#### **Business Items**

### Res. No. 17-21 Requesting the Advance of Municipal State Aid Funds for Municipal Construction Projects and Bond Principal Payment.

City Engineer Sarff reported the Minnesota Department of Transportation allows cities to advance municipal state aid funds as required to construct state-aid projects when the city's Municipal State Aid Construction account does not have adequate funds to cover the eligible project costs. In 2020, the City had requested an advance of municipal state aid funds for the construction of several projects, including the 2020 State Aid Overlay Project and the Monroe Avenue Street & Utility Reconstruction Project. Decreased transportation revenue in 2020 due to the COVID 19 pandemic resulted in MnDOT issuing a temporary moratorium on state aid advances. The City received less state aid funds than anticipated for the 2020 State Aid Overlay Project and the Monroe Avenue Street & Utility Reconstruction Project. Municipal State Aid advances will resume on a limited basis in 2021, and the City is eligible to make an advance request. The proposed advance would include the remaining state aid funds on the projects started in 2020, as well as the principal payment on existing state aid bond that was issued in 2015 to finance the City's portion of the Trunk Highway 14/County State Aid Highway 41 (Rockford Road) interchange project.

Council Member Norland moved, seconded by Council Member Whitlock, to adopt Res. No. 17-21 Requesting the Advance of Municipal State Aid Funds for Municipal Construction Projects and Bond Principal Payment. Vote on the motion: Norland, Oachs, Whitlock, Steiner, and Dehen aye; no nays. Motion carried.

## Res. No. 18-21 Supporting Pursuit of Local Road Improvement Program Funding from the Minnesota Department of Transportation for the Lor Ray Drive and Somerset Lane Improvement Project.

City Engineer Sarff reported in 2020, the Minnesota Legislature appropriated approximately \$75 million in bond funds statewide to the Local Roads Improvement Program (LRIP). A portion of the program provides funds for the costs of constructing or reconstructing city streets, county highways, or town roads with statewide or regional significance. This is a competitive grant opportunity available to cities, counties, and townships throughout the state. The maximum amount of each grant is \$1,250,000. Staff is recommending a grant application for the Lor Ray Drive and Somerset Lane improvement in the amount of \$1,250,000 be submitted. The project would include reconstructing the existing two-lane roadways on Lor Ray Drive and Somerset Lane with a 40-footwide bituminous street with curb and gutter on both sides. The reconstruction would also include a mini-roundabout at the intersection of Lor Ray Drive and Carlson Drive/Countryside Drive.

Council Member Norland moved, seconded by Council Member Steiner, to adopt Res. No. 18-21 Supporting Pursuit of Local Road Improvement Program Funding from the Minnesota Department of Transportation for the Lor Ray Drive and Somerset Lane Improvement Project. Vote on the motion: Norland, Oachs, Whitlock, Steiner, and Dehen aye; no nays. Motion carried.

### Approval of Final Plat of Pleasant View Cottages: A Request from ALH Land Company.

Community Development Director Fischer reported in January 2021 the applicant received the approval of the Preliminary Plat of Pleasant View Cottages. The plat accommodates the development of three new townhome buildings on a piece of property being annexed into the City limits along Pleasant View Drive. The final plat consists of one lot to accommodate the 3 new townhome buildings, 2 new driveways, a stormwater pond, an existing home, and an existing storage building.

The proposed platting meets all of the City Code regulations, including building setback, density requirements, lot size requirements, ground coverage, and building height regulations within an R-3 zoning district.

Council Member Whitlock moved, seconded by Council Member Norland, to Approve Final Plat of Pleasant View Cottages: A Request from ALH Land Company. Vote on the motion: Norland, Oachs, Whitlock, Steiner, and Dehen aye; no nays. Motion carried.

Pursuant to due call and notice thereof, a Council Work Session of the North Mankato City Council was held in the Council Chambers on February 22, 2021. Mayor Dehen called the meeting to order at 12:00 pm. The following were present remotely through Zoom for roll call: Council Members Oachs, Steiner, Whitlock, and Mayor Dehen, Finance Director McCann, Public Works Director Host, Caswell Sports Director Tostenson, and City Clerk Van Genderen. Absent: Council Member Norland and City Administrator Harrenstein. Citizen monitoring was available through a conference call.

