PROGRAM OVERVIEW


- The Pilot's goal is to improve participants' economic stability and health
- \$500 monthly cash payments to 3,250 Cook County residents for 24 months
- The \$42M Pilot is the nation's largest government-funded guaranteed income pilot to date

PROGRAM TIMELINE



ELEGIBILITY CRITERIA

- Cook County residents 18+ years of age
- · Not participating in another guaranteed income pilot
- Household income ≤250% of the Federal Poverty Level:



EXPECTED APPLICANTS

- Seniors on fixed incomes
- People with disabilities
- Single parents
- Caregivers unable to work
- People who want to further their schooling or start a new business

PILOT EVALUATION

- The University of Chicago will conduct a comprehensive evaluation of:
 - Participant outcomes
 - Impacts to the local economy and local community

RESEARCH FINDINGS

- Money is spent on essentials like housing, groceries, utilities, medical bills, and transportation
- Recipients with children spend the money on tutoring, school supplies, and extracurricular activities
- Significant debt reduction, increase in savings, and ability to weather emergency expenses

- Significant improvements to recipients' mental health
- Guaranteed income pilots
 have shown increased
 employment among
 recipients and have not led to
 increased unemployment or
 people choosing not to work
- Some recipients use the money to start their own business or non-profit organization

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

What is guaranteed income? How does it differ from universal basic income?	Both programs provide unrestricted cash payments on a recurring basis. Universal basic income programs provide payments to all residents of a city, state or country, while guaranteed income programs are specifically designed to target a subset of the population. Cook County Promise is a guaranteed income program.
How can communities benefit from guaranteed income policy?	By putting more cash in people's pockets, guaranteed income programs can stimulate the local economy as money flows to neighborhood businesses. Other guaranteed income pilots have shown increases in participants' full-time employment, and some participants launched their own small businesses or local non-profits.
Can residents get help with their applications?	Individuals who would like assistance in completing the application, or need access to a computer, tablet, or smartphone, will be able to access in-person and virtual support during the application window in locations across the County.
How will households be selected to participate?	After submitting an online application, applicants who meet the eligibility criteria will be entered into a lottery. Residents are eligible to apply regardless of citizenship status. We anticipate that there will be many more residents who apply than we can serve. Only one application per household will be accepted.

July Community Public Safety Meeting

The Village of Maywood Police Department holds monthly public safety meetings. Here are some of the topics that were touched on:

- ✓ Chief Willis spoke on the (15) license plate readers set to be installed in the village sometime in August. They will be installed in what has been determined to be hot spots throughout the village.
- ✓ The subject of carjacking was discussed, and the most recent trend seems to be involving rideshare vehicles. If you know anyone who does provide this service, please advise them to be always cautious and aware.
- ✓ New Interim Village Manager, Jim Krischke was in attendance as well and addressed the group that he was settling in and ready to take on some key issue in the village right away.
- ✓ Newly promoted Deputy Chief Yancy took information from residents about issues they have and assured them the police department would do their best to address them. Yancy also spoke about the new speed signs being installed on 5th Ave on the north side of Maywood to help reduce speeders in that area along with speed bumps that will be placed on 19th Ave between St. Charles road to Washington Ave. Speed bumps will also be placed on north and south Maywood Drive.
- ✓ Resource Liaison Rivera gave information about different events taking place in Maywood as well as Area Towing was offering free tow for the seniors in the village of Maywood.
- ✓ Lt. Fairley let everyone know that overnight parking was still being enforced and residents are not allowed to park on there lawns. Also, that the Boot Program in Maywood would be starting back up.
- ✓ Investigators Smith and Dolan gave updates on some cases that had been solved and gave as much insight as they could on on-going cases. They also talked about the joint car jacking task force that has had success in recovering vehicles and catching the suspects.

As you can see a lot of information is provided in these meetings and we encourage you to come out and see what your police department is actively doing to keep the neighborhood safe. **The next meeting will be on August 22, 2022 @ 7pm at the Lightford Recreation Center**


