## Recent Funding in the SECOG Region

**DENR Awards:** At its June 22nd board meeting, the state Board of Water and Natural Resources approved a total of \$20.001 million in grants and loans for water and waste projects. Grants and loans were awarded to the following communities:

#### **Hartford**

\$1.482 million loan for sanitary and storm sewer construction

#### Lennox

\$4.678 million for central basin sanitary and storm sewer improvements, which includes \$2.27 million in grant funds and \$2.408 million in loan funds

#### Parker

\$1.428 million in two loans for utility improvements

GOED Local Infrastructure Improvement
Program (LIIP): Elk Point was awarded a
\$200,000 LIIP grant from GOED to construct an

access road to the new industrial park.

SDDOT Industrial Park Access Grant: Elk Point was awarded a \$300,000 LIIP grant from SDDOT to construct an access road to the new industrial park.

#### CDBG Bulldoze, Build, and Beautify (BBB) Activity

The Governor's Office of Economic Development (GOED) is pleased to announce the details for the Bulldoze, Build, and Beautify (BBB) Activity under the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) program. GOED has set aside \$1 million of its FY 2017 CDBG award to support this activity. This program aims to address blighted properties in communities.

#### Eligibility Requirements

#### Property Type

- o Residential dwellings only; may be single- or multi-family
- o Mobile homes are eligible, provided they are replaced by a permanent structure

#### **Property Condition**

- o Must be in a blighted, dilapidated, or abandoned condition.
- o Must be unoccupied and not used for another activity (e.g., a business)

#### <u>Ownership</u>

- o Must be owned by a county, city, or local non-profit organization
- o Title must be clear of any prior liens
- o If not owned, the county, city, or local non-profit must have an enforceable contract giving it the option to purchase the property within 18 months of the grant award

#### Site Work

- o Blighted structure must be demolished and removed completely from the lot
- o Lot must be restored to a build-ready state, including necessary utilities to the property line
- o Foundation/basement concrete must be removed and filled, unless it has been certified by an engineer for reuse within three months for a replacement property on the site
- o Site work for demolition/removal must be completed within 18 months of award date

#### Replacement Housing

- o Residential dwellings only; may be single- or multi-family
- o No cost limits, but must be affordable based on the general wage level of the community or priced to meet a specific need identified by a business in the community
- o Award recipient must replace the demolished unit within two years of demolition and removal

#### Match and Limitation on Awards

- o Local match must be made at a minimum of 1:1 with CDBG funds, based on total project cost
- o Properties in which asbestos or other environmental issue is encountered after an approved project moves forward will be dealt with on a case-by-case basis.
- o Local match may be in-kind; in-kind contributions will be valued at the FEMA rate
- o No limit on the number of units applied for; no lifetime limit on awards to a community; GOED may limit or partially fund applications if demand exceeds available funds

#### 2018-2021 TIP

The Sioux Falls Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) and the South Dakota Department of Transportation (SDDOT) are in the process of drafting the 2018-2021 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) and Statewide Transportation Improvement Program (STIP). The TIP and STIP include prioritized listings of multimodal transportation improvement projects for streets and highways, public transportation, aviation, railroads, bicycles, and pedestrian.

The draft 2018–2021 TIP, which includes transportation improvement projects for the MPO area (Brandon, Crooks, Harrisburg, Hartford, Sioux Falls, Tea, and portions of Lincoln and Minnehaha Counties), were presented to the MPO committees at the July 12th and 13th meetings, including a public hearing scheduled on Thursday, July 13th, at 2:00 p.m. in the SECOG Board Room. Additional opportunities to participate in the TIP and STIP updates are listed to the left.

# Planners' Plans



#### South Dakota Planners Conference 2017

Kristen Benidt and Patrick Andrews will be attending the joint conference of the South Dakota Planners Association (SDPA) and Western Planning Resources, Inc. It will be held at the Holiday Inn and Convention Center in Spearfish, South Dakota from September 13th to the 15th, 2017. The annual conference provides planners, planning commissioners, elected officials, and other interested parties an opportunity to learn about relevant planning topics and new tools that will be beneficial to their municipal and/or county planning and zoning efforts. This year the conference will be a joint effort with the Western Planning region meaning there will be an opportunity to interact with other planners throughout the state as well as from 12 other states.

The conference will start with a keynote presentation from Charles Marohn, president of Strong Towns, and there will also be multiple break-out sessions on a variety of topics and issues.

#### Five-Year County Highway and Bridge Improvement Plan

The time has come for counties to prepare their Five-Year County Highway and Bridge Improvements Plan, commonly called the Transportation Plan. In order to maintain eligibility for the State BIG program the plan needs to be updated on an annual basis with the previous projects reviewed and status updates reported. The imposition of a wheel tax is also required to be eligible for BIG funding. Completed plans are due to the State Department of Transportation on or before October 15, 2017.

The Bridge Improvement Grant (BIG) program was created by the 2015 legislative session in Senate Bill 1 (SB 1). SB 1 dedicated \$7 million per year for the BIG funds. This money comes from the license plate fees and from non-commercial vehicle fees. In addition, SDDOT will set aside \$8 million per year of state gas tax funds, for a total of \$15 million available for the BIG grants.
