Pursuant to due call and notice thereof, a regular meeting of the North Mankato City Council was held in the Municipal Building Council Chambers on February 21, 2017. Mayor Dehen called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. asking that everyone join in the Pledge of Allegiance. The following were present for roll call: Mayor Dehen, Council Members Whitlock, Steiner, Norland, and Freyberg, City Administrator Harrenstein, Finance Director McCann, City Attorney Kennedy, Community Development Director Fischer, Public Works Director Swanson and City Clerk Van Genderen.

Approval of Agenda

Council Member Norland moved, seconded by Council Member Steiner, to approve the agenda as presented. Vote on the motion: Whitlock, Steiner, Norland, Freyberg, and Dehen aye; no nays. Motion carried.

Approval of Council Meeting Minutes

Council Member Norland moved, seconded by Council Member Steiner, to approve the minutes of the Council meeting of February 6, 2017. Vote on the motion: Whitlock, Norland, Freyberg and Dehen aye; Steiner, abstain. Motion carried.

Consent Agenda

Council Member Norland moved, seconded by Council Member Steiner, to approve the Consent Agenda which included:

- B. Res. No. 14-17 Approving Donations/Contributions/Grants.
- C. Approved Temporary Liquor License for Vista Prairie at Monarch Meadows on April 27, 2017.

- E. Set Public Hearing for 7 p.m. on March 6, 2017, to Consider Amending City Code Chapter 91: Animals.
- F. Res. No. 15-17 Set Rates and Fees.
- G. Res. No. 16-17 Waiving Waiting Period for Exemption from Lawful Gambling License for Holy Rosary Church.

Vote on the motion: Whitlock, Steiner, Norland, Freyberg and Dehen aye; no nays. Motion carried.

Public Comments

Barb Church, 102 Wheeler Avenue, appeared before Council and stated she believed the wrong word was used in the proposed ordinance changes. She did not think 'detention' was the right word to use when referencing a detention pond.

Business Items

Res. No. 17-17 Requesting the Advance of Municipal State Aid Funds for Municipal Construction Projects. City Engineer Dan Sarff stated he would discuss both the Advance of Municipal State Aid Funds for Municipal Construction Projects and the Advance of Municipal State Aid Funds for Federal Construction Projects at the same time. City Engineer Sarff reported any City over a population of 5,000 receives Municipal State Aid. The City of North Mankato has borrowed ahead and advanced those State Aid dollars for the completion of both municipal and federal projects. He stated this would be the last advance for the completion of the Lookout Drive project and the Roe

Crest Drive project. Council Member Steiner moved, seconded by Council Member Norland to adopt Res. No. 17-17 Requesting the Advance of Municipal State Aid Funds for Municipal Construction Projects. Vote on the motion: Whitlock, Steiner, Norland, Freyberg and Dehen aye; no nays. Motion carried.

Res. No. 18-17 Requesting the Advance of Municipal State Aid Funds for Federal Construction Projects. Council Member Norland moved, seconded by Council Member Steiner to Adopt Res. No. 18-17 Requesting the Advance of Municipal State Aid Funds for Federal Construction Projects. Vote on the motion: Whitlock, Steiner, Norland, Freyberg and Dehen aye; no nays. Motion carried.

