Pursuant to due call and notice thereof, a regular meeting of the North Mankato City Council was held in the Municipal Building Council Chambers on October 2, 2017. Mayor Dehen called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. asking that everyone join in the Pledge of Allegiance. The following were present for roll call: Mayor Dehen, Council Members Whitlock, and Steiner, City Administrator Harrenstein, City Attorney Kennedy, Community Development Director Fischer, Public Works Director Swanson and City Clerk Van Genderen. Absent: Council Members Norland and Freyberg, and Finance Director McCann.

Approval of Agenda

Council Member Steiner moved, seconded by Council Member Whitlock, to approve the agenda as presented. Vote on the motion: Whitlock, Steiner, and Dehen aye; no nays. Motion carried.

Approval of Council Meeting Minutes

Council Member Steiner moved, seconded by Council Member Whitlock, to approve the minutes of the Council meeting of September 18, 2017. Vote on the motion: Whitlock, Steiner, and Dehen aye; no nays. Motion carried.

Public Hearing-Public Comments on the 2018 Proposed Budget. None.

Public Hearing-Consider Purchase of 928 South Avenue.

City Administrator Harrenstein reported the City recently became aware that 928 South Avenue, which abuts the Police Annex, may be available for purchase. City staff recommends the purchase of the property and is negotiating a purchase price. This public hearing is to inform the City of the intent to purchase the property. Kim Spears, 916 South Avenue, appeared before Council and requested clarification on if the public hearing was publicized. City Clerk Van Genderen indicated it was included in the Agenda, but clarified a public hearing was not a requirement for the purchase of the property. Administrator Harrenstein stated a second public hearing could be held on October 16, 2017. Attorney Kennedy noted additional information would be available at the next meeting. Mr. Spears stated if the City purchases the property it comes off of the tax rolls. Council Member Steiner indicated the property had previously been discussed for purchase. Tom Hagen, 927 Lake Street, appeared before Council and stated in light of affordable housing shortages he did not agree with taking the house down, he believed it could be rented or sold. Mayor Dehen stated the City is well aware of the need for affordable housing and discussion had been made concerning moving the house to a different location.

Consent Agenda

Council Member Whitlock moved, seconded by Council Member Steiner, to approve the Consent Agenda which included:

- A. Bills and Appropriations.
- B. Res. No. 68-17 Approving Donations/Contributions/Grants.
- C. Res. No. 69-17 Declaring as Surplus and Authorizing the Sale of Administrative Police Department Vehicle.
- D. Approved Purchase of Replacement Police Administrative Vehicle.

Vote on the motion: Whitlock, Steiner, and Dehen aye; no nays. Motion carried.

Public Comments

None.

Business Items

Receive Information Concerning Affordable Housing from Tom Hagen. Mayor Dehen reported the City is aware that there is a shortage of affordable housing and the City is working with Mankato to consider possible solutions. Mayor Dehen stated the City is limited in their ability to create affordable housing, but the City is looking for creative ways to help find a solution. Tom Hagen, 927 Lake Street, appeared before Council and reviewed information he learned at an Affordable Housing Forum hosted by the Mankato Free Press. He stated discussion was held concerning the shortage of affordable housing in the Greater Mankato area and that new affordable housing is difficult to build due to expenses. He believes the solution lies in legacy housing and allowing the conversion of homes in lower North Mankato to rentals. Mr. Hagen reported St. Peter is 60% rental and they manage the issues with enforcement. Phil Henry, 1300 Noretta Drive, appeared before Council and stated he believes the issue with affordable housing is property taxes and permit fees.

