*"To Serve With Concern"*



# DEPARTMENT STRUCTURE





# PATROL DIVISION

The Patrol Division is responsible for providing general police services within the Village of Larchmont. The division consists of fourteen Patrol Officers and five First Line Supervisors assigned to three different shifts.



Contained within the Patrol Division is the Bicycle Patrol Unit. This unit is responsible for uniformed patrol duties of specific areas. The unit is intended to complement traditional vehicle patrol while increasing visibility and mobility over foot patrol.



# DETECTIVE DIVISION

The Detective Division is responsible for investigating crime within the Village of Larchmont. Criminal activity that is first reported to the Patrol Division is forwarded to the Detective Division for investigative follow-up. This often involves identification of a suspect and their subsequent apprehension.

Additionally, the Detective Division proactively initiates investigations into criminal activity. Investigations of this kind often culminate with the execution of a court ordered search and or arrest warrant.





# SPECIALIZED UNITS



## MOTORCYCLE PATROL UNIT

The Larchmont Police Department was one of the first agencies in Westchester County to employ motorcycles as part of their patrol efforts. Ptl. Oliver Cochran was the first member of the Department assigned to motorcycle patrol in 1910. The Department abandoned the use of motorcycles in 1955.

In the spring of 2017 motorcycle patrol was reintroduced with the purchase of a Harley Davidson Electra Glide Police Motorcycle. Currently, the motorcycle unit consists of two motorcycles assigned to Officer Michael Genkerell and Officer John Tychyn.





# SPECIALIZED UNITS

## SCHOOL RESOURCE OFFICER PROGRAM

The purpose of the SRO program is to take a proactive approach to law enforcement by employing three major components: law enforcement, education, and counseling.

While assigned to a school, the SRO provides all law enforcement duties, educates the students on law related issues and counsels both students and parents on various topics.

The SRO interacts with the students as a positive role model. The intent is that the positive experiences students have with the SRO will bridge the gap between juveniles and law enforcement, and in doing so, help prevent juvenile crime.





# SPECIALIZED UNITS



The purpose of the Honor Guard is to have a unit of officers to represent the Police Department at funeral ceremonies, parades and other formal functions with the utmost respect and dignity.

The unit consists of a small group of officers who volunteer to participate in these ceremonies.








# TRAFFIC SAFETY





## Calls for Service




## Offense Summary





Traffic Violations




Parking Violations





Aided Cases





Warrants Cleared




