Pursuant to due call and notice thereof, a regular meeting of the North Mankato City Council was held in the Municipal Building Council Chambers on October 7, 2019. Mayor Dehen called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m., asking that everyone join in the Pledge of Allegiance. The following were present for roll call: Council Members Norland, Oachs, Whitlock, Steiner, and Mayor Dehen, City Administrator Harrenstein, City Attorney Kennedy, Finance Director McCann, Community Development Director Fischer, and City Clerk Van Genderen. Absent: Public Works Director Host.

Approval of Agenda

Council Member Norland moved, seconded by Council Member Steiner, to approve the agenda. Vote on the motion: Norland, Oachs, Whitlock, Steiner, and Dehen aye; no nays. Motion carried.

Approval of Council Meeting Minutes September 16, 2019

Council Member Steiner moved, seconded by Council Member Norland, to approve the minutes of the Council meeting of September 16, 2019. Vote on the motion: Norland, Oachs, Whitlock, Steiner, and Dehen aye; no nays. Motion carried.

Approval of Council Work Session Minutes September 23, 2019

Council Member Norland moved, seconded by Council Member Steiner, to approve the minutes of the Council Work Session meeting of September 23, 2019. Vote on the motion: Norland, Oachs, Whitlock, Steiner, and Dehen aye; no nays. Motion carried.

Public Hearing, 7:00 p.m.-Abatement of Property Located at 415 Webster Avenue.

City Attorney Kennedy reviewed the Code Enforcement process. He reported complaints are submitted to the City and Community Development Director Fischer begins the Code Enforcement process by reviewing the property to determine if a violation of City Code has occurred. If a violation is discovered the Community Development Director sends out a Notice of Violation to the property owner with notice of the Code Violation, the action needed to correct the violation, and a date the correction(s) need to be completed. The Community Development Director follows up with a review of the property after the original date of completion. If the property still has violations a second letter is sent to the property owner and the property revisited after the date of completion. If the property is still in violation the Community Development Director sends the information to the City Attorney who reviews the information and sends a letter to the property owner. The letter informs the owner that the City will proceed with an abatement process by setting a public hearing if the code violation is not corrected by a certain date. A review of the property occurs and if the violation is not corrected the issue is brought before the City Council to set a Public Hearing. The City Council holds a Public Hearing and if necessary passes a Resolution requiring the owner to correct the violation or the City will take the matter to District Court for a summary judgment which would allow the City to go onto the property and correct the violation.

Community Development Director Fischer reported the resident at 415 Webster Avenue received a Notice of Violation based on City Code 92.21 that requires no more than 20% of the exterior of the surface finish is peeling, cracked, chipped or otherwise deteriorated. The notice required the property owner to paint his residence at 415 Webster Avenue. The resident has not complied and has made no effort to respond to the request.

Barb Church, 102 Wheeler Avenue, appeared before Council and asked if the applicant has received information on available housing assistance programs such as North Side Revivals, should the

City add a burden on the resident if he can't afford to paint the house, and if the resident needs to locate a painter the wait may be long.

With no one else appearing before Council, the Mayor closed the Public Hearing.

Public Hearing, 7:00 p.m.-Abatement of Property Located at 229 Allan Avenue.

Community Development Director Fischer reviewed the Notice of Violation, which included outdoor storage of materials and vegetation. He noted the amount, size and lack of maintenance of the vegetation on the property is an issue.

Edward Borchardt, 229 Allan Avenue, appeared before City Council and reported he was the owner of the property at 229 Allan Avenue. He stated he has been working to comply with correcting the issues noted in the Notice of Violation. He noted most of the items stored outside have been removed, or they plan on removing them in the next few weeks. Mr. Borchardt stated his health has prevented him from working in his yard and noted that he and his wife want to create a place in their yard where monarchs, pollinators, and birds are welcomed. He stated all of the vegetation is planted to attract pollinators, birds, and monarchs.

Lucy Lowry, 2263 Northridge Drive, appeared before Council and stated the Borchardts have made progress and requested the City give them more time to comply.

Diane Anderson, 225 Allan Avenue, appeared before Council and reported the Borchardts have lived at their home since 1984, and this is not a new issue. She requested Council take action to improve the residence.

Jordin Johnson, 240 Allan Avenue, appeared before Council and noted neighbors would be willing to help the Borchardts clean up the property. Mr. Johnson has seen rats, woodchucks, raccoons, and feral cats around the property. He would like the Borchardts to clean up the property and would be willing to help.