Consider Adopting Res. No. 70-17 Rejecting Bid for Project No. 17-4 Spring Lake Park Swim Facility. City Administrator Harrenstein reported the bid opening for the Spring Lake Park Swim Facility was held on October 2, 2017, at 2:00 p.m. The City received only one bid for the entire package. The base bid for the facility improvements was 2.8 million which exceeded the engineer's estimates by \$960,000. Due to the limited amount of bids received and the fact that the bid exceeded the amount reserved for the project; City staff recommends rejecting the bid. USAquatics will attend the next City Council meeting and explain the lack of bids and why the bid was overestimated. City Administrator Harrenstein indicated the City is still committed to achieving the improvement of the swim facility matching North Mankato residents' expectations. City Administrator Harrenstein requested City Council reject the bid and move to rebid the project. Council Member Steiner stated he remains committed to updating the swim pond, but not the addition of amenities. City Administrator Harrenstein thanked Council Member Steiner for his stand, saying 1.4 million of the proposed work is for the improvement of the swim facility, \$400,000 for the warming house and \$400,000 for amenities. He stated residents might express concern if no amenities are included in the improvement. Council Member Steiner moved, seconded by Council Member Whitlock to Adopt Res. No. 70-17 Rejecting Bid for Project No. 17-4 Spring Lake Park Swim Facility and put the Project Back out for Bid. Vote on the motion: Whitlock, Steiner, and Dehen aye; no nays. Motion carried.

Consider Approving a Developer Agreement for Privately Financed Improvements for the Landing North Phase 2. City Administrator Harrenstein reported this development agreement is for Landing North Phase 2 in the Reserve Subdivision. He stated the developers owned the property before the recession and stayed with the City maintaining the property and paying taxes until they were able to move forward with the second phase. Mayor Dehen stated it would be a welcome addition. Council Member Whitlock moved, seconded by Council Member Steiner to approve the Developer Agreement for Privately Financed Improvements for the Landing North Phase 2. Vote on the motion: Whitlock, Steiner, and Dehen aye; no nays. Motion carried.

Consider Approving Developer Agreement for Privately Financed Improvements for North Gate No. 3. City Administrator Harrenstein reported this would be a similar agreement to the one just approved. The development would extend Valdez Drive. Mayor Dehen stated this

development is an R1-S which has smaller lot sizes and is more for entry-level homeowners. Council Member Steiner moved, seconded by Council Member Whitlock to approve the Developer Agreement for Privately Financed Improvements for North Gate No. 3. Vote on the motion: Whitlock, Steiner, and Dehen aye; no nays. Motion carried.

City Administrator and Staff Comments

City Administrator Harrenstein stated the City is aware of the concerns about affordable housing and staff is committed to land use planning to allow affordable housing. Affordable housing is the impetus for guiding property to R1-S One Family Dwelling, Small Lot District. He stated cities have limited tools available to assist with the creation of affordable housing. City Administrator Harrenstein indicated that while the City is not its own housing agency, Section 8 vouchers are available. City Administrator Harrenstein reported 40 new multi-family housing units had been added to the community including some good entry level options. Administrator Harrenstein said City staff has proposed budgeting \$50,000 for the North Side Revival Program which will benefit legacy housing. The rental density cap restricts turning legacy homes into rentals which provides a greater opportunity for young professionals to obtain the property as they are not competing with landlords for properties. City Administrator Harrenstein stated the City is committed to the whole community. He stated an additional issue is that wages for the middle class have not kept up and wages limit the ability for prospective homeowners to enter homes.

City Administrator congratulated Hoover Elementary for being named a Blue Ribbon School.

Public Works Director Swanson thanked Dotson for allowing their employees to work for the City during the rebuilding of the foundry following the fire.

Public Works Director Swanson reminded citizens that fall drop-off is October 13, 14 and 15 from 8:00 am until 4:00 pm.

Mayor and Council Comments

Council Member Whitlock reported Business on Belgrade (BOB) participated in the LEMA (Law Enforcement Memorial Association) service. He stated he was very moved by the service.

Council Member Whitlock stated Bier on Belgrade was held on September 23rd. Attendance was down due to the heat, as it was over 96°.

Mayor Dehen stated Coffee with the Council would be held on Saturday, October 7th at 10:00 a.m. at the North Mankato Taylor Library. He said Finance Director McCann would be available to discuss the budget. Mayor Dehen stated Finance Director McCann would be hosting two Brewing up the Budget meetings on October 12, 2017, at 6:00 pm and October 17, 2017, at 6:00 pm at Neutral Groundz, 229 Belgrade Avenue.

