1. Obtain an application packet
2. Complete application and log onto <https://ct.flexcheck.us.idemia.io/cchrspreenroll> to complete the Pre-Enrollment for fingerprint and background check.
3. The Agency/Entity Service Code = 9574-58AB
4. Complete the Pre-Enrollment in its entirety and make payment online code screen and BRING it with you to Troop K located at 15 Old Hartford Road, Colchester to have your fingerprints taken at the following times:
 - 7:00am
 - 3:00pm
 - 11:00pm

Please note, the duties of Troop K take priority over fingerprinting, we appreciate your patience and understanding should you be asked to return at another time.

5. Once fingerprinted and ink is dried, staple the Confirmation page to the back of the finger print card and return the completed application packet and all documents to Andrea Kranc **Please call 860-295-6229 to make arrangements.**

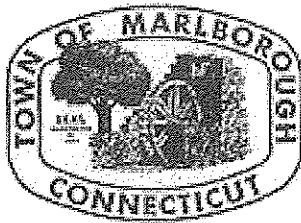

REQUIREMENTS FOR A TEMPORARY STATE PERMIT TO CARRY PISTOLS AND REVOLVERS:

1. A **completed and notarized DPS-799-C (Rev. 12/28/18)** CT state pistol permit application made out within the last 12 months. Do not sign your application until you are in front of a notary, who will attest to your signature.
2. You are **required to complete a handgun safety course**, which must consist of no less than the NRA's "Basic Pistol Course," prior to submitting the application. The NRA's "Home Firearms Safety Course" and "First Steps Pistol Orientation Program" are not approved courses.

Live fire is also required. Computer-generated programs, dry-fire, other simulated shooting tools, plastic bullets, air guns or any other alternatives are not acceptable. Students must fire a semi-automatic pistol or revolver. Any questions should be referred to the Special Licensing and Firearms Unit at (860) 685-8290.

3. You will **also be required to submit to a background investigation and criminal history check**; submit fingerprints **with two checks** in the amounts of (as of Jan 1, 2019) \$ 13.25 and \$75.00 both payable to "Treasurer, State of CT". Personal checks are accepted, but must contain the pre-printed name and address. If the person presenting the check does not wish to have these items on their check, or only has starter checks, SPBI requests a money order to avoid delays from SPBI sending the check back and requesting a money order.

To have your fingerprinting done contact the above Police officers to make an appointment. If you are unable to meet with the local officers, Troop K is providing fingerprinting services to the general public. This service will be provided three times a day at the following hours:

7:00 AM
3:00 PM
11:00 PM

In order to provide this service in compliance with social distancing guidelines, there will be a specific process involved. During these times, one (1) person will be able to wait in the lobby. If there is already one person waiting, you will be asked to leave a cell phone number with desk personnel and wait in your vehicle. You will be called in the order you signed in at the desk. All individuals coming into the Troop will have their temperature checked. Anyone with a temperature of 100.4 Degrees or more will be rechecked, and if still at or above that mark, asked to return at a later date.

Once inside, visitors will be asked to wear a facemask until leaving.

Or you can go online to schedule an appointment with State Police HQ-Middletown, Troop E – Montville, and Troop G – Bridgeport.

Note: There will be a \$15.00 fee charged by the State for fingerprinting at all locations.

4. Applicants must **provide proof you are legally and lawfully in the United States**, such as a certified (raised seal) birth certificate or U.S. Passport. Legal Alien Residents must provide Alien Registration numbers and 90-day proof of residency. Naturalized citizens require proof of citizenship.
5. **When you have all of the above together** call/e-mail for an appointment to drop off to Darlene Crowley at 200 West Road (rear of Station 2 Fire House to the left of the Police Office). Any questions: publicworks@marlboroughct.net or 860-295-6216.

When you have completed all the requirements **you will be called** to pick up your Temporary State Pistol Permit to carry pistols and revolvers: **the amount of \$70.00 payable to the Town of Marlborough is due at the time you pick up your permit.** This temporary permit will be valid for 60 days from the date on the front during which time you will have to obtain your regular state permit from CT DESPP by appointment only through <https://portal.ct.gov/DESPP>. The permit will be valid for 5 years. A \$70.00 fee payable to Treasurer-State of CT at that time.

 - g. Unlawful restraint in the second degree as specified under C.G.S. § 53a-96
 - h. Riot in the first degree as specified under C.G.S. § 53a-175
 - i. Riot in the second degree as specified under C.G.S. § 53a-176
 - j. Inciting to riot as specified under C.G.S. § 53a-178
 - k. Stalking in the second degree as specified under C.G.S. § 53a-181d
3. You are an unlawful user of or addicted to any controlled substance (as defined in the Controlled Substances Act (21 U.S.C. 801, et. seq.)).
4. You were **CONVICTED** of a **MISDEMEANOR CRIME of DOMESTIC VIOLENCE**.
This means an offense that (1) is a misdemeanor under federal or state law; and (2) has, as an element, the use or attempted use of physical force, or the threatened use of a deadly weapon, committed by a current or former spouse, parent or guardian of the victim, or by a person with whom the victim shares a child in common, or by a person who is cohabiting with or who has cohabited with the victim or spouse, parent, or guardian, or by any person similarly situated to a spouse, parent or guardian of the victim.
5. You were discharged from custody within the preceding 20 years after having been found **NOT GUILTY OF A CRIME BY REASON OF MENTAL DISEASE OR DEFECT** pursuant to C.G.S. § 53a-13.
6. You were **CONFINED TO A HOSPITAL** for persons with psychiatric disabilities (C.G.S. § 17a-495) within the preceding sixty (60) months by order of a Probate Court.
7. You have been voluntarily admitted to a hospital for persons with psychiatric disabilities, within the preceding six (6) months for reasons other than solely for alcohol or drug dependence.
8. You are subject to a **RESTRAINING ORDER** or **PROTECTIVE ORDER** issued by a court after notice and an opportunity to be heard has been provided to you in a case involving the use, attempted use or threatened use of physical force against another person.
9. You are the subject of a court issued risk warrant to seize firearms pursuant to C.G.S. § 29-38c (d).
10. You are an **ILLEGAL ALIEN** in the United States.
11. You are **UNDER the AGE of 21 years**.
12. You have renounced your United States citizenship.
13. You have been discharged from the Armed Forces under a dishonorable condition.
14. You are prohibited by federal law, under 18 U.S.C. 922 (g) or (n).

