RESOLUTION NO.

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LAMESA, TEXAS, APPROVING A NEGOTIATED SETTLEMENT BETWEEN THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE OF CITIES SERVED BY ATMOS WEST TEXAS ("CITIES") AND ATMOS ENERGY CORP., WEST TEXAS DIVISION REGARDING THE COMPANY'S 2019 RATE REVIEW MECHANISM FILING; DECLARING EXISTING RATES TO BE UNREASONABLE; ADOPTING TARIFFS THAT REFLECT RATE ADJUSTMENTS CONSISTENT WITH THE NEGOTIATED SETTLEMENT; FINDING THE RATES TO BE SET BY THE ATTACHED SETTLEMENT TARIFFS TO BE JUST AND REASONABLE AND IN THE PUBLIC INTEREST: APPROVING AN ATTACHED EXHIBIT ESTABLISHING A BENCHMARK FOR PENSIONS AND RETIREE MEDICAL BENEFITS; APPROVING AN ATTACHED EXHIBIT REGARDING AMORTIZATION OF REGULATORY LIABILITY; REQUIRING THE COMPANY TO REIMBURSE CITIES' REASONABLE **EXPENSES**; RATEMAKING DETERMINING THAT RESOLUTION WAS PASSED IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE REQUIREMENTS OF THE TEXAS OPEN MEETINGS ACT; ADOPTING A SAVINGS CLAUSE; DECLARING AN EFFECTIVE DATE; AND REQUIRING DELIVERY OF THIS RESOLUTION TO THE COMPANY AND THE CITIES' LEGAL COUNSEL.

WHEREAS, the City of Lamesa, Texas ("City") is a gas utility customer of Atmos Energy Corp., West Texas Division ("Atmos West Texas" or "Company"), and a regulatory authority with an interest in the rates and charges of Atmos West Texas; and

WHEREAS, the City is a member of Cities Served by Atmos West Texas ("Cities"), a coalition of similarly-situated cities served by Atmos West Texas that have joined together to facilitate the review of, and response to, natural gas issues affecting rates charged in the Atmos West Texas service area; and

WHEREAS, Cities and the Company worked collaboratively to develop a new Rate Review Mechanism ("RRM") tariff that allows for an expedited rate review process by Cities as a substitute to the Gas Reliability Infrastructure Program ("GRIP") process instituted by the

Legislature, and that will establish rates for Cities based on the system-wide cost of serving the Atmos West Texas service area; and

WHEREAS, the RRM tariff was adopted by the City in a rate ordinance in 2018; and

WHEREAS, on about April 1, 2019, Atmos West Texas filed its 2019 RRM rate request with Cities based on a test year ending December 31, 2018, and filed an errata on April 26, 2019; and

WHEREAS, Cities coordinated its review of the Atmos West Texas 2019 RRM filing through its Executive Committee, assisted by Cities' attorneys and consultants, to resolve issues identified in the Company's RRM filing; and

WHEREAS, the Executive Committee, as well as Cities' counsel and consultants, recommends that Cities approve an increase in base rates for Atmos West Texas of \$4.7 million for Cities' members; and

WHEREAS, the attached tariffs (Exhibit A) implementing new rates are consistent with the recommendation of the Cities' Executive Committee, are agreed to by the Company, and are just, reasonable, and in the public interest; and

WHEREAS, the Exhibit A rate tariffs incorporate the federal income tax rates that became effective January 1, 2019; and

WHEREAS, the settlement agreement sets a new benchmark for pensions and retiree medical benefits (Exhibit B) and

WHEREAS, the settlement agreement establishes an amortization schedule for regulatory liability (Exhibit C); and

WHEREAS, the RRM Tariff contemplates reimbursement of Cities' reasonable expenses associated with RRM applications;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF Lamesa, TEXAS:

Section 1. That the findings set forth in this Resolution are hereby in all things approved.

Section 2. That, without prejudice to future litigation of any issue identified by Cities, the City Council finds that the settled amount of an increase in revenues of \$11.1 million on a system-wide basis, and \$4.7 million increase for Cities, represents a comprehensive settlement of gas utility rate issues affecting the rates, operations, and services offered by Atmos West Texas within the municipal limits arising from Atmos West Texas' 2019 RRM filing, is in the public interest, and is consistent with the City's authority under Section 103.001 of the Texas Utilities Code.

Section 3. That the existing rates for natural gas service provided by Atmos West Texas are unreasonable. The new tariffs attached hereto and incorporated herein as Exhibit A, are just and reasonable, and are designed to allow Atmos West Texas to recover annually an additional \$11.1 million in revenue on a system-wide basis, and \$4.7 million from customers in Cities, over the amount allowed under currently approved rates. Such tariffs are hereby adopted.

