officer employed by the Lamesa Police Department who, after an investigation, is shown to have engaged in racial profiling in violation of the Lamesa Police Department's policy adopted under this article;
- 6.) require collection of information relating to motor vehicle stops in which a citation is issued and to arrests made as a result of those stops, including information relating to:
  - a.) the race or ethnicity of the individual detained;
  - b.) whether a search was conducted and, if so, whether the individual detained consented to the search; and
  - c.) whether the peace officer knew the race or ethnicity of the individual detained before

detaining that individual; and

- 7.) require the chief administrator of the agency, regardless of whether the administrator is elected, employed, or appointed, to submit an annual report of the information collected under Subdivision(6) to:
  - a.) the Commission on Law Enforcement; and
  - b.) the governing body of each county or municipality served by the agency, if the agency is an agency of a county, municipality, or other political subdivision of the state.

Good afternoon Mr. Chapman,

Thank you for meeting with Leland today, we're really excited about the prospect of working with you!

Leland asked me to send you sample contracts to review with your City Attorney. Per his instructions, I'm attaching the accounts receivable contract in this email and will send a separate court fines & fees contract to Judge Dimas in a separate email. Please let me know of any changes or modifications that you or your attorney wish to make.

He also indicated there were a few AR questions that I might be able to clarify:

- How does MVBA take out our fee? We send you all funds weekly provided we have collected in that week along with a detailed invoice identifying the customer, account number, amount paid to either us or the City in separate columns, and the fee amount due. The City would only remit our fee back monthly. Statements are generated monthly. We remit to you via ACH deposit or send a paper check, per the City's preferences. \*If you prefer we can net our fee out before sending funds, this works fine with AR because unlike court, there are generally no fees added or balance adjustments. We don't advise this methodology for court fines and fees, we always want to send the court all monies collected. With court, we are able to use a GL report from your Incode court software that allows us to match our fee to the penny ensuring we always match what your system has allocated ensuring no discrepancies\*
- **Do we mail notices?** Yes, MVBA sends all letters and makes phone calls. All costs associated with the collection process is incurred by MVBA. We work on a contingency basis and do not charge our fee unless money is collected.
- Are there any value add services we can provide for AR? We're always looking for ways to enhance efficiencies and provide value added services. We pride ourselves on open communication and collaboration with our clients through our personal service business model. In the past we have been able to assist clients by utilizing our telephony technology to get public service announcements out, i.e., water restrictions, we can also help by sending reminder messages on your behalf for delinquent accounts and/or cut-off dates approaching. We're open to any ideas that you might have where we can assist you!

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# CONTRACT FOR THE COLLECTION OF DELINQUENT ACCOUNTS RECEIVABLE

STATE OF TEXAS

COUNTY OF DAWSON

THIS CONTRACT is made and entered into by and between the CITY OF LAMESA, TEXAS, acting herein by and through its governing body, hereinafter styled, "City", and MVBA, LLC dba McCREARY, VESELKA, BRAGG AND ALLEN, LLC, hereinafter styled "MVBA".

I.

The City agrees to retain and does hereby retain MVBA to provide services related to the collection of delinquent accounts receivable, including but not limited to delinquent utility bills; and the cost incurred by the City or authorized by the City Code to be imposed by the City to bring any property into compliance with the City Code including, assessments for the mowing of vacant lots, removal of trash and debris from vacant lots, demolition of substandard structures and abatement of other nuisances by the City ("Delinquent Accounts Receivable") pursuant to the terms and conditions described herein. Legal services shall include but not be limited to recommendations and legal advice to the City to take legal enforcement action; representing the City in any dispute or legal challenge to authority to collect such delinquent accounts receivable; defending the City in litigation or challenges of its collection authority; and representing the City in collection interests in bankruptcy matters as determined by MVBA or the City. The City further authorizes MVBA to execute all legal documents that are reasonably necessary to pursue collection of the City's claims in connection with the collection of delinquent accounts receivable that are subject to this contract. This contract supersedes all prior oral and written contracts between the parties regarding delinquent accounts receivable, and can only be amended if done so in writing and signed by all parties. Furthermore, this contract cannot be transferred or assigned by either party without the written consent of all parties.