Marion Brunz, 227 Allan Avenue, appeared before Council and stated she appreciated Ed and Anne but would like the yard cleaned up. She noted there are neighbors who have milkweed or pollinator gardens that are neat and do not take over the yard.

Tom Hagen, 927 Lake Street, appeared before Council and questioned the City's legal process concerning abatements. He stated the Borchardts have native species but do not have weeds in their yard, and they have just allowed their yard to go into a more natural state to help provide a wildlife sanctuary. Mr. Hagen reported the Borchardts should receive an award.

Bess Tsaose, 136 Mary Circle, appeared before Council and reported she is an advocate for monarchs and pollinators and would like homeowners to decrease their lawn areas, increase flowers and to not use herbicides and pesticides on their yards.

With no one else appearing before Council, Mayor Dehen closed the Public Hearing.

Public Hearing, 7:00 p.m. Ordinance Imposing a One Half of One Percent Food & Beverage Sales Tax.

Mayor Dehen commented the Ordinance would be discussed tonight, and the final vote would be held on October 21, 2019.

Council Member Oachs reported the City Council passed a resolution on February 19, 2019, establishing legislative priorities, which included a Food and Beverage Tax, but discussion was the tax would not be implemented until later. She questioned why the tax was being considered for implementation in 2020. Council Member Oachs reported she did not believe the tax would provide enough funds to solve the Caswell Park operation deficit. The staff implemented new strategies, and the City should wait to determine if the new strategies at Caswell Park will reduce the operations deficit. Council Member Oachs reported the economic impact Caswell Park brings is not realized by

local North Mankato businesses, rather Mankato received a majority of the benefit. She stated she did not believe the additional tax should be added.

Christopher Schmidt, 23 Otter Court, appeared before Council and requested the Council not institute the tax, rather they should practice fiscal responsibility.

Barb Church, 102 Wheeler Avenue, appeared before Council and reported she was opposed to the Food and Beverage tax because she believes it unfairly targets family-owned businesses.

Jim Downs, 2244 North Ridge Drive, appeared before Council and stated he helps run the NaKato in North Mankato and Pagliai's in Mankato. Mr. Downs reported events at Caswell do not bring additional patronage to the NaKato, and if the tax is implemented his prices will increase, and patrons will notice.

Kim Spears, 916 South Avenue, appeared before Council and requested the Council not institute the Food and Beverage Tax. He stated the City should manage their debt and spend less.

Jenny Bobholz, 228 Garfield Avenue, appeared before Council and stated it is difficult to run a small business, and as the new owner of the Circle Inn, she does not want to raise prices to account for the proposed Food and Beverage Tax.

Jill Schmidt, 23 Otter Court, appeared before Council and stated she does not want the Food and Beverage Tax.

Tom Hagen, 927 Lake Street, appeared before Council and stated North Mankato is a bedroom community, and the City Council should reject the Food and Beverage Tax to encourage small businesses and retain the small-town feel and history.

Deb Joerg, 814 Wall Street, reported she works for the American Legion and would like to discourage the City Council from passing the Food and Beverage Tax because they do not want to pass the cost on to their customers.

Lucy Lowry, 2263 North Ridge Drive, appeared before Council and encouraged the Council to vote against the Food and Beverage Tax.

Debra Morin, 229 Belgrade Avenue, appeared before Council and reported she owns Neutral Groundz and reported if the tax was enacted they would need to increase their prices again, and up to approximately 80% of customers are North Mankato residents. She encouraged a tax that was not specific to food and beverage.

Jeff Steinbach, 1261 Lake Street, appeared before Council and stated Caswell Park is now running the softball leagues producing additional revenue for the City. He reported if the tax is enacted he would like the tax to go toward projects that benefit everyone.

With no one else appearing before Council, the Mayor closed the Public Hearing.

Public Comments Concerning Business Items on the Agenda None.

Business Items

Res. No. 73-19 of the North Mankato City Council in the Matter of a Nuisance Property Located at 415 Webster Avenue.

City Administrator Harrenstein reviewed the proposed resolution concerning the property located at 415 Webster Avenue, noting the resolution provides the owner 20-days to submit a plan to paint the house by June 1, 2020. Council Member Whitlock expressed concerns about the resident's ability to understand the resolution and Notice of Violation. City Administrator Harrenstein reported the City would have police officers attempt to deliver the resolution for the next three days and provide information concerning housing repair/remodel assistance. City Attorney Kennedy reported the resolution would also be sent certified and first-class mail. Council Member Norland moved, seconded by Council Member Oachs, to adopt Res. No. 73-19 of the North Mankato City Council in the Matter of a Nuisance Property Located at 415 Webster Avenue. Vote on the motion: Norland, Oachs, Whitlock, Steiner, and Dehen aye; no nays. Motion carried.

