Apply for up to \$60,000 in emergency mortgage assistance paid directly to your mortgage servicer.

Eligibility Requirements

- The homeowner must have experienced a COVID-19- related hardship after January 21, 2020.
- The homeowner must be delinquent on mortgage, property taxes, and/or condo association fees.
- · The homeowner must currently own and occupy the property as their primary residence.
- Proof of citizenship is not required. Homeownership assistance is not a "public-charge" benefit.

Illinois Homeowner Assistance Fund (ILHAF) Steps

- Get Informed: Attend or watch an online information session about the ILHAF program at illinoishousinghelp.org.
- 2. Explore Your Options: Pursue housing counseling, loss mitigation or legal aid assistance.
- Get Started: Gather all required documents so you are poised to apply when the grant application opens on Nov. 1, 2022.

2022 Roadway Improvements

Wilcox Street from 21st Avenue to 19th Avenue: The installation of the curb and gutter, concrete driveways, and excavation of roadway between 21st Avenue and 20th Avenue along with 20th Avenue and 19th Avenue has been completed. The excavation of the Alley between 20th Avenue and 19th Avenue on Wilcox Street is complete.

The removal/replacement of curb and gutter, sidewalks, and driveways, along with reconstruction of structures, and adjustment of curb line drainage structures has been completed. Underground consisting of the installation of new drainage structures and sewer laterals, installation of new manholes, reconstruction of existing manholes, and adjustment of curb line drainage structures has been addressed. Patching of the roadway at certain locations and begin milling operations for the installation of the HMA level binder and surface course has been addressed for the following:

- ✓ Erie Street from 3rd Avenue to 1st Avenue
- ✓ 3rd Ave from School St to Madison St
- ✓ 2nd Ave from School St to Madison St.
- ✓ School St from 3rd Avenue to 1st Ave
- √ 8th Avenue from Green St to School St





Infrastructure Development

21st Avenue CDBG Roadway Improvements The project is complete and the final thermoplastic pavement markings will be completed in the Spring.


2022 Green Infrastructure Alley Improvements The project is complete.

2022 Water Main Improvements Project

The project is complete with the exception of the Concrete Pavement Patching on St. Charles Road. This work will be performed in the Spring. The asphalt patches that are currently on St. Charles Rd. are temporary and have been made safe and driveable for winter. The contractor has performed clean up work over the past week along the residential properties. The punch list items will be completed in the Spring. Note that residents will not be responsible for the condition of the sod until it is inspected and accepted in the Spring.

2022 Roadway Improvements Project

The project is complete with the exception of signage, thermoplastic pavement markings, and final hot-mix asphalt surface course. The signage is scheduled to be installed next week. Temporary pavement markings will be placed (where stop bars are to be installed) for the winter. The hot-mix asphalt binder has been installed throughout the project. The contractor has "ramped in" all meet points at adjacent streets as well as ADA sidewalk ramp crossings with the placement of the hot-mix asphalt binder course, for safety. The asphalt contractor will resume work in the Spring by milling down the raised areas, saw-cuttting fresh butt joints, and installing the hot-mix asphalt final surface course. Thermoplastic pavement markings will follow. The punch list items will be completed in the Spring. Note that residents will not be responsible for the condition of the sod until it is inspected and accepted in the Spring.

The <u>Village of Maywood Police</u>

<u>Department</u> has been bringing intentional focus on public safety and community engagement. Our last village board meeting was full of successes. Our crime rates have lowered double digits this year across all areas (excluding car jackings). Here is a list of just a few of the things our police force has been busy executing on:

- √ (2) Radar speed signs being implemented on 5th N. Ave.
- ✓ Appointed a Deputy Chief, a Records Supervisor
- ✓ Deployed tasers and AR-15
- ✓ Established a Criminal Analyst position to assist in Investigations
- ✓ Established a School Resource Officer (SRO) for District 89 and Proviso East High School
- ✓ Established <u>Maywood</u>

 <u>Department of Homeland</u>

 <u>Security and Emergency</u>

 <u>Management</u>
- ✓ Hired 15 Officers: 10 Full Time and 5 Part Time
- ✓ Hired an Investigation Specialist to assist with cold cases
- ✓ Implemented (15) Geovision LPR cameras enhancing our technology
- ✓ Purchased 60 radios for department
- ✓ Secured a grant to assist with purchase of body worn cameras for \$16,000
- ✓ Re-established the boot program, there is now a dedicated Boot Administrator
