
# Notable clarifications resulting from the edit process





#### **Disclaimer about edits**

- No technical changes resulted from edits
- Added sections reflect clarifications of previously existing provisions



### 101.2.1 (Scope)

New section clarifies that the SFPC shall not require construction, modifications or installation of systems regulated by the applicable building code

### 101.2.2 (Scope)

 Clarifies that maintenance requirements shall not be construed as a requirement for installation
 Construction is to be maintained as installed

#### 110.1 General (Unsafe Conditions)

- Clarifies and emphasizes that there must be a code violation in order to deem a structure unsafe
- This section grants authority but generally cannot be cited by itself as a violation



### 901.5.1 Occupancy

- Clarifies the building cannot be occupied until any required fire protection systems have been tested and approved by the Building Official
- BO may allow partial occupancy on case by case basis

#### 905.5.3 Class II System

- NEW section emphasizes, clarifies NFPA 14 requirements for labeling
- Hoses are intended to be used specifically by trained personnel, not general occupants
- Fire extinguishers are designed for use by general occupants

### 1001.3.1 Temporary Occupant Load Determination

- NEW section allows the FO to address situations of alleged overcrowding by reestablishing a temporary occupant load until the BO can officially address the situation
- To be used in emergency situations only
- BO establishes the permanent occupant load

### 1031.11 Emergency Supplemental Hardware

- Part of a broader change that aligns with VCC
- New definition for ESH
- Mandates that the ESH shall be used as intended
- Grants FO authority, when in conjunction with BO and law enforcement, to revoke use and storage of ESH if utilized in a manner inconsistent with its approval

#### Some VCC Tables Removed from SFPC

- Building to be maintained according to figures approved by BO during construction
- Tables remain enforceable per "applicable building code" rather than SFPC

# Table 107.2 Operational permit requirements - SRCFs

- New permit for AHJ's to consider about State Regulated Care Facilities
- Where licensing regulations require SFPC inspection, locality can require an operational permit

Table 107.2 Operational permit requirements - Cooking operations

- Localities authorized to require permits for cooking operations in non-assembly uses
- Ex: restaurant producing grease vapors with occ load < 50 such as fast food, deli, take-out or bakery







#### 202 Cooking Tent definition

- . New definition for cooking tent
- Used to be described as having sides, but now may be without sides
- Ensures fire separation applicable to cooking tents are not imposed on other tents











# 314.4 Indoor display of vehicles

- Section applies to liquidfueled and gaseous-fueled vehicles
- FO to determine method of safeguarding vehicle regarding electrical system



Storage in a nonsprinklered room can extend to the ceiling along the walls, but must maintain 24 inches clear to the ceiling in the remainder of the room.




Storage in a room with sprinklers can extend to the ceiling along the walls, but must maintain 18 inches clear below the fire sprinkler deflectors in the remainder of the room.

# 315.3.1 Ceiling clearance for indoor storage

 New exceptions allow increase in storage height against walls

Different requirements for sprinklered and nonsprinklered



# 315.1; 315.7 Outdoor pallet storage

Requirements added for height limitation and separation to buildings and property lines for outdoor storage of wood or plastic pallets 316.6; 316.6.1; 316.6.2 Structures & outdoor storage underneath high voltage transmission lines, bridges & elevated roadways

- Provisions extended to storage under bridges and elevated roadways
- Limits storage to noncombustible
- Hazardous materials prohibited







# 319.1.1, 319.1.2 Wheel chocks and separation

- New requirements related to food prep vehicles
- Wheel chocks and separation distances required







#### 319.2.1 Permit authority having jurisdiction

- Clarifies the AHJ responsible for permitting mobile food prep vehicles
- . The FO where the vehicle is registered is responsible





# 403.12.3; 403.12.3.1 Crowd managers

- Threshold for crowd managers reduced to 500 people for certain events
- Managers shall be trained



404.2.3; 406.3.4.1; 1001.4; 1010; 1031 Special emergency locking arrangements in educational occupancies

- Major change in alignment with changes to VCC
- New definition for Emergency
   Supplemental Hardware
- Requires coordination between BO, FO, LEO prior to approval
- Hardware installation is approved by BO
- Maintenance and use enforced by FO and potentially BMO
- Lockdown plans, training shall be approved by FO

#### 404.2.3; 404.2.3.1; 404.2.3.2 Lockdown plans

Updates and prescribes details for facility lockdown plans



# Table 405.2 Fire and evacuationdrill frequency and participation

 Sets fire evacuation drill frequency for R-2 occupancies serving communities aged 55+; added Group R SRCFs except hospice facilities







#### 407.2 Safety data sheets

 Safety data sheets allowed in electronic format







## 605.13; 605.16; 605.17 Refrigerants with lower flammability hazards

 New requirements regarding safety for lower flammability refrigerant gasses





# 607.2 Commercial cooking operations

- Requires cooking hood operation during cooking operations, where ventillation is required by applicable building code
- FO is not authorized to require hood installation







