Pursuant to due call and notice thereof, a regular meeting of the North Mankato City Council was held in the Municipal Building Council Chambers on May 18, 2020. City Administrator Harrenstein on March 31, 2020, under MN Statute Section 13D.021, declared the use of electronic meetings due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Mayor Dehen called the meeting to order at 7:00 pm, asking that everyone join in the Pledge of Allegiance. The following were present remotely through Zoom for roll call: Council Members Oachs, Whitlock, Steiner, City Attorney Kennedy, Finance Director McCann, Community Development Director Fischer, Public Works Director Host, Library Director Heintz, and Police Chief Gullickson, present in the Council Chambers for roll call: Council Member Norland, Mayor Dehen, City Administrator Harrenstein, and City Clerk Van Genderen. Citizen participation was available through teleconference and live stream of the meeting.

Approval of Agenda

Council Member Norland moved, seconded by Council Member Steiner, to approve the agenda. Vote on the motion: Norland, Oachs, Whitlock, Steiner, and Dehen aye; no nays. Motion carried.

Approval of Council Meeting Minutes May 4, 2020.

Council Member Steiner moved, seconded by Council Member Norland, to approve the minutes of the Council meeting of May 4, 2020. Vote on the motion: Norland, Oachs, Whitlock, Steiner, and Dehen aye; no nays. Motion carried.

Public Hearing, 7 pm Project No. 20-03 ABCDEF Countryside Drive Improvement Project.

City Engineer Sarff reported the proposed project area is from Haughton Avenue to Coventry Lane. There is a residential development proposed on property north of Countryside Drive that requires infrastructure improvements on Countryside Drive. The preliminary engineering report was authorized by Council on February 18th, and information was sent to property owners the week of March 23rd. Engineer Sarff reviewed the Sanitary Sewer System's existing conditions, which includes a 27" trunk sanitary sewer constructed in 1996 and existing residential properties currently have sanitary sewer services. The proposed improvements include a new 8" sanitary sewer system to serve new residential lots on the north side of Countryside Drive. The existing Watermain System consists of a 16" ductile iron watermain constructed in 1998. Existing residential properties on the south side of Countryside Drive currently have water service. Proposed improvements include new 8" watermain stub outs to the north to accommodate new development and new 1" plastic service lines for new lots on the north side of Countryside Drive along with new auto-reading water meters provided to all properties receiving assessments, regardless if new water service is constructed or not. There is no existing storm sewer on Countryside Drive except at intersecting streets and project termini. Proposed improvements include a new storm sewer system on Countryside Drive with a 12 inch pipe to a 30inch storm sewer pipe, manholes, and catch basins. The current street and surface is a "rural" design approximately 24' wide bituminous with side ditches & culverts. There is an existing 6' wide concrete sidewalk west of Haughton Avenue and on Coventry Lane. No off-street trail on Countryside Drive east of Lor Ray Drive or Coventry Lane. Proposed street improvements include a 40' wide street, curb and gutter, reconstruction of existing driveways, and a new 6-foot wide concrete sidewalk on the north side of Countryside Drive matching existing sidewalk to the west. New streetlights will be installed. In 2016 the City Council adopted the Complete Streets Policy, and staff reviewed the policy and are proposing that Countryside Drive and Coventry Lane be designated as on-street bike trails with sharethe-road pavement markings. The estimated cost of the project are \$1,631,500; the estimated cost

includes allowances for contingencies, administrative, engineering, and financing costs. Additional costs for stormwater management constructed by others may be included in the project costs used for financing.

City Engineer Sarff reviewed the assessment policy and reported the proposed estimated assessments ranged from \$5,632 to \$33,300. He said the City intends to utilize a cap on the assessment to provide a more reasonable assessment. Since the properties on the south side of Countryside Drive already have sanitary sewer and water service, an assessment cap of \$4,500 is proposed to reflect only street and storm sewer improvements. Assessment calculations for the residential development property in the north of Countryside Drive are still being determined. City Engineer Sarff reviewed the assessment process and noted residents would be informed by mail of an assessment hearing. The hearing is proposed for August 3, 2020.

With no one appearing and no comments submitted, the Mayor closed the Public Hearing.

Public Hearing, 7 pm Annexation of 109 Acres of Land Owned by Lovona M. Bengtson Revocable Trust into the City of North Mankato.

Community Development Director Fischer reported the City received a petition for Annexation from the Lovona M. Bengtson Revocable Trust on April 6, 2020. The Council approved the petition of Annexation, and the City served upon the Township Board and residents abutting the land 30-days notice that the City would conduct a Public Hearing. The current owner plans to annex the land, and upon successful Annexation intends to sell the property to a developer.

With no one appearing and no comments submitted, the Mayor closed the Public Hearing.

Open Forum

None.