II.

For purposes of this contract Delinquent Accounts Receivable shall be considered delinquent and referred to MVBA when not timely paid in accordance with any applicable contract, ordinance or statute providing for the payment of the underlying debt.

At least once each month on a date or dates agreed upon by the parties, the City will provide MVBA with copies of, or access to, the information and documentation necessary to collect the Delinquent Accounts Receivable that are subject to this contract. The City shall furnish the information to MVBA by electronic transmission, magnetic medium.

MVBA shall forward to the City copies of any correspondence regarding a disputed debt received from a debtor and the request for verification of the debt. The City will provide to MVBA within ten (10) days of the receipt for the request for verification of the debt, copies of all records which will verify the debt which in turn will be forwarded to the debtor by MVBA. All collection activity will be suspended on any disputed debt until the appropriate verification of the debt is delivered to the debtor.

#### IV.

Upon consultation and agreement by both parties hereto, MVBA may institute civil legal proceedings, including seeking writs of execution to collect Delinquent Accounts Receivable. The City shall pay in advance of the initiation of any writ of execution or collection lawsuit any filing fees charged by the Court or Clerk of the Court in which the writ of execution is to be issued or the collection lawsuit is to be filed including the costs for service of citation. MVBA may also, after consultation and agreement by both parties, file proofs of claims in the United States Bankruptcy Court on behalf of the City.

#### V.

MVBA shall forward all cashier checks or money order payments made payable to the City and any correspondence from debtor directly to the City. Cashier checks or money order payments made payable to MVBA will be deposited daily into the MVBA Trust Account. MVBA may also collect the amount due from the debtor by credit card or electronic draft which is deposited directly into the MVBA Trust Account. MVBA may set up payment arrangements and accept partial payments on any delinquent accounts receivable. MVBA shall remit to the City all payments in full received into the MVBA Trust Account weekly, along with an invoice detailing the account number, name of debtor, amount paid to MVBA or City, MVBA fee percentage and fees earned for each account.

#### VI.

MVBA shall indemnify and hold the City harmless from and against all liabilities, losses and/or costs arising from claims for damages, or suits for losses or damages, including reasonable costs and attorney's fees, which may arise as a result of MVBA's performance of the services described in this Contract. The indemnity provision of this Contract shall have no application to any claim or demand which results from the sole negligence or fault of the City, its officers, agents, employees or contractors. And furthermore, in the event of joint and/or shared negligence or fault of the City and MVBA, responsibility and indemnity, if any, shall be apportioned in accordance with Texas law and without waiving any defenses of either party. The provisions of this paragraph are intended for the sole benefit of the parties hereto and are not intended to create or grant any right, contractual or otherwise, to any other persons or entities.

For the collection of Delinquent Accounts Receivable in which the data files are transmitted to MVBA by electronic media, the City agrees to pay to MVBA as compensation for services provided, pursuant to this contract, a fee of twenty percent (20%) of the amount of the Delinquent Accounts Receivable collected.

All compensation shall become the property of MVBA at the time of payment. The City shall pay to MVBA said compensation on a monthly basis by check.

#### VIII.

The City recognizes and acknowledges that MVBA owns all right, title and interest in certain proprietary software that MVBA may utilize in conjunction with performing the services provided in the contract. The City agrees and hereby grants to MVBA the right to use and incorporate any information provided by the City ("account or debtor information") to update the databases in this proprietary software, and, notwithstanding that the case or defendant information has been or shall be used to update the databases in this proprietary software, further stipulates and agrees that the City shall have no rights or ownership whatsoever in and to the software or the data contained therein, except that the City shall be entitled to obtain a copy of such data that directly relates to the City's accounts at any time.

MVBA agrees that it will not share or disclose any specific confidential account or debtor information with any other company, individual, organization or agency, without the prior written consent of the City, except as may be required by law or where such information is otherwise publicly available. It is agreed that MVBA shall have the right to use account or debtor information for internal analysis, improving the proprietary software and database, and generating aggregate data and statistics that may inherently contain account or debtor information. These aggregate statistics are owned solely by MVBA and will generally be used internally, but may be shared with MVBA's affiliates, partners or other third parties for purposes of improving MVBA's software and services.

