MESSAGE FROM MAYOR DUNLAVY: WATER, WATER, WATER!

Here we are in the middle of July; the days have been bright and sunny but very, very warm. That's what we've come to expect this time of year. The problem is, however, when it's sunny and hot some people think you must pour water to the lawn. This year has been a real challenge for us to deal with. Year after year City officials stress water conservation, we join with the television and print media explaining the benefits to us all if we "Slow the Flow" and conserve instead of wasting water. You hear all the time that overwatering actually damages your landscaping, and yet there continues to be waste of our water resource. I hear statements like, "I pay for my water, I'll use as much as I please. I don't care about conserving, that's your problem". Here at the City we are improving the delivery system,

we've deepened wells, we've drilled new wells and built new storage reservoirs to manage our system properly. The last three years we've experienced very little growth in our city. But the usage of water during the summer months continues to go up. Because of the excessive watering during the day and overwatering at night, each of you will begin to feel the effects. As the summer goes on, you will begin to experience very low pressure or even some periods without much water at all, unless this community changes and starts doing something about this very important situation. We MUST begin to conserve. Do not water during the day, you're wasting your time, because most of the water evaporates. Water less in the evenings. Be proactive. If your neighbor is overwater-

ing, let him know we need to conserve, if you don't want to do that, give us a call at city hall. We have people going around everyday asking residents to stop overwatering.

We have done our part in developing our water system. It's now time for each of you to do yours. Please help us in changing your watering habits. **DO NOT WATER AT ALL DURING THE DAY.** It will help us maintain this valuable service to each of you at a level you deserve. For those of you who are conserving, my sincere expression of gratitude goes out to you, you're helping make our community better. Thank you very much.

Area #1 All water users North of Vine and West of Main water Wednesdays and Saturdays.

Area #2 All water users North of Vine and East of Main water Tuesdays and Fridays.

Area #3 All water users South of Vine water Mondays and Thursdays.

Outdoor watering is not permitted on Sundays.

The City encourages residents **not to water during the hottest hours of the day, between 10 am and 6 pm.** If there are special circumstances that require a modified schedule for residents or businesses—such as newly planted sod or lawn, contact Tooele City at 843-2150.

City parks and schools have been placed on a modified schedule because of the size of their lawn areas.

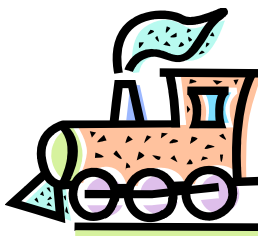

August 6 *Red Desert Ramblers* play Bluegrass, Classic-Country and Swing music. Combining 165 years of experience, they blend harmonies with smoking instrumental breaks. The Salt Lake Tribune says, "When it comes to locally produced bluegrass bands, it's had to do better." They have been honored by the International Bluegrass Music Association by being the first Utah band to EVER be hired for an IBMA performance. They are a regional band with national recognition and members hail from Salt Lake, Summit, and Cache Counties representing the best of Utah.

August 13 *GMC* is the Grantsville Music Company formed by Mary Margaret Brown and Peggy Pearce in 2006. Many outstanding performers perform. *GMC* says, "We are glad that the Tooele City Arts Council wants us for the yearly 'Fridays on Vine.'".

His credits also include six albums, a concert DVD, gui-

tar song-books, film score, song-writing awards, and concerts with several symphony orchestras and choirs, including the Mormon Tabernacle Choir. 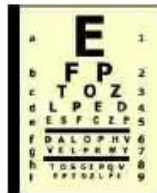