Res. No. 74-19 of the North Mankato City Council in the Matter of a Nuisance Property Located at 229 Allan Avenue.

City Administrator Harrenstein reviewed the information on the property and the process the City followed. He stated the issue of pollinator gardens and rain gardens should be sent to the Planning Commission for discussion and the development of City Code to guide those interested in a less traditional yard. The guidelines would help protect the integrity and beauty of North Mankato neighborhoods. City Administrator Harrenstein reported the yard needs to be cleaned up to City Code standards, and he stated the neighbors' concerns should be addressed. Council Member Steiner noted the progress and noted the neighbors were all willing to help. Council Member Oachs stated there had been progress, but the vote should also take into consideration the majority. Council Member Norland reported she would be creating a small contained pollinator garden, and thanked them for their efforts but noted the gardens should be well maintained. Mayor Dehen requested an update from the Community Development Director after the twenty days allowed for the Borchardt's to clean up the property. Council Member Norland moved, seconded by Council Member Steiner, to adopt Res. No. 74-19 of the North Mankato City Council in the Matter of a Nuisance Property Located at 229 Allen Avenue. Vote on the motion: Norland, Oachs, Whitlock, Steiner, and Dehen aye; no nays. Motion carried.

Council Member Whitlock moved, seconded by Council Member Steiner, to refer the development of City Code language concerning rain gardens and pollinator gardens to the Planning Commission. Vote on the motion: Norland, Oachs, Whitlock, Steiner, and Dehen aye; no nays. Motion carried.

Res. No. 75-19 Providing for the Issuance and Sale of \$3,065,000 General Obligation Bonds, Series 2019A, Pledging for the Security Thereof Special Assessments and Net Revenues and Levying a Tax for the Payment Thereof.

City Administrator Harrenstein reported the City had a successful sale of bonds, and Ms. Jessica Green from Northland Security was present to review the sale. Ms. Green reported the sale is associated with capital improvement for the Commerce Drive and Tyler Avenue projects, along with the sewer projects at Carol Court and the construction of the deep sewer in Lexington. The City

maintained an "AA" rating from S & P Global Ratings. The rating report noted the City's strong budgetary performance and very strong liquidity. Ms. Green reported there were six bids with Piper Jaffray the low bid. The average coupon rate was 2%, with a True Interest Cost of 1.98%. Mayor Dehen thanked Norland Securities for their work and noted the bond rating reflects the City's strong assets and debt management. Council Member Steiner moved, seconded by Council Member Norland, to adopt Res. No. 75-19 Providing for the Issuance and Sale of \$3,065,000 General Obligation Bonds, Series 2019A, Pledging for the Security Thereof Special Assessments and Net Revenues and Levying a Tax for the Payment Thereof. Vote on the motion: Norland, Oachs, Whitlock, Steiner, and Dehen aye; no nays. Motion carried.

Open Forum

Tom Hagen, 927 Lake Street, appeared before Council and stated the City needs to improve its procedures for abatements. He also stated the City can't tell developers what to do and can't tell builders to maintain historic preservation, but can tell residents they can't have a woodland in their backyard. He reported the City should support a historic preservation committee so the City can tell developers how to maintain the historic character of the City.

Bess Tsaouse, 136 Mary Circle, reported she was disappointed with the decision concerning the 229 Allan Avenue property because she thinks the City will have too much control over what residents do with their property.

Attorney Kennedy stated the Council, as the Policy Board, is in a difficult spot. Some residents say the City has too much power, while others want the City to increase its government control over developers and residents.

City Administrator and Staff Comments

City Engineer Sarff reported the Lexington deep sewer project, Tyler Avenue Project, and the Commerce Drive Project are going well.

Mayor and Council Comments

Council Member Oachs thanked residents who came out to speak and stated the decisions that are made are not easy, and the goal is to consider what is best for the majority of the residents in the City.

Council Member Norland suggested people consider ways to reduce their use of plastic.

Council Member Steiner thanked all those that came out to speak.

Mayor Dehen reported it is Firefighter Appreciation Week and October 7, 2019, is the North Mankato Firefighters 9-11 Pizza Delivery event, and October 27, 2019, from 8 am to noon is the Dad's Belgian Waffle feed.