Section 4. That the ratemaking treatment for pensions and retiree medical benefits in Atmos West Texas' next RRM filing shall be as set forth on Exhibit B, attached hereto and incorporated herein.

Section 5. That amortization of regulatory liability shall be consistent with the schedule found in Exhibit C, attached hereto and incorporated herein.

Section 6. That Atmos West Texas shall reimburse the reasonable ratemaking expenses of the Cities in processing the Company's 2019 RRM filing.

Section 7. That to the extent any resolution or ordinance previously adopted by the Council is inconsistent with this Resolution, it is hereby repealed.

Section 8. That the meeting at which this Resolution was approved was in all things conducted in strict compliance with the Texas Open Meetings Act, Texas Government Code, Chapter 551.

Section 9. That if any one or more sections or clauses of this Resolution is adjudged to be unconstitutional or invalid, such judgment shall not affect, impair, or invalidate the remaining provisions of this Resolution, and the remaining provisions of the Resolution shall be interpreted as if the offending section or clause never existed.

Section 10. That consistent with the City Ordinance that established the RRM process, this Resolution shall become effective from and after its passage with rates authorized by attached tariffs to be effective for bills rendered on or after October 1, 2019.

Section 11. Surcharges: Plus an amount for surcharges calculated in accordance with the applicable rider(s).

Curtailment Overpull Fee

Upon notification by Company of an event of curtailment or interruption of Customer's deliveries, Customer will, for each MMBtu delivered in excess of the stated level of curtailment or interruption, pay Company 200% of the "Index" price reported for the month of delivery in Inside FERC's Gas Market Report under the heading "West Texas Waha".

Replacement Index

In the event the "Index" price reported for the month of delivery in Inside FERC's Gas Market Report under the heading "West Texas Waha" is no longer published, Company will calculate the applicable imbalance fees utilizing a daily price index recognized as authoritative by the natural gas industry and most closely approximating the applicable index.

Agreement

A transportation agreement is required.

Notice

Service hereunder and the rates for services provided are subject to the orders of regulatory bodies having jurisdiction and to the Company's Tariff for Gas Service.

Special Conditions

In order to receive transportation service under this tariff, customer must have the type of meter, instrumentation, and communication required by Company. Customer must pay Company all costs associated with the acquisition and installation of the required equipment.

MODEL STAFF REPORT FOR RESOLUTION

BACKGROUND AND SUMMARY

The City, along with 66 other West Texas cities served by Atmos Energy Corporation, West Texas Division ("Atmos West Texas" or "Company"), is a member of Cities Served by Atmos West Texas ("Cities"). In 2007, the Cities and Atmos West Texas settled a rate application filed by the Company pursuant to Section 104.301 of the Texas Utilities Code for an interim rate adjustment commonly referred to as a GRIP filing (arising out of the Gas Reliability Infrastructure Program legislation). That settlement created a substitute rate review process, referred to as Rate Review Mechanism ("RRM"), as a substitute for future filings under the GRIP statute.

Since 2007, there have been several modifications to the original RRM Tariff. The most recent iteration of an RRM Tariff was reflected in an ordinance adopted by Cities in 2018. On or about April 1, 2019, the Company filed a rate request pursuant to the RRM Tariff adopted by Cities. The Company claimed that its cost of service in a test year ending December 31, 2018, entitled it to additional revenues system-wide of \$17.27 million, which was reduced to \$14.82 million after the application of a credit for excess accumulated deferred income taxes. The requested revenue increase attributable to Cities, after the initial credit, was \$6.23 million.

Application of the standards set forth in the Cities' RRM Tariff reduces the Company's request for additional revenues from Cities to \$5.13 million. After a review of Cities' consultants' report and negotiations with Cities' Executive Committee, Atmos agreed to a system-wide rate increase of \$11.1 million. That increase, when allocated between Cities, the Amarillo/Lubbock coalition, and environs, results in an increase to Cities of \$4.70 million. The Effective Date for new rates is October 1, 2019. Cities should take action approving the Resolution before the end of September.

PROOF OF REVENUES

Atmos generated proof of revenues associated with the Resolution and attached rate tariffs. That proof is attached as Attachment 1 to this Staff Report. Cities' consultants have confirmed the accuracy of the proof.

BILL IMPACT

The impact of this increase in revenues to an average residential customer's bill is an increase of approximately \$2.48 per month. A bill impact estimate is attached as Attachment 2.

