REPORTS:

- Assessor no report
- Clerk Clerk Bonin reminded those present that the Borough's Annual Reorganization meeting is scheduled for January 2, 2023 at 7 PM, in person, in the Borough Hall. He also commented that Hillsborough will be holding a rabies clinic on January 21, 2023 and the Borough will do in person dog and cat licensing on January 28, 2023 from 9:00 AM to 11:00 AM.
- Emergency Management (OEM/State Police/Fire) Mayor Heck reported he has conducted the required functional FEMA drill. It was a two hour exercise with Deputy Emergency Manager Gene Grimshaw.
- Finance/Tax Collection no report
- Historic Commission Mayor Heck reported the new historic marker signs have been installed and have been placed to avoid causing a site line issue on the roadway.
- Recreation Commission Mayor Heck reported the Recreation Commission is working on a new Christmas function that will be open to residents.

COUNCIL REPORTS:

- Buildings and Grounds no report
- Planning Board Councilman Gallie reported on the redevelopment plan discussion at the Planning Board. He stated the plan for the Van Cleef property has been rewritten as the first version had link between sewer and our plan, it has been rewritten to remove linkage. The plan is still before the Planning Board for editing. Councilman Galli said Attorney Muller will be reaching out to Attorney Offen regarding the plan details.
- Traffic and Roads Mayor Heck stated he has a call out to county about status of traffic study on County Route 533. The County has said they will conduct the study in December. Mayor Heck also reached out to county regarding the installation of our new led speed signs.

MAYOR'S REPORT:

Mayor Heck reported that the Heritage trail project is fully grant funded and ready for installation. Which we will work on this spring.



Attorney Offen stated after the Planning Board finalizes its redevelopment plan the Borough Council will have to review and vote on it. Councilman Galli commented that he has been told the plan could be adopted by the Planning Board just for the Van Cleef property without the Borough Council approval. Attorney Offen stated that any redevelopment plan needs Borough Council approval. Councilman Galli suggested Attorney Offen speak with Attorney Muller about that matter.

Mr. Henry Wierzbowski commented that he attended the County meeting and spoke to the Commissioners and Engineer Matt Loper about the traffic study and dangerous conditions on Rt 533. The County did understand his concerns but did not commit to a date for the study.

He also commented that he would like to see the boroughs revenue from traffic enforcement, and he still has leaves near his property.

Mayor Heck stated the leaves will be picked up soon and asked CFO Vesce to obtain the revenue information requested.

Councilman Galli commented that in general we pay just over \$40,000 for police services and also asked if we know what receive in ticket revenue. Mayor Heck says he is unsure but will get that information. Councilman Galli stated we are spending more than we collect and the Borough is making substantial efforts to calm traffic, despite costing more than we take in.
