Mourns the Passing of Trustee Dawn Czarny In early June, we lost our dedicated Village Trustee, Dawn Czarny, Dawn served on our Village Board for over six years and was also on the Finance Committee. Her

devotion to ecology was exemplified in her roles as liaison to both the Lakes and Environmental Commissions, as well as being our Solid Waste Agency of Lake County (SWALCO) representative.

Due to the unexpected and unfortunate passing of Dawn Czarny, the Mayor brought forward the nomination of Ronald Grace to fill her remaining term. Pursuant to the statute, the Village Trustees voted on this nomination and on July 26th, the Lindenhurst Village Board swore in our newest Board member, Ronald Grace. Trustee Grace has also been appointed to the Human Resources Committee.

Ron has been a Lindenhurst resident since April 2000, in the Country Place (North) subdivision, and retired as Purchasing Supervisor from United Conveyor Corporation (Waukegan) in 2018— ending a forty-one-year career in Supply Chain management.

Since retirement, Ron has kept



occupied by teaching adult Sunday School at the Shiloh Baptist Church of Waukegan, owning a small consulting firm – Gracemark

Business Consultants, hosting a music show, and co-hosting a talk show on WRLR 98.3 FM in Round Lake Beach.

His personal philosophy is that, "We are all neighbors, and as such, tend to be more alike than different. Mere conversation can often avert confrontation. In addition, my standard approach to projects or issues, is to be as informed, organized, and as prepared as possible."

* TAX INCREMENTAL FINANCING (TIF): The Village strives to be responsive to its residents, and the Grand Avenue business district has long been a source of concern to residents, as well as the Village. After listening sessions with residents and community stakeholders, the Village Board prioritized the redevelopment of Grand Avenue as a goal of the Village's Strategic Plan. To revitalize the Grand Avenue corridor, the Village of Lindenhurst took the necessary steps to designate much of this area as a TIF district. The Village believes that without this redevelopment tool, opportunity and vitality much needed in this particular area may not occur. With the TIF, we endeavor to redevelop the Grand Avenue business corridor into a modern, more appealing commercial district. Linden Notes

Landscape Collection

Groot landscape service runs through November 29th. Landscape waste includes grass, shrubbery, small tree limbs and weeds. Sticker service: Each sticker is \$3.40 and one must be affixed to each 32-gallon container or Kraft bag placed curbside each week. Residents may use 1 sticker for every 2 bags from October 18th - November 29th.

Subscription service: This service is \$165 annually. Residents may place up to four 32-gallon containers or Kraft style bags curbside each week; any additional containers would require a sticker. Stickers can be purchased at the following locations:

- Village Hall (2301 E Sand Lake Road)
- Butera Finer Foods (1500 E Grand Avenue).

50/50 Programs

Lindenhurst offers reimbursement to residents that have planted a

tree, added shoreline buffer plantings or purchased a rain barrel and/ or compost bin.

- Program dollars will be dispersed by the Village to the homeowner after proof of purchase and residency.
- Households may participate one time during the Village's fiscal year (May 1- April 30).
- Residents must submit a receipt to Village Hall for reimbursement.
- First-come, first-served basis as budgeted funds are available.

Rain Barrel & Compost Bin:

This program will allow residents to be more sustainable by reducing residential water consumption or improving soil and plant life.

Up to \$75 for up to three rain barrels OR a compost bin (excluding sales tax, delivery, accessories, etc.).

Shoreline Stabilization:

Residents who own lake shore property are reimbursed 50% for acceptable shrubs and plantings that help preserve the shoreline and water quality of the lakes.

Up to \$100 for approved shoreline plants (excluding sales tax, delivery, installation, etc.).

Tree Reimbursement:

Residents are reimbursed 50% of the cost of a single tree planted in their parkway or private yard excluding sales tax, delivery, installation, etc.)

Up to \$200 for an **acceptable** tree (no invasives permitted; other exclusions may apply).

Utility Bill Payment Options

Residents can take advantage of the Village's online utility bill system, at no additional cost. Residents can use InvoiceCloud to pay their utility bill, view the bill or receive paperless billing through the e-bill program. VILLAGE ORDINANCE REMINDERS

As the Fall season approaches, please be mindful of our Village ordinances. Our full code can be found at www.lindenhurstil.org.

Landscape

The burning of leaves, brush, and any yard waste is prohibited. Grass should be less than 8" in height, properties free of weeds.

Tree limbs and shrubs must not obstruct the sidewalk, and have a minimum 8-feet of overhead clearance.

Vehicles

No vehicle may be parked on the front lawn or obstruct a public sidewalk. Boats, RVs, and trailers have size and parking restrictions. All vehicles shall be operable, with current plates displayed. 2 AM to 6 AM street parking is prohibited.

Garage Sales

Only 2 garage sales are permitted within a calendar year, and may not exceed 4 consecutive days in duration.

Signs can not be affixed to lamp posts, fences, mailboxes, electric lights, utility poles, street signs, or public buildings.

Structure Maintenance

For prompt emergency response, display address numbers, a minimum of 4-inches high, using a color contrasting with its background. Keep trim and wall exteriors free from chipping/peeling paint and rotting wood. Maintain hand and guard rails.

Storage/Debris

All garbage must be sealed in a tight-fitting container, and may not be stored in front of the house. Receptacles, yard waste, and other items can be placed roadside after 6 PM the night before a scheduled pick-up, and must be removed by 8 PM the day of pick-up. Keep yard free of litter/debris. Store toys, bicycles, and tools inside. Remove animal waste regularly.

Fire Protection Week is October 3 - 9

As Fire Prevention Week™ approaches, the Lake Villa Fire Protection District reminds residents to "Learn the Sounds of Fire Safety™"

The Lake Villa Fire Protection District is teaming up with the National Fire Protection Association® (NFPA®)—the official sponsor of Fire Prevention Week for more than 90 years—to promote this year's Fire Prevention Week TM campaign, "Learn the Sounds of Fire Safety TM." This year's campaign, October 3 - 9th, works to educate everyone about simple but important actions they can take to keep themselves and those around them safe.

"What do the sounds mean? Is there a beep or a chirp coming out of your smoke or carbon monoxide alarm? Knowing the difference can save you, your home, and your family," said Lorraine Carli, vice-president of outreach and advocacy at NFPA.

LVFPD encourages all residents to embrace the 2021 Fire Prevention Week theme. "It's important to learn the different sounds of smoke and carbon monoxide alarms. When an alarm makes noise—a beeping sound or a chirping sound—you must take action!" said Lt. Justin Biggs. "Make sure everyone in the home understands the sounds of the alarms and knows how to respond. To learn the sounds of your specific smoke and carbon monoxide alarms, check the manufacturer's instructions that came in the box, or search the brand and model online."

Lake Villa Fire Protection District wants to share safety tips to help you "Learn the Sounds of Fire Safety":

- A continuous set of three loud beeps—beep, beep, beep—means smoke or fire. Get out, call 9-1-1, and stay out.
- A single chirp every 30 or 60 seconds means the battery is low and must be changed.
- All smoke alarms must be replaced after 10 years.
- Chirping that continues after the battery has been replaced means the alarm is at the end of its life and the unit must be replaced.
- Make sure your smoke and CO alarms meet the needs of all your family members, including those with sensory or physical disabilities.
