Pursuant to due call and notice thereof, a Council Workshop of the North Mankato City Council was held in the Council Chambers of the Municipal Building on April 4, 2011. The meeting was called to order at 6 p.m. The following were present for the meeting: Mayor Dehen, Council Members Norland, Schindle, Steiner and Freyberg, City Administrator Sande, Finance Director Mork and City Clerk Gehrke.

#### VINE

Pam Determan, Executive Director of VINE Faith in Action, appeared before the Council and reported VINE has assumed the management of the Summit Center which now serves over 400 people. She asked for the City's support as VINE raises funds to obtain and rehabilitate the Nichols Building to house the senior programming of the Summit Center and consolidate the offices and programs of their organization. She reported Blue Earth County has agreed to sell the Nichols Building to VINE for \$1.00 providing they can generate the resources needed to renovate the building. Funds needed to rehabilitate the exterior are estimated at \$1.7 million and are needed by this fall. The total project cost is \$4.3 million. She asked the Council to consider having a member serve on the Development Task Force. Council Member Norland asked if Executive Director Determan has applied for funds from the Federal Home Loan Bank Board and USDA Rural Development. She asked Ms. Determan to contact her regarding other areas of funding. The Mayor asked for a volunteer from the Council to serve on the VINE Development Team.

#### **Swim Facility**

Administrator Sande reported the operation of the swim facility was included in the approved 2011 General Fund Expenditures Budget. Since no definitive information has been received from the Legislature regarding LGA cuts, staff asked for a determination from the Council on how to proceed with the swim facility. Finance Director Mork has estimated a net savings of \$57,375 in the General Fund if the swim facility is not opened in 2011. Council Member Schindle asked for a list of other items that could be cut in the parks in order to keep the swim facility open. The Council directed staff to proceed with hiring the personnel and to open the swim facility.

#### Proposed Amendment to Charitable Gambling Ordinance

Mayor Dehen reported the Lake Washington Improvement Association has requested the City consider amending the Charitable Gambling Ordinance to include two miles outside the boundaries of Independent School District No. 77. He reported the Lake Washington Improvement Association would like to have charitable gambling in Hott Shotts. Council Member Schindle requested a breakdown of the donations from the Lake Washington Improvement Association. Council Member Freyberg requested an inventory of all charitable gambling functions in Mankato and North Mankato.

#### **Port Authority**

Port Authority President Wade Hensel and Commissioner Bob Knutson, members of the North Mankato Port Authority Commission were in attendance to discuss revitalization efforts in the downtown and related issues. Council Member Freyberg reported he had several questions regarding the bylaws of the Port Authority. He asked if the current City Administrator has always been the Executive Vice President of the Port Authority. Administrator Sande reported he has been the Executive Vice President of the Port Authority since he was appointed City Administrator. The previous City Administrator was the Executive Vice President prior to that time. Council Member Freyberg asked about the times for the Port Authority meetings. He stated that 7:30 a.m. meetings limit the number of people able to attend. Administrator Sande reported the meeting times were changed for a period of time and the attendance was the same. He reported the meetings are televised

to give a broader audience access to the meetings. President Hensel reported that 7:30 a.m. was the best time for the Port Authority Commissioners. Council Member Freyberg reported he has heard from many of his constituents that they would like a different meeting time. President Hensel said meeting times would be discussed at a future Port Authority meeting.

Council Member Freyberg addressed the North Mankato Federal Revolving Loan Fund Guidelines, Section VII.B. Ineligible Activities, states that funds may not be used for retail businesses. Administrator Sande reported there are two divisions of funds and local funds may be used for retail. Council Member Freyberg stated in his opinion loaning up to 40 percent of a project cost is risky. He also asked who reviews the business plan prior to approval of a loan and if the loan request is referred to the City Council for approval. Administrator Sande reported that a Port Authority Loan Committee meets and reviews the application and makes a recommendation to the Port Authority Commission. Council Member Schindle reported that the loan funds are coming from the Revolving Loan Fund and not from the General Fund. Administrator Sande gave background information on the monies in the Revolving Loan Fund reporting the Coloplast and Capstone grants were repaid with interest and these funds are used to loan out for other projects. Administrator Sande also reported the Port Authority is usually the third position for a loan after the bank and the Small Business Administration (SBA). Discussion was held about possible revisions to the bylaws and this item will be discussed at a future Port Authority meeting.

