• RESOLUTION ACCEPTING AND ACKNOWLEDGING THE 2020 MILLSTONE BOROUGH AUDIT.

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40A: 5-4 requires the governing body of every local unit to have made an annual audit of its books, accounts and financial transactions; and

WHEREAS, the Annual Report of Audit for the year 2020 has been filed by a Registered Municipal Accountant with the Borough Clerk as per the requirements of N.J.S.A. 40A:5-6, and a copy has been received by each member of the governing body; and

WHEREAS, the Local Finance Board of the State of New Jersey is authorized to prescribe reports pertaining to the local fiscal affairs, as per R.S. 52-27BB-34; and

WHEREAS, the Local Finance Board has promulgated a regulation requiring that the governing body of each municipality shall by resolution certify to the Local Finance Board of the State of New Jersey that all members of the governing body have reviewed, as a minimum, the sections of the annual audit entitled:

; and

WHEREAS, the members of the governing body have personally reviewed as a minimum the Annual Report of Audit, and specifically the sections of the Annual Audit entitled:

General Comments Recommendations

as evidenced by the group affidavit form of the governing body; and

WHEREAS, such resolution of certification shall be adopted by the governing body no later than forty five days after the receipt of the annual audit, as per the regulations of the Local Finance Board; and

WHEREAS, all members of the governing body have received and have familiarized themselves with, at least, the minimum requirements of the Local Finance Boards of the State of New Jersey, as stated aforesaid and have subscribed to the affidavit, as provided by the Local Finance Board; and



WHEREAS, failure to comply with the promulgations of the Local Finance Board of the State of New Jersey may subject members of the local governing body to the penalty provisions of R.S. 52:27BB-52 – to wit:

R.S. 52:27BB-52 – "A local officer or member of a local governing body who, after a date fixed for compliance, fails or refuses to obey an order of the director (Director of Local Government Services), under the provisions of this Article, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction, may be fined not more than one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00) or imprisoned for not more than one year, or both, in addition shall forfeit his office".

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Borough Council of the Borough of Millstone, hereby states that it has complied with the promulgations of the Local Finance Board of the State of New Jersey dated July 30, 1968 and does hereby submit a certified copy of this resolution and the required affidavit to said Board to show evidence of said compliance.

• RESOLUTION DESIGNATING MAY AS "BAG UP NJ MONTH"

Councilwoman Kidd offered a motion to approve the Bag Up NJ resolution. Seconded by Councilwoman Ross.

WHEREAS, P.L.202, c.117, signed into law on November 4, 2020 is the most progressive disposable bag law in the country, with the goal of phasing out single-use plastic and paper bags and encouraging the use of reusable bags throughout New Jersey; and

WHEREAS, New Jersey is working to reduce reliance on single-use products to ensure that future generations have a clean and healthy environment to live, work, and recreate in; and

WHEREAS, banning or limiting the use of single-use plastic and paper carryout bags is a significant step in this effort; and

WHEREAS, the New Jersey Clean Communities Council, the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection, the New Jersey Department of State, policymakers, environmental and business groups, as well as other stakeholders, are working together to educate consumers, businesses, and communities about the new law and encouraging residents to "Bag Up" before the ban on single-use plastic bags goes into effect on May 4, 2022; and

WHEREAS, the comprehensive "Bag Up NJ" campaign will include educational programs, public and media engagement and reusable bag distribution programs throughout the state, with an emphasis on underserved communities; and

WHEREAS, this statewide public education campaign will provide residents, businesses and visitors with information about the types of reusable and sustainable bags and containers that they may use and where to access these products.



NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Borough of Millstone, in the County of Somerset that it is critical to begin educating the public about this new law; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that one way to gain important recognition is to deem the month of May each year as "Bag Up NJ" month in Millstone Borough, as a further reminder that all residents should bring their own reusable bags to the store; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that a copy of this resolution shall be transmitted to the NJ Clean Communities Council, and the New Jersey State League of Municipalities.