There being no further business, on a motion by Council Member Steiner, seconded by Council Member Whitlock, the meeting adjourned at 7:32 p.m.








SUBJECT: October Traffic & Safety Committee meeting

On Tuesday, October 10, 2017, the Traffic & Safety Committee met to discuss items of business. Member present: Council Liaison Jim Whitlock, Community Member Bill Borchardt, Police Chief Chris Boyer, Public Works Director Brad Swanson and Community Development Director Mike Fischer.

The following is a summary of the meeting:

1. Request to review existing no parking area on South Lake Street at the intersection of Belgrade Avenue.

Staff summarized a request from the property owners at 801 Belgrade Avenue to eliminate the no parking area on the west side of South Lake Street near the Belgrade Avenue intersection to accommodate more on-street parking near their home. Staff spoke about past concerns for traffic visibility at the intersection including on-street parking changes made. The Traffic & Safety Committee held discussions regarding safety over convenience, amount of on-street parking available in this area, past visibility concerns, current conditions and existing on-street parking restrictions at similar intersections.

Recommendation

The Committee recommends that no changes be made to the current on-street parking conditions

2. Request to consider no on-street parking proposal during the winter months.

Staff presented a request from Tony Ulmen for consideration of a no on-street plan with the intent of improving snow removal from all City streets. The Committee held discussions about past City efforts intended to improve snow removal, enforcement challenges, citizen reaction, associated costs and snow emergencies.




1. Request to review existing no parking area on South Lake Street at the intersection of Belgrade Avenue.

The City has received a request from Albert and Carmen Rist at 801 Belgrade Avenue to eliminate the no parking area on the west side of South Lake Street near the Belgrade Avenue intersection to accommodate more on-street parking near their home. Attached are pictures showing the existing no parking area.

Due to traffic visibility concerns at this intersection reported by multiple area residents, several years ago, the City created the no parking area on the west side of South Lake Street to improve visibility. As the Rist family believes this limits the amount of on-street parking near their home, they are requesting that it be removed.

Since the installation of the no parking area, staff has not received any citizen concerns regarding safety or visibility at this intersection.





2. Request to consider a no on-street parking proposal

Attached is a proposal from North Mankato resident Tony Ulmen to consider a weekly no onstreet parking concept to improve snow removal and street sweeping. In summary, the proposal would **voluntary** limit on-street parking the day before garbage pick-up from 8:30 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. to allow staff to plow streets curb to curb.

Subject: Snow Plowing Curb to Curb

Hi Brad, I want to present to you a snow plowing plan that I have discussed with John Harrenstein & Jim Whitlock. As you know Pleasant View Drive is a narrow street with parking only on the east side. Following a snow storm, the street is even narrower if the street isn't plowed curb to curb. I have noticed in other parts of North Mankato that the driving lanes are also too narrow when the street isn't plowed curb to curb to curb. I know that the City of North Mankato doesn't like to call a Snow Emergency, but in the interest of safety and emergency vehicle assess, the streets should be plowed curb to curb following a snow storm. I believe this curb to curb snow plowing could be accomplished, without calling a Snow Emergency, by having No Parking Days. Using the garbage collection map, the City of North Mankato is divided into 5 zones. The day before garbage is collected, No Parking would be allowed on the streets in that zone from 8:30am to 3:30pm. The street could then be plowed curb to curb. For example, my garbage collection day is Friday, so No Parking would be allowed on Pleasant View Drive on Thursday, 8:30am to 3:30pm. This shouldn't affect most residents because they would be at work or school. The No Parking would be voluntary. This way, the residents would know that their street would be plowed curb to curb in no more than 1 week following a storm. This plan could be in effect from November 15 to April 15. This plan would also work good for street sweeping. The plan could be included in the City Newsletter, and with the water & sewer bill. Keep up the good work. Tony Ulmen

Subject: Local Roads Improvement Program Funding Application for Commerce Drive

Improvements

In 2017, the Minnesota Legislature appropriated approximately \$25.3 million in bond funds statewide to the Local Roads Improvement Program. One portion of the program provides funds for the costs of constructing or reconstructing city streets, county highways, or town roads with statewide or regional significance. The Minnesota Department of Transportation State Aid for Local Transportation Office administers the Local Roads Improvement Program with guidance from the Local Road Improvement Program Advisory Committee. This is a competitive grant opportunity available to cities, counties, and townships throughout the state. Selected projects from cities with population over 5,000 can receive up to \$1,000,000 in grant funds.