Council Member Freyberg addressed the Business Subsidy Policy and referenced Section 16.994(2) which states the criteria may not be on a case-by-case basis. Administrator Sande reported the provision was made so that discretion could be exercised for projects that retained jobs versus creating jobs, such as in the Thin Film case.

Council Member Freyberg asked if the term "riverfront redevelopment" was used on the ballot when the vote was taken for the Local Option Sales Tax. Administrator Sande reported the state tax chair requested the term riverfront redevelopment to have consistent terminology with the City of Mankato's request; however, the riverfront redevelopment was defined as "Assist business development in the Central Business District." Administrator Sande will send the Council copies of the ballot and also the information given to residents prior to the election.

Council Member Freyberg asked that when an applicant has requested a loan that the applicant is required to be at the Port Authority meeting where the loan is being considered. He also requested that if a Port Authority Commissioner votes "no" on a question, that the Port Authority minutes reflect the reason he voted "no."

Mayor Dehen asked for a comprehensive plan for parking in the downtown area. He also reported the biggest concern for North Mankato is the lack of commercial property available for development.

President Hensel stated he appreciated the Council's discussion of the Port Authority and reported the Port Authority has the same interests in revitalization and economic development.

Commissioner Knutson reported the Port Authority Commissioners struggle when loans or grants are more subjective, but feel we have enough confidence and vision to make the right decisions.

#### **Approval of Minutes**

Council Member Freyberg moved, seconded by Council Member Steiner, to approve the minutes of the Council meeting of March 21, 2011. Vote on the motion: Freyberg, Steiner, Norland and Dehen, aye; Schindle abstained; no nays. Motion carried.

Correspondence – none.

#### Public Hearing, 7 p.m. - Consider Amendment to the 2010-2014 HUD Consolidated Plan

The Mayor opened the public hearing to consider the amendment to the 2010-2014 HUD Consolidated Plan. Planner Fischer reported a notice of hearing was published in the official newspaper. He reported that since the Cities of North Mankato and Mankato achieved Metropolitan Statistical Area status, the communities are eligible for Community Development Block grants. As a requirement to receive the grants, the City was required to submit to HUD a 2010-2014 Consolidated Plan which is used as a guideline of how the City will utilize annual Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funds. He reported that since the original submittal of the Consolidated Plan, other potential uses of CDBG funds not in the Plan have been identified. To include new uses of CDBG funding into the Plan, it is necessary to amend the Plan and hold a public hearing. Staff is recommending amending the 2010-2014 Plan to include the use of CDBG funds for the following projects: 1) Provide financial assistance to the South Central Small Business Development Center to provide technical assistance to small business owners; and 2) Acquisition of vacant parcels of residential land for development purposes. Council Member Freyberg reported he could not support giving \$30,000 to the SBDC until they provide an audited annual financial report. Council Member Norland reported that she heard the SBDC has provided a lot of help in setting up business plans for new entrepreneurs. Administrator Sande reported Region 9 is no longer hosting the SBDC and Minnesota State University-Mankato has agreed to serve as the host for the SBDC. He stated that all of us believe having a SBDC is helpful in attracting and maintaining businesses. Kim Spears, 916 South Avenue, appeared before the Council and asked for clarification about who is supporting the SBDC. Administrator Sande reported Region 9, South Central College, Minnesota State University-Minnesota and the Department of Employment and Economic Development are partners in the SBDC. Phil Henry, 1300 Noretta Drive, appeared before the Council and expressed that he would be inclined to ask for help from an experienced business person rather than the SBDC. Planner Fischer reported the 30-day comment period for the Consolidated Plan is now open. With no one else appearing before the Council, the Mayor closed this portion of the meeting. Council Member Freyberg moved, seconded by Council Member Schindle, to table consideration of the amendment to the 2010-2014 HUD Consolidated Plan until the Council has received an audited annual financial report for the Small Business Development Corporation and also received affidavits from entrepreneurs outlining the help the SBDC has provided to them. Vote on the motion: Schindle, Freyberg, Steiner, Norland and Dehen, aye; no nays. Motion carried.