MVBA reserves the right to return to the City all accounts not collected within one (1) year of referral by the City, or identified as being in bankruptcy. Upon return of these accounts, neither party will have any obligation to the other party to this contract.

#### IX.

The initial term of this contract is three years, beginning on the first day of the month following the execution of this contract by both parties, and shall automatically renew on the anniversary date and continue in full force and effect thereafter from year to year for additional twelve month periods on the same terms and conditions unless either party delivers written "Notice of Termination of Contract" to the other party of its intent to terminate this contract at least sixty (60) days prior to each anniversary date of this contract.

In the event that the City terminates this contract, MVBA shall be entitled to continue its collection activity on all accounts previously referred to MVBA for six (6) months from the date of receipt of the "Notice of Termination of Contract" and to payment of its fee, pursuant to Paragraph VII of this contract for all amounts collected on accounts referred to MVBA. The City may, at its discretion, refer additional accounts to MVBA after notice of termination has been received by MVBA. At the end of the six (6) month period, all accounts shall be returned to the City by MVBA.

## **Interlocal Agreement**

MVBA agrees to extend prices and terms to all entities who have entered or will enter into joint purchasing interlocal cooperation agreement(s) with the City.

X.

XI.

This contract is made and is to be interpreted under the laws of the State of Texas. Exclusive venue for any action, lawsuit, claim, dispute or another legal proceeding concerning or arising out of this contract shall be in Dawson County, Texas.

In the event that any provision(s) of this contract shall for any reason be held invalid or unenforceable, the invalidity or unenforceability of that provision(s) shall not affect any other provision(s) of this contract, and it shall further be construed as if the invalid or unenforceable provision(s) had never been a part of this contract.

### XII.

In consideration of the terms and compensation herein stated, MVBA hereby agrees to undertake performance of said contract as set forth above.

The City has authorized by order heretofore passed and duly recorded in its minutes the chief executive officer to execute this contract.

# CONTRACT FOR COLLECTION OF DELINQUENT MUNICIPAL COURT FINES AND FEES

STATE OF TEXAS

COUNTY OF DAWSON

THIS CONTRACT is made and entered into by and between the CITY OF LAMESA, TEXAS, acting herein by and through its governing body, hereinafter styled, "City", and McCREARY, VESELKA, BRAGG AND ALLEN, P.C., hereinafter styled "MVBA".

L

The City agrees to retain and does hereby retain MVBA to provide specific legal services provided herein and enforce the collection of delinquent municipal court fines, fees, court costs, restitution, debts and accounts receivable and other amounts in accordance with Article 103.0031, Texas Code of Criminal Procedure (hereinafter referred to in the agreement as "Fines and Fees") pursuant to the terms and conditions described herein. Legal services shall include but not be limited to recommendations and legal advice to the City to take legal enforcement action; representing the City in any dispute or legal challenge to authority to collect such court fees and fines; defending the City in litigation or challenges of its collection authority; and representing the City in collection interests in bankruptcy matters as determined by MVBA or the City. The City further authorizes MVBA to execute all legal documents that are reasonably necessary to pursue collection of the City's claims in connection with the collection of fines and fees that are subject to this contract. This contract supersedes all prior oral and written contracts between the parties regarding court fees and fines, and can only be amended if done so in writing and signed by all parties. Furthermore, this contract cannot be transferred or assigned by either party without the written consent of all parties.

II.

For purposes of this contract all Fines and Fees shall be referred to MVBA when determined to be delinquent as provided for in Article 103.0031, Code of Criminal Procedure.

At least once each month on a date or dates agreed upon by the parties, the City will provide MVBA with copies of, or access to, the information and documentation necessary to collect the Fines and Fees that are subject to this contract. The City shall furnish the information to MVBA by electronic transmission or magnetic medium.

