Pursuant to the due call and notice thereof, a regular meeting of the North Mankato City Council was held in the Municipal Building Council Chambers on January 17, 2023. Mayor Carlson called the meeting to order at 7:00 pm, asking everyone to join the Pledge of Allegiance. The following were present for roll call: Council Members Peterson, Whitlock, Steiner, Oachs, City Administrator McCann, Interim Finance Director Ryan, Community Development Director Fischer, Public Works Director Arnold (remote), and City Clerk Van Genderen.

Approval of Agenda

Council Member Steiner moved, seconded by Council Member Oachs, to approve the agenda as presented. Vote on the motion Peterson, Whitlock, Steiner, Oachs, and Carlson, aye, no nays. Motion carried.

Approval of Council Minutes from January 3, 2023, Council Meeting.

Council Member Oachs moved, seconded by Council Member Peterson, to approve the Council Meeting Minutes of January 3, 2023. Vote on the motion Peterson, Whitlock, Steiner, Oachs, and Carlson, aye, no nays. Motion carried.

Public Hearing, 7 pm Consider Amending City Code Chapter 52 Section 52.07

Interim Finance Director Ryan reported the City currently had a mixture of manual and automatic read meters. The City no longer installs manual read meters and would like to change all meters to automatic read meters. The proposed ordinance would require anyone obtaining a plumbing permit over \$2,000 first install an automatic read meter. The ordinance would also require all residents who do not read their meters for 6 months to install automatic read meters. It also requires new automatic read meter installation when a property is sold.

With no comments, Mayor Carlson closed the Public Hearing.

Consent Agenda

Council Member Steiner moved, seconded by Council Member Peterson, to approve the Consent Agenda.

- E. Accepted and Implemented the January Traffic & Safety Committee Recommendations.

Vote on the motion Peterson, Whitlock, Steiner, Oachs, and Carlson, aye, no nays. Motion carried.

Public Comments Concerning Business Items on the Agenda.

Barb Church, 102 Wheeler Avenue, appeared before Council and suggested the Sales Tax Resolution not specify the Caswell Indoor Recreation Facility as the use of the funds. She asked what the City was doing for kids that were not interested in sports.

Tom Hagen, 927 Lake Street, appeared before Council and requested Council not pursue the recreational facility and slow the process down.

Business Items

Consider Ordinance No. 155, An Ordinance of the City of North Mankato, Minnesota, Amending North Mankato City Code Chapter 52 Section 52.07 Water Meters.

Interim Finance Director Ryan summarized the three times a new water meter would be required, which included the sale of property, a plumbing permit over \$2,000 dollars, and 6 months of non-meter readings. A discussion was held concerning the specifics of the Ordinance, including if both commercial and residential were included, the amount set for plumbing permits, and the lack of knowledge for those that are planning remodels or sales. Council Member Steiner suggested rewriting the ordinance to answer questions concerning how the ordinance would be implemented.

Council Member Whitlock moved, seconded by Council Member Steiner, to Table the Ordinance and Bring the Topic to a Council Work Session. Vote on the motion Peterson, Whitlock, Steiner, Oachs, and Carlson, aye, no nays. Motion carried.

Res. No. 8-23 Requesting the Advance of Municipal State Aid Funds for Municipal Construction Projects and Bond Principal Payment.

City Engineer Sarff said that the Minnesota Department of Transportation allows cities to advance municipal state aid funds as required to construct state-aid projects when the city's Municipal State Aid Construction account does not have adequate funds to cover the eligible costs. The City of North Mankato is requesting an advance of Municipal State Aid Funds in the amount of up to \$985,000 for the construction of the Lor Ray Drive/Howard Drive Roundabout Project. A \$250,000 request is also being made for the payment of the bond principal for the existing State Aid bond that was taken out in 2015 for the TH 14/CSAH 41 interchange project.

