The meeting was called to order at 4:07 pm by Clara Russell

Articles of Organization:

Mr. Davis was consulted and the entire issue was explained to him more in depth.

Russell ask the difference between a Closed Session vs Special Meetings. A Closed Session would only happen if a lawyer had an opinion letter and the details were personal in nature. So privacy is in need. Very rarely do you have closed door meetings about public issues.