MVBA shall forward to the City all cashier's checks or money orders received by MVBA made payable to the City and any correspondence from defendants. Cashier's checks or money orders received by MVBA which are made payable to MVBA will be deposited daily into the MVBA Trust Account. MVBA may collect the amount due from the defendant by credit card or electronic draft which funds shall be deposited into the MVBA Trust Account. MVBA shall remit to the City, weekly, all funds deposited into the MVBA Trust Account which pay the entire balance of a fines and fees account, along with an invoice detailing the docket number, name of defendant, amount paid by the defendant to MVBA or directly to the City and the MVBA fee percentage and fees earned for each case. The remittance from MVBA to the City shall include the fees earned by MVBA on the fines and fees collected. The City shall be responsible for the posting to the records of the City the payment of all fines and fees and accounts receivable collected pursuant to this contract.

#### IV.

MVBA shall indemnify and hold the City harmless from and against all liabilities, losses and/or costs arising from claims for damages, or suits for losses or damages, including reasonable costs and attorney's fees, which may arise as a result of MVBA's performance of the services described in this Contract. The indemnity provision of this Contract shall have no application to any claim or demand which results from the sole negligence or fault of the City, its officers, agents, employees or contractors. And furthermore, in the event of joint and/or shared negligence or fault of the City and MVBA, responsibility and indemnity, if any, shall be apportioned in accordance with Texas law and without waiving any defenses of either party. The provisions of this paragraph are intended for the sole benefit of the parties hereto and are not intended to create or grant any right, contractual or otherwise, to any other persons or entities.

V.

For the collection of Fines and Fees, the City agrees to pay to MVBA, as compensation for the legal services rendered the following fees:

- 1. For those Fines and Fees imposed against Unadjudicated Offenses that occurred before June 18, 2003, there is no fee due (0%) MVBA on the amount collected by the Court on those cases.
- 2. For those Fines and Fees imposed against Adjudicated Offenses regardless of the date of the offense, and against Unadjudicated Offenses that occurred on or after June 18, 2003, a fee of thirty percent (30%) of the amount of the Fines and Fees collected by the Court as provided by Article 103.0031 of the Code of Criminal Procedure.
- 3. In the event any case is disposed of by acquittal or dismissal, or if the fine, costs and/or fees are discharged through performance of community service, credit for jail time served, the discretionary removal of a collection fee by the Court or pursuant to §45.0491 of the Code of Criminal Procedure, no compensation shall be paid to MVBA by the City.

All compensation due to MVBA shall become the property of MVBA at the time of payment of the fines and fees by the defendant. The City shall pay to MVBA said compensation on a monthly basis by check.

#### VI.

The City recognizes and acknowledges that MVBA owns all right, title and interest in certain proprietary software that MVBA may utilize in conjunction with performing the services provided in the contract. The City agrees and hereby grants to MVBA the right to use and incorporate any information provided by the City ("case or defendant information") to update the databases in this proprietary software, and, notwithstanding that the case or defendant information has been or shall be used to update the databases in this proprietary software, further stipulates and agrees that the City shall have no rights or ownership whatsoever in and to the software or the data contained therein, except that the City shall be entitled to obtain a copy of such data that directly relates to the City's accounts at any time.

MVBA agrees that it will not share or disclose any specific confidential case or defendant information with any other company, individual, organization or agency, without the prior written consent of the City, except as may be required by law or where such information is otherwise publicly available. It is agreed that MVBA shall have the right to use case or defendant information for internal analysis, improving the proprietary software and database, and generating aggregate data and statistics that may inherently contain case and defendant information. These aggregate statistics are owned solely by MVBA and will generally be used internally, but may be shared with MVBA's affiliates, partners or other third parties for purposes of improving MVBA's software and services.

MVBA reserves the right to return to the City all accounts not collected within one (1) year of referral by the City, or identified as being in bankruptcy. Upon return of these accounts, neither party will have any obligation to the other party to this contract.

#### VII.

The initial term of this contract is three years, beginning on the first day of the month following the execution of this contract by both parties, and shall automatically renew on the anniversary date and continue in full force and effect thereafter from year to year for additional twelve month periods on the same terms and conditions unless either party delivers written "Notice of Termination of Contract" to the other party of its intent to terminate this contract, at least, sixty (60) days prior to each anniversary date of this contract.

