


Ordinance 96-158C
AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING PARKING ON SNOW COVERED ROADS
IN THE BOROUGH OF MILLSTONE, COUNTY OF SOMERSET

BE IT ORDAINED by the Borough Council of the Borough of
Millstone, County of Somerset and State of New Jersey as follows:

1. Parking of any vehicle on any portion of a public road, street or highway is prohibited whenever snow has fallen and the accumulation is such that it covers the public road, street or highway in the Borough of Millstone.
2. Said parking prohibition shall remain in effect after the snow has ceased and until the streets, roads or highways have been plowed sufficiently and to the extent that parking will not interfere with the normal flow of traffic.
3. As used in this Ordinance, the term snow shall mean any precipitation depositing any accumulation on the streets, roads or highways, including snow, sleet, hail, ice or freezing rain.
4. As to Section 1 of this Ordinance, regulatory and warning signs in accordance with N.J.S.A. 39:4-198 shall be erected and maintained at all street, road, or highway entrances for motor vehicles into this Borough.
5. Any unoccupied vehicle parked or standing in violation of this ordinance shall be deemed a nuisance and a menace to the safe and proper regulation of traffic and any police officer may provide for the removal of such a vehicle. The owner of such a vehicle shall pay the reasonable costs of the removal and storage which may result from such removal, before regaining possession of such vehicle.
6. Unless another penalty is expressly provided for by New Jersey Statute, every person convicted of a violation of a provision of this Ordinance shall be liable to a penalty of not exceeding \$50.00 or imprisonment for a term not exceeding fifteen (15) days or both.
7. The invalidity of any section or provisions of this Ordinance shall not invalidate any other section or provisions thereof.
8. All ordinances or parts or ordinances inconsistent with this ordinance are hereby repealed.
9. This ordinance shall take effect immediately upon final passage and publication as required by law.