As you recall, \$908,000 in federal funding through the Surface Transportation Program (STP) was awarded to the City in 2016 for improvements to Commerce Drive between Lookout Drive and Lor Ray Drive. The total estimated project cost is \$\$1,984,200, leaving approximately \$1,076,000 to be paid from Municipal State Aid or local funds. It is recommended that a funding application in the amount of \$1,000,000 be submitted under the current Local Roads Improvement Program solicitation for the Commerce Drive project.

The proposed project would include the partial reconstruction of Commerce Drive between Lookout Drive and Lee Boulevard. The project would include the complete removal of the existing full-depth bituminous pavement section and replacement of a new bituminous pavement section with aggregate base and edge drains. The project would include isolated removal and replacement of the existing curb and gutter and sidewalk as well as ADA pedestrian ramp improvements at the intersecting streets. New streets lights would be provided along the length of the project. The new street section will be re-striped to provide for one lane in each direction, a center turn lane and designated bicycle lanes on both sides of the street. It is anticipated that the project will also include the closure of some of the driveways between Roe Crest Drive and Lor Ray Drive to improve safety by reducing conflicting left turn movements and reduce traffic congestion.

A resolution authorizing the application for funding of this project are included in the City Council packet for your consideration. I will be available at the October 16 council meeting to answer any questions you may have.

WHEREAS, the Local Road Improvement Program (LRIP) administered by the Minnesota Department of Transportation makes available up to \$1,000,000 to apply towards projects on local roads that are regionally significant, result in safety improvements, and address transportation deficiencies, and

WHEREAS, Commerce Drive is a major collector urban street extending between Lookout Drive and Lor Ray Drive, serving as a major access route to the largest commercial area in the City of North Mankato providing access to approximately 44 businesses, and

WHEREAS, safe and efficient travel for all modes on Commerce Drive is also vital to the health and live ability of the surrounding area as it provides access to a pharmacy, medical clinic, an elementary school, South Central College, and a church, therefore serving as a route for emergency services and school buses, and

WHEREAS, the Commerce Drive Improvements project will maintain and enhance safe and efficient travel through this corridor, which will be essential in order to maintain the economic viability of the businesses in the surrounding area, and

WHEREAS, the existing Commerce Drive road segment within Commerce Drive Improvement project are in poor structural condition due to consistent heavy industrial use, and

WHEREAS, the Commerce Drive Improvements project includes reconstruction of the existing Commerce Drive (MSAS Route 119) between Lookout Drive and Lor Ray Drive within the City of North Mankato, and

WHEREAS, the proposed improvements include the replacement of the degraded existing pavement with a new bituminous pavement section with aggregate base and edge drains, upgrading an existing 9-ton road to a 10-ton road, and

WHEREAS, the planned closure and/or consolidation of several driveways and accesses within the project area would reduce conflicting left turn movements and reduce traffic delays in the area, and

WHEREAS, the project provides an opportunity to update pedestrian facilities to meet ADA standards, providing safer mobility to all pedestrian traffic in the area, and

WHEREAS, the project provides an opportunity to re-stripe the roadway to designate bicycle lanes on both sides of the street, filling an east-west gap between two existing trail systems, and

WHEREAS, the construction of said project is planned to take place in fiscal year 2019.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NORTH MANKATO, MINNESOTA that the City Council hereby supports the reconstruction of the existing Commerce Drive road segment within the Commerce Drive Improvement project.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the City Council hereby supports the City's pursuit of Local Road Improvement Program (LRIP) funding and authorizes staff to prepare and submit such application,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the City of North Mankato, if awarded the federal funds for said project, agrees to secure and guarantee the local share of costs associated with this project and agrees to see this project through to its completion, with compliance of all applicable laws, rules and regulations.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the City of North Mankato agrees to design and construct said project and agrees to operate and maintain the facilities constructed with federal transportation funds for the useful life of the improvement.