Mayor Dehen reported the City of North Mankato is proposing a decrease in the tax levy, while several cities in the surrounding area, including Mankato, are raising property taxes. Mayor Dehen commented that the Food and Beverage Tax is proposing to bring in \$50,000 a year which would mean an average family of 2.38 people would have an increase in what they pay a year going out to eat or drink of \$16.00 and unlike the property tax the food and beverage tax is voluntary. Mayor Dehen commented that Caswell Park would collect some of that tax from visitors due to the concession and beer sales.

Pursuant to due call and notice thereof, a Council Work Session of the North Mankato City Council was held at the Police Annex at 1001 Belgrade Avenue on October 14, 2019. Mayor Dehen called the meeting to order at 12:00 p.m. The following were present for roll call: Mayor Dehen, Council Members Oachs, Whitlock, and Norland, City Administrator Harrenstein, Finance Director McCann, City Engineer Sarff, and City Clerk Van Genderen. Absent: Council Member Steiner.

Review Proposed 2020 Utility Funds Budget

Finance Director McCann reported the City Council reviewed the General Fund at a previous Council Work Session, and today the Council would consider the Utility Funds. Finance Director McCann began with the Water Utility Fund-601. He reported the estimated customer receipts were trending down, based on a decrease in water usage. There was an increase in charges for services due to the popularity of the radio read meters. Increases in expenditures included merit increases, health insurance, supplies and charges related to the Minnesota Department of Health. The total revenue is calculated at \$2,106,000 with expenditures calculated at \$2,169,850. The cash balance will remain steady. City Administrator Harrenstein reported a rate increase would be considered in 2022 or 2024. Cash balances are anticipated to increase and are used to upgrade the system.

Finance Director McCann reviewed the Wastewater Fund Collections 2020 Budget. He reported an increase in customer receipts of \$61,000 due to a proposed increase in rates. Special assessment collections continue to increase as residents continue to use the consent assessment process provided by the City. He noted an increase in expenditures due to personnel merit increases, health insurance, and supplies. He reported a proposed capital outlay of \$250,000 in 2019 the funds were used for the new Zipper and a Sewer Camera. Total revenue calculated at \$2,514,810 with a total calculated expenditure of \$2,486,506. Finance Director McCann reported staff is proposing a \$2.00 rate increase, noting the last increase occurred in 2017. Mayor Dehen requested clarification on if there would be increased costs associated with the proposed upgrades of the Mankato Wastewater Treatment Plant where North Mankato's waste is processed. City Administrator Harrenstein indicated the rate increase should account for any increases from the City of Mankato, although they do not anticipate changes until later.

Finance Director McCann reviewed the proposed Recycling Fund 2020 Budget. He reviewed an estimated increase in Recycling Collection Fees based on contracts; he noted an increase in the facility rental as the City had increased the lease price for West Central Sanitation. Finance Director McCann reported an increase in personnel costs associated with merit increases and health insurance. A decrease in anticipated supply costs and an increase in recycling transfer fees. Mayor Dehen commented on the volatile market and requested clarification on if the proposed budget took into account those variables. City Administrator Harrenstein reported the budget reflects the contracts that have been established, which minimize the impact of the volatile market on the City.

Finance Director McCann reviewed the Solid Waste Fund 2020 Budget, noting the fund is basically an in and out fund. The customer receipts pay the contract with West Central Sanitation and few other items. The calculated revenue is \$821,600, and the calculated expenditures are \$813,500.

Finance Director McCann reviewed the proposed Stormwater Fund 2020 Budget. He reported the anticipated customer receipts are \$400,000 an increase from the receipts in previous years due to the increased rates. Expenditure increases include supplies for ravine maintenance, services, and charges includes a payment to Mankato for the City's portion of the Lake Street station. Finance Director McCann reported the large cash balance in 2019 includes the North Ridge Ravine Project. Mayor Dehen requested clarification on if the fund has enough funding to address the ravines. City Administrator Harrenstein reported the Stormwater Fund was not designed for ravine maintenance and

repairs, but it is a home for the funds. The Stormwater Fund was designed to manage smaller infrastructure issues.