CITIES' OBJECTION TO THE SECTION 104.301 GRIP PROCESS

Cities strongly opposed the GRIP process because it constitutes piecemeal ratemaking by ignoring declining expenses and increasing revenues and rewarding the Company for increasing capital investment. The GRIP process does not allow any review of the reasonableness of capital investment and does not allow cities to participate in the Railroad Commission's review of annual GRIP filings or allow Cities to recover their rate case expenses. The Railroad Commission undertakes a mere administrative review of GRIP filings (instead of a full hearing), and rate increases go into effect without any material adjustments. In the Executive Committee's view, the GRIP process unfairly raises customers' rates without any regulatory oversight. In contrast, the RRM process has allowed for a more comprehensive rate review and annual evaluation of expenses and revenues, as well as capital investment.

EXPLANATION OF "BE IT RESOLVED" PARAGRAPHS

- 1. This section approves all findings in the Resolution.
- 2. This section adopts the attached RRM rate tariffs and finds the adoption of the new rates to be just, reasonable, and in the public interest.
- 3. This section finds that existing rates are unreasonable. Such finding is a necessary predicate to establishment of new rates. The new tariffs will permit Atmos West Texas to recover an

additional \$11.1 million on a system-wide basis. Settling Cities will be responsible for \$4.7 million of the \$11.1 million.

- 4. This section approves an exhibit that establishes a benchmark for pensions and retiree medical benefits to be used in future rate settings.
- 5. This section approves an exhibit to be used in future rate cases regarding recovery of regulatory liabilities, such as excess deferred income taxes.
- 6. This section requires the Company to reimburse the City for expenses associated with adoption of the Resolution.
- 7. This section repeals any resolution or ordinance that is inconsistent with this Resolution.
- 8. This section finds that the meeting was conducted in compliance with the Texas Open Meetings Act, Texas Government Code, Chapter 551.
- 9. This section is a savings clause, which provides that if any section is later found to be unconstitutional or invalid, that finding shall not affect, impair, or invalidate the remaining provisions of this Resolution. This section further directs that the remaining provisions of the Resolution are to be interpreted as if the offending section or clause never existed.
- 10. This section provides for an effective date upon passage.
- 11. This section directs that a copy of the signed Resolution be sent to a representative of the Company and legal counsel for the Executive Committee.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 12, DIVISION 3. STOP INTERSECTIONS, SECTION 12.03.082(2) OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES TO PROVIDE FOR ADDITIONAL STOP SIGNS.

On this the 20th day of August, 2019, there came on and was held at the regular meeting place, the City Hall, an open meeting of the City Council of the City of Lamesa, Texas held pursuant to the provisions of the Texas Open Meetings Act; there being a quorum present and acting throughout the meeting, the following ordinance was formally submitted by motion and duly seconded for the consideration and action of the meeting, to wit:

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Lamesa, Texas wishes to promote the safe passage of motor vehicles and other traffic within the City Limits of the City of Lamesa, Texas; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Lamesa, Texas has received a petition from residents of the neighborhood requesting a stop sign at this location; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Lamesa, Texas has determined that additional stop signs are warranted; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Lamesa, Texas wishes to provide for the installation and maintenance of such additional stop signs; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Lamesa, Texas finds it to be in the public interest and welfare to pass an ordinance to add additional stop signs at this location.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LAMESA, TEXAS:

SECTION ONE. That Section 12.03.082(2) of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Lamesa, Texas is hereby amended to include as follows:

The provisions of this ordinance are to be cumulative and all other ordinances or parts of ordinances governing or regulating the same subject matter as that covered herein; provided, however, that all prior ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent with or in conflict with any of the provisions of this ordinance are hereby expressly repealed to the extent of any such inconsistency or conflict.

SECTION FOUR. If any section, subsection, sentence, clause or phrase of this ordinance is, for any reason, held to be unconstitutional or invalid, such holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this ordinance. The City Council of the City of Lamesa, Texas hereby declares that it would have passed this ordinance and each

section, subsection, sentence, clause, or phrase hereof irrespective of the fact that any one or more sections, subsections, sentences, clauses, or phrases be declared unconstitutional or invalid.

SECTION FIVE. The City Secretary is hereby authorized and directed to publish the descriptive caption of this ordinance in the manner and for the length of time prescribed by Article IV, Section 24 of the City Charter.

SECTION SIX. That the Director of Public Works is hereby authorized and directed to cause the placement of suitable traffic control and devices as may be necessary to ensure compliance with the provisions of this ordinance.