In the event that the City terminates this contract, MVBA shall be entitled to continue its collection activity on all accounts previously referred to MVBA for six (6) months from the date of receipt of the "Notice of Termination of Contract" and to payment of its fee, pursuant to Paragraph V of this contract for all amounts collected on accounts referred to MVBA. The City may, at its discretion, refer additional accounts to MVBA after notice of termination has been received by MVBA. At the end of the six (6) month period, all accounts shall be returned to the City by MVBA.

#### Interlocal Agreement

MVBA agrees to extend prices and terms to all entities who have entered or will enter into joint purchasing interlocal cooperation agreement(s) with the City.

#### VIII.

This contract is made and is to be interpreted under the laws of the State of Texas. Exclusive venue for any action, lawsuit, claim, dispute or another legal proceeding concerning or arising out of this contract shall be in Dawson County, Texas.

In the event that any provision(s) of this contract shall for any reason be held invalid or unenforceable, the invalidity or unenforceability of that provision(s) shall not affect any other provision(s) of this contract, and it shall further be construed as if the invalid or unenforceable provision(s) had never been a part of this contract.

X.

In consideration of the terms and compensation herein stated, MVBA hereby agrees to undertake the performance of said contract as set forth above.

The City has authorized by order heretofore passed and duly recorded in its minutes the chief executive officer to execute this contract.

REQUEST FOR ACCESS TO CITY OF LAMESA RIGHT-OF-WAY 602 N. BRYAN Re: **AVENUE, LAMESA, TX** 

To Whom It May Concern:

Ranger Environmental Services, Inc. (Ranger) is currently under contract with the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) to conduct site investigation activities in response to a historic gasoline release at the former fueling facility (SITE) listed below:

**Chapa Gulf** 411 N. Bryan Avenue Lamesa, Texas 79331 LPST ID No.: 94305

As part of the site investigation activities to monitor this release, the TCEQ has requested that Ranger install an additional monitor well to the northwest of the Site, at 602 N. Bryan Ave.. The purpose of the well installation is to collect representative groundwater samples in an attempt to delineate the extent of subsurface groundwater contamination. Attached to this letter is the approved TCEQ Work Order (Task 1) requesting the installation of the additional monitor wells.

If an effort to complete the monitor well installation request, Ranger has attempted to secure private property access to install the monitor well at 510 N. Bryan Ave. However, we were declined access to the private property location. Due to the denial of access, Ranger is respectfully requesting your consent to access the City of Lamesa right-of-way (ROW) in order to install the monitor well in accordance with Proposed Scope of Work listed further below. Please note that all costs associated with the below Proposed Scope of Work will be borne by the TCEQ (i.e. - State of Texas).

The monitor well that Ranger is requesting access to the City of Lamesa ROW would be placed at the following location and approximate latitude/longitude:

#### Proposed Monitor Well 23 (PMW-23A)

Located approximately 65 feet west of the N. Bryan Avenue and N. 5th Street intersection, along the northern side of N. 5th Street. GPS coordinates are approximately (Latitude/Longitude) 32.735411°, -101.962231°.

#### PROPOSED SCOPE OF WORK

#### Monitor Well Installation

The presence of petroleum contamination has been documented in the soil and groundwater at the SITE. As part of the corrective action process, the TCEQ requires that the horizontal extent of impacted groundwater be defined.

Prior to any drilling activities, a utility one-call will be performed. In addition, we will meet with you or any of your representatives to ensure that no City of Lamesa utility lines are endangered by the drilling operations. Access to the drilling areas will be cordoned off with safety cones and/or warning tape. Ranger and the subcontracted State of Texas licensed drilling firm will be working under a site-specific health and safety plan. The well installation operations will be conducted in a manner so as to minimize any disruptions to City of Lamesa daily operations. However, Ranger recommends closing North 5<sup>th</sup> Street while the drilling is performed.

The proposed monitor wells will be drilled to approximately 90 feet below ground surface, and constructed of two-inch diameter schedule 40 PVC pipe. The wells are completed flush to the ground with a metal bolt down man-way cover to allow both pedestrian and vehicular crossings. Attached is a copy of a typical monitoring well construction diagram for the existing wells associated with the SITE as well as photographs of the monitor well installation process and completion.