Council Member Steiner moved, seconded by Council Member Oachs to Adopt Res. No. 8-23 Requesting the Advance of Municipal State Aid Funds for Municipal Construction Projects and Bond Principal Payment. Vote on the motion Peterson, Whitlock, Steiner, Oachs, and Carlson, aye, no nays. Motion carried.

Res. No. 9-23 Accepting Bid Project 2023 Mill & Overlay Project.

City Engineer Sarff reported that bids were opened on Tuesday, January 10th at 11:00 am for the 2023 Street and Miscellaneous Paving Improvement Project. The base bid Street Mill and Overlay included James Drive, Northridge Drive, Oak Terrace Drive, and Oak Terrace Court. The base bid Alley Mill and Overlays included four alleys and the Caswell West Parking Lot. Alternate bids included North Ridge Drive Sump Pump Service lines, Oak Terrace Drive Underdrain and Sump Pump Service lines, and Caswell West Parking Lot. There were three bidders with Nielsen Blacktopping, Inc. from Kasota, Minnesota, being the lowest. The low bid for the base bid is approximately 4% lower than the engineer's estimate and approximately 8% below the next low bid. Several bids were removed from the project cost in order for the City to remain within the budget. The final bid amount to be rewarded is \$535,150.

Council Member Steiner moved, seconded by Council Member Oachs to Adopt Res. No. 9-23 Accepting Bid Project 2023 Mill & Overlay Project. Vote on the motion Peterson, Whitlock, Steiner, Oachs, and Carlson, aye, no nays. Motion carried.

Approve The North Mankato Road Right of Way Plat No. 1

Community Development Director Fischer reported that in the summer of 2023, the City would be installing a roundabout at the intersection of Lor Ray Drive and Howard Drive. To accommodate the design and construction of the roundabout, it is necessary for the City to acquire additional road

right of way in the area. The City has negotiated the purchase of land needed with the adjacent landowners. As part of the process, it is necessary to formally replat the property at the intersection. The Planning Commission reviewed and recommended the final plat.

Council Member Whitlock moved, seconded by Council Member Steiner to Approve The North Mankato Road Right of Way Plat No. 1. Vote on the motion Peterson, Whitlock, Steiner, Oachs, and Carlson, aye, no nays. Motion carried.

Res. No. 10-23 Supporting the State Bonding for the Regional Waste Water Resource Recovery Facility.

Interim Finance Director McCann reported that the resolution would support the bonding request for the Regional Sewage and Wastewater Treatment plant in Mankato. The City of North Mankato utilizes the facility. The estimated cost of the upgrade is currently \$89 million, and Mankato is requesting \$44.5 million. Mankato plans to start the project in 2024 and complete the preparation work in 2023. The City of North Mankato will soon renew a five-year contract for use of the facility.

Council Member Steiner moved, seconded by Council Member Oachs to adopt Res. No. 10-23 Supporting the State Bonding for the Regional Waste Water Resource Recovery Facility. Vote on the motion Peterson, Whitlock, Steiner, Oachs, and Carlson, aye, no nays. Motion carried.

Res. No. 11-23 to Support the Authority to Extend a Local Sales Tax to Fund Specific Capital Improvements Providing Regional Benefits, to Establish the Duration of the Tax and the Revenue to be Raised by the Tax, and to Authorize the City to Issue Bonds Supported by the Sales Tax Revenue.

City Administrator McCann reported the resolution relates to the Work Session and funding the Caswell Recreation Facility by extending the Local Option Sales Tax by \$6 million. He noted that the City's lobbyist Ward Einess stated that a specific project must be identified. Extending the tax with the plan of supporting the Caswell Recreation Facility, a regional facility, that may receive State support through the bonding request. Both Representative Brands and State Senator Frentz are ready to move forward with promoting the request.