Belgrade Avenue Development Related Public Improvements

City Engineer Dan Sarff appeared before City Council and reported at the September 23, 2019, Council Work Session a memo was presented that outlined a wide range of public improvements that the City could consider implementing in conjunction with the Rooftop Bar + Kitchen and Frandsen Bank development. City Council provided direction for staff follow up. The first improvement considered was Pedestrian Crossing Improvements. City Engineer Sarff reported the proposal would be to install a lighted pedestrian sign with flashing lights to improve recognition of the crossing. He noted the sign could be moved to a midblock crossing if it is determined to move forward with one. The estimated cost for the sign is \$7,000. Pedestrian counts have been taken and will be collected again in 2020 after the development project is completed and operational. The second improvement is enhanced lighting and related improvements. A discussion was held about two lighting pole options. Mayor Dehen requested clarification on if the City Center Partnership lighting study was completed and if there was a plan for implementation. City Administrator Harrenstein reported the study had been completed and individual City Council's may determine what portions to use and the City of North Mankato could use the City Center Partnership lighting suggestion which is more modern or use the pole that is being used on the Commerce Drive Project which is more traditional. City Engineer Sarff reported staff had reviewed alley improvements, parking modifications, and access closures. The alley improvements include the proposed reconstruction of the alley from 15-foot wide to 22-foot width, which will accommodate two-way traffic. Discussion was held by the Council on the best way to obtain the additional feet of right of way or easement. The proposal presented included obtaining an easement or right of way from the American Legion and the Circle Inn. Council Member Whitlock suggested obtaining right of way or easement from three property owners on the north side of the current alley because the City already owns three of the six properties. City Administrator Harrenstein reported the proposed Belgrade Avenue Development will proceed in 2020 and noted the pedestrian crossing sign and the wayfinding signs are planned into the 2020 budget, but the street lighting for and the alley improvements are not in the budget and requested direction. Mayor Dehen suggested the improvements be added to the TIF. City Administrator Harrenstein reported there were two ways the projects could be added. He reported the City could pay for the improvements out of the General Fund, which would draw down the General Fund balance, or the City could take a note out against the TIF and increase the term of the TIF. Mayor Dehen noted the TIF could be extended up to 25 years for a redevelopment project, and the proposed improvements were for the public good.

ORDINANCE NO. 119, FOURTH SERIES

AN ORDINANCE SETTING MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL COMPENSATION

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NORTH MANKATO, MINNESOTA, ORDAINS:

SECTION I. Section 30.11 of the North Mankato City Code allows for the amendment of compensation as follows:

Sec. 30.12. Salary of the Mayor and Council Members. Salaries of the Mayor and City Council Members, effective January 1, 2021, are hereby fixed as follows, which amounts are deemed reasonable.

- Subd. 1. The compensation payable to the duly elected Mayor of the City of North Mankato shall be the sum of \$11,300 for 2021, which shall be payable in equal monthly installments.
- Subd. 2. The compensation payable to the duly elected members of the City Council of the City of North Mankato shall be the sum of \$7,600 for 2021, which shall be payable in equal monthly installments.
- Subd. 3. The Mayor and Council members shall, on a calendar year basis, beginning with the 2022 calendar year, accumulate a cost of living adjustment (COLA) to their salaries in the same percentage as the consumer price index (CPI) percentage for the preceding calendar year. The COLA set out in this section shall take effect biannually in accordance with Minnesota Statute 415.11, or any state law amending or replacement said Statute.

SECTION II. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and publication.


Audio Permit Responsibilities:

- Applicants must comply with City Code Ordinance 90.045 and Minnesota Rules Chapter 7030 which limits noise.
- Noise levels cannot exceed 60 dBA more than 50 percent of the time.

What happens if there is a noise complaint?

- A North Mankato Patrol Officer will meet with the complainant and evaluate and measure the noise using a decibel reader at the location of the complainant.
- If the noise is found out of compliance, the Patrol Officer will contact the onsite event coordinator, and the amplified sound must be turned down.
- If the onsite event coordinator does not comply, the event will be immediately terminated, and the group will be disbursed.
- Failure to comply will affect future ability to obtain an audio permit.



ORDINANCE NO. 121, FOUTH SERIES

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF NORTH MANKATO, MINNESOTA, REPEALING AND REPLACING CHAPTER 34.4 THROUGH 34.5 OF THE CITY CODE, LOCAL SALES AND USE TAX

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NORTH MANKATO DOES HEREBY ORDAIN:

Section 1. Authority. Pursuant to Laws 2017, 1st Special Session Chapter 1, Article 5, Section 17, amends Laws 2008 Chapter 366, Article 7, Section 20 the Minnesota Legislature has authorized the City of North Mankato to impose a local sales and use tax to provide revenues to pay the costs of collecting and administering the tax to the commissioner of revenue of the state of Minnesota and to finance the capital and administrative costs related to the funding of designated projects as defined in Laws 2017, 1st Special Session Chapter 1, Article 5, Section 17 and approved by the voters at the 2016 referendum.