### **Caswell Sports Bonding Project Presentation**

Public Works Director Host presented the Caswell Sports Bonding Project. In 2016 voters authorized a 15 million dollar extension of the existing local option sales and use tax to be collected until 2038. The allowed purposes included developing regional parks, hiking, biking trails, existing and new recreational facilities, expansion of the North Mankato Taylor Library, riverfront redevelopment, and lake improvement projects. In 2019 the Minnesota Legislature granted the extension but reduced the amount to \$9,000,000 for the ballot question's purposes. In 2020 the City of North Mankato requested 10.5 million dollars from the State of Minnesota to be matched with local option sales tax and general fund revenues to complete deferred maintenance at Caswell Park and to construct an indoor recreational facility. In 2020 the Minnesota Legislature granted a 2.0 million dollar grant to the City of North Mankato for Phase I capital improvements and deferred maintenance at the Caswell Park Sporting Complex.

Public Works Director Host reviewed the Caswell Softball Proposed Phase 1 Improvements. Improvements include \$765,000 to upgrade, improve and replace fencing, backstops, and netting. Lighting upgrades for fields 1-4, \$547,000. Concession and restroom upgrades, including concession expansion and ADA upgrades to the bathrooms for \$272,000. New dugouts and dugout benches for \$235,000. Streaming IT upgrades and PA system improvements for \$210,000. Shade Covers for observes for bleachers on fields 1-6 for \$125,000. Removing pavers and replacing them with concrete for \$125,000. The design and bidding for the field improvements will cost approximately \$110,000. Six new scoreboards for fields 1-6 for \$100,000. Bleacher expansion for fields 5 and 6 for \$56,000. Trees for outlining the outfield fence for fields 1-6 \$55,000. Three new pitching/batting warm-up cages for \$30,000. Expansion of Fields 2 and 3 to 300 feet has a cost of \$20,000. The total for Caswell Phase I Improvements is \$2,650,000.

Public Works Director Host reviewed a list of considered but currently not proposed items. Those include turn infields, upper deck viewing improvements, kiosk upgrades, championship field scoreboard, West parking lot improvements, and north parking lot improvements for a total of \$1,910,000. Mayor Dehen requested clarification if the work being completed would still make a championship video board a possibility. Public Works Director Host reported it would work to convert to a championship board at a later date.

Public Works Director Host reviewed the Caswell North Soccer Complex Proposed Phase 1 Improvement. Improvements include installing synthetic turf on the championship field and creating a second championship grade field with the original championship field's excess soils. Lighting upgrade to the turf championship field from 30 candles to 50 candles and installing 30 candles on the new championship grass field. Installation of a bleacher and press box at the Championship field. Caswell Soccer upgrades would equal \$1,838,300.

Public Works Director Host reviewed the Caswell Indoor Recreation Center Proposed Phase 1 Design. Total expenditures for the Recreation Center is \$500,000, which is mainly architectural design services.

The total for Proposed Phase 1 Improvements is \$2,650,000 for Caswell Softball Upgrades, \$1,850,000 for Caswell Soccer Turf Field improvements, and \$500,000 for Indoor Recreation Design services for a total proposed Phase One Improvement Budget of \$5,000,000.

Funding for the project includes \$2,300,000 from Sales Tax Bonds, \$2,000,000 from the State of Minnesota Bonding, a \$500,000 donation from the Mankato United Soccer Club, and a \$200,000 donation from Mankato Adult Softball for a total revenue of \$5,000,000.

Council Member Oachs requested clarification on what would happen to the items that were removed and replaced including backstops, bleachers and old utilities. Public Works Director Host responded that with the use of State Bonding money there maybe restrictions on what can be done with the materials that are removed, but he would be speaking with them.

Council Member Oachs requested clarification on if consideration could be made to not removing the pavers, instead using those funds for a championship board. Public Works Director Host stated it could be considered.

Council Member Whitlock expressed his excitement about the improvements and how the park will become the jewel of Southern Minnesota.

Mayor Dehen commented that several actions will be brought forward to allow for the bidding of the projects and moving them forward in a timely manner.

Council Member Whitlock moved, seconded by Council Member Steiner, to adjourn the meeting at 12:37 pm.

### **Audio Permit**

#### About:

An audio permit is required for anyone operating outdoor amplified sound (i.e., a loudspeaker, public address system, or sound amplifying equipment). All Audio Permits must be approved by the Council. The sound system cannot be operated before 7:00 am or after 10:00 pm. There is a \$25 fee.

### **Audio Permit Responsibilities:**

- An onsite event coordinator must be available by mobile during the event.
- An applicant will provide a schedule of any music or entertainment proposed to occur during the event.
- A beginning and end time must be supplied on the application, and the event coordinator must ensure compliance.
- Applicants must comply with City Code Ordinance 90.045 and Minnesota Rules Chapter 7030, which limits noise.
- Noise levels cannot exceed 60 dBA more than 50 percent of the time.