2016 Police Department Annual Report. Police Chief Boyer presented the 2016 Police Department Annual Report. Chief Boyer stated the Police Reserve Unit worked over 1,000 hours mainly assisting with special events; they are called out for special crimes if police officers need to secure an area. He reported personal crimes remained steady, property crimes went down, while narcotic crimes remained flat. Chief Boyer stated the statistics for traffic road and driving complaints appear to have increased dramatically, but the increase is due to the new system which creates a report for every police contact or calls whether or not a citation or action is taken. He reported zero car fatalities in the City of North Mankato and only eight injuries that required the accident victims be transported for medical care. Chief Boyer indicated the increased calls for neighborhood support is again related to the new reporting system. Chief Boyer did indicate the number of medical calls had increased, but the police officers are well trained to assist with all of the officers being trained as first responders, EMTs or are paramedics. Mayor Dehen requested information on the number of deer and vehicle collisions in North Mankato as this has been a citizen concern. Chief Boyer reported three incidents occurred in 2016 with two on the Judson Bottom Road and the other on Lookout Drive. Administrator Harrenstein thanked Chief Boyer and all the police officers for their phenomenal work in maintaining a safe community. He indicated Chief Boyer was a responsive and active chief and worked with his officers to ensure the safety of the community. He thanked the Police Reserve for the time and effort they put into providing safety for the community events. City Administrator Harrenstein stated the City of North Mankato has been doing community policing since before it became popular. Council Member Steiner moved, seconded by Council Member Norland to approve the 2016 Police Department Annual Report. Vote on the motion: Whitlock, Steiner, Norland, Freyberg and Dehen aye; no nays. Motion carried.

City Administrator and Staff Comments

None.

Mayor and Council Comments

Mayor Dehen read the following proclamation into the record:

WHEREAS, March is St. Jude Month fundraises for the global resource known as St. Jude Children's Research Hospital that is completely focused on childhood cancer and other lifethreatening diseases in children, including kids' right in our community.

Mayor Dehen reported Peter Pendergast earned the honor of Eagle Scout Rank.

Mayor Dehen stated Pedal Past Poverty would occur on Saturday, February 25, 2017, with the City staff providing riders for the event.

Public Comments

Tom Hagen, 927 Lake Street, appeared before Council and requested the City pursue a Historic Preservation Commission. Mr. Hagen stated he attended an event hosted by Excel Energy concerning opportunities for sustainable energy. He encouraged the City to improve their sustainable energy practices. Mr. Hagen encouraged the City Council to pursue a deer hunt.

Administrator Harrenstein stated as the Belgrade Avenue Corridor Study, and the Downtown Master Plan draws to a close the City Council can determine if the two studies remain together or if they are separated. He stated it appears the Belgrade Avenue Corridor Study will undergo revisions and may take longer to complete, while the Downtown Master Plan has been in process for over a year and is close to completion. If the studies are divided, the City Council will need to decide how to manage the historic preservation information. Administrator Harrenstein stated it might be beneficial to refer the information to the Planning Commission but the City Council would need to decide how to proceed. Mayor Dehen indicated historic preservation would be a good topic to discuss at the City Council Strategic Planning meeting. Mayor Dehen stated City Electrician Tom Neubert has been working on improving the City of North Mankato's energy efficiency. Public Works Director Swanson indicated the City is working to transition to eco-friendly street lighting and are waiting on bids from three companies.

<u>Barb Church, 102 Wheeler Avenue</u>, appeared before Council and reported her concern about the noise from Mankato's River Front Park. She requested the City Council work with Mankato to reduce the noise.

Gary Zellmer, 1591 Sharon Drive, appeared before Council and expressed his desire to discuss library issues and the direction of the library and the resignation of former Library Director Lucy Lowry.

Brenda Peterson, 488 Marvin Boulevard, appeared before Council and requested clarification on Library Board issues.

There being no further business, on a motion by Council Member Norland, seconded by Council Member Whitlock, the meeting adjourned at 7:41 p.m.



ORDINANCE NO. 86, FOURTH SERIES

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE CODE OF ORDINANCES FOR THE CITY OF NORTH MANKATO, MINNESOTA REVISING, UPDATING AND

COMPILING CERTAIN ORDINANCES OF THE CITY DEALING WITH THE SUBJECTS EMBRACED IN THE CODE OF ORDINANCES AND PROVIDING PENALTIES FOR THE VIOLATION OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES

WHEREAS, Minnesota Statutes Section 415.02 and 415.021 authorize the City to cause its ordinances to be revised, updated and compiled;

NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NORTH MANKATO, ordains as follows:

- **Section 1**. All portions of the City of North Mankato Code will be revised as outlined in the attached Exhibit A; and
- **Section 2.** Ordinance Nos. 64, 65, 66, 67, 68, 70, 71, 72, 73, 74, 75, 76, 77, 78, 79, 80, 81, 82, 83, 84, and 85, Fourth Series, are incorporated into the revised Code of Ordinances:
- **Section 3.** This ordinance amending the Code of Ordinances shall be a sufficient publication of any ordinance included in it and not previously published in the City's official newspaper. The City Clerk shall cause a substantial quantity of the amended Code of Ordinances to be printed for public distribution to the public at actual cost and shall furnish a copy of the amended Code of Ordinances to the County Law Library or its designated depository. The official copy of this amended Code of Ordinances shall be marked and kept in the Office of the City Clerk.
- **Section 4.** The Code of Ordinances is declared to be prima facie evidence of the law of the City and shall be received in evidence as provided by Minnesota Statutes by the Courts of the State of Minnesota.
- **Section 5.** This ordinance amending the Code of Ordinances shall take effect upon publication of this ordinance in the City's official newspaper.

EXHIBIT A TO ORDINANCE NO. 86, FOURTH SERIES UPDATING CODE OF ORDINANCES CITY OF NORTH MANKATO

CHAPTER 50: RULES AND REGULATIONS RELATING TO MUNICIPAL UTILITIES 50.04 Rules and Regulations Related to Municipal Utilities

(D) Ownership of municipal utilities. Ownership of all municipal utilities, plants, lines, mains, extensions, and appurtenances thereto shall be held by the city, and remain in the city, except for the service line from the structure to the city main, which shall be the property owner's responsibility. including the corporation stop, saddle, curb stop and curb box, which shall be the property owner's responsibility. Provided, however, that private facilities and appurtenances constructed on private property are not intended to be included in municipal ownership.

CHAPTER 111: ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES 111.206 PERSONS ALLOWED ON THE LICENSED PREMISES.

- (B) Age restrictions.
- (2) No person under 21 years of age may enter a licensed premises except to work, consume meals on premises that qualify as a restaurant, or attend social functions that are held in a portion of the premises where liquor is not sold, while accompanied by a legal guardian.

CHAPTER 150: BUILDING REGULATIONS 150.02 Building Permits

(G) Survey Drawing. For every new residential, commercial or industrial building constructed, a survey drawing prepared by a licensed surveyor showing the location of all buildings, parking areas, and storm water detention areas shall be submitted as part of the building permit application process.

150.04 Fees, Charges and Bond Requirements

(B) Start without a permit. Where work for which a permit is required is started or pursued prior to issuance of a permit, the building permit fees shall be doubled an investigative fee in the amount of the building fee, not including the state surcharge, will be added to the building cost due at the time the permit is issued., but the payment of such increased fee shall not relieve any persons from fully complying with the requirements of the law in the execution of the work, nor from any penalties prescribed herein.

CHAPTER 151: RESIDENTIAL RENTAL PROPERTY LICENSING CODE 151.06 Applications

All applications shall be made as follows:

- (A) All applications shall be made at the office of the City Clerk, upon forms which have been approved by motion of the City Council;
- (B) All such applications must be subscribed, sworn to, and include, but not be limited to, the following:
 - (1) Applicant's name, age, and citizenship;
 - (2) Applicant's present address and phone number and length of time at that address;
 - (3) Address of property to be rented;
 - (4) Sketch of property to be rented identifying all rental units by number;
 - (5) Parking plan showing the size and location of all off-street parking spaces;
 - (6) Name(s) of each occupant of each rental unit;
 - (7) Name of person (if other than applicant) responsible for the rental unit;
- (8) Whether or not applicant has ever been convicted of a felony or misdemeanor, including violation of a city ordinance but excluding traffic violations, and, if so, the date and place of conviction and the nature of the offense;
- (9) Social Security number and Minnesota business identification number of the applicant as required by Minnesota Statues 270C.72, Subd. 4
- (910) Such other information as the Council shall deem necessary considering the nature of the use for which the license application is made.