Council Member Oachs questioned why only the Caswell Indoor Recreational facility is mentioned and not other options. City Administrator McCann reported that a specific project must be identified. Mayor Carlson asked if the bonding is not approved and the sales tax is approved can the Council reallocate the funds? City Administrator McCann said yes, as the other options approved by the referendum are still in the bill.

Council Member Whitlock stated that \$6 million is being requested for the Indoor Recreational Facility. If it is not approved, the City will not move forward with the facility. Council Member Peterson commented that if the City gets the extended sales tax and does not get the bonding for the facility, the City cannot move forward with the project. He also addressed concerns from a citizen by stating that the library, which received sales tax funds for its expansion, provides activities and access to the arts. City Administrator McCann reported the library is interested in using the indoor facility space for events and programming.

Council Member Steiner moved, seconded by Council Member Oachs to Adopt Res. No. 11-23 to Support the Authority to Extend a Local Sales Tax to Fund Specific Capital Improvements Providing Regional Benefits, to Establish the Duration of the Tax and the Revenue to be Raised by the Tax, and to Authorize the City to Issue Bonds Supported by the Sales Tax Revenue. Vote on the motion Peterson, Whitlock, Steiner, and Carlson, aye, Oachs nay. Motion carried.

Open Forum

Tom Hagen, 927 Lake Street, appeared before Council and requested an apology following a public nuisance process.

Mark Haack, 713 Bennett Street, appeared before Council and stated the snow removal by City staff has been inadequate.

City Administrator and Staff Comments

City Administrator McCann reported that the Adult Spelling Bee would occur on January 27, 2023, at the Mankato Brewery and encouraged residents to register.

City Administrator McCann reminded residents of the 14th Annual Anthony Ford Pond Hockey Tournament that will be held on Saturday, January 28th, and Sunday, January 29th, at Spring Lake Park.

City Administrator McCann reported the Weight Loss Challenge kicked off last Thursday, but you can still register.

City Administrator McCann reminded residents about the Boulevard Tree program. The City offers homeowners the opportunity to purchase a boulevard tree at a reduced price. The application deadline is February 15th.

City Administrator McCann reported that staff is currently working on widening the streets and clearing boulevards of excess snow. Please be patient as it takes time to work through the City.

Mayor and Council Comments

Council Member Oachs stated that even if she voted against the Sales Tax Extension, she is still interested in the Caswell project.

Council Member Steiner commented on a large amount of snow received this year and thanked staff for their work.

Council Member Whitlock commented that snow removal would be easier if there had not been all of the rain.

Mayor Carlson welcomed Public Work Director Arnold. Mayor Carlson stated was excited about being a part of the Council and the process.

Mayor Carlson thanked the Fire Department for their work.

At 7:50 pm, on a motion by Council Member Steiner, seconded by Council Member Oachs, the Council Meeting was adjourned.

Pursuant to due call and notice thereof, a Council Work Session of the North Mankato City Council was held in the Council Chambers on January 17, 2023. Mayor Carlson called the meeting to order at 6:00 pm. The following were present for roll call: Council Members Steiner, Oachs, Peterson, Whitlock, Carlson, City Administrator McCann, Interim Finance Director Ryan, Public Works Director Arnold (remote), and City Clerk Van Genderen.

Caswell Regional Sporting Complex and Sales Tax History

City Administrator McCann stated that the presentation would cover all the topics listed on the Council Work Session Agenda. He indicated that former Mayor Dehen, Caswell Sports Director Tostenson, and a representative from R.W. Carlstrom, ISG, and the Tennis Association were available to answer questions.

City Administrator McCann reported that since 1987 approximately 850,000 people had visited Caswell Park. The complex hosts local youth softball, regional tournaments, and adult softball. The State Girls' High School State Tournament has been held at Caswell since 1994, with 32 teams with 10,700 people in attendance, in 2022. Additional use includes national and international tournaments and teams.