City Administrator and Staff Comments

A. Discuss the City's Reopening Plans.

City Administrator Harrenstein commented that the swim facility and Caswell Park plans were not finalized and are waiting for further guidance from the Governor. The proposed plans provide guidance for the reopening of public buildings in the City. Discussion may need to be included concerning playgrounds as the CDC does not recommend opening playgrounds, but MDH does not say that they should remain closed. He commented it might be time to transition from closed signs to social distancing signs, but would welcome advice from the Council.

Police Chief Gullickson, who is also the Emergency Management Director, reviewed the proposed plans for City Hall and the Police Department. The proposed plan includes protection for both the staff and residents who visit the public buildings focusing on social distancing, sanitizing, personal hygiene, and screening of those visiting the buildings. The current proposal, if additional PPE items arrive on time, would be to open June 1, but the buildings may remain closed if that is not possible.

Library Director Heintz reviewed the library's proposed reopening plan, which included a high-risk hour in the morning, followed by cleaning and general opening to the public. The number of people allowed into the library would be limited to 40, and additional cleaning and personal protection for both patrons and staff incorporated. The discussion was held concerning maintaining consistency with the Blue Earth County library to prevent a large influx of patrons into Taylor Library. Mayor Dehen suggested limiting visiting to 30-minutes.

Public Works Director Host reported parks to remain open; shelters are available for use if people maintain social distancing, and staff continues to maintain proper cleaning.

Mayor Dehen commented that until the Governor allows meetings of more than ten people, the buildings should remain closed to the public. He said that it would be best to coordinate the library's reopening with Blue Earth County.

Council Member Norland thanked staff for cleaning park restrooms and allowing outside socially distanced gatherings. She was inclined to open playgrounds to the public.

Council Member Steiner commented that children are very tactile and encouraged leaving the playgrounds closed.

Council Member Oachs commented that she agreed with Council Member Norland and encouraged the normalization of additional use of hand sanitizer and cleaning protocols.

Council Member Whitlock encouraged library staff to wear masks when interacting with the public.

City Administrator Harrenstein commented that the public buildings and meetings would remain closed until the Governor allows meetings of 50 or more people. Additional research will be conducted concerning the playgrounds.

Mayor and Council Comments

Council Member Norland thanked those who donated. She noted the Department of Labor and Industry has useful guidance on how to sanitize work locations before reopening.

Council Member Oachs thanked the staff for their work in preparing for reopening.

Council Member Steiner thanked the staff and wished everyone a happy Memorial Day.

Council Member Whitlock commented that he was excited for the development by Countryside Drive and encouraged the building of on slab single-family homes.

Council Member Whitlock reported he received comments from residents concerning constructing a roundabout at Countryside Drive and LorRay Drive.

City Administrator Harrenstein commented that the City would reach out to MAPO to see if a traffic study could be conducted at the corner of Countryside Drive and LorRay Drive.

Mayor Dehen commented that he was excited to connect the Walter S. Farm Park with the biking and walking trails of the rest of the City.

Mayor Dehen commented that the cancellation of Art Splash and Fun Days was very deliberative and a tough decision to make. He commented that Fun Days was first created to thank those who saved the City from a flood but would be canceled to save people from the pandemic.

At 7:58 pm on a motion by Council Member Norland, seconded by Council Member Steiner, the Council Meeting was adjourned.


WHEREAS, said project includes sanitary sewer improvements, watermain improvements, storm sewer improvements, street and surface improvements, street light improvements, and other related improvements.

- 3. The bids will then be tabulated, and will be considered by the City Council at their regular meeting at 7:00 p.m. on August 3, 2020. Any bidder whose responsibility is questioned during consideration of the bid will be given an opportunity to address the council on the issue of responsibility.
- 4. No bids will be considered unless sealed and filed with the clerk and accompanied by a cash deposit, cashier's check, bid bond or certified check payable to the clerk for five (5) percent of the amount of such bid.

Plans and specifications have been prepared for the Countryside Drive Street & Utility Improvement Project. The proposed improvements are essentially the same as that presented with the Preliminary Engineering Report and subsequent City Council presentations. The following is a brief summary of the proposed improvements:

Project Location: Countryside Drive between Haughton Avenue and Coventry Lane

Proposed Improvements:

Sanitary Sewer:

- o Existing 27" trunk sanitary sewer on Countryside Drive constructed in 1996:
- Existing residential properties on south side of Countryside Drive currently have sanitary sewer service – no improvements required
- New 8" sanitary sewer system proposed to serve new residential lots on the north side of Countryside Drive
- Construct new sanitary sewer services from sewer main to ROW for new lots on north side
- o No replacement or improvements to existing 27" trunk sanitary sewer

Watermain:

- o Existing 16" ductile iron watermain on Countryside Drive constructed in 1998
- Existing residential properties on south side of Countryside Drive currently have water service – no improvement required
- New 8" watermain stub outs to the north to accommodate new development
- o New 1" plastic service lines for new lots on north side of Countryside Drive
- New auto-reading water meters will be provided to all properties receiving assessments - regardless of if a new water service is constructed or not
- o No replacement or improvements to existing 16" watermain

Storm Sewer:

- New storm sewer system will be constructed on Countryside Drive
- New storm sewer system will consist of 12-inch to 30-inch storm sewer pipe, new manholes and catch basins, and minor modifications/abandonments of the existing storm sewer near Haughton Avenue
- Will provide storm sewer stub out for extension into the park

- Most of new storm sewer on Countryside Drive will outlet into ponds in proposed development
- o Ponding will either be constructed with project or compensation will be provided to developer for additional capacity/increased treatment
- Street and Surface:
 - Reconstruct existing street with new 40-foot wide "urban" street section with curb
 & gutter and bituminous pavement
 - o Accommodates two lanes of traffic, on street parking and shared bike lanes
 - o Street centerline will be lowered, and ditches filled in so that curb and gutter matches existing driveways and yards on south side
 - o Reconstruct existing driveways on south side as required to match new curb grade
 - New 6-foot wide concrete sidewalk on the north side of Countryside Drive matches existing sidewalk configuration to the west
 - Crossings to be provided as needed at intersecting streets and at Walter S. Farm Park
 - New sidewalks and pedestrian ramps will meet the current Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) standards for accessibility
 - New street lights will be provided
 - o Restore all disturbed residential turf areas with seed or sod
- Street Lights
 - o Five new street lights will be provided

Section Highlights

This section of the Study examines basic demographic data for North Mankato. Comparative information is often provided for the entire Greater Mankato area.

- Many of the differences that exist within specific demographic data components between North Mankato and the Greater Mankato area can be linked to a student population, primarily residing within the City of Mankato. Post-secondary students can impact age distribution, median age, average household size and similar demographic characteristics.
- To some extent, even growth rates have been affected, as construction of student-oriented housing in Mankato has directly impacted that City's capacity to add households. Readers should be aware that students cannot generally be removed from the analyses that follow, but are recognized as impacting demographic information.

Population Highlights

- During the current decade, North Mankato has grown at a slower rate than the entire Greater Mankato area. North Mankato's population had increased by an estimated 6.7% between 2010 and 2019, compared to 13% growth in Mankato and 10.6% for the entire Greater Mankato area.
- North Mankato's median age of 37.9 years in 2019 was older than the Greater Mankato area, at 31.2 years.
- According to the 2018 American Community Survey, post-secondary students represented less than 5% of North Mankato's total population compared to more than 16% for the Greater Mankato area.

Household Highlights

- Similar to population, the City's household count increased at a lower rate than the rate for the entire Mankato area over the last decade. The best available estimates show average annual household growth in North Mankato in a range of 42 to 45 households per year from 2010 to 2019.
- The estimates also indicate that over the decade, North Mankato had a net reduction in the number of households age 54 and younger, but an increase of households age 55 and older. In 2019, more than 43% of all households in North Mankato were age 55 or older, compared to approximately 38% for the Greater Mankato area.

Population Trends

Recent estimates for population are available from various sources. In the following table, the 2019 estimates from Esri have been presented, as the most recent available data.

For North Mankato, there is relative consistency between the available data sources on total population. Esri's estimate for 2019 showed 14,269 people living in the City. For comparison, the State Demographer's 2018 estimate for the City was 14,059 people, and the Census Bureau's 2018 estimate was 13,914.

If reduced to an annual average, to adjust for the one-year time difference, the City has been adding between 65 and 100 people in a typical year. But the estimates from Esri and the State Demographer are more similar and near the upper end of this range, with average growth of approximately 83 to 100 people per year.

When compared to the aggregation of jurisdictions that form Greater Mankato, the City of North Mankato has been growing at a slower rate since at least the year 2000. However, the City grew at a much faster rate in the 1990s.

Demographic Data

Between the 2000 Census and the 2010 Census, the entire Greater Mankato area had a population increase of 18.3%, compared to 13.5% in North Mankato. This slower growth rate has continued after 2010, as the growth rate for Greater Mankato has been substantially higher than the rate in North Mankato.

The strong percentage growth since 2000 has been due to the City of Mankato. After increasing by more than 21% in the 2000s, the City of Mankato's population has then increased by 13% in the 2010s.

Median Age

The population level in the Greater Mankato area is impacted by the large student population, attending various post-secondary programs. To better understand the distribution of a possible traditional student population, the estimated median age has been examined.

The City of North Mankato has an older population than the remainder of the Greater Mankato area. The estimated median age in North Mankato was 37.9 years in 2019 according to Esri, compared to a median age of 31.2 years for the entire area. With a large student population living in Mankato, that City's estimated median age in 2019 was more than 10 years younger than the median for North Mankato.