151.07 Action on Application for Rental License

Upon receipt of a completed application, and payment of all license fees, and compliance with all applicable property inspections the City Clerk, or his or her designee, shall issue a license to the applicant for the specified property. All residential rental property in North Mankato must obtain a license by January 1, 2003. Such licenses will be valid for a period of 1 year unless canceled or revoked pursuant to this chapter. From January 1, 2004, forward, all licensees will be required to obtain annual renewal of their residential rental licenses on or before January 1 of each year. If by January 1 of each year, a rental license has not been renewed, a \$100 reinstatement fee for each property will be charged in addition to the annual license fee. An annual rental license renewal will not be granted if the licensee does not provide the City with a Social Security number and Minnesota business identification number of the licensee as required by Minnesota Statutes 270C.72, Subd. 4

CHAPTER 156: ZONING CODE 156.035 Generally

(G) Accessory buildings. If an accessory building is attached to the main building, it shall be made a structural part of the main building and shall comply in all respects with the requirements of this chapter applicable to the main building. An accessory building, unless

attached to and made a part of the main building, shall not be closer than 5 feet to the main building or another accessory building. In no event shall an accessory building be permitted on a vacant lot or when not subordinate to and serving the principal use structure on the same lot.

- (1) An accessory building larger than 12068 square feet shall be accessible by a hard-surfaced driveway which meets all applicable setback regulations.
- (P) Storage or utility sheds. Permitted in any residential zoning district subject to the following:
 - (1) Maximum floor area shall not exceed 12068 square feet.
 - (2) Minimum setback is 5 feet from any rear or side property line.
 - (3) Located a minimum of 10 5 feet from any main or accessory building.
 - (4) Shall not be located within any front yard.
 - (5) Maximum height shall not exceed 14 feet.
 - (6) Overhangs shall not exceed 2 feet.
 - (7) Access door shall not exceed 6 feet in width.
 - (8) No more than 1 storage shed or utility shed is permitted on any lot.
 - (9) Minimum setback is 5 feet from any ravine breakline.
- (II) For every new attached or detached residential dwelling unit constructed, the following is required: an individual water service and shut-off shall be installed for each dwelling unit. Multi-unit rental apartment buildings are not subject to this provision.
 - (1) An individual water service and shut-off shall be installed for each dwelling unit
- (2) An individual sanitary sewer service shall be installed for each dwelling unit Multi-unit rental apartment buildings are not subject to this provision.

(K) Residential driveways.

- (1) The maximum allowable driveway width measured at the <u>front</u> property line on residential property <u>having a width of less than 80 feet</u> shall not exceed 24 feet. <u>The maximum allowable driveway width measured at the front property line on a residential property having a width of 80 feet or more shall not exceed 30 feet. <u>Beginning at the front property line</u>, the driveway width may be enlarged at an angle not greater than 45 degrees to a point not closer than 10 feet to the side property line. There shall be a minimum of 20 feet of hard surfaced driveway located perpendicular from the face of any garage stall to the street. <u>with no greater than a 45 degree angle back to the main driveway</u>. All driveways shall conform to the required side yard building setbacks for the district it is within.</u>
- (X) Stormwater detention pond. For any residential, commercial or industrial development utilizing more than 1 acre of land, an on-site stormwater detention pond is required. Prior to issuance of a building permit, a stormwater drainage plan shall be submitted and approved by the Building Inspector. Setbacks for storm water ponds, rain gardens or other storm water retention areas shall be a minimum of are 10 feet from any property line.