# 608.3 Nonmetallic cooking oil storage tanks

- New listing and capacity requirements for cooking oil storage
- Note Commercial Kitchen Cooking Oil Storage provisions moved from 610 → 608







#### 701.6; 3308.9 (new) Fire safety for buildings of Types IV-A, IV-B, and IV-C construction

 Adds maintenance provisions for mass timber structures and safeguards during construction

# 807 Combustible decorative materials

- Clarified application of limitations on decorative combustible material
- VA amendments brought section in line with scope of SFPC







# 807.4 Artificial decorative vegetation

- Section also reorganized with previous change
- New exception allows a small amount of combustible decorative vegetation without testing in I-1, I-2 condition 1, R-2, R-3, and R-4, when equipped with sprinkler



# 901.6.2 Integrated fire protection system testing

- New requirements regarding integrated testing of systems
- Criteria added and reference to NFPA 4 for acceptance of the system as a whole

### 905.11 Locking Caps on Standpipe Outlets


 Authorizes FO to require locking caps on dry standpipe hose connection outlets






#### 910.5 Maintenance of smoke and heat removal equipment

- Maintenance and testing frequency added for smoke and heat vents and mechanical smoke removal
- Smoke and heat vents shall be inspected annually and tested at least every 5 years

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# 1031.4 Exit signs in existing buildings

- Exit signs shall be maintained in accordance with 1013, 1203, and the applicable building code
- VA deletes Ch. 11 as VEBC supersedes



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#### 1031.10 Inspection and testing of emergency egress lighting

- Provisions relocated from Chapter 6
- Revised to allow selfdiagnostics

New chapter for energy systems





1204.5 Rapid shutdown for solar PV power systems

Photovoltaic systems

 equipped with rapid
 shutdown shall be labeled as
 such





## 1206.2 Stationary storage battery systems

- Provisions relocated from section 608
- Requirements added for new battery technologies and required safety systems







#### Chapter 22 Combustible Dust

 Added reference to NFPA 652 Standard on the Fundamentals of Combustible dust

### 2306.7.3.1 Protection from Vehicle Impact

FO is authorized to require additional vehicle impact protection at fuel dispensing facilities





## 2309.6; 2309.6.1 Defueling of hydrogen fueled vehicles

 Requirements updated to reflect current technologies



## 2311.6 Repair of vehicles fueled by CNG and LNG

 Updated requirements for repairing vehicles fueled by CNG or LNG to reflect new technology



2311.8 Repair garages for vehicles fueled by lighterthan-air fuels

 Updated requirements for repairing vehicles fueled by lighter-than-air fuels to reflect new technology

#### 2810 Outdoor storage of pallets at pallet manufacturing or recycling facilities

 New section adds requirements for outdoor pallet storage at pallet manufacturing and pallet recycling facilities





#### Chapter 31 Umbrella structures


 Umbrellas now regulated as tent structures





# 3106 Outdoor assembly events

- New section adds requirements for outdoor public gatherings
- Improves correlation between VCC and SFPC






#### 3107.12.5 Cooking tents

 All cooking tents require 20 ft fire separation, even without walls or sides










When determining the size of the high-piled combustible storage area, include a perimeter aisle or the distance to a wall, whichever is less.



Separating high-piled combustible storage areas by 100 feet allows each area to be considered separately.

#### Chapter 32 High-piled combustible storage

- Chapter updated to correlate
   with NFPA 13-2016
- Commodity classification criteria changed
- Adds plastic pallets and fire department access doors
- Revises separation distances



### 3304.5; 3308; 3309.1 Fire watch during construction and demolition

- FO allowed to require fire watch during non working hours for construction > 40ft above lowest adjacent grade
- Clarifies functions and duties of FW personnel
  Shall be trained in use of portable fire extinguishers



#### Chapter 38 Higher education laboratories

- New chapter for Higher Education Laboratories
- Correlates with VCC 428
   Higher Education
   Laboratories
- VA amends many sections to align with USBC

# Chapter 39 Processing and extraction facilities

- New chapter regulating the extraction of oils from plant material
- VA amends some sections to align with USBC

# 5103.2.2 Aerosol cooking spray products

 New fire protection requirements added to address aerosol cooking spray products





5307.1; 5307.3; 5307.3.1; 5307.3.2 Liquid carbon dioxide system for beverage dispensing

 Provisions for liquid CO<sub>2</sub> for beverage dispensing have been correlated with the provisions for gas detection systems





5307.4; 5307.4.1-3; 5307.4.3.1; 5307.4.4-6 Carbon dioxide enrichment systems

Maintenance of CO<sub>2</sub> enrichment systems is now regulated by the SFPC when system contains > 100 lbs of CO<sub>2</sub>, or when refill connection is remote from tank or vessel







#### 5707 Mobile fueling operations

- On-demand mobile fueling is prohibited
- Exceptions:
  - Highway vehicles in an
  - emergency
  - Farm vehicles and machinery
  - When in compliance with 5706.5.4.1 through 5706.5.4.5
