Hearing none, we proceed to the next item on the agenda.

- Emergency Management (OEM/State Police/Fire) Mayor Heck stated he is at a mandatory OEM training session. He thanked the Council members who attended the elected officials training and proudly stated that Millstone is the first municipality in county to fully comply with our OEM requirements.

COUNCIL REPORTS:

- Buildings and Grounds no report
- Planning Board Mr Galli stated that the redevelopment plan passed by the Planning Board will now go the Borough Council to review. He also commented that St. Josephs Church has applied for a variance to install a pavilion. Attorney Offen commented that the redevelopment matter is on this agenda for discussion.
- Traffic and Roads Council President Kidd said he ordered crack sealer to go forward with that work. He asked if we have cones and signs for traffic control. Mayor Heck stated we have many cones and can get signs from the County. Council President Kidd also stated he has called the County to make the Amwell Rd and Rt 533 intersection a 4-way arrow light.

MAYOR'S REPORT:

Mayor Heck stated he has been working with County leadership to help resolve speed limit issues on Rt 533 and the County has agreed to reduce speed limit on Rt 533 to 25mph. They are working on pedestrian crossing issues and a Main St designation.

MEETING OPEN TO THE PUBLIC:

Council President Kidd offered a motion to open the meeting to the public. Seconded by Ms. Grimshaw.

Mr. Wierzbowski of 1444 Millstone River Road, stated he was glad to hear speed limit will be lower on Rt 533 and stated it is now a question of enforcement. He opined that the lower part of Amwell Rd should also be 25 MPH.

Carol Halm of 75 Amwell, came to ask again for arrows at lighted intersection, stating the arrows would help. She also commented that all roads in Somerville are now 25mph and Millstone should do the same.

President Kidd suggested that the school busses should not come up Amwell Road on their way to other destinations, they should use Amsterdam Rd.

• RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE PAYMENT OF CLAIMS AGAINST THE BOROUGH OF MILLSTONE

WHEREAS, request for payment has been made in connection with the attached claims against the Borough of Millstone as shown on the attached detail; and

WHEREAS, the Chief Financial Officer has certified the availability of funds to pay for the following claims; and

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE BOROUGH OF MILLSTONE IN THE COUNTY OF SOMERSET, NEW JERSEY, that the proper Borough Officials are hereby authorized to pay the following bills, subject to and contingent upon appropriation of sufficient funds and that this authorizing Resolution be and is hereby made a part of the official records of the Borough of Millstone.

NEW BUSINESS:

• ORDINANCE 2023-001: AN ORDINANCE TO EXCEED THE MUNICIPAL BUDGET APPROPRIATION LIMITS AND TO ESTABLISH A CAP BANK (N.J.S.A. 40A: 4-45.14) and set the public hearing for May 15, 2023

A motion to introduce Ordinance 2023-001 and set the public hearing for May 15, 2023 was offered by Council President Kidd, seconded by Ms. Grimshaw.

WHEREAS, the Local Government Cap Law, N.J.S. 40A: 4-45.1 et seq., provides that in the preparation of its annual budget, a municipality shall limit any increase in said budget up to 2.5% unless authorized by ordinance to increase it to 3.5% over the previous year's final appropriations, subject to certain exceptions; and,

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40A: 4-45.15a provides that a municipality may, when authorized by ordinance, appropriate the difference between the amount of its actual final appropriation and the 3.5% percentage rate as an exception to its final appropriations in either of the next two succeeding years; and,



WHEREAS, the Borough Council of the Borough of Millstone in the County of Somerset finds it advisable and necessary to increase its CY 2022 budget by up to 3.5% over the previous year's final appropriations, in the interest of promoting the health, safety and welfare of the citizens; and,

WHEREAS, the Borough Council hereby determines that a 3.5% increase in the budget for said year, amounting to \$15,881.28 in excess of the increase in final appropriations otherwise permitted by the Local Government Cap Law, is advisable and necessary; and,

WHEREAS, the Borough Council hereby determines that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED, by the Borough Council of the Borough of Millstone, in the County of Somerset, a majority of the full authorized membership of this governing body affirmatively concurring, that, in the CY 2023 budget year, the final appropriations of the Borough of Millstone shall, in accordance with this ordinance and N.J.S.A. 40A: 4-45.14, be increased by 3.5%, amounting to \$15,881.28, and that the CY 2023 municipal budget for the Borough of Millstone be approved and adopted in accordance with this ordinance; and,

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years; and,

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that a certified copy of this ordinance as introduced be filed with the Director of the Division of Local Government Services within 5 days of introduction; and,

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that a certified copy of this ordinance upon adoption, with the recorded vote included thereon, be filed with said Director within 5 days after such adoption.

• RESOLUTION TO INTRODUCE THE 2023 BOROUGH BUDGET AND SET THE PUBLIC HEARING FOR MAY 15, 2023.

A resolution to introduce the 2023 Borough budget and set the public hearing for May 15, 2023 was offered by Council President Kidd, seconded by Ms. Grimshaw.

BE IT RESOLVED, that the following statements of revenues and appropriations shall constitute the Municipal Budget for year 2023.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that said Budget be published in the Courier News in the issue of April 24, 2023.

Notice is hereby given that the Budget and Tax Resolution was approved by the Borough Council of the Borough of Millstone, County of Somerset, on April 17, 2023; and

A Hearing on the Budget and Tax Resolution will be held during the Borough Council's monthly meeting on May 15, 2023 at 7:30 PM at which time and place objections to said Budget and Tax Resolution for the year 2023 may be presented by taxpayers or other interested persons.

- Discussion Mayor Heck brought up the issue of allowing cannabis retail stores in the borough. He asked if the Borough could allow one class of distribution and restrict the others. Attorney Offen said yes, the borough could make that choice.
- Discussion Appointment of Special Counsel for the Van Cleef PILOT

Attorney Offen suggest a special counsel to do the Van Cleef PILOT as his firm represents the Van Cleef organization and this could be a conflict. He suggested local attorney Mark Anderson could do the PILOT and negotiations with the Van Cleef association. Mayor Heck endorsed Mark Anderson for this role.

Council President Kidd offered a motion to appoint Mark Anderson as the attorney to draft and negotiate a PILOT with the Van Cleef organization. Second by Ms. Grimshaw.

• Discussion – TND Redevelopment Plan

Attorney Offen reported the Planning Board has approved the TND Redevelopment plan and the process now would be for the Borough Council to adopt the plan via an ordinance.

Attorney Offen stated the Van Cleef organization has some items they would wish to add to the plan. These changes would have to go back to the Planning Board for approval before the Borough Council could approve.

• Discussion – Revised Sewer Concept Plan

Mr. Galli stated he has reached out to our consultant, Mott McDonald, and has not heard from them regarding a scaled back sewer plan. He asked that this matter be carried to the next meeting.

OLD BUSINESS:

- LEPC Mayor Heck reiterated he is at a mandatory OEM conference and will report on it in May.
- FEMA/Mitigation Mayor Heck reported he is working to development another application and another concept to preserve existing properties.
- Status of PILOT nothing further to discuss
- Council President Kidd asked the Borough Council members if they would be in favor of making the end of Van Doren Drive a proper cul-de-sac so large vehicles can turn around. Mayor Heck stated he will review the tax maps to see what property, rights-of-way and utilities might be involved.
