New MPO Citizen Advisory Committee Members

The Metropolitan Planning Organization's (MPO) governing body, the Urbanized Development Commission has approved the appointment of Ryan Groeneweg, Mark Hoffman, and Luke Jessen to the 13-member Citizens Advisory Committee.

Ryan Groeneweg is Director of Community Education and Assistant Professor at the University of South Dakota Stanford School of Medicine Center for Disabilities. He submitted a CAC Request to Serve application to represent Persons with Disabilities stating, "I moved to Sioux Falls approximately two years ago to continue my work as a school psychologist and behavior analyst at the USD Center for Disabilities. Over the past 20 years, I have worked with families and their children across the age span who are diagnosed with various neurodevelopmental disabilities. At the same time, I have personally coped with a disability that impacts my vision and hearing and have a brother with similar hearing and vision deficits who also struggles to navigate communities in his wheelchair. I believe that I am well suited to provide perspective and advocate on behalf of individuals with disabilities."

Mark Hoffman is Sales Manager for the Midwest Division of L.G. Everist, Inc. Mark is a Civil Engineer and has lived in Sioux Falls since 2006. He submitted a CAC Request to Serve application to represent Construction and Development stating, "I have worked and collaborated with the transportation departments from Iowa, Nebraska and South Dakota as well as completed projects with countless private engineering firms, municipalities, and counties. Being experienced in construction aggregates, municipal and heavy highway construction, railroad and transportation, I feel I have some insight to future metropolitan infrastructure and expansion."

Luke Jessen is Development Director at Lloyd Companies. Luke has lived in the Sioux Falls area for nearly 10 years and been employed for the past six years at Lloyd Companies. In his CAC Request to Serve application he stated, "I work across the upper midwest evaluating opportunities for our company to develop projects. Recreation Trails Program Grants

Are My Doodles Public Records?



If you occasionally doodle at work, you are not alone. In fact, many writers, celebrities, CEOs, and even presidents of the United States are known doodlers. While making a few quick sketches while on the clock is generally inconsequential, South Dakota law broadly classifies all documents and materials produced by a governmental entity or its employees as public records. According to SDCL 1-27-1.1, public records include "all records and documents, regardless of physical form, of or belonging to this state, any county, municipality, political subdivision, or tax-supported district in this state...." As public records, those materials are subject to very strict retention rules and public inspection requirements. Does this mean that everything you create or produce while at work, even a few scattered doodles, must be kept, filed, and made readily accessible to the public? Not exactly.

While discussions about the importance of maintaining things like personal doodles in your official government files is a bit farfetched, it is important for local governments to understand exactly what state law requires. SDCL 1-27-1 requires that, "Each government entity or elected or appointed government official shall, during normal business hours, make available to the public for inspection and copying...all public records held by that entity or official". This broad command presumes that anything you create or produce while at work qualifies as something that must be accessible to the public. However, SDCL 1-27 goes on to specify several exceptions to this general rule, many of which are things you would expect like trade secrets, attorney work product, emergency or disaster response plans or protocols, citizen account payment information, social security numbers, and drafts of public policy documents. Circling back to the discussion of doodles, SDCL 1-27-1.5(19) specifically exempts "[p]ersonal correspondence, memoranda, notes, calendars or appointment logs" from public inspection and copying. While this provision has not been specifically litigated as applied to doodles, they are likely exempt as it seems targeted towards private things you may create at work that are unrelated to your official duties.

While it sounds relatively straight forward, ensuring that your local government is complying with the requirements of SDCL 1-27 may be worth discussing with your attorney. Decennial Census Redistricting

The 2020 Census Redistricting data, including the population counts and the census blocks for counties and communities, is scheduled to be released around April 1st. With this data, new voting district boundaries, which are dependent upon fluctuations in population counts, may need to be created. Required changes in the voting district boundaries must be adopted by February of 2022. SECOG will be offering redistricting services to communities and counties and will be available for redistricting questions. Similar to redistricting after the 2010 Census, each community or county will receive four hours of service for free with additional time charged at the member rate of \$60 per hour. 