156.053 Off-Street Parking and Loading

- (3) Construction and maintenance.
- (a) All residential, commercial and industrial parking areas, driveways and access drives shall be surfaced with either a concrete or a bituminous surface. All parking lots in any zoning district designed to accommodate more than six (6) vehicles, shall include B style curb and gutter. A drainage plan may be required for review by the Building Official. The owner of the property shall maintain all parking areas, driveways and access drives in a well-kept condition.

156.054 Performance Standards

- (9) Fences. Fences are a permitted use in any zoning district, subject to the following.
- (a) Fences shall not be located on any property line. and shall be located on the property in a manner that both sides can be maintained from the owner's property.
- (b) In all residential zones, fences located in front yard setbacks may not exceed 3 feet in height, except as regulated in (c). In all other yards, fences shall not exceed 6 feet in height and shall follow the unaltered natural terrain of the land.
- (c) where a lot is located at the intersection of two streets, fences shall be no higher than 3 feet for a distance equal to or greater than the front yard setback measured both directions from the corner property pin.
- (ed) Fences in commercial zoning districts shall not exceed 6 feet in height and shall follow the unaltered terrain of the land.
- (de) Fences in industrial zoning districts shall not exceed 8 feet in height. No barbed wire shall be located less than 6 feet from the ground.
 - (ef) All fences shall be constructed and maintained so as not to endanger life or property.
 - (g) Fences shall not interfere with traffic or pedestrian visibility

ORDINANCE NO. 87, FOURTH SERIES

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF NORTH MANKATO, MINNESOTA, AMENDING NORTH MANKATO CITY CODE, TITLE IX, GENERAL REGULATIONS, CHAPTER 91, ANIMALS

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NORTH MANKATO, MINNESOTA ORDAINS:

Section 1. Sections of North Mankato City Code, Title IX, General Regulations, Chapter 91 Animals, are hereby amended as follows:

§91.19 PROHIBITION ON SUPPLEMENTAL DEER FEEDING

- (A) Findings. It is hereby determined that an increasing population of deer within the city poses a threat to public safety by:
 - (1) Increasing the likelihood of deer-vehicle collisions
 - (2)Contributing to the transmission of diseases to humans from deer
- (3) Posing a threat to native and ornamental plants and animal life by excessive foraging which disturbs natural ecological balances
 - (4) Posing a threat to the quality of life by deer-related damage to landscaping and vegetable gardens
- (B) Purpose: Prohibition on supplemental deer feeding, which results in unnatural concentrations of deer and can affect the normal movement of deer within the community.
- (C) Prohibition: No resident may place or permit to be placed on the ground, or within five (5) feet of the ground surface any grain, salt licks, fruit, vegetables, nuts, seeds, hay or other edible materials which may reasonably be expected to intentionally result in deer feeding, unless such items are screened or protected in a manner that prevents deer from feeding on them. Living fruit trees and other live vegetation shall not be considered as supplemental deer feeding.

(C) Exemptions from Provisions

- (1) Veterinarians, city animal control officials or county, state or federal game officials who are in the course of their duties and have deer in their custody or under their management.
 - (2) Persons are feeding birds using self-enclosed feeding devices or containers.
- (3) The use of straw, hay or straw-related materials for erosion control, mulching, gardening or other landscape purposes.
- (4) Persons are maintaining a compost pile that is screened or protected to prevent deer from foraging.

Penalty, see §91.99 (C)

Section 2. After adoption, signing, and attestation, this Ordinance shall be published once in the official newspaper of the City and shall be in effect on or after the date following such publication.

Audio Permit

About:

An audio permit is required for anyone operating outdoor amplified sound (i.e., a loudspeaker, public address system, or sound amplifying equipment). All Audio Permits must be approved by the Council. The sound system cannot be operated before 7:00 am or after 10:00 pm. There is a \$25 fee.

Audio Permit Responsibilities:

- An onsite event coordinator must be available by mobile during the event.
- An applicant will provide a schedule of any music or entertainment proposed to occur during the event.
- A beginning and end time must be supplied on the application, and the event coordinator must ensure compliance.
- Applicants must comply with City Code Ordinance 90.045 and Minnesota Rules Chapter 7030 which limits noise.
- Noise levels cannot exceed 60 dBA more than 50 percent of the time.