Upon completion of the well installation process, all soils generated during the drilling process will be containerized in 55-gallon drums and properly disposed of. The area surrounding the wells will be swept to remove any remaining loose soil. The entire monitoring well installation process generally takes approximately 4 to 6 hours (barring no unforeseen issues). Copies of all testing reports, construction diagram and related documents for the wells to be installed will be provided to you upon request.

#### Groundwater Monitoring

Upon completion of the well installation activities, groundwater samples and water level measurements will be periodically collected from the installed monitoring well, as required by the TCEQ. The TCEQ typically requires monitoring wells to be sampled on a quarterly basis (once every three months) until project closure. Thus, it is presently anticipated that the proposed monitoring wells will be accessed and sampled on a quarterly basis, until such time that the TCEQ issues a closure letter for the remediation project associated with the SITE.

#### Monitor Well Plugging and Abandonment

Upon TCEQ regulatory closure of the SITE leaking petroleum storage tank (LPST) case, the monitor wells in the City of Lamesa ROW will be properly plugged and abandoned by a licensed State of Texas well driller in accordance with the requirements of Texas Administrative Code, Chapter 76. Prior to conducting this activity, we will meet with you or your representative to discuss and schedule the well plugging operations.

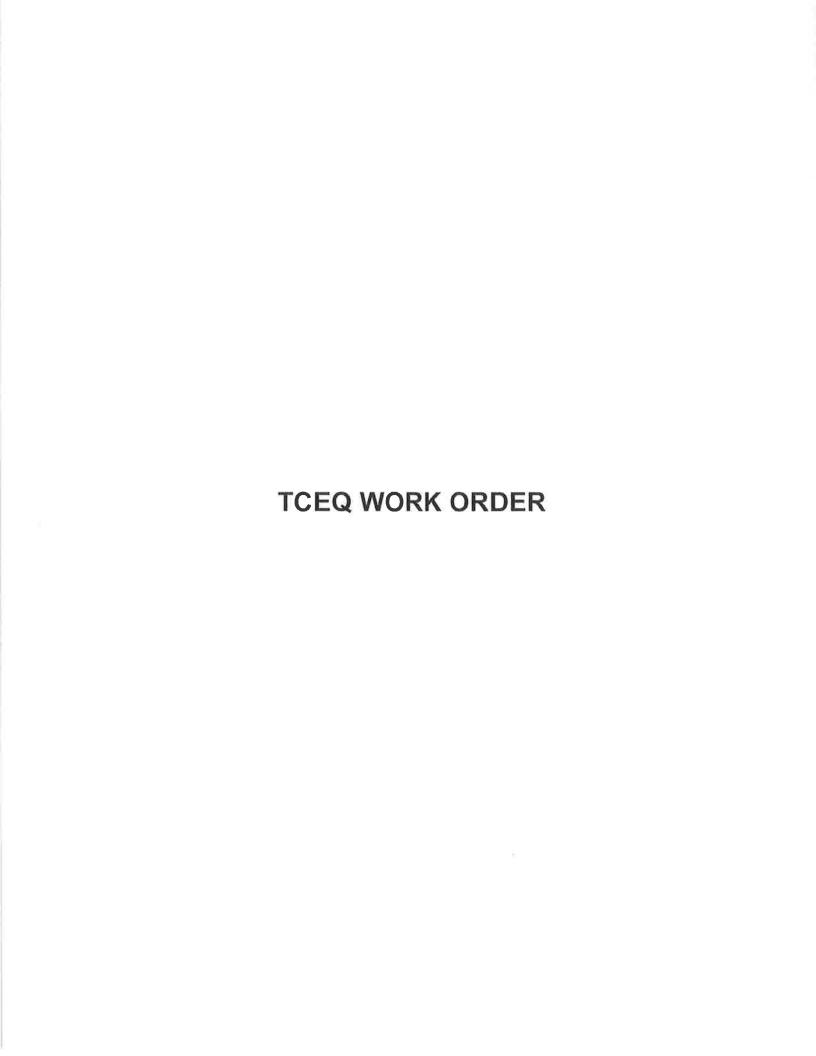

In addition, the contractor will inspect the site during the first scheduled site activity/site visit and document the presence of any former remediation system equipment, any damage or deterioration of active remediation systems, missing monitor wells, damage to monitor well completions, missing monitor well lids or lid bolts, drums that are not scheduled for prompt removal and any other site conditions that need immediate attention by the TCEQ. Upon returning from the field any noted issues will be reported to the TCEQ Project Manager and will include photo documentation and a recommendation for needed actions.