In 2006, the voters passed a referendum to approve a Local Option Sales Tax allowing up to \$6 million to be raised to pay all or part of the capital costs of the Trunk Highway 14/County State-Aid Highway 41 interchange project, development of regional parks and hiking and biking trails, expansion of the North Mankato Taylor Library, riverfront development, and lake improvement projects. The legislature approved the request in 2008. In 2016, the voters approved a referendum for a \$15 million extension of the Local Option Sales Tax for regional parks, hiking and biking trails, existing and new recreational facilities, expansion of North Mankato Taylor Library, riverfront redevelopment, and lake improvements. In 2017, the legislature approved \$9 million of the \$15 million dollar approved referendum. City Administrator McCann reported that the question is, should the City be authorized to extend the one-half of one percent (0.5%) local option sales and use tax through 2038 in an amount not to exceed \$15 million to finance the acquisition and development of regional parks, hiking and biking trails, existing and new recreational facilities, expansion of the North Mankato Taylor Library, riverfront redevelopment, and lake improvements.

City Administrator McCann reviewed the uses of the Local Option Sales Tax, which included the 2009C bonds for a Library expansion, riverfront redevelopment, and park improvements totaling \$2,560,000. The 2021A bonds included Caswell Park Improvements for \$1,225,164, Caswell North Turf for \$1,285,430, and Caswell Indoor Recreation Plan development of \$686,790. Currently, the City has \$6,633,355 in bond funds sitting in designated Recreational Facility Funds.

City Administrator McCann reviewed the Caswell/Sales Tax Timeline. Highlights included the construction of Caswell Park in 1987, in 2005 there was a Caswell Land expansion identified with possibilities for indoor ice, and in 2006, the voters approved a 0.5% Sales Tax referendum which was enacted by the legislation in 2008. In 2011, discussion began on the need for a community center. In 2012, the discussion expanded to a multipurpose community center, and in 2015 the Caswell Park Master Plan was completed. In 2015, discussion began on the Sales Tax extension discussion with the desire to expand use to include indoor recreation facilities. The 2015 plan included indoor ice, an aquatic center, picnic areas, and a stormwater pond. The 2015 cost estimates for the proposed improvements were up to \$26,600,500, dependent upon the options selected. In 2015, the City Council authorized a resolution

requesting the extension of the existing sales and use tax. In 2016, the voters approved the extension for \$15 million, and in 2016-2018 community-wide discussion organized by Greater Mankato Growth discussed the need for indoor facilities. In 2017, the legislature approved \$9 million of the voter-approved \$15 million. Moving forward in 2018, a community discussion was held concerning the pursuit of indoor recreation with local and regional significance. In 2019 the City retained Pinnacle Indoor Sports to conduct an indoor recreational facility feasibility study and pro forma. In 2019, the City of North Mankato submitted a bonding bill request for Caswell Improvements which included Caswell Park, Caswell North, and Caswell Indoor Recreation. In 2019, Pinnacle Indoor Sports facility showed demand for a 44,000 sq. ft. facility, and a second larger 88,000 sq. ft. would allow for larger regional and national tournaments with an estimated cost of \$13.5 million. In 2019, a Caswell Regional Fieldhouse user group subcommittee was formed with City Staff, Mayor and Council Members, and user groups. In 2020 the sub-committee developed a plan that showed a need for a 90,000 to 110,000 sq ft. facility. In January 2020, North Mankato submitted a bonding bill request for \$10.5 million for Caswell Improvements (Caswell Park, Caswell North, and Caswell Indoor Recreation), with the Indoor Recreation estimated at \$17.5 million. In the fall of 2020, North Mankato received a bonding bill appropriation for \$2.0 million for Caswell Improvements (Caswell Park, Caswell North, and Caswell Indoor Recreation). In 2021, Caswell Park and Caswell North Improvements were designed and bid. In 2022, North Mankato submitted a bonding bill request for \$8.5 million for the Caswell Indoor Recreation facility. In December of 2022, North Mankato resubmitted the Caswell Indoor Recreation bonding bill request for \$8.5 million, with an inflationary increase of \$1.5 million, for a total of \$10 million request with an estimated construction cost of \$23.2 million. In January 2023, North Mankato seeks to extend the sales tax collections by \$6 million to be in line with the \$15 million voters approved in 2016.

