

The Strasburg Village Council met in regular session on Tuesday, July 5, 2022 at 6:00 pm. Mayor Steve Smith presided over the meeting. Pastor Matthew Wald led the prayer.

Members answering roll call were Kathy Burrier, Jeff Smith, Don Wallick, Liz Dreher, Martin Zehnder, and Dustin Briggs. Other's present were Legal Counsel Terry Seeberger, Village Administrator Ron Lambert, Police Chief Dave Warrick, Fire Chief Steve Laskey, Zoning Inspector Ted Foster, Press Representative Barb Limbacher, Jerry Schultz, Marcus Weaver, Matthew Wald, and Michael Rosenberry.

A motion was made by Kathy Burrier, seconded by Jeff Smith, to approve the minutes from the June 21, 2022 council meeting. At roll call, all members voted approval.

Michael Rosenberry addressed council regarding a neighbor painting a mural on their driveway, asked why the Library Fall Festival is scheduled for a Monday and not a Saturday, and why Martin Zehnder does not have an email address on the village's website.

Mayor Steve Smith reported that the paving of Fernsell Avenue will start on July 18, 2022 and that the Library Fall Festival is Monday, September 12, 2022 from 4 – 8 pm, noting any questions should be directed to Strasburg Library Branch Manager Emily Crilley.

Zoning Inspector Ted Foster supplied council with a zoning report including an appeal filed by Adams Electronic Signs. Foster reported that the 8th Street Alley issue has been referred to the Planning Commission and reported that inflatable swimming pools do not require a permit per the zoning ordinance. Foster noted that the zoning ordinance wording only includes permanent structures and noted that the Planning Commission will review the ordinance regarding swimming pools.

Police Chief Dave Warrick reported that the police department is accepting applications for crossing guards for the 2022-2023 school year.

Fire Chief Steve Laskey supplied council with a report including six new members of the fire department, 36 calls from 6/20-7/4, training updates, and researching a new reporting/tracking software system.

ORDINANCE O-26A-2022

Ordinance O-26A-2022 was given its first reading by title only. A motion was made by Jeff Smith, seconded by Kathy Burrier, to suspend the rules of the mandatory three readings. At roll call, all members voted approval. A motion was made by Jeff Smith, seconded by Kathy Burrier, to approve Ordinance O-26A-2022, AN ORDINANCE STATING WHAT SERVICES THE VILLAGE WILL PROVIDE TO THE GRANDVIEW UNION CEMETERY UPON ANNEXATION. At roll call, all members voted approval and this ordinance shall take effect immediately.

ORDINANCE O-29-2022

Ordinance O-29-2022, An Ordinance limiting use of fireworks within village, and enacting municipal regulation 91.01, was given its second reading by title only.

ORDINANCE O-31-2022

Ordinance O-31-2022, An Ordinance amending Resolution O-38-2020 (Zoning Code) by enacting new section 807, regulating marijuana related uses, was given its first reading by title only.
