Director's Corner

Riverline District Update

On February 5, 2024, the Friends of the Riverline District announced a 50-year vision for the community based on an economic impact study by Johnson Consulting which includes:

- Building a new convention center on the Riverline District site near downtown Sioux Falls.
 - Sioux Falls has had to turn down larger events due to not having enough space to host such events in the current facility.
 - A larger convention center brings the strongest return on investment by allowing larger events in Sioux Falls and the ancillary growth that will occur including the possibility of a full-service hotel.
- Repurposing the existing convention center into a year-round, indoor recreation facility.
 - The recreation space could include various activities such as soccer fields, basketball courts, pickleball, walking paths, indoor playground equipment, and rock-climbing walls for example.

The plans are not final, and there is a still a lot of work to be done including receiving more community engagement and visioning.

Annual DOT Road Inventory Project

Upcoming Deadlines

DOT Agri-Business Grants (AG)

- Grants apply to construction of roads meeting minimum program criteria and serving as primary access to an agriculture related business
- Grant amounts are limited to \$600,000
- State provides 80% of the project cost on a reimbursement basis

Applications
Due:

July 15th







Community Access Grant Program (CAG)

- State funds to be used for the construction or reconstruction of major streets in towns with a population of 5,000 or less. Major streets include Main Street, the road to the elevator, schools, hospital, etc.
- Grant provides 80% of the construction costs of the project, not including engineering or utility work
- Amounts limited to \$600,000

Application Deadline: July 15, 2024



SECOG

LOCAL INFRASTRUCTURE IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM (LIIP)

- Grants apply to construction or reconstruction of public infrastructure associated with an economic development project
- Open to any political subdivisions in SD, tribal government, or local development corporation
- Board considers the economic impact of the project and the funding available to be utilized by the applicant

Applications due July 31st

Sioux Falls MPO 2023 Year End Report

The Sioux Falls Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) receives federal funding to conduct continuous, comprehensive, and cooperative transportation planning and programming activities for the Sioux Falls metropolitan area. The 2023 Year End Report for the Sioux Falls MPO is posted <a href="https://example.com/here/beart/falls-net

Highlights of the transportation planning activities from 2023 include the completion of the Lincoln County Highway 106 Corridor Study and the Brandon Master Transportation Plan. In addition, the Sioux Falls MPO completed the Market Research Study as preparation for the 2050 Long Range Transportation Plan. Sioux Falls MPO 2025 Unified Planning Work Program

The Sioux Falls Metropolitan Planning Organization is preparing its 2025 Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP). The UPWP is the document which describes the annual objectives, work activities, and planning studies to be accomplished by the Sioux Falls MPO participants. The participants include the cities of Brandon, Crooks, Harrisburg, Hartford, Sioux Falls, and Tea; Lincoln and Minnehaha County; SECOG; South Dakota Department of Transportation; Federal Highway Administration; and Federal Transit Administration.

The draft for the 2025 UPWP will be presented to the MPO committees at their May meetings in the SECOG Boardroom, 500 N. Western Ave, Sioux Falls, South Dakota 57104. Interested parties may attend these public meetings in-person or via Microsoft Teams. SDDOT will be hosting meetings across the state over the upcoming weeks. Input from stakeholders is a key component in developing the statewide Coordinated Plan. The purpose of the Coordinated Plan is to enhance the transportation services for persons with disabilities, older adults, and individuals with low incomes by ensuring communities maximize transportation resources.