City Administrator McCann reviewed the facilities' discussion and progress. He noted that Bethany, MSU-Mankato, ISD 77, Mankato, and North Mankato began to assess facility needs independently. Bethany identified and constructed their own facility, MSU identified the need for a sports dome, and ISD continues long-range facility studies. Mankato prioritized Tourtellotte, Thomas Fields, and Rosa Parks as specific needs. North Mankato continues the discussion of Caswell Improvements and expansion of indoor recreation.

City Administrator McCann reviewed the Caswell Softball, and Caswell North improvements completed or being completed in 2022/2023. Improvements at Caswell Softball included concessions and restrooms, PA and streaming, scoreboards and new lights, bigger dugouts, vinyl fencing, new pads for knee walls and backstop, and batting cages. Caswell North improvements included a turf championship field, an additional full-size blue grass field, a bleacher press box, and LED lighting. Some items were not able to be completed due to budgetary constraints.

City Administrator McCann reviewed the proposed plans for the Indoor Recreation Facility, including the 44,000 sq ft option, the 88,000 sq ft option, a 2020 Caswell Indoor Recreation option by Wilkus of 91,866 sq ft., a Wilkus option for 95,733 sq. ft, a 2021 Preliminary plan by ISG for 118,000 sq. ft. and the current plan in 2022 of 120,000 sq ft. He reviewed proposed estimates for the latest plan, which has alternatives and could cost up to \$23,172,914 million.

City Administrator McCann reported that the following users had confirmed their Memorandum of Understanding. Confirmed with a written agreement includes Greater Mankato Tennis Association, MN Attack, MN Rise, MNSU, Mankato Basketball Association, and

Bethany Lutheran College. Those with verbal commitments include the Mankato Area Pickleball Association and ISD 77.

City Administrator McCann reviewed the pro forma provided by Pinnacle in 2019, which showed the facility nearly breaking even after four years. The City is awaiting an updated pro forma from Pinnacle. In 2019, City staff prepared a pro forma which showed a slight surplus after four years. In 2023, the staff updated the pro forma and showed the facility losing money after four years due to the exclusion of batting cages and inflation. An opportunity exists to cover the loss with naming rights.

City Administrator McCann reported next steps would include the approval of the sales tax extension resolution to help fund the projected construction shortfall. The resolution would need to be passed and submitted to the legislature by the end of January. The City would want to reconvene the subcommittee and architects to explore design options.

Council Member Whitlock stated that the City needs to make its intentions known before the end of January. Mayor Carlson stated that if the City is going to complete the project, it should be done right and expressed concerns about the current design and lack of storage and other options. An ISG representative stated that the footprint could be changed to accommodate changes, and the facility was set on the property in a way that additional space could be added. Council Member Peterson noted the building was not landlocked and had availability for expansion.

Mark Dehen, 1706 Lor Ray Drive, stated that approving the resolution as written focusing on the Caswell Indoor Sports Facility does not eliminate the original allowed uses approved by the voters and legislature. If the 10 million bonding request does not go through, other options remain viable within the approved options. He noted that the reduction of courts would eliminate the ability of the facility to accommodate regional and national tournaments.

City Administrator McCann provided a user group MOU overview, which included user hours. Mayor Carlson requested Caswell Sports Director Tostenson to provide information concerning usage. Caswell Sports Director Tostenson reported the facility would be busy, and there would be the option for community use hours. City Administrator McCann reported that the library would like to use the facility for events. He also suggested this might be a good time to review the option for a walking track to increase community use.

