18	WHEREAS, we also request to restrict certain packaging that is enticing to minors; and
19 20 21 22	WHEREAS, a large number of people were concerned about access to medicinal cannabis, there is currently no differentiation between recreational marijuana high in Tetrahydrocannabinol (THC), medicinal cannabis high in Cannabinoids (CBD), and Industrial hemp or the State should consider differentiation by both definition and distinct regulations; and
23 24 25	WHEREAS , there is currently no control of contaminants or potency in marijuana products, minimum standards need to be established and appropriate labeling required to include both THC and CBD levels; and
