WHEREAS, the Chief Financial Officer has certified the availability of funds to pay for the following claims; and

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE BOROUGH OF MILLSTONE IN THE COUNTY OF SOMERSET, NEW JERSEY, that the proper Borough Officials are hereby authorized to pay the following bills, subject to and contingent upon appropriation of sufficient funds and that this authorizing Resolution be and is hereby made a part of the official records of the Borough of Millstone.

#### **NEW BUSINESS:**

 RESOLUTION TO AWARD A CONTRACT FOR SOLID WASTE COLLECTION SERVICES



Council President Kidd offered a resolution to award a contract for solid waste collection services. Seconded by Councilman Stashek.

Attorney Offen explained that Dave's Suburban Disposal was the low bidder but did not include an annual report with their bid. Attorney Offen stated this was a material defect which made their bid defective and incurable. The only other bidder was Raritan Valley Disposal. Attorney Offen stated the importance of the document is to show the financial integrity of company. Without that document you do not know which company is financially solvent and able to do the contract. Attorney Offen stated it would be unfair to rebid the contract as prices are now public.

WHEREAS, bids were received by the Borough's Qualified Purchasing Agent on October 11, 2022 for Solid Waste Collection (the "Project") and

WHEREAS, bids were received from Dave's Suburban Disposal Service, LLC ('Dave's) and Republic Services of NJ d/b/a Raritan Valley Disposal ('Republic Services'); and

WHEREAS, the bid received from Dave's was the numerically lowest, however did not include a copy of their annual report as required by N.J.A.C. 7:26H-6.1, and N.J.A.C. 7:26H-6.5, (d)(2); and

WHEREAS, the Borough Attorney determined that the omission of the annual report in the bid submission is deemed a 'fatal flaw' which cannot be corrected; and

WHEREAS, the Borough's Qualified Purchasing Agent and Attorney deemed the bid submitted by Republic Services complete, responsible and responsive.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Borough Council of the Borough of Millstone, Somerset County, that the bid received from Dave's for the Project is hereby rejected; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, by the Borough Council of the Borough of Millstone, Somerset County, that 1) a contract for the Project be awarded to Republic Services of NJ d/b/a Raritan Valley Disposal, 9 Frontage Road, Clinton, NJ 08809; and 2) the Borough shall compensate the Contractor for the Project in accordance with the Contract Documents for a three year contract in the amount not to exceed:

 RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE TRANSFER OF FUNDS IN THE BOROUGH OF MILLSTONE CALENDAR YEAR 2022 BUDGET AMONG CURRENT FUND APPROPRIATIONS PURSUANT TO N.J.S.A. 40A:4-59

WHEREAS, the following details indicate the account to which funds need to be transferred and the account from which funds need to be transferred from to ensure adequate appropriations exist where needed to pay claims against the Borough.