What happens if there is a noise complaint?

- A North Mankato Patrol Officer will meet with the complainant and evaluate and measure the noise using a decibel reader at the location of the complainant.
- If the noise is found out of compliance, the Patrol Officer will contact the onsite event coordinator and the amplified sound must be turned down.
- If the onsite event coordinator does not comply, the event will be immediately terminated, and the group will be disbursed.
- Failure to comply will affect future ability to obtain an audio permit



ORDINANCE NO. 86, FOURTH SERIES

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE CODE OF ORDINANCES FOR THE CITY OF NORTH MANKATO, MINNESOTA REVISING, UPDATING AND

COMPILING CERTAIN ORDINANCES OF THE CITY DEALING WITH THE SUBJECTS EMBRACED IN THE CODE OF ORDINANCES AND PROVIDING PENALTIES FOR THE VIOLATION OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES

WHEREAS, Minnesota Statutes Section 415.02 and 415.021 authorize the City to cause its ordinances to be revised, updated and compiled;

NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NORTH MANKATO, ordains as follows:

- **Section 1**. All portions of the City of North Mankato Code will be revised as outlined in the attached Exhibit A; and
- **Section 2.** Ordinance Nos. 64, 65, 66, 67, 68, 70, 71, 72, 73, 74, 75, 76, 77, 78, 79, 80, 81, 82, 83, 84, and 85, Fourth Series, are incorporated into the revised Code of Ordinances;
- **Section 3.** This ordinance amending the Code of Ordinances shall be a sufficient publication of any ordinance included in it and not previously published in the City's official newspaper. The City Clerk shall cause a substantial quantity of the amended Code of Ordinances to be printed for public distribution to the public at actual cost and shall furnish a copy of the amended Code of Ordinances to the County Law Library or its designated depository. The official copy of this amended Code of Ordinances shall be marked and kept in the Office of the City Clerk.
- **Section 4.** The Code of Ordinances is declared to be prima facie evidence of the law of the City and shall be received in evidence as provided by Minnesota Statutes by the Courts of the State of Minnesota.
- **Section 5.** This ordinance amending the Code of Ordinances shall take effect upon publication of this ordinance in the City's official newspaper.

EXHIBIT A TO ORDINANCE NO. 86, FOURTH SERIES UPDATING CODE OF ORDINANCES CITY OF NORTH MANKATO

CHAPTER 50: RULES AND REGULATIONS RELATING TO MUNICIPAL UTILITIES 50.04 Rules and Regulations Related to Municipal Utilities

(D) Ownership of municipal utilities. Ownership of all municipal utilities, plants, lines, mains, extensions, and appurtenances thereto shall be held by the city, and remain in the city, except for the service line from the structure to the city main, including the corporation stop, saddle, curb stop and curb box, which shall be the property owner's responsibility.

CHAPTER 111: ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES 111.206 PERSONS ALLOWED ON THE LICENSED PREMISES.

- (B) Age restrictions.
- (2) No person under 21 years of age may enter a licensed premises except to work, consume meals on premises that qualify as a restaurant, or attend social functions while accompanied by a legal guardian.

CHAPTER 150: BUILDING REGULATIONS 150.02 Building Permits

(G) Survey Drawing. For every new residential, commercial or industrial building constructed, a survey drawing prepared by a licensed surveyor showing the location of all buildings, parking areas, and storm water detention areas shall be submitted as part of the building permit application process.

150.04 Fees, Charges and Bond Requirements

(B) Start without a permit. Where work for which a permit is required is started or pursued prior to issuance of a permit, an investigative fee in the amount of the building fee, not including the state surcharge, will be added to the building cost due at the time the permit is issued. The payment of such increased fee shall not relieve any persons from fully complying with the requirements of the law in the execution of the work, nor from any penalties prescribed herein.