Post-Secondary Student Populations

The Census Bureau's American Community Survey includes an estimate of number of residents enrolled in some type of post-secondary educational program, including undergraduate and graduate school programs. In addition to the actual number of people, this information can be compared to the total population level to provide information of the percentage of students. The American Community Survey total population estimate has also been used when calculating the percentage. The most recent data release from the American Community Survey is for 2018.

According to the 2018 American Community Survey there were 629 post-secondary students living in North Mankato. When compared to the total population estimate for the City, fewer than 5% of the City's residents were enrolled in college as an undergraduate, graduate or professional school program. Presumably the student population would include people enrolled at South Central College in North Mankato, as well as Minnesota State and Bethany College in Mankato. Within the MSA, students in St. Peter would also be reflected.


The student population was primarily living in the City of Mankato in 2018, with an estimated 11,348 people enrolled in a post-secondary program. This represented more than 28% of all Mankato residents. Of the entire post-secondary student population living in the MSA, nearly 72% were in the City of Mankato.

Consistent with the information presented on the previous pages on student populations and median age, North Mankato has a smaller population distribution in the prime post-secondary student age ranges. As a result, the City tends to have larger percentages in the other defined age groups, including children age 14 and younger, and among senior citizens.

Household Trends Analysis

The following table contains 2019 household estimates from Esri. Estimates from the State Demographer for 2018 are contained in the text that follows.

According to Esri, there were 5,983 households in North Mankato in 2019. When compared to the 2010 Census, this was an increase of 403 households, or an annual average of 45 households per year over the current decade.

The State Demographer's household count in 2018, with 5,917 total households in North Mankato, was generally very similar to the Esri estimate, when allowing for the one-year difference in effective dates. When compared to the 2010 Census, the Demographer showed an increase of 337 households, or an annual average of 42 households per year over the eight-year period.

The estimates for the entire Greater Mankato area are also similar, when adjusted for the one-year time difference. Esri shows the aggregated area adding 2,856 households between 2010 and 2019, while the State Demographer shows growth of 2,780 households through 2018. If viewed as an annual average, the range is from 317 to 348 households per year.

For the entire MSA, encompassing all of Blue Earth and Nicollet Counties, the Esri numbers would represent average annual growth of 431 households per year between 2010 and 2019. This is higher than the State Demographer's MSA estimate which shows the two-county area adding an average of 385 households per year from 2010 to 2018.

Despite some differences that may exist, both sources show Mankato as a primary location for much of the recent growth in the entire MSA. Esri would place approximately 60% of the increased number of households in Mankato, while the State Demographer has tracked approximately 77% of the growth within Mankato.

Despite the substantial amount of household growth that has been occurring in recent years, the percentage change has been slowing over time. In the 1990s, North Mankato was growing at a significantly faster rate than the Greater Mankato area. In the 2000s, this percentage decreased somewhat and was slightly below the rate of growth for Greater Mankato.

Through the first nine years of the current decade, the Esri estimate showed an even lower percentage growth rate for North Mankato. The percentage increase in households in Mankato since 2010 is more than double the rate in North Mankato.

Average Household Size

The following table provides decennial Census information on household size. The State Demographer's 2018 estimates and Esri's 2019 estimates have also been provided.

Household formation has generally been occurring at a different rate than population change in recent decades due to a steady decrease in average household size. This has been caused by household composition changes, such as more single person households and single parent families, fewer children per family, and more senior households due to longer life spans.

These patterns have been present in North Mankato, as the City's average household size has decreased since the year 2000. However, the most recent estimate from Esri shows only a minor decrease since 2010, while the State Demographer's estimate shows a slightly greater reduction.

Esri shows that the average household size in Mankato and in Greater Mankato area has remained more stable, although the State Demographer does show some continued decrease since 2010.

It is possible that student households in Mankato have had some impact on the stabilization of household size. A number of larger apartments have been constructed in Mankato and oriented to student occupancy. With many student rental units having three to five bedrooms, this would have an impact on the calculation of average household size.



As tracked by Esri, the largest numeric age-based change in North Mankato has occurred within the senior citizen age group between 65 and 74 years old. If the older adult age groups are aggregated together, Esri believes that the City has had net increase of 495 total households age 55 and older. However, an overall decrease of 92 households has occurred within the combined age groups 54 and younger.

Household by age patterns show growth in most of the defined 10-year age cohorts, but households age 65 to 74 have shown the greatest increase over the past nine years. Households age 55 to 64 increased in number resulting in substantial growth in the 20-year range between 55 and 74 years old. The 20-year age cohort between 25 and 44 years old also has been growing since 2010. Overall, there has been an increase of 2,114 households age 55 and older, and an increase of 742 households age 54 and younger.