RESOLUTION FOR SIGN MAINTENANCE AGREEMENT FOR "WELCOME TO MILLSTONE BOROUGH" SINGS ON SOMERSET COUNTY ROADS

Councilwoman Kidd offered a motion to approve the grant submission. Seconded by Councilwoman Ross

WHEREAS, the Borough of Millstone (hereinafter "Borough") seeks to install new, or upgraded existing "Welcome to Millstone Borough" signs (hereinafter "Signs"), within Somerset County (hereinafter "County") rights-of-way at municipal boundaries; and

WHEREAS, the County requires the Borough to be responsible for the maintenance of the Signs; and

WHEREAS, the Borough has expressed a willingness to cooperate with he County requirements; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED in consideration of the conditions contained here, and pursuant to all applicable federal, state, county and local laws and ordinances, the Borough Council of the Borough of Millstone agrees as follows;

1. The Borough has prepared locations maps showing the Signs at the following locations:

A. Lot No. 2, Block No. 1.01,

County Rd 533 Northwest side near Hillsborough boundary. Owner: McCauley B. Lot No. 6, Block No. 1, County Rd 514 Rd East of Amsterdam Rd near Hillsborough boundary Mindel, Lee et al Trust Mgt

- C. Lot No. 8, Block No. 1, County Rds 514 and 533 intersection on Southwest side corner, Owner Somerset County
- D. Lot No. 9, Block No. 7, County Rd. 533, Southeast side near Hillsborough boundary.
- 2. The Borough agrees the Signs must not block any other traffic control sign.
- 3. The Borough agrees to pay all costs, including but not limited to installation, maintenance, repair and replacement of the Signs.
- 4. The Borough agree to defend, indemnify, protect and save harmless the County and its agenda and employees from and against any and all suits, claims, losses, demands or damages of whatever kind of nature airing out of or claims to rise out of the performance of any services, action or operation in connection with the installation of the Signs.
- 5. The Borough acknowledges that if the Signs become a hazard, in any way, to the public, the County reserves the right to remove the Signs.

• DISCUSSION – CANNABIS

Mayor Heck introduced the topic of passing an ordinance restricting the sales and cultivation of cannabis in the borough. Attorney Offen summarized the options available to the Borough.

The Borough Council discussed the matter and agreed to introduce an ordinance restricting the cannbis operations in the borough.



Council President Kidd offered a motion to introduce the ordinance and set the public hearing for July 19, 2021. Seconded by Councilwoman Ross.

• INTRODUCTION OF ORDINANCE NO. 2021-003: AN ORDINANCE BY BOROUGH OF MILLSTONE IN THE COUNTY OF SOMERSET, STATE OF NEW JERSEY PROHIBITING THE OPERATION OF ANY CLASS OF CANNABIS BUSINESSES WITHIN ITS GEOGRAPHICAL BOUNDARIES AND AMENDING AND/OR DELETING PRIOR ORDINANCES and set the public hearing for July 19, 2021

WHEREAS, in 2020 New Jersey voters approved Public Question No. 1, which amended the New Jersey Constitution to allow for the legalization of a controlled form of marijuana called "cannabis" for adults at least 21 years of age; and

WHEREAS, on February 22, 2021, Governor Murphy signed into law P.L. 2021, c. 16, known as the "New Jersey Cannabis Regulatory, Enforcement Assistance, and Marketplace Modernization Act" (the "Act"), which legalizes the recreational use of marijuana by adults 21 years of age or older, and establishes a comprehensive regulatory and licensing scheme for commercial recreational (adult use) cannabis operations, use and possession; and

WHEREAS, the Act establishes six marketplace classes of licensed businesses, including:

- Class 1 Cannabis Cultivator license, for facilities involved in growing and cultivating cannabis;
- Class 2 Cannabis Manufacturer license, for facilities involved in the manufacturing, preparation, and packaging of cannabis items;
- Class 3 Cannabis Wholesaler license, for facilities involved in obtaining and selling cannabis items for later resale by other licensees;
- Class 4 Cannabis Distributer license, for businesses involved in transporting cannabis plants in bulk from on licensed cultivator to another licensed cultivator, or cannabis items in bulk from any type of licensed cannabis business to another;
- Class 5 Cannabis Retailer license for locations at which cannabis items and related supplies are sold to consumers; and
- Class 6 Cannabis Delivery license, for businesses providing courier services for consumer purchases that are fulfilled by a licensed cannabis retailer in order to make deliveries of the purchases items to a consumer, and which service would include the ability of a consumer to make a purchase directly through the cannabis delivery service which would be presented by the delivery service for fulfillment by a retailer and then delivered to a consumer.