CHAPTER 151: RESIDENTIAL RENTAL PROPERTY LICENSING CODE 151.06 Applications

All applications shall be made as follows:

- (A) All applications shall be made at the office of the City Clerk, upon forms which have been approved by motion of the City Council;
- (B) All such applications must be subscribed, sworn to, and include, but not be limited to, the following:
 - (1) Applicant's name, age, and citizenship;
 - (2) Applicant's present address and phone number and length of time at that address;
 - (3) Address of property to be rented;
 - (4) Sketch of property to be rented identifying all rental units by number;
 - (5) Parking plan showing the size and location of all off-street parking spaces;
 - (6) Name(s) of each occupant of each rental unit;
 - (7) Name of person (if other than applicant) responsible for the rental unit;
- (8) Whether or not applicant has ever been convicted of a felony or misdemeanor, including violation of a city ordinance but excluding traffic violations, and, if so, the date and place of conviction and the nature of the offense;
- (9) Social Security number and Minnesota business identification number of the applicant as required by Minnesota Statues 270C.72, Subd. 4
- (10) Such other information as the Council shall deem necessary considering the nature of the use for which the license application is made.

151.07 Action on Application for Rental License

Upon receipt of a completed application, payment of all license fees, and compliance with all applicable property inspections the City Clerk, or his or her designee, shall issue a license to the applicant for the specified property. All residential rental property in North Mankato must obtain a license by January 1, 2003. Such licenses will be valid for a period of 1 year unless canceled or revoked pursuant to this chapter. From January 1, 2004, forward, all licensees will be required to obtain annual renewal of their residential rental licenses on or before January 1 of each year. If by January 1 of each year, a rental license has not been renewed, a \$100 reinstatement fee for each property will be charged in addition to the annual license fee. An annual rental license renewal will not be granted if the licensee does not provide the City with a Social Security number and Minnesota business identification number of the licensee as required by Minnesota Statutes 270C.72, Subd. 4

CHAPTER 156: ZONING CODE 156.035 Generally

(G) Accessory buildings. If an accessory building is attached to the main building, it shall be made a structural part of the main building and shall comply in all respects with the requirements of this chapter applicable to the main building. An accessory building, unless

attached to and made a part of the main building, shall not be closer than 5 feet to the main building or another accessory building. In no event shall an accessory building be permitted on a vacant lot or when not subordinate to and serving the principal use structure on the same lot.

- (1) An accessory building larger than 168 square feet shall be accessible by a hard-surfaced driveway which meets all applicable setback regulations.
- (P) Storage or utility sheds. Permitted in any residential zoning district subject to the following:
 - (1) Maximum floor area shall not exceed 168 square feet.
 - (2) Minimum setback is 5 feet from any rear or side property line.
 - (3) Located a minimum of 5 feet from any main or accessory building.
 - (4) Shall not be located within any front yard.
 - (5) Maximum height shall not exceed 14 feet.
 - (6) Overhangs shall not exceed 2 feet.
 - (7) Access door shall not exceed 6 feet in width.
 - (8) No more than 1 storage shed or utility shed is permitted on any lot.
 - (9) Minimum setback is 5 feet from any ravine breakline.
- (II) For every new attached or detached residential dwelling unit constructed, the following is required:
 - (1) An individual water service and shut-off shall be installed for each dwelling unit
- (2) An individual sanitary sewer service shall be installed for each dwelling unit Multi-unit rental apartment buildings are not subject to this provision.
- (K) Residential driveways.
- (1) The maximum allowable driveway width measured at the front property line on residential property having a width of less than 80 feet shall not exceed 24 feet. The maximum allowable driveway width measured at the front property line on a residential property having a width of 80 feet or more shall not exceed 30 feet. There shall be a minimum of 20 feet of hard surfaced driveway located perpendicular from the face of any garage stall to the street.. All driveways shall conform to the required side yard building setbacks for the district it is within.
- (X) Stormwater detention pond. For any residential, commercial or industrial development utilizing more than 1 acre of land, an on-site stormwater detention pond is required. Prior to issuance of a building permit, a stormwater drainage plan shall be submitted and approved by the Building Inspector. Setbacks for storm water ponds, rain gardens or other storm water retention areas shall be a minimum of 10 feet from any property line.