#### Public Hearing, 7 p.m. – Consider Approval of the 2011 Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Action Plan

The Mayor opened the public hearing to consider the 2011 Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Action Plan. Planner Fischer reported a notice of hearing was published in the official newspaper. He reported in addition to amending the 2010-2014 HUD Consolidated Plan, it is necessary to develop a 2011 Action Plan for the use of the 2011-2012 CDBG funds. As proposed in the 2011-2012 CDBG Action Plan, the following are the recommended projects: 1) Assistance to the SBDC- \$30,000; Property Acquisition, 202 Christensen Street - \$35,000; Building Acquisition Contribution, 238 Belgrade Avenue - \$11,000; and Program Administration - \$8,000 for a total of \$84,000. Planner Fisher reported the 2010 CDBG allocation was \$96,068 and according to HUD, the City should plan for a 10-20 percent reduction in funds for 2011. Council Member Norland asked what was located at 238 Belgrade Avenue. Administrator Sande reported the Budget Mart at this location is in Chapter 7 bankruptcy and that since it is an important part of the Central Business District, the City would like to be in a position to consider a purchase of the property when it is available. He reported that federal funds could be used for the acquisition, demolition or retrofitting of the Budget Mart property. In response to a question, Planner Fischer reported the 2010 funds were used for homeowner assistance. With no one else appearing before the Council, the Mayor closed this portion of the meeting. Council Member Freyberg moved, seconded by Council Member Schindle, to table consideration of the 2011 Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Action Plan until the Council has received an audited annual financial report for the Small Business Development Corporation and also received affidavits from entrepreneurs outlining the help the SBDC has provided to them. Vote on the motion: Schindle, Freyberg, Steiner, Norland and Dehen, aye; no nays. Motion carried.

#### Public Hearing, 7 p.m. - Proposal to Modify Industrial Development District No. 1

The Mayor opened the public hearing to consider the modification of Industrial Development District No. 1 to include the 50.40-acre parcel recently acquired by the Port Authority for expansion of Northport Industrial Park. Administrator Sande reported a notice of hearing was published in the official newspaper. Kim Spears, 916 South Avenue, appeared before the Council and asked if this parcel was eligible for Tax Increment Financing. Administrator Sande reported the Port Authority could provide subsidies to this parcel. With no one else appearing before the Council, the Mayor closed this portion of the meeting.

#### Res. No. 25-11 Modifying Industrial Development District No. 1 and Adopting Development Program for Said Industrial Development District

Council Member Steiner moved, seconded by Council Member Norland, to adopt Resolution No. 25-11 Modifying Industrial Development District No. 1 and Adopting Development Program for Said Industrial Development District. Vote on the Resolution: Schindle, Freyberg, Steiner, Norland and Dehen, aye; no nays. Motion carried.

#### Open the Meeting to the Public for the First Time

The Mayor opened the meeting to the public for the first time with no one appearing.

### Staff Reports City Administrator Impound Agreement

Administrator Sande presented a letter and proposed Animal Impound Agreement with Premier Veterinary Center for the period of April 1, 2011 through December 31, 2013. He reported the proposed contract reflects a price increase of 15 percent from the current contract which began

August 1, 2005. The City of North Mankato has an excellent working relationship with Premier Veterinary Center and recommends approval of the new Impound Agreement. Council Member Norland reminded residents to not let their pets roam free. Council Member Norland moved, seconded by Council Member Steiner, to approve the Animal Impound Agreement with Premier Veterinary Center for the period of April 1, 2011 through December 31, 2013. Vote on the motion: Schindle, Freyberg, Steiner, Norland and Dehen, aye; no nays. Motion carried.