#### 1 - Offsite Access

SCOPE: The contractor shall attempt to obtain an offsite property access agreement where an additional monitor well can be installed in order to delineate the NAPL contaminant plume (see attached map with the location of PMW-23A). Technical Specialist time and mileage are included for travel and to meet with the property owner.

**SCHEDULE:** Work shall be scheduled upon activation of this WO. Once obtained, a copy of the signed offsite access agreement shall be submitted to the TCEQ project manager.

**PAYMENT:** Payment for work may be requested once the TCEQ Project Manager has received and accepted the signed offsite access agreement. If a signed offsite access agreement cannot be obtained, a request for payment for work must be accompanied by sufficient documentation of efforts/resources used in an attempt to secure the access agreement. Signed copies of timesheets, complete with description of services performed, are required when invoicing labor hours.

#### 2 - 8-Hour MDPE Events

SCOPE: Two 8-hour MDPE events shall be conducted. Each event will utilize RW-25 and RW-24 as extraction points. Vapor samples will be collected and analyzed as per contract specifications. If the field data indicates that the hydrocarbon recovery rate is low, the TCEQ Project Manager must be contacted to discuss whether the event should be discontinued. If PID/FID readings steadily decline or drop significantly for four consecutive readings, then the MDPE events must be terminated. The results from each event shall be documented in a MDPE report.

Liquid waste generated during each event will be containerized in a 55-gallon drum and stored onsite until disposal. Note that it is the contractor's responsibility to properly classify and dispose of waste at an appropriate, properly registered facility. Disposal/recycling should be accomplished as soon as laboratory analyses indicate which disposal/recycling facility is appropriate.

SCHEDULE: The first MDPE event shall be scheduled to begin within 30 days after activation of this WO and the second event approximately 90 days later. Each MDPE report shall be completed and submitted to the TCEQ within 45 days of the completion of each MDPE event.

**PAYMENT:** The contractor may invoice for payment following submittal and acceptance of each MDPE report. Each report must be accurate and complete to be considered acceptable and waste disposal should be documented as part of the required reporting. Signed copies of time sheets, complete with a description of services performed, will be required for invoicing labor hours.

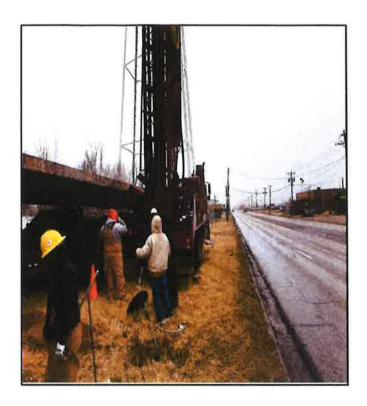

#### CITY MANAGER'S MEMORANDUM

RE: Request for Access to City of Lamesa Right-of-Way

Dear Ms. Burkhart:

X8 Environmental (X8e), a direct contractor to the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ), has been instructed to install seven new monitor and recovery wells in the City of Lamesa. Some of these wells will be in City right-of-way, and I recently learned of a City requirement that a formal request must be filed with the City Manager and approved by the City Council. This letter provides some site background, explains the proposed work, and formally requests approval from the City of Lamesa for right-of-way access where needed.

#### **Historical Background**

Under our contract with the TCEQ, X8e is assigned as the remediation contractor at two sites in Lamesa - J&M Shamrock, 611 N. 4th Street (TCEQ LPST #092553) and McCormick Oil (Paula's Quick Mart), 701 S. Dallas (TCEQ LPST #096331). These sites are former retail gasoline stations where <a href="https://district.nlm.nih.google.new.nih.g

As a result of historical and ongoing investigation, remediation, and monitoring activities at these sites, a number of groundwater monitor and recovery wells have been installed on and around each site. Twenty-nine (29) monitor and recovery wells have been installed on and around the J&M site, 17 of which have since been abandoned leaving 12 monitor and recovery wells in place. Twenty-one (21) monitor and recovery wells have been installed on and around the McCormick site, one of which has since been destroyed, leaving 20 monitor and recovery wells in place. Site Maps for each site are enclosed.