- **Section 2. Definitions.** For purposes of this chapter, the following words, terms, and phrases have the meanings given them in this section unless the language or context clearly indicates a different meaning is intended.
 - (a) City. "City" means the City of North Mankato, Minnesota.
- **(b) Commissioner.** "Commissioner" means the commissioner of revenue of the state of Minnesota or a person to whom the commissioner has delegated functions.
- (c) Designated projects. "Designated projects" means the acquisition and development of regional parks, hiking and biking trails, existing and new recreational facilities, expansion of the North Mankato Taylor Library, riverfront redevelopment and lake improvement projects as authorized by the Minnesota Legislature in 1st Special Session Chapter 1, Article 5, Section 17, amends Laws 2008 Chapter 366, Article 7, Section 20 and approved by the voters at the 2016 referendum.
- (d) State sales and use tax laws and rules. "State sales and use tax laws and rules" means those provisions of the state revenue laws applicable to state sales and use tax imposition, administration, collection, and enforcement, including Minnesota Statutes, chapters 270C, 289A, 297A, and Minnesota Rules, chapter 8130, as amended from time to time.
- Section 3. Local sales and use tax imposed; amount of tax; coordination with state sales and use tax laws and rules. A local sales tax is imposed in the amount of one-half of one percent on the gross receipts from sales at retail sourced within city limits which are taxable under the state sales and use tax laws and rules. A local use tax is imposed in the amount of one-half of one percent on the storage, use, distribution or consumption of goods or services sourced within city limits which are taxable under the state sales and use tax laws and rules. All of the provisions of the state sales and use tax laws and rules apply to the local sales and use tax imposed by this chapter. The local sales and use tax imposed by this chapter shall be collected and remitted to the commissioner on any sale or purchase when the state sales tax must be collected and remitted to the commissioner under the state sales and use tax laws and rules and is in addition to the state sales and use tax.
- Section 4. Effective date of tax; transitional sales. Except as otherwise provided herein, the local sales and use tax imposed by this chapter shall apply to sales and purchases made on or after October 1, 2008. The local sales and use tax imposed by this chapter shall not apply to:

- (a) The gross receipts from retail sales or leases of tangible personal property made pursuant to a bona fide written contract, which unconditionally vests the rights and obligations of the parties thereto, provided that such contract was enforceable prior to October 1, 2008 and that delivery of the tangible personal property subject thereto is made on or before October 1, 2008.
- **(b)** The gross receipts from retail sales made pursuant to a bona fide lump sum or fixed price construction contract, which unconditionally vests the rights and obligations of the parties thereto and which does not make provision or allocation of future taxes, provided that such contract was enforceable prior to October 1, 2008 and that delivery of the tangible personal property used in performing such construction contract is made before March 31, 2009.
- (c) The purchase of taxable services, including utility services, if the billing period includes charges for services furnished before and after October 1, 2008, but the local sales and use tax imposed by this chapter shall apply on the first billing period not including charges for services furnished before October 1, 2008.
- (d) Lease payments for tangible personal property and motor vehicles that includes a period before and after October 1, 2008, but the local sales and use tax imposed by this chapter shall apply on a prorated basis to lease payment amounts attributable to that portion of the lease payment period on or after October 1, 2008 and on the entire lease payment for all lease payment periods thereafter.

Section 5. Tax Clearance; Issuance of Licenses.

- (a) The city may not issue or renew a license for the conduct of a trade or business within the city if the commissioner notified the licensing division of the city that the applicant owes delinquent city taxes as provided in this chapter, or penalties or interest due on such taxes.
 - (1) City taxes include sales and use taxes provided in this article. Penalties and interest are penalties and interest due on taxes included in this definition.
- **(b)** Delinquent taxes does not include a tax liability if: (i) an administrative or court action which contests the amount or validity of the liability has been filed or served, (ii) the appeal period to contest the tax liability has not expired, or (iii) the applicant has entered into a payment agreement and is current with the payments.
- (c) Applicant means an individual if the license is issued to or in the name of an individual or the corporation or partnership if the license is issued to or in the name of a corporation or partnership.
 - (1) A copy of the notice of delinquent taxes given to the licensing division of the city shall also be sent to the applicant taxpayer. In the case of renewal of a license, if the applicant requests in writing, within 30 days of receipt of the notice of hearing, then, a contested hearing shall be held under the same procedures as provided in Minn. Stat. 270A for the state sales and use tax imposed under Minn. Stat. 297A; provided further that if a hearing must be held on the state sales and use tax, hearings must be combined.