PURCHASE AGREEMENT

This Purchase Agreement ("Agreement") is made this _____ day of October, 2017, by Gary G. Erickson and Leslie K. Erickson, husband and wife; Leilani K. Barnes and Joseph W. Barnes, husband and wife; and Terry L. Sparks and Larry A. Sparks, husband and wife ("Sellers"), and the City of North Mankato, a municipal corporation ("Purchaser").

In consideration of the mutual covenants and the undertakings contained herein, the parties agree as follows:

1. <u>Purchase of Land.</u> Sellers agree to sell to Purchaser and Purchaser hereby agrees to buy from Sellers, on the terms and conditions set forth herein, property described as follows to-wit:

Lot Twenty-Three (23) of Menton's Addition to North Mankato, Nicollet County, Minnesota, according to the plat on file and of record in the office of the Register of Deeds of Nicollet County.

2. <u>Purchase Price.</u> The purchase price ("Purchase Price") for the property is One Hundred Twenty Five Thousand and no/100 Dollars (\$125,000.00) to be paid as follows:

One Hundred Twenty Five Thousand Dollars (\$125,000.00) to be paid at closing.

- 3. <u>Covenants and Warranties of Sellers.</u> Sellers covenant and warrant to Purchaser as follows:
 - a. On the Closing Date there will be no tenants, persons or entities occupying or having a right to occupy the Land or any part thereof.
 - b. At Closing, no contracts of agreements shall be in effect with respect to the Land by which Purchaser shall be bound, other than easements of record existing and recorded with the office of the County Recorder in and for Nicollet County, Minnesota.
- 4. <u>Closing: Closing Date.</u> The Closing shall take place on _______, 2017 or before if mutually agreed at a place to be agreed upon by the parties.
- 5. At the Closing, the Sellers shall deliver to Purchaser:
 - a. A Warranty Deed transferring all interest they have in the described property.
- 6. **Real Estate Taxes and Special Assessments.** Real Estate taxes shall be pro-rated as of the date of closing.

- 7. <u>Possession.</u> Sellers agree to deliver possession of the land to Purchaser on the closing date. State Deed Taxes, which are \$3.30 per \$1,000.00 of the sales price shall be the responsibility of Purchaser. Sellers shall provide to Purchaser an abstract for the property being purchased.
- 8. <u>Risk of Loss.</u> Risk of loss of the Land prior to the time of Closing shall remain in the Sellers.
- 9. <u>Complete Agreement</u>. This is a final Agreement between the Parties with respect to the Land and contains their entire Agreement and supercedes all understandings and agreements oral or written relative to the Land. No waiver of any of the terms in this Purchase Agreement will be effective unless in writing executed by both parties.
- 10. <u>Time of the Essence</u>. Time is of the essence in the performance of this Agreement.
- 11. **Governing Law.** This Agreement is made and entered into under the laws of Minnesota, and Minnesota law shall govern its construction and enforcement.
- 12. <u>Counterparts.</u> This Agreement may be executed in counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original, and which together shall constitute a single, integrated contract.

13. Representation and Warranties of Purchaser.

- a. <u>Authority.</u> Purchaser have full legal power and authority to enter into, execute and deliver this Agreement, to perform its obligation hereunder, to make the representations, warranties and covenants contained herein and to cause the transactions contemplated by this Agreement to be consummated.
- b. <u>Compliance</u>. Neither the execution, delivery or performance of this Agreement will result in the breach under any indenture, security instrument or other agreement or court administrative order by which Purchaser or the Land may be bound or affected.
- c. <u>Validity and Binding Effect</u>. This Agreement is, and the documents and agreement mentioned herein, contemplated hereby or to be delivered pursuant to the terms hereof which Purchaser are a party when a duly executed and delivered, will be legal, valid and binding obligations of the Purchaser, enforceable against Purchaser in accordance with the terms and conditions of this Agreement.
