Accessory Apartments, aka Accessory Dwelling Units

Accessory apartments are permitted throughout the entire city in all Single-Family residential zones, providing our current and future residents with moderate-income housing opportunities. Accessory apartments not only offer supplementary living accommodations in the community but also supplementary income opportunities for property owners. The accessory apartments can be attached or detached, in the basement or in the backyard. Keep in mind that the property needs to be owner-occupied in order to qualify and provide enough parking within the lot for two dwelling units. Please do not hesitate to contact our front counter to check the regulations and requirements for an accessory dwelling unit on your lot.

Our hours of operation are Monday to Thursday from 7:30 AM to 5:30 PM and Fridays from 8:00 AM to 12:00 PM. You can contact our staff by calling (801) 785-6057.

LIONS – AN UNSTOPPABLE SPIRIT

In 1925, at the ninth convention of the Lions International Convention, Helen Keller challenged Lions Clubs to become “Knights of the Blind.” At 18 months old an illness rendered Helen deaf and blind. With the help of Anne Sullivan, “the miracle worker,” and other teachers along the way, she learned the alphabet (handwritten and braille) and to read, write, and eventually speak. 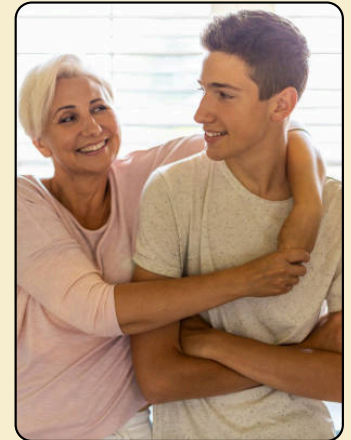

MARCH 14-15, 2025

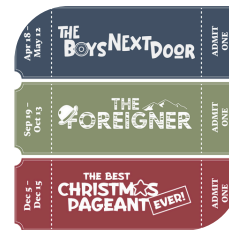

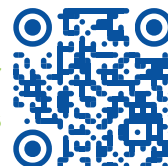

- help your kids avoid risky behaviors

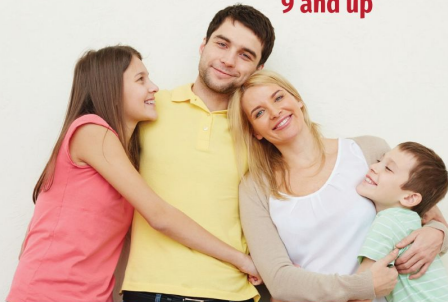