WHEREAS, section 31a of the Act authorizes municipalities by ordinance to adopt regulations governing the number of cannabis establishments (defined in section 3 of the Act as "a cannabis



cultivator, a cannabis manufacturer, a cannabis wholesaler, or a cannabis retailer"), cannabis distributors or cannabis delivery services allowed to operate within their boundaries, as well as the location manner and times operation of such establishments, distributors or delivery services, and establishing civil penalties for the violation of any such regulations; and

WHEREAS, section 31b of the Act authorizes municipalities by ordinance to prohibit the operation of any one or more classes of cannabis establishments, distributors, or delivery services anywhere in the municipality; and

WHEREAS, section 31b of the Act also stipulates, however, that any municipal regulation or prohibition must be adopted within 180 days of the effective date of the Act (*i.e.*, by August 22, 2021); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to section 31b of the Act, the failure to do so shall mean that for a period of five years thereafter, the growing, cultivating, manufacturing, selling and reselling of cannabis and cannabis items shall be permitted uses in all industrial zones, and the retail selling of cannabis items to consumers shall be a conditional use in all commercial and retail zones; and

WHEREAS, at the conclusion of the initial and any subsequent five-year period following a failure to enact local regulations or prohibitions, the municipality shall again have 180 days to adopt an ordinance regulating or prohibiting cannabis businesses, but any such ordinance would be prospective only and would not apply to any cannabis business already operating within the municipality; and

WHEREAS, the Borough Council of the Borough of Millstone has determined that, due to present uncertainties regarding the potential future impacts that allowing one or more classes of cannabis business might have on New Jersey municipalities in general, and on Borough of Millstone in particular, it is at this time necessary and appropriate, and in the best interest of the health, safety and welfare of Borough of Millstone's residents and members of the public who visit, travel, or conduct business in Borough of Millstone, to amend Borough of Millstone's zoning regulations to prohibit all manner of marijuana-related land use and development within the geographic boundaries of Borough of Millstone; and

WHEREAS, due to the complexity and novelty of the Act; the many areas of municipal law that are or may be implicated in decisions as to whether or to what extent cannabis or medical cannabis should be permitted for land use purposes or otherwise regulated in any particular municipality; and the relatively short duration in which the Act would allow such decisions to be made before imposing an automatic authorization of such uses in specified zoning districts subject to unspecified conditions, the most prudent course of action for all municipalities, whether or not generally in favor of cannabis or medical cannabis land development and uses, would be to prohibit all such uses within the Act's 180-day period in order to ensure sufficient time to carefully review all aspects of the Act and its impacts;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, by the Borough Council of the Borough of Millstone in the County of Somerset, State of New Jersey, as follows:

1. Pursuant to section 31b of the New Jersey Cannabis Regulatory, Enforcement Assistance, and Marketplace Modernization Act (P.L. 2021, c. 16), all cannabis establishments, cannabis distributors or cannabis delivery services are hereby prohibited from operating anywhere in Borough of Millstone, except for the delivery of cannabis items and related supplies by a delivery service.

- 3. Any article, section, paragraph, subsection, clause, or other provision of the Borough of Millstone Code inconsistent with the provisions of this ordinance is hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.
- 4. If any section, paragraph, subsection, clause, or provision of this ordinance shall be adjudged by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, such adjudication shall apply only to the section, paragraph, subsection, clause, or provision so adjudged, and the remainder of this ordinance shall be deemed valid and effective.
- 5. This ordinance shall take effect upon its passage and publication and filing with the Somerset County Planning Board, and as otherwise provided for by law.


