MINUTES:

• None – Clerk Bonin reported that both the September and October minutes will be presented in November.

REPORTS:

- Assessor none
- Clerk Clerk Bonin reminded everyone the general election is scheduled for November 2, 2021. Early voting is an option in New Jersey
- Emergency Management (OEM/State Police/Fire) Mayor Heck reported that he is still doing Ida clean up and the Borough is 99% clean. Catch basins still need to be cleaned and the large drains also will be cleaned by the County. He stated that leaves dropping are a problem. Mayor Heck commented the Borough is making a request for assistance on what was affected in the town by Ida and we are seeking FEMA reimbursement.
- Finance/Tax Collection CFO Vesce reported our tax collection rate is 98%.
- Historic Commission Mayor Heck reported the Historic Commission Journey to the Past event was held again and was excellent. Covid restrictions brought smaller crowds but still there was a considerable amount of people. Millstone Borough has a lot of history and historical artifacts.

COUNCIL REPORTS:

- Planning Board Councilman Galli reported there was not much to report other than there was a discussion of renewing Carter Van Dyke and Gerry Muller contracts for another year.
- Traffic and Roads Mayor Heck reported that he got update from County to get Maple Terrace paved in first week of November. It should be a quick project.

MAYOR'S REPORT:

Mayor Heck reported that he has taken steps to renew or flood mitigation plan which includes more houses being evaluated for possible flood mitigation. Most of the flood prone homes that were elevated did not flood although one did have some water on the first floor. The Borough is looking at possibly 4 more structures for elevation and 2 more for relocation.

Mayor Heck is working with the County to get the gas station moved out of flood plain via a land swap.

Mayor Heck commented that he and Clerk Bonin met with representatives from Mott McDonald regarding the borough's potential sewer design. Councilman Galli asked if sewer would be gravity fed. Mayor Heck stated that would be the goal as much as possible

Comcast franchise renewal public hearing

Mayor Heck introduced Robert Clifton, government representative for Comcast. Mayor Heck outlined the franchise renewal process. Mr. Clifton stated that Comcast is only looking for a 10 year renewal period.

Mayor Heck asked if Comcast still provides senior citizen discounts. Mr. Clifton stated that is considered discriminatory pricing, but they do provide 10% if the user meets NJ senior taxation criteria.

Mayor Heck asked about signal consistency and wireless 5g. Mr. Clifton said Comcast is a wired company and will continue to maintain services and equipment. In south NJ Comcast has a control center to see when outages occur to dispatch crews quickly. Comcast is constantly maintaining and upgrading system.

Mayor Heck asked about municipal services provided to NJ municipalities, for the Borough the local cable channel is a vital OEM tool. He stated our tv station equipment is aging and in need to be upgraded. Mayor Heck asked will Comcast provide a technology grant to Millstone so we can update our systems? Mr. Clifton responded Comcast will include a grant offer in the contract that he sends to the Borough.

Councilman Galli asked what channel is the Borough's Comcast tv station. Mayor Heck stated we have channels 19 and 29.

• RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE PAYMENT OF CLAIMS AGAINST THE BOROUGH OF MILLSTONE

WHEREAS, request for payment has been made in connection with the attached claims against the Borough of Millstone as shown on the attached detail; and

WHEREAS, the Chief Financial Officer has certified the availability of funds to pay for the following claims; and

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE BOROUGH OF MILLSTONE IN THE COUNTY OF SOMERSET, NEW JERSEY, that the proper Borough Officials are hereby authorized to pay the following bills, subject to and contingent upon appropriation of sufficient funds and that this authorizing Resolution be and is hereby made a part of the official records of the Borough of Millstone.

NEW BUSINESS:

• RESOLUTION OF THE BOROUGH OF MILLSTONE, COUNTY OF SOMERSET, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, DESIGNATING LOT 1, 2, 3A AND 8 IN BLOCK 8 WITHIN THE BOROUGH AS A "NON-CONDEMNATION AREA IN NEED OF REDEVELOPMENT"

Councilman Stashek offered a resolution to establish a redevelopment area. Seconded by Councilman Galli.

Attorney Offen explained that this resolution would place a PILOT upon the Van Cleef parcel if that is what the Borough Council desires.

WHEREAS, the Local Redevelopment and Housing Law, *N.J.S.A.* 40A:12A-1 *et seq.* (the "*Redevelopment Law*") authorizes municipalities to determine whether certain parcels of land in the municipality constitute "areas in need of redevelopment," as defined in the LRHL; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the LRHL, the Borough Council of the Borough of Millstone (the "Borough Council") did previously, by Resolution adopted April 15, 2019 (the "Referral Resolution") refer the property identified on the Borough's tax map as Lots 1, 2, 3A, and 8 in Block 8(the "Study Area") to the Borough's Planning Board for the Planning Board to perform a preliminary investigation to determine whether the Study Area qualifies as an "area in need of redevelopment" pursuant to the LRHL; and



WHEREAS, the Referral Resolution specified that, if the Study Area should qualify as an "area in need of redevelopment" under the LRHL, it should be a "non-condemnation area in need of redevelopment" as contemplated by the LRHL; and

WHEREAS, the Borough's Planning Board (the "Planning Board") prepared a preliminary investigation report entitled Preliminary Investigation for Determination of Redevelopment Area dared October 1, 2020 – revised December 15, 2020 (the "Preliminary Investigation"), which included a map of the Study Area and recommendations concerning whether the Study Area qualified as an "area in need of redevelopment" in accordance with the LRHL; and

WHEREAS, the Planning Board considered the recommendations in the Preliminary Investigation at its duly-noticed public meeting held on December 15, 2020; and

WHEREAS, at its duly-noticed public meeting held on December 15, 2020, the Planning Board adopted the recommendations of its preliminary investigation and recommended that the Council designate the Study Area as a "non-condemnation area in need of redevelopment" in accordance with the LRHL; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with the requirements of the LRHL, the Council has determined that the Study Area meets certain requirements as outlined in the Preliminary Investigation and LRHL to be designated as a "non-condemnation area in need of redevelopment;"

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Borough Council of the Borough of Millstone as follows:

Section 1. The Borough Council hereby designates the Study Area (identified as Tax Block_8, Lots 1, 2, 3A, and 8 as a "non-condemnation area in need of redevelopment," which designation allows the Borough Council to, among other things, adopt and implement a redevelopment plan for the Study Area in accordance with the requirements and prerequisites of the LRHL and to contract with a redeveloper for the redevelopment of the Study Area.

<u>Section 2.</u> The Borough Council hereby directs that the Borough Clerk transmit a copy of this Resolution to the Commissioner of the Department of Community of Affairs for review in accordance with the LRHL.

Section 3. The Study Area shall be known as the "Van Cleef Property" Redevelopment Area.

Section 4. The Council is hereby directed to take such further action as may be necessary in accordance with the LRHL in order to prepare a redevelopment plan for the Van Cleef Property Redevelopment Area that will be adopted by Ordinance of the Borough pursuant to the procedures outlined in the LRHL.

<u>Section 5.</u> This resolution shall take effect in accordance with applicable law.
