COUNCIL MEMBER QUESTIONS OF THE MAYOR (Audio 10:48)

• Mr. McGhee stated he had walked out of the last budget session because of a violation of the open meeting act and asked if he was aware of the full process and procedure. He also stated that he counseled with the city attorney and learned that the finance committee is not an approved committee. Mayor Welch replied that he had a discussion with Mr. Wilson today that workshop sessions were made open to the public and there was no violation as he saw it. The finance committee was no different than a committee he served on in 2007 and according to what he had described, Mr. Wilson did not think that it had been violated. Mr. McGhee replied that committees are to be voted on and approved by the council and he was going by the code of ordinances. He also stated there was an addition at the end of the last budget session meeting that pay scale changes were being considered that employees and the public were not notified about. The biggest concern he has is that it affects all employees in the long run. Mr. Claus stated he had attended one of the finance meetings as a member of the public (inaudible) and that would constitute a form of public notice, he believes.

COMMUNICATIONS FROM DEPARTMENT HEADS, BOROUGH REPRESENTATIVE AND THE CITY CLERK

Fire Department, Chief Coon

- We have made a conditional offer to fill the vacant firefighter position. It will still take until early December to have the position filled. We are only waiting on the Dr.'s physical to finish up the hiring.
- October was fire prevention month and we hosted dozens of station tours for elementary
 and day care kids. Last weekend when changing your clocks, you should have changed
 the battery in your smoke alarm.
- At the request of the Mayor I have participated with the other department heads in a training seminar with Confluence Consulting 49 LLC.
- I attended the "RESAC" regional emergency services advisory committee meeting. The committee is tasked with making recommendations to the Borough Assembly on improving emergency services.
- I completed the 1st quarter EMPG grant report.

Training:

- We have one member finishing up her firefighter 1 training and two members in EMT 1 class.
- Two members attended the EMS symposium in Anchorage last week.
- The Fire Department participated in a planning teleconference for a patient movement exercise in February.
- DC Heineken has been working with the staff on finishing up some training. Training is a big component in our ISO rating and one that the department takes very seriously.

Maintenance Report:

- The forced air furnaces in the annex were installed and are up and running without any issues.
- M-21 went into the shop for a recall but is back in service.
- B-shift is still working on oil changes apparatus inspections.

Finance, Tricia Fogarty

- In early October we received our second payment of PDF garnishments in the amount of \$28,201. We are really close to making our budgeted amount.

Mayor Welch asked if there was any further discussion?

Mr. McGhee stated he would not approve a one mil increase in property taxes and that there were a number of items he did not agree with, including hiring a part time Admin employee. He says raising the sales tax instead of property taxes would take the burden off of property owners.

Mayor Welch discussed sales tax and mil rate history in the City and how it affects its residents.

Ms. Welch stated an increase in property taxes will result in extra services to residents.

Mr. Walley stated we have one of the lowest mil rates in the state. We could fall short with sales tax. The budget is not perfect but an increase of one mil could help bridge the gap in moving forward.

Mr. McGhee commented that he is in favor of a sales tax increase. He wants to meet with Ms. Fogarty to discuss hiring a part time Admin employee. He understands the needs of the fleet funds and of Public Works. He thinks we should tax the ones using the system, not the property owners in order to provide for the needs of the City.

Mayor Welch stated that an online sales tax is something we have to do. By raising the mil rate by ½ a mil, increasing the sales tax and raising the exemption to \$300, we should be able to slide home.

Mr. McGhee <u>moved to amend Ordinance 19-20 an Ordinance of the North Pole City</u> Council Establishing the 2020 Operating Budget and Capital Budget by increasing the

REQUEST TO APPROVE WAGE DETERMINATION FOR A LATERAL HIRE IN THE POLICE DEPARTMENT

Chief Dutra Currently Kurt Lockwood is a Police Lieutenant with the Fairbanks Police Department. I have given the council a copy of Lieutenant's Lockwood's resume. Kurt Lockwood has been a police officer for 23 years, he has experience with SWAT operations, canine handling and is a canine instructor, snowmobile safety instructor, firearms instructor, field training instructor, the list go's on and on. His professionalism is beyond the norm. I would ask that you consider \$41.18 per hour as a minimum and at \$42.42 he would be making more than my Lieutenant. \$41.18 is a good number it is respectable wage.