Section 6. Deposit of revenues; costs of administration; termination of tax.

(a) All of the revenues, interest, and penalties derived from the local sales and use tax imposed by this chapter collected by the commissioner and remitted to the city shall be deposited by the city finance director in the city treasury and shall be credited to the fund established to pay the

costs of collecting the local sales and use tax imposed by this chapter and to finance the capital and administrative costs directly related to completing the designated projects.

- (b) The local sales and use tax imposed by this chapter shall terminate at the earlier of: (1) December 31, 2038; or (2) when the City Council determines that \$15 million, plus an amount sufficient to pay the costs related to issuing bonds and interest on the bonds has been received from the local sales and use tax imposed by this chapter to pay for all the capital and administrative costs directly related to completing the designated projects. Any funds remaining after payment of all such costs and retirement or redemption of the bonds shall be placed in the general fund of the city. The local sales and use tax imposed by this chapter may terminate at an earlier time if the City Council so determines by ordinance.
- **Section 7. Agreement with the commissioner.** The city may enter into an agreement with the commissioner regarding each party's respective roles and responsibilities related to the imposition, administration, collection, enforcement, and termination of the local sales and use tax imposed by this chapter. Any such agreement shall not abrogate, alter, or otherwise conflict with the state sales and use tax laws and rules, this ordinance, or 2017, 1st Special Session Chapter 1, Article 5, Section 17, amends Laws 2008 Chapter 366, Article 7, Section 20.

Section 8. Summary publication. The following summary is approved by the City Council and shall be published in lieu of publishing the entire ordinance pursuant to Minnesota Statutes section 412.191:

Pursuant to a voter-approved referendum, the city is authorized to and will impose a local sales and use tax of one-half of one percent on retail sales made after October 1, 2008 to be used to fund certain designated projects related to the acquisition and development of regional parks, hiking and biking trails, existing and new recreational facilities, expansion of the North Mankato Taylor Library, riverfront redevelopment and lake improvement projects.

Section 9. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and publication.

ORDINANCE NO. 118, FOURTH SERIES

ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 34 AND CREATING SECTION 34.60 OF THE NORTH MANKATO CITY CODE AND IMPOSING A ONE HALF OF ONE PERCENT LOCAL SALES TAX ON ALL SALES OF FOOD AND BEVERAGES BY A RESTAURANT OR PLACE OF REFRESHMENT THAT ARE LOCATED WITHIN THE CITY OF NORTH MANKATO

WHEREAS, Law of Minnesota for 2019 Chapter 6, Article 6 Section 23 Authorizes the City of North Mankato to impose a sales tax of up to one percent on the gross receipts on all sales of food and beverages by a restaurant or place of refreshment located within the City; and

WHEREAS, proceeds of the taxes imposed hereby shall be used by the City of North Mankato to pay all or a portion of the expenses of operation, maintenance, and capital expenses for the Caswell Regional Sporting Complex and for costs related to regional tourism events; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of North Mankato that the City Code Section 34 be and hereby is amended as follows:

Section 1. Chapter 34.65 Definitions. The words, terms, and phrases used in Section 34.65 shall have the meaning ascribed to them in Minnesota Statutes, Section 297A.01 except where the context clearly indicates otherwise. In addition, the following definitions shall apply:

- A. "Act" means Law of Minnesota for 2019 Chapter 6, Article 6 Section 23.
- B. "City" means City of North Mankato, Minnesota
- C. "Commissioner" means the Commissioner of Revenue for the State of Minnesota, acting under the authority of an agreement entered into between the City and the State of Minnesota pursuant to the act, or such other person designated to administer and collect the North Mankato Sales and Use, and Food and Beverage tax.

Section 2. Chapter 34.70 Food and Beverage Tax.