156.053 Off-Street Parking and Loading

- (3) Construction and maintenance.
- (a) All residential, commercial and industrial parking areas, driveways and access drives shall be surfaced with either a concrete or a bituminous surface. All parking lots in any zoning

district designed to accommodate more than six (6) vehicles, shall include B style curb and gutter. A drainage plan may be required for review by the Building Official. The owner of the property shall maintain all parking areas, driveways and access drives in a well-kept condition.

156.054 Performance Standards

- (9) Fences. Fences are a permitted use in any zoning district, subject to the following.
 - (a) Fences shall not be located on any property line.
- (b) In all residential zones, fences located in front yard setbacks may not exceed 3 feet in height, except as regulated in (c). In all other yards, fences shall not exceed 6 feet in height and shall follow the unaltered natural terrain of the land.
- (c) where a lot is located at the intersection of two streets, fences shall be no higher than 3 feet for a distance equal to or greater than the front yard setback measured both directions from the corner property pin.
- (d) Fences in commercial zoning districts shall not exceed 6 feet in height and shall follow the unaltered terrain of the land.
- (e) Fences in industrial zoning districts shall not exceed 8 feet in height. No barbed wire shall be located less than 6 feet from the ground.
 - (f) All fences shall be constructed and maintained so as not to endanger life or property.
 - (g) Fences shall not interfere with traffic or pedestrian visibility

ORDINANCE NO. 87, FOURTH SERIES

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF NORTH MANKATO, MINNESOTA, AMENDING NORTH MANKATO CITY CODE, TITLE IX, GENERAL REGULATIONS, CHAPTER 91, ANIMALS

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NORTH MANKATO, MINNESOTA ORDAINS:

Section 1. Sections of North Mankato City Code, Title IX, General Regulations, Chapter 91 Animals, are hereby amended as follows:

§91.19 PROHIBITION ON SUPPLEMENTAL DEER FEEDING

- (A) Findings. It is hereby determined that an increasing population of deer within the city poses a threat to public safety by:
 - (1) Increasing the likelihood of deer-vehicle collisions
 - (2)Contributing to the transmission of diseases to humans from deer
- (3) Posing a threat to native and ornamental plants and animal life by excessive foraging which disturbs natural ecological balances
 - (4) Posing a threat to the quality of life by deer-related damage to landscaping and vegetable gardens
- (B) Purpose: Prohibition on supplemental deer feeding, which results in unnatural concentrations of deer and can affect the normal movement of deer within the community.
- (C) Prohibition: No resident may place or permit to be placed on the ground, or within five (5) feet of the ground surface any grain, salt licks, fruit, vegetables, nuts, seeds, hay or other edible materials which may reasonably be expected to intentionally result in deer feeding, unless such items are screened or protected in a manner that prevents deer from feeding on them. Living fruit trees and other live vegetation shall not be considered as supplemental deer feeding.
- (C) Exemptions from Provisions
- (1) Veterinarians, city animal control officials or county, state or federal game officials who are in the course of their duties and have deer in their custody or under their management.
 - (2) Persons are feeding birds using self-enclosed feeding devices or containers.
- (3) The use of straw, hay or straw-related materials for erosion control, mulching, gardening or other landscape purposes.
- (4) Persons are maintaining a compost pile that is screened or protected to prevent deer from foraging.

Penalty, see §91.99 (C)

Section 2. After adoption, signing, and attestation, this Ordinance shall be published once in the official newspaper of the City and shall be in effect on or after the date following such publication.