#### **Xcel Energy Rate Increase Notice**

Administrator Sande presented a notice of a proposed rate increase from Xcel Energy. He reported Xcel Energy must submit rate increase notices as required by Minnesota State 216B.16, Subd. 1 and their Franchise Agreement with the City of North Mankato.



#### **Residential Property**

Pricing tables in our computer software were updated, resulting in a revaluation of all residential homes. Increases and decreases varied, depending on numerous factors. Land value remained the same. There was 135 arm's length sales used in the October 2009 through September 2010 sales study. The ratio before any adjustments was 95.6%. The overall increase was 4.1%. Comparing our new values with those same sales, our ratio is 98.64%.

#### **Commercial/Industrial Property**

Pricing tables were updated for the commercial and industrial property. These properties were inspected and reviewed by our office. Increases and decreases varied, depending on numerous factors. There was no significant change in the overall value.





## NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING FOR AMENDMENT TO THE CITY CODE CHAPTER 111 ENTITLED "ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES" SPECIFICALLY SECTION 111.208 REGARDING THE REQUIREMENTS FOR LAWFUL GAMBLING

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the City Council of the City of North Mankato, Minnesota, will meet in the Council Chambers of the Municipal Building, 1001 Belgrade Avenue, North Mankato, Minnesota, at 7 p.m. on the 6<sup>th</sup> day of June, 2011, to hold a public hearing to amend Chapter 111 of the City Code entitled "Alcoholic Beverages," specifically Section 111.208 regarding the requirements for lawful gambling.

Such persons as desire to be heard with reference to the proposed amendment to the City Code will be heard at this meeting.

#### § 111.207 LICENSE REVOCATION OR SUSPENSION.

- (A) Responsible officer. The Chief of Police shall be responsible for investigating any violations of law or license limitations by any license holder. If the Chief of Police determines that a violation may warrant immediate disciplinary action, then the information concerning such violations shall be provided to the Council in a timely fashion. In all other situations, the Chief of Police shall coordinate with the City Clerk to provide the information to the Council at the time the City Clerk submits the application for renewal of licenses to the Council for consideration.
- (B) Council action. If the Council determines that disciplinary action may be warranted due to the information provided by the Chief of Police, then a formal hearing before the Council shall be scheduled. Notice of such hearing shall be given to the license holder at least 30 days prior to the hearing. The notice shall contain information adequate to advise the license holder concerning the allegations. The license holder shall have the right to appear at the Council meeting and to contest the claims. Upon the finding that the license holder has failed to comply with the law or a license restriction, the Council may suspend the license for up to 60 days or revoke the license or impose a civil fine not to exceed \$2,000 for each violation.
- (C) Civil and criminal penalties. The imposition of a suspension or revocation of a license as a civil penalty shall not impair the ability of lawful authority from filing criminal charges and seeking criminal penalties for any violation of law.

  (Ord. 121, passed 9-16-1991)

#### § 111.208 LAWFUL GAMBLING.

- (A) Leasing agreements. A licensee may lease any portion of the licensed premises to "qualified" organizations licensed to conduct lawful gambling pursuant to M.S. Ch. 349, as it may be amended from time to time. An organization is "qualified" for leasing purposes if it meets one of the following criteria:
  - (1) At least 40% of its active members reside within the city;
  - (2) Eighty percent of its active members reside within Minnesota School District 77; or
- (3) One hundred percent of net profits generated within the city are irrevocably designated to an eligible recipient as established from time to time by resolution of the Council and located within the corporate limits of the cities of North Mankato or Mankato, Minnesota. For those organizations qualifying under this subsection, a minimum of 40% of the net profits generated within the city will be restricted to the benefit of local residents as defined by the geographic area within Minnesota School District 77.
- (B) Liquor license renewals. At the time a licensee applies for renewal of a liquor license or permit, there shall be submitted to the City Clerk copies of all leasing agreements concerning any lawful

gambling covering any portion of the previous 12 months. The licensee shall also submit a copy of the verified statement of the organization concerning the residency requirement.