AN ORDINANCE ADOPTING AND APPROVING A BUDGET FOR THE FISCAL YEAR BEGINNING OCTOBER 1, 2019 AND ENDING SEPTEMBER 30, 2020 AND MAKING APPROPRIATIONS FOR EACH DEPARTMENT, PROJECT, AND ACCOUNT; APPROVING REVISED BUDGET FIGURES FOR THE FISCAL YEAR ENDED SEPTEMBER 30, 2018; PROVIDING FOR NECESSARY TRANSFERS OF FUNDS BETWEEN ACCOUNTS AND DEPARTMENTS, IF REQUIRED; AND PROVIDING A SAVINGS CLAUSE.

On the this 22rd day of August, 2019, there came on and was held at the regular called meeting place, the City Hall, an open meeting of the City Council of the City of Lamesa, Texas, held pursuant to the provisions of the Texas Open Meetings Act, and there being a quorum present and acting throughout the meeting, the following ordinance was formally submitted by motion and duly seconded for the consideration and action of the meeting, to wit:

WHEREAS, a budget for the Fiscal Year beginning October 1, 2019, and ending September 30, 2020, has been prepared by the City Manager; and

WHEREAS, the City Manager, on July 31, 2019, filed a proposed budget with the City Secretary for the Fiscal Year beginning October 1, 2019; and

WHEREAS, the City Secretary did post notice that said proposed budget had been filed and was available for public inspection; and

WHEREAS, the City Council did not hold two public hearings regarding the proposed property ad valorem tax rate at \$0.83406 due to it being equivalent to the effective tax rate and not exceeding the effective tax rate.

WHEREAS, On August 22rd, 2019, the City Council held a public hearing and adopted the 2019-2020 Budget Ordinance on 1st reading for the upcoming Fiscal Year. On August 27th, 2019, City Council will consider passing the Budget Ordinance on 2nd and final reading. It is determined the proposed budget for Fiscal Year 2019-2020 to be appropriate and correct in all respects and that all requirements of the law have been satisfied; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of Lamesa:

SECTION 1. Subject to the applicable provisions of the State Law and the City Charter, the budget for the Fiscal Year beginning October 1, 2019, and ending September 30, 2020, as filed and submitted by the City Manager, and adjusted by the City Council, containing estimates of resources and revenues for the year from all of the various sources provided by the city, and the projects, operations, activities and purchases proposed to be undertaken during the year, together with the estimated costs thereof, and estimated amounts of all other proposed expenditures, is hereby approved and adopted.

- **SECTION 2.** (A) There is hereby appropriated from the funds indicated and for such purposes and other expenditures proposed in such budget, not to exceed for all such purposes for any department, the total amount of the estimated costs of the projects, operations, activities, purchases and other expenditures proposed for such department; and
- (B) The City Manager is hereby authorized to approve the transfer of allocated amounts between classifications, departments, and unappropriated surpluses if such transfers do not significantly change the work program contemplated in the approved budget.
- SECTION 3. THE BUDGET WILL RAISE LESS REVENUE FROM PROPERTY TAXES THAN LAST YEAR'S BUDGET BY AN AMOUNT OF \$-2,456, WHICH IS A -0.10 PERCENT DECREASE FROM LAST YEAR'S BUDGET. THE PROPERTY TAX REVENUE TO BE RAISED FROM NEW PROPERTY ADDED TO THE TAX ROLL THIS YEAR IS \$14.

SECTION 4. The amounts set out under the headings "Revised or Estimated 2019-2020" shall be, and are hereby, authorized and approved as revised budget amounts for the Fiscal Year ending on September 30, 2019.

SECTION 5. Increases in fees and rates to be amended as follows:

That Section §13.03.216 Water rates and charges is hereby amended as follows:

- (a) Rate schedule.
 - (1) The minimum rate for water, which shall be charged to all customers, except as otherwise provided, shall be \$42.70 per month effective October 1, 2019.
 - (2) Next two thousand gallons (each 1,000) shall be \$3.25.
 - (3) Each 1,000 gallons above three thousand shall be \$3.90.
 - (4) Increase of 10% on consumption rates related to the prison.
 - (5) Bulk Water Rate: \$15 per one thousand gallons (each 1,000).

That Section §13.03.217 Wastewater service rates and charges to be amended as follows:

(a) Minimum rate. The minimum rate for wastewater service, which shall be charged all customers, except as otherwise provided, shall be: (1) residential: \$26.00; and (2) commercial: \$34.50; per month effective October 1, 2019.

That Section §1.08.006 Park Fees is hereby amended as follows:

(d) Fees for Park Rentals and Deposits

(1) Forrest Park Community Center:

(A) Small Room (34' x 60')
