2025-2028 Transportation Improvement Plan

The Sioux Falls Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) and the South Dakota Department of Transportation (SDDOT) are in the process of drafting the 2025-2028 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) and 2025-2028 Statewide Transportation Improvement Program (STIP), respectively. The TIP and STIP include prioritized listings of multimodal transportation improvement projects for streets and highways, public transportation, aviation, railroads, bicycles, and pedestrian.

The draft 2025-2028 TIP, which includes transportation improvement projects for the MPO area (Brandon, Crooks, Harrisburg, Hartford, Sioux Falls, Tea, and portions of Lincoln County and Minnehaha County), was presented to the MPO committees at the July 10th and 11th meetings. Additional opportunities to participate in the TIP update are listed to the right.

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Bridge Improvement Grant (BIG) Program

Updating the Five-Year County Highway and Bridge Improvements Plan

Counties are once again tasked with the important responsibility of updating their Five-Year County Highway and Bridge Improvements Plan, often referred to as the Transportation Plan. To remain eligible for the State Bridge Improvement Grant (BIG) program, this plan must be updated annually. The update should include a thorough review of the previous year's projects and their current status. The revised plan must be submitted to the State Department of Transportation by October 15, 2024.

Transportation planning is a collaborative effort that seeks to involve all system users, including the business community, freight operators, and the general public. This involvement is achieved through an active and inclusive public participation process led by the County. The process also promotes effective communication among local governments, such as townships, to collectively address transportation needs and coordinate improvement efforts.

The BIG program was established during the 2015 legislative session with the passage of Senate Bill 1 (SB1), which allocated \$7 million annually for the program. Funding for the BIG program comes from license plate fees and non-commercial vehicle fees. Additionally, the State Department of Transportation contributes \$8 million per year from state gas tax funds, bringing the total available for BIG grants to \$15 million annually.

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U.S. Department of Transportation's Safe Streets and Roads for All

In May 2024, SECOG staff submitted a grant application to the U.S. Department of Transportation's Safe Streets and Roads for All (SS4A) program. The SS4A grant program provides two types of funding: 1) Planning and Demonstration Grants and 2) Implementation Grants. SECOG applied for a Planning and Demonstration grant, that, if awarded, SECOG will use to hire a consultant to develop a regional Safety Action Plan. A Safety Action Plan provides a systemic safety analysis for motorists, motorcyclists, bicyclists, and pedestrians to help prevent roadway fatalities and serious injuries. Twenty of SECOG's members chose to participate in this project. Adopting a Safety Action Plan would allow for communities to apply for an Implementation Grant that could help pay for the cost of making certain improvements to sidewalks, roadways, and bike paths. Such improvements include, but are not limited to:

- 1. Applying low-cost roadway safety treatments, such as left/right turn lanes at intersections, centerline and shoulder rumble strips, wider edge lines, high-friction surface treatments, road diets, and better signage along high-crash urban and rural corridors
- 2. Correcting common risks, such as improving pedestrian crosswalks by adding high-visibility pavement markings, lighting, and signage at transit stops, neighborhoods, or along busy public transit routes
- 3. Transforming roadway corridor into a complete street
- 4. Installing pedestrian safety enhancements such as sidewalks, rectangular rapid-flashing beacons, signal improvements, and audible pedestrian signals for people walking or using mobility assisted devices
- 5. Supporting development of bike lanes
- 6. Speed management strategies
- 7. Safe routes to school
- 8. Education campaigns for new or innovative roadway infrastructure
- 9. Improving safety of intersections though enhanced delineation, shoulder widening, rumble strips, etc.

SECOG will learn in fall 2024 whether it is awarded. Thank you to everyone involved in this effort.