- (C) Leasing restrictions. The following restrictions apply to lawful gambling leases.
  - (1) A licensee may not lease to anyone except a "qualified" organization.
- (2) A licensee may not lease any portion of the licensed premises to more than 1 organization licensed to conduct lawful gambling at the same time.
- (3) The maximum term of such lease shall be no more than 2 years, but such lease may be renewed.

#### (D) Local gambling tax.

- (1) A tax of 3% shall be imposed upon the gross receipts generated within the city by licensed organizations from the conduct of lawful gambling activities. The 3% tax shall be levied on the gross receipts less the cost of prizes actually paid out by the organization.
- (2) The tax shall be paid to the city on a monthly basis, on or before the last business day of the month following the month for which the report is made. Such payment shall be accompanied by a report containing the following information upon such form as may be required by the City Finance Director:
- (a) Total amount of receipts from lawful gambling activities within the city during the reporting period.
- (b) The total amount of prizes actually paid out by the organization during the reporting period from such gross receipts.
  - (c) The signature of the person filing the return.
  - (d) The period covered by the return.

#### (E) Specific expenditures.

- (1) A licensed organization shall make specific expenditures of 10% from its net profits derived from lawful gambling. The 10% expenditure shall be levied on gross receipts generated within the city less prizes actually paid out by the organization and amounts expended for allowable expenses attributable to such gross receipts.
- (2) The specific expenditure shall be paid twice a year on or before June 30 and December 31 toward the lawful purpose established from time to time by resolution of the Council.

- (3) The licensed organization shall also submit the following information upon such form as may be required by the City Finance Director:
- (a) Total amount of receipts generated within the city from lawful gambling activities during the reporting period;
- (b) The total amount of prizes actually paid out attributable to the gross receipts by the organization during the reporting period;
- (c) The total amount of money expended for allowable expenses attributable to the gross receipts;
- (d) The amount of net profits derived from lawful gambling during the reporting period attributable to the gross profits;
  - (e) The identification of the lawful purpose to which such 10% expenditure was made;
  - (f) The signature of the person filing the report;
  - (g) The period covered by the report; and
- (h) A receipt from the person or entity representing the lawful purpose to which such 10% expenditure was made.

SUBJECT: Quotation for Electrical Work in the Central Business District

Under a previous contract, Kunkel Electric installed underground connections and street lighting as part of the Wall Street Project and removal of overhead electric lines in the Marigold Project area. In conjunction with the construction of additional parking spaces on Nicollet Avenue, we recommend removing the overhead electrical services in the east half of the alley behind the 200 Block on the south side of Belgrade. The enclosed diagram depicts the work to be constructed. We have reviewed the work with Xcel Energy and they are prepared to do their portion of the work during the early part of the month of May. We believe that placing the electric utilities underground will be a significant aesthetic improvement in the area. At the same time this work is accomplished, we will do some realignments of the storm sewer in the alley to provide better overall drainage.

The quote from Kunkel Electric including the installation of a new street cabinet on the east side of Nicollet Avenue totals \$30,300. That price includes cutting and patching of the blacktop. We are currently having discussions with the property owners regarding the possible repaving of both the public and private portions of the alley and will adjust the work to be accomplished if agreement is reached. This project will be funded with sales tax proceeds in the current budget.

Necessary action for the Council is to approve the quote of Kunkel Electric in the amount of \$30,300 subject to a determination of how to proceed on asphalt paving.






