When asked, Ms. Cason reported that Levy monies are about 85% of their operating revenue.***


**Re: Request for Five Year Excess Levy Renewal May 2026**

Dear Commissioners:

The Board of Trustees of the Marion County Public Library would like to request a continuation of our current Excess Levy that expires June 30, 2026, to be voted upon at the next primary election scheduled for May 2026.

The purpose of the levy is for the general operation of the Marion County Public Library System. MCPLS has three branch locations (in Fairmont, Fairview, and Mannington), two bookmobiles, and a 24-hour kiosk (in White Hall). MCPLS employs 34 people throughout the county. As you may know, the excess levy generates 78% of the Library System's funding and without its passage, the county would lose this vital public service.

**MCPLS FUNDING**



During the fiscal year that ended on June 30, 2025, MCPLS had 105,751 visits to a library branch, 148,403 checkouts of physical materials, and 93,490 checkouts of electronic materials, such as eBooks and eAudiobooks. The library also notarized 695 documents at no cost to the public and had 8,087 adult and juvenile patrons use our public access computers.

ORDER AUTHORIZING LEVY ELECTION UNDER PROVISIONS OF WV CODE §  
11-8-16 TO PROVIDE FOR THE CONTINUED OPERATION OF THE MARION  
COUNTY PUBLIC LIBRARY

WHEREAS, Pursuant to the provisions of West Virginia Code Chapter 11, Article 8, the County Commission of Marion County, West Virginia is authorized to provide for a levy election for the purpose of general county current expenses; and

WHEREAS, on the 24th day of September 2025 came the Marion County Parks and Recreation Commission in public meeting and presented to the County Commission of Marion County, West Virginia a request to authorize a levy election for the purpose of continued operation of the Marion County public Library; and

WHEREAS, the County Commission is authorized by the provisions of West Virginia Code Chapter 11, Article 8, Section 16 to continue it's levies by entering on its record of proceedings an order setting forth;

- (1). The purpose for which additional funds are needed
- (2). The amount for each purpose
- (3). The total amount needed
- (4). The separate and aggregate assessed valuation of each class of taxable property within its jurisdiction.
- (5). The proposed additional rate of levy in cents on each class of property.
- (6). The proposed number of years of levy, not exceeding five.
- (7). The fact that the levying body will not issue bonds as provided by this section, if on approval of the proposed levy; and

WHEREAS, the Public Library in Marion County as operated by the Marion County Public Library Board of Trustees is funded partially from funds generated by an excess levy currently in effect in the county; and;

WHEREAS, the levy is essential to the continued operation of the Marion County Public Library and services provided to the citizens of the county would be greatly reduced without the levy funds; and

WHEREAS, for the existing parks and recreation system to continue beyond June 30, 2025 additional funds are required; and

WHEREAS, the Commission is of the opinion that for the good of the public welfare, it is necessary that the levy continue to fund the operation of the Marion County Public Library;

- It is accordingly ORDERED that pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 11, Article 8 of the West Virginia Code, as election shall be held to place before the voters of Marion County the question of a continued levy for the purpose of continued operation of the Marion County Public Library in Marion County, West Virginia. It is further ordered that:

1. The purpose of the continued levy funds shall be to continue the operation of the Marion County Public Library in Marion County, West Virginia.
2. The total of the needed funds is approximately six hundred twenty-seven thousand, twenty five dollars and seventy three cents (\$1,319,987) per fiscal year for the next four years.
3. All funds received pursuant to the excess levy shall be utilized for the continued operation of Marion County Public Library in Marion County, West Virginia. Any surplus funds received shall be utilized for the same purpose during the fiscal year so received. In the event that any funds may be obtained from the United States of America, State of West Virginia, or any other legal source, by gift, grant or otherwise, in aid of furtherance of the aforesaid purposes, the Marion County Public Library Board of Trustees is hereby authorized to match such funds, if required by the granting authority, from the proceeds of the levy.
4. The separate and aggregate assessed valuation of each class of taxable property within Marion County, West Virginia, as shown by the last assessment thereof for State, County and City taxation is as follows:

Class I	\$ 0
Class II	\$1,671,472,358
Class III	\$778,706,217
Class IV	\$748,587,082
Total	\$3,198,765,657

5. The proposed additional rate of levy in cents on each one hundred dollars (\$100.00) assessed valuation of taxable property in Marion County, West Virginia shall be as follows:

Upon Class I properties	1.5 cents
Upon Class II properties	3.0 cents
Upon Class III properties	6.0 cents
Upon Class IV properties	6.0 cents

6. The proposed years to which the additional levy shall apply shall be the fiscal years beginning July 1, 2026, July 1, 2027, July 1, 2028, July 1, 2029
7. The Marion County Commission shall not issue bonds upon approval of the proposed increased levy.

8. The question of laying such additional levy shall be submitted to the voters of Marion County, West Virginia in a Primary Election to be held in said County on the 12th day of May 2026 in accordance with the election laws of the State of West Virginia.
9. The registration of voters and the use of registration books shall be governed by the permanent registration laws of the State of West Virginia. The registration lists of Marion County, West Virginia, as amended and corrected according to law, shall be the official registration list for such Primary Election.
10. The notice calling such election shall be given by the publication of this Order as a Class II legal advertisement in the Times West Virginian, a newspaper of general circulation in the territory in which the election is held and as such shall be published once a week for two successive weeks within a period of fourteen consecutive days with at least an interval of six full days within the period between the date of the first publication and the date of the second publication.
11. The form of the ballot for such election shall be as follows:

Levy For Funds to Continue Operation of the Marion County Public Library in Marion County West Virginia

A Special election to authorize levies for fiscal years beginning July 1, 2026, July 1, 2027, July 1, 2028, July 1, 2029 for the purpose of funding the continued operation of the Marion County Public Library in Marion County, West Virginia according to the Order of the Marion County Commission entered on the 24th day of September 2025.

The Continued levy in cents per one hundred dollars of assessed valuation on each class of property within Marion County shall be as follows:

Class I	1.5 cents
Class II	3.0 cents
Class III	6.0 cents
Class IV	6.0 cents

In addition, Mr. Michalski reported that MCPARC has given 1.6 million dollars back to groups in the County for activities, which would not be possible without the levy. Mr. Michalski also recognized Tina Mascaro, MCPARC Sports Management Director and Jay Ford, MCPARC Board President, who were present with him.***