#### **Proposed Action**

The TCEQ has now instructed X8e to install three new monitor wells – MW-9R (R=replacement), MW14R, and MW-26 - at the J&M site, and four new monitor and recovery wells - RW-3R, MW-5R, MW-7R, and MW-8R - at the McCormick site. These wells are necessary because the existing wells have gone dry due to a dropping groundwater table. Several of the wells will be installed on private property, but several wells will be located in City of Lamesa right-of-way due to private access issues, utility locations, or hydrogeologic issues. Specifically, the following wells will be installed:

- MW-9R (J&M site) South side of N 4<sup>th</sup> Street, approximately 165 feet east of Avenue F (32 degrees, 44 minutes, 7.95 seconds W; 101 degrees, 57 minutes, 20.74 degrees west)
- MW-14R (J&M site) West side of Avenue F, approximately 95 feet north of N 3<sup>rd</sup> Street (32 degrees, 44 minutes, 5.28 seconds W; 101 degrees, 57 minutes, 22.67 degrees west)
- MW-26 (J&M site) North side of N 4<sup>th</sup> Street, east corner of Thriftway parking lot (32 degrees, 44 minutes, 8.35 seconds W; 101 degrees, 57 minutes, 24.01 degrees west)
- RW-3R (McCormick site) Central portion of 701 S. Dallas, north of buildling (32 degrees, 43 minutes, 38.04 seconds north; 101 degrees, 56 minutes, 54.17 seconds west)
- MW-5R (McCormick site) Southeastern corner of 701 S. Dallas, east of building (32 degrees, 43 minutes, 37.41 seconds north; 101 degrees, 56 minutes, 53.39 seconds west)
- MW-7R (McCormick site) North side of S. 6<sup>th</sup> Street, approximately 50 feet east of S. Dallas (32 degrees, 43 minutes, 38.87 seconds north; 101 degrees, 56 minutes, 54.70 seconds west)
- MW-8R (McCormick site) South side of S. 6<sup>th</sup> Street, approximately 20 feet west of S. Lynn (32 degrees, 43 minutes, 38.92 seconds north; 101 degrees, 56 minutes, 51.58 seconds west)

In addition, 11 monitor and recovery wells will be plugged at the McCormick site – MW-1, RW-3, MW-4, MW-5, MW-7, MW-8, MW-13, RW-15, RW-16, RW-17, and MW-20.

Prior to mobilization, X8e will submit a utility locate request with Texas 811 and, should the City of Lamesa not be listed as a notified party, X8e will contact Mr. Dionicio Garza, City of Lamesa Utilities Director, to inform him of the planned activities. X8e will then mobilize with a subcontracted driller to install the wells. At each location, a hole approximately nine inches in diameter by 90 feet deep will be installed. The holes will be drilled with an air rotary drill rig, which will be accompanied by several support vehicles. Soil cuttings will be drummed and stored on the LPST site until disposal can be arranged. A PVC monitor or recovery well will then be installed in the hole, and the space around the casing (well annulus) will be filled with sand and bentonite. The well will be finished with a steel flush-mounted well cover in a concrete foundation, and will be finished low enough to allow for mowing over it in the affected areas. The well will then be registered with the Texas Water Development Board.

The wells will be periodically accessed by X8e staff to collect groundwater samples, and the wells will remain in place until such time as the TCEQ determines that the site meets closure requirements and the case is closed. At that time, X8e will be instructed to permanently plug and abandon the wells, which will include removal of the surface features.

Each well installation is being done at the expense of the TCEQ, as will the eventual well closure. As long as the wells are not intentionally damaged by property owners or City personnel, the wells will be maintained at TCEQ expense. Also, should a well ever be in the way of a planned activity, the City of Lamesa can notify X8e, and we will work with the TCEQ and the City of Lamesa to act as necessary to assist.



A copy of the TCEQ Work Orders authorizing this work and Proposed Monitor Well Maps for each site are enclosed.