### What happens if there is a noise complaint?

- A North Mankato Patrol Officer will meet with the complainant and evaluate and measure the noise using a decibel reader at the location of the complainant.
- If the noise is found out of compliance, the Patrol Officer will contact the onsite event coordinator, and the amplified sound must be turned down.
- If the onsite event coordinator does not comply, the event will be immediately terminated, and the group will be disbursed.
- Failure to comply will affect future ability to obtain an audio permit.

### COMMENT

Attached as Exhibit A is a request from Select Management LLC to amend City Code Section 156.041 (J) which is located in the R-4 Zoning Regulations. The purpose of the R-4 zoning district is to create opportunities for high density residential development. The current regulation pertaining to maximum building height is as follows:

(J) Height regulations. No structure hereafter erected or altered shall exceed 3 stories or 45 feet in height, except as may be permitted in division (D)(4) of this section, as regulated by this chapter. Accessory uses shall not exceed 1-1/2 stories or 22 feet in height.

As the applicant is proposing to construct a new 4 story apartment complex, it would not exceed 45 feet in height. However, the current language limits any new building not to exceed 3 stories. Attached as Exhibit B is a rendering of what the apartment may look like. The location of the apartment building would be at the intersection of Marie Lane and Tower Boulevard on property zoned R-4. Note that this is the only vacant property within the City zoned as R-4.

For comparison, attached as Exhibit C is summary of building height regulations used by other cities in high density zoning districts.

### RECOMMENDATION

Based on the results from the City survey, most other cities allow buildings up to 45 feet and higher in high density residential districts. Therefore, staff recommends an amendment for a maximum building height of 45 feet with no reference to the number of stories.

Our proposed design for our building would have a flat roof structure to allow us to stay under the current City Code height requirement of 45 feet.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NORTH MANKATO, MINNESOTA, that a hearing shall be held on the 5<sup>th</sup> day of April 2021 in the City Council Chambers of City Hall, 1001 Belgrade Avenue, North Mankato, Minnesota at 7:00 p.m., to pass upon such proposed assessment. All persons owning property affected by such improvement will be given an opportunity to be heard with reference to such assessment, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the City Clerk is hereby directed to cause a notice of the hearing on the proposed assessment to be published once in the official newspaper at least two weeks prior to the hearing, and the City Clerk shall state in the notice the total cost of the improvement. The City Clerk shall also cause mailed notice to be given to the owner of each parcel described in the assessment roll not less than two weeks prior to the hearing.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the owner of any property so assessed may, at any time prior to the date specified in the assessment resolution and notices, pay the whole of the assessment on such property, with interest accrued to the date of payment, to the City Clerk, except that no interest shall be charged if the entire assessment is paid by the date specified in the assessment resolution and notices. An owner may at any time thereafter, pay to the City Clerk the entire amount of the assessment remaining unpaid, with interest accrued to December 31 of the year in which such payment is made. Such payment must be made before November 15 or interest will be charged through December 31 of the succeeding year.

### JOINT USE AGREEMENT

<u>PARTIES.</u> The Parties of this Agreement are the City of North Mankato, a Minnesota municipal corporation, referred to herein as "the City", and Independent School District No. 77, Mankato, a Minnesota public corporation referred to herein as "District 77".

<u>RECITALS.</u> District 77 is the fee title owner of real estate in the City of North Mankato, Nicollet County, Minnesota described as:

Lot 1 of Block 1, Caswell Park North Subdivision, and Outlot A, Caswell Park North Subdivision

It is the intent of District 77 to construct upon Lot 1 of Block 1 of said subdivision an elementary school building, together with all necessary exterior improvements for use with said school building, including a hard-surfaced parking lot. District 77 does not have need for the exclusive use of Outlot A of said subdivision for the construction of the elementary school and related improvements. City does have a need for the use of Outlot A and portions of Block 1 for the purposes of athletic fields and related improvements. A Joint Use Agreement executed by both parties on March 24, 2011, referred to herein as "Previous Agreement", set forth the provisions agreed to by both parties regarding the joint use of Outlot A. Subsequent to the execution of the Previous Agreement, the City constructed athletic fields and related improvements on Outlot A. In cooperation with District 77, the City also constructed driveway and parking area improvements on Outlot A and portions of Lot 1 of Block 1. Both Parties agree that said driveway and parking lot improvements are intended to jointly serve the City's athletic field improvements and District 77's future elementary school. The City desires to continue the rights to use Outlot A and to continue and expand the rights to use of that portion of Lot 1 of Block 1 defined in this agreement. For their mutual benefit, the parties agree as follows:



- 1. Upon execution of this Agreement, the Previous Agreement (Joint Use Agreement executed on March 24, 2011) is null and void and replaced with the provisions of this Agreement.
- 2. District 77 hereby grants to the City the right to nonexclusive use of the property owned by District 77 as described as follows, referred to here as "Subject Property", subject to the terms, limitations and covenants contained herein:

- a. Outlot A, Caswell Park North Subdivision
- b. That portion of Lot 1, Block 1 Caswell Park North Subdivision encompassing the existing driveway, the existing parking lot, and the recreational field addition, described as follows and shown on the attached Exhibit 1:
  - Beginning at the Northwest corner of said Lot 1, Block 1; thence South 00 degrees 27 minutes 20 seconds East (bearing based on Nicollet County Coordinate System NAD83, 2011 Adjustment), along the west line of said Lot 1, Block 1, a distance of 600.00 feet; thence South 41 degrees 10 minutes 31 seconds East along said west line, a distance of 445.87 feet; thence South 00 degrees 32 minutes 19 seconds East along said west line, a distance of 345.00 feet to the Southwest corner of said Lot 1, Block 1; thence North 89 degrees 27 minutes 41 seconds East along the south line of said Lot 1, Block 1, a distance of 308.50 feet; thence North 00 degrees 32 minutes 19 seconds West, a distance of 440.75 feet; thence South 89 degrees 27 minutes 41 seconds West, a distance of 292.50 feet; thence North 41 degrees 10 minutes 31 seconds West, a distance of 426.50 feet; thence North 00 degrees 27 minutes 20 seconds West, a distance of 518.91 feet to the north line of said Lot 1, Block 1; thence South 89 degrees 32 minutes 40 seconds West along said north line, a distance of 28.50 feet to the point of beginning.
- 3. District 77 hereby grants to the City the right to continue use of the previously constructed athletic fields and related improvements on Outlot A.
- 4. City shall, within 24 months of the execution of this Agreement, make improvements, described as follows:
  - a. Construction of improvements to the existing athletic fields and related facilities currently located within Outlot A.
  - b. Construction of new athletic fields and related facilities said portion of Lot 1 of Block 1.
  - c. All such construction will be in accordance with plans to be submitted to and approved by District 77.
  - d. All such construction shall be at the sole expense of the City or such funding partners as may be identified by the City.
  - 5. City shall have the right to make rules and regulations with respect to use of the facilities it creates and establishes upon the Subject Property and said portions of as it shall deem appropriate.
- 6. City shall at all times during the existence of this Agreement maintain the improvements constructed on the Subject Property. Such maintenance shall include but is not limited to: grass mowing and weed control; removal of debris; snow removal, maintenance and reconstruction of driveways, sidewalks, trails, and parking areas; repair and reconstruction of any physical structures or improvements; and all such other acts as shall be necessary to keep the property in an attractive condition and fit for the intended purposes of said improvements on Subject Property.
- 7. At such times as District 77 is not using the driveway and parking areas located on Subject Property, the City and its invitees shall be allowed to use said driveway and parking areas for events on the Subject Property. District 77 shall be allowed to use the athletic fields and facilities to be constructed by City for purposes of the District's education program including co-curricular activities during school days.

### RESOLUTION ESTABLISHING CASWELL PARK IMPROVEMENTS-STATE BONDING FUND, APPROVING A TRANSFER FROM THE GENERAL FUND, AND DETERMINING THE CITY'S INTENT TO REIMBURSE THE TRANSFER FROM THE PROCEEDS OF THE SALE OF BONDS

WHEREAS, The City is undertaking improvements to Caswell Park in the City (the "Project"). The State of Minnesota is providing a grant in the amount of \$2,000,000 for the Project provided the City provides a match of City funds in the amount of \$750,000.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved, by the City Council of the City of North Mankato, Minnesota as follows:

- 1. <u>Establishment of Caswell Park Fund</u>. The City Council does hereby establish a Caswell Park Improvements–State Bonding Fund for the Project (the "Caswell Park Fund").
- 2. <u>Transfer and Deposit into Caswell Park Fund</u>. The City Council does hereby authorize the permanent transfer and deposit of \$750,000 from the General Fund of the City into the Caswell Park Fund.
- 3. <u>Reimbursement</u>. The City proposes to issue bonds to finance costs of the Project. The City shall reimburse the General Fund from the proceeds of the bonds for the \$750,000 permanent deposit of General Fund monies into the Caswell Park Fund.