- Subd. 1. Except as otherwise provided in this Chapter, there is hereby imposed an additional excise tax in the amount of one half of one percent (.5%) on the gross receipts of all sales of food and beverages by a restaurant or place of refreshment, that are located within the City.
- Subd. 2. For purposes of this section "restaurant" is defined as a business that sells unpackaged food to the customer in a ready-to-consume state, in individual servings, where the customer consumes these foods in the building, picks up the food from the building to consume elsewhere, or the food is delivered to the customer by employees of the restaurant and establishments. If liquor is served in the establishment as defined in Chapter 111: Alcoholic Beverages in the North Mankato City Code. Kitchen facilities shall be capable of servicing the permitted occupancy. This definition includes, but is not limited to: fast-food restaurants, sit down restaurants, pick-up or carry-out restaurants, and delivery restaurants, drive-in restaurants, drive-thru restaurants, cafes, tea rooms, delis, sidewalk vendors, coffee houses, clubs and any combination thereof. May also be referred to as an eating establishment.
- Subd. 3. For the purpose of this Section, "place of refreshment" is defined as any premise or location where alcoholic beverages, non-alcoholic beverages, or food items are sold at retail for consumption at or near the premise or location. This definition includes but is not limited to bars,

saloons, clubs, pubs, taprooms, coffee houses, dance clubs, teen centers, concession stands, sidewalk vendors, and any combination thereof.

Section 2. After adoption, signing, and attestation, this Ordinance shall be published once in the official newspaper of the City and shall be in effect on January 1, 2020.

RESOLUTION APPROVING A SPECIAL LAW AUTHORIZING A FOOD & BEVERAGE TAX FOR NORTH MANKATO

WHEREAS, the City of North Mankato sought authority to impose up to a one percent (1.0%) food and beverage tax to assist in funding operation, maintenance, and capital expenses for the Caswell Regional Sporting Complex and for costs related to regional tourism events; and

ORDINANCE NO. 119, FOURTH SERIES

AN ORDINANCE SETTING MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL COMPENSATION

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NORTH MANKATO, MINNESOTA, ORDAINS:

SECTION I. Section 30.11 of the North Mankato City Code allows for the amendment of compensation as follows:

Sec. 30.12. Salary of the Mayor and Council Members. Salaries of the Mayor and City Council Members, effective January 1, 2021, are hereby fixed as follows, which amounts are deemed reasonable.

- Subd. 1. The compensation payable to the duly elected Mayor of the City of North Mankato shall be the sum of \$11,300 for 2021, which shall be payable in equal monthly installments.
- Subd. 2. The compensation payable to the duly elected members of the City Council of the City of North Mankato shall be the sum of \$7,600 for 2021, which shall be payable in equal monthly installments.
- Subd. 3. The Mayor and Council members shall, on a calendar year basis, beginning with the 2022 calendar year, accumulate a cost of living adjustment (COLA) to their salaries in the same percentage as the consumer price index (CPI) percentage for the preceding calendar year. The COLA set out in this section shall take effect biannually in accordance with Minnesota Statute 415.11, or any state law amending or replacement said Statute.

SECTION II. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and publication.

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF NORTH MANKATO, MINNESOTA ANNEXING LAND LOCATED IN BELGRADE TOWNSHIP, NICOLLET COUNTY, MINNESOTA PURSUANT TO MINNESOTA STATUTES § 414.033 SUBDIVISION 2(3), PERMITTING ANNEXATION BY ORDINANCE

WHEREAS, a petition signed by all the property owners, requesting that property legally described in Exhibit A be annexed to the City of North Mankato Minnesota, was duly presented to the Council of the City of North Mankato on the 3rd day of September 2019; and

ANNEXATION REIMBURSEMENT AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CITY OF NORTH MANKATO AND BELGRADE TOWNSHIP

Pursuant to Minn. Stat. Sec. 414.036:

Unless otherwise agreed to by the annexing municipality and the affected town, when an order or other approval under this chapter annexes part of a town to a municipality the order or other approval must provide a reimbursement from the municipality to the town for all or part of the taxable property annexed as part of the order. The reimbursement shall be completed in substantially equal payments over not less than two nor more than eight years from the time of annexation. The municipality must reimburse the township for all special assessments assigned by the townships to the annexed property and any portion of debt incurred by the town prior to the annexation and attributable to the property to be annexed but for which no special assessments are outstanding, in substantially equal payments over a period of not less than two or no more than eight years.

In accordance with this State Statute, the City of North Mankato will reimburse Belgrade Township an annual amount based on the property taxes collected by Belgrade Township in the last year it collected taxes on any land valued over \$50,000 which the City of North Mankato annexes into its City limits. There will be no reimbursement for land valued under \$50,000 which the City annexes. Any reimbursement shall be paid for a period of five years. The City reserves the right to pre-pay at any time.