Council Member Oachs asked if Caswell Park was still requiring a transfer from the General Fund. City Administrator McCann reported yes; it still required a \$77,000 transfer from the General Fund. She questioned if Caswell was not in the black, how would the City be able to get the Caswell Indoor Recreational facility in the black? Council Member Peterson noted that the facility would have more uses and more users, making it have a better chance of getting into the black. Council Member Oachs noted that the City is good at running Caswell Softball why not just focus on what they are good at? Council Member Peterson noted that the City was not good at soccer nine years ago, but now people enjoy coming to Caswell North as it is an excellent facility. The facility would also run year-round, not just six months a year.

Mayor Carlson noted that North Mankato is the center of activity in south central Minnesota as it is set between the twin cities and Sioux Falls, which both have significant sports activities.

Council Member Oachs noted she is concerned about balancing the budget and ensuring the facility does not impact the General Fund. Council Member Steiner stated user groups will help make up the deficit. Mayor Carlson commented that the facility needs to be built in such a way as to continue the strong commitment of the partners. Council Member Oachs requested

clarification on if the letters of commitment have expirations. Caswell Sports Director Tostenson stated they do not, but once the users are utilizing the facility, they will not want to leave as there are no additional expectations of the partners to build. He noted that there are options to obtain sponsorship dollars. Council Member Peterson commented that after the facility is built, terms of use could be negotiated. City Administrator McCann reported the MOUs could be changed into contracts.

Audio Permit

About:

An audio permit is required for anyone operating outdoor amplified sound (i.e., a loudspeaker, public address system, or sound amplifying equipment). All Audio Permits must be approved by the Council. The sound system cannot be operated before 7:00 am or after 10:00 pm. There is a \$25 fee.

Audio Permit Responsibilities:

- An onsite event coordinator must be available by mobile during the event.
- An applicant will provide a schedule of any music or entertainment proposed to occur during the event.
- A beginning and end time must be supplied on the application, and the event coordinator must ensure compliance.
- Applicants must comply with City Code Ordinance 90.045 and Minnesota Rules Chapter 7030 which limits noise.
- Noise levels cannot exceed 60 dBA more than 50 percent of the time.

What happens if there is a noise complaint?

- A North Mankato Patrol Officer will meet with the complainant and evaluate and measure the noise using a
 decibel reader at the location of the complainant.
- If the noise is found out of compliance, the Patrol Officer will contact the onsite event coordinator, and the amplified sound must be turned down.
- If the onsite event coordinator does not comply, the event will be immediately terminated, and the group will be disbursed.
- Failure to comply will affect future ability to obtain an audio permit.

The decision to waive or not waive the statutory tort limits must be made annually by the member's governing body, in consultation with its attorney if necessary.

Members who obtain liability coverage from LMCIT must decide whether to waive the statutory tort liability limits to the extent of the coverage purchased. The decision has the following effects:

- If the member does not waive the statutory tort limits, an individual claimant could recover no more than \$500,000 on any claim to which the statutory tort limits apply. The total all claimants could recover for a single occurrence to which the statutory tort limits apply would be limited to \$1,500,000. These statutory tort limits would apply regardless of whether the member purchases the optional LMCIT excess liability coverage.
- If the member waives the statutory tort limits and does not purchase excess liability coverage, a single claimant could recover up to \$2,000,000 for a single occurrence (under the waive option, the tort cap liability limits are only waived to the extent of the member's liability coverage limits, and the LMCIT per occurrence limit is \$2,000,000). The total all claimants could recover for a single occurrence to which the statutory tort limits apply would also be limited to \$2,000,000, regardless of the number of claimants.
- If the member waives the statutory tort limits and purchases excess liability coverage, a single claimant could potentially recover an amount up to the limit of the coverage purchased. The total all claimants could recover for a single occurrence to which the statutory tort limits apply would also be limited to the amount of coverage purchased, regardless of the number of claimants.

Claims to which the statutory municipal tort limits do not apply are not affected by this decision.