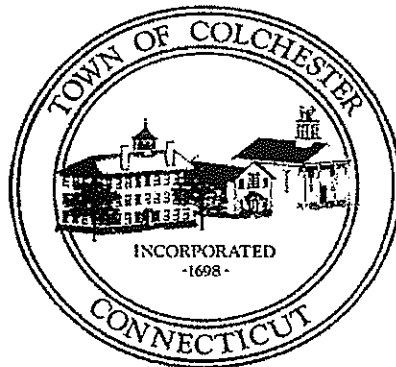
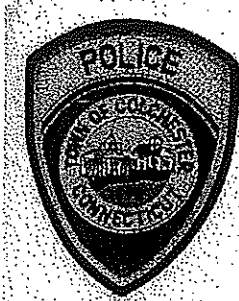

The Department of Emergency Services and Public Protection (DESPP) herein notifies the applicant that DESPP will be notified by the Department of Mental Health and Addiction Services if the applicant has been confined in a hospital for persons with psychiatric disabilities within the preceding sixty (60) months by order of Probate Court, or if the applicant has been voluntarily admitted to a hospital for persons with psychiatric disabilities within the preceding six (6) months for reasons other than solely for alcohol or drug dependence. DESPP will use this information in order to fulfill its statutory obligations under Connecticut General Statutes Sections 29-28, 29-36f.



PISTOL PERMIT PROCEDURES

1. Successfully complete the Gun Safety Course and obtain a Certificate of Completion.
2. Complete the Pistol Permit application, and have it **notarized**.
(Notary is available in the Town Clerk's office located in Town Hall).
3. Bring all the following documents to the Colchester Police Department:
 - **Completed, Notarized Application**
 - **Valid CT Drivers License**
 - **Certified copy of birth certificate, U.S. passport or document issued by I.C.E.**
 - **NRA Pistol Safety Course Certificate (original copy)**
 - **DD-214 - U.S. Military discharge papers (if applicable)**
4. Completion of Fingerprints. Fingerprint services are provided at the Colchester Police Department **BY APPOINTMENT ONLY-please call 860-537-7270 to schedule an appointment.**
5. The Pistol Permit application fees are as follows:
 - Fingerprint fee - \$15.00
 - State background check - \$75.00
 - Federal background check - \$13.25 (as of January 1, 2019)**PLEASE BRING 3 SEPARATE CHECKS/MONEY ORDERS MADE PAYABLE TO "TREASURER - STATE OF CT" (CASH/CREDIT NOT ACCEPTED)**
6. Once the Federal and State background checks have been successfully completed you will receive a letter in the mail instructing you that your Temporary Pistol Permit is ready to be picked up.
7. The Temporary State Pistol Permit will be issued for a \$70.00 fee payable to the "Town of Colchester".

Once you have completed all of the above steps and gathered all the documents requested you will need to:

- a) The "service code" which you will use when you logon to the CT Criminal History Request System is 9574-58AB
- b) **Register online** and pay for your criminal history checks. The new temporary pistol permit registration for the State of CT and FBI Criminal History Check is done online at <https://ct.flexcheck.us.idemia.io/cchrspreenroll>
This process requires a valid credit card for payment.

After registering electronically in the system, you will be emailed an Applicant Tracking Number and Barcode. You will print these out and take them with you to get your fingerprints done.

Once we receive the results of the background investigation, you will be contacted to schedule an appointment to receive your Temporary Permit. At this appointment please bring a check made payable to The Town of Marlborough in the amount of \$70.00. If you do not apply for the state permit within 60 days, your temporary permit will expire and you will have to go through the process again.

NEW TEMPORARY PISTOL PERMIT PROCEDURE INSTRUCTIONS AS OF AUGUST 10, 2021

At the time of application, **applicants must be 21 years of age** to apply for a temporary pistol permit:

All applicants must have the following documentation completed to apply for a temporary pistol permit:

1. **Completed, signed and notarized PAPER application** Applicants must complete the **Temporary Pistol Permit Application (DPS-799-C)** [Click here for the Temporary Pistol Permit Application.](#)

Applications can be notarized at the Marlborough Town Clerk's office if needed - Notary Fee is \$5.00 with a valid ID.

2. **NRA Firearms Safety and Use Course Certificate:**
Complete your NRA Firearms Safety and Use course. A Completion Certificate will be needed to apply for your temporary permit.

What are the minimum firearms training course requirements for pistol permit applicants?

You are **required** to complete a handgun safety course, which must consist of no less than the NRA's "Basic Pistol Course," prior to submitting the application. The NRA's "Home Firearms Safety Course" and "First Steps Pistol Orientation Program" are **not approved courses**.

Live fire is also required. Computer-generated programs, dry-fire, other simulated shooting tools, plastic bullets, air guns or any other alternatives are not acceptable. Students must fire a semi-automatic pistol or revolver.
