Water Conservation Schedule

Area #1 All water users north of Vine and west of Main water Wednesdays and Saturdays.

Area #2 All water users north of Vine and east of Main water Tuesdays and Fridays.

Area #3 All water users south of Vine water Mondays and Thursdays.

Outdoor watering is not permitted on Sundays.

The City encourages residents not to water during the hottest hours of the day, typically between 10 am and 6 pm. This conserves water and reduces your water bills.

If there are special circumstances that require a modified schedule for residents or businesses—such as newly planted sod or lawn, contact Tooele City at 843-2150.

City parks and schools have been placed on a modified schedule because of the size of their lawn areas. While some parks and schools may be watering more than two days each week, each specific area of that park is only watered twice during the week.

SR-36 (Main Street) on June 1, 2015. The project will fully reconstruct the road from **7 RENEWED** 3 O'Clock Drive to 1280 North and rehabilitate the pavement from 1280 North to Stansbury Parkway. Current work taking 3 O'Clock Drive to Stansbury place on the Tooele City waterline will be complete by the

end of June. Traffic restrictions for reconstruction of SR-36 will be similar to those used during the waterline work. One lane of traffic will remain open in each direction at all times with cross street closures as needed. Please remember to utilize 50 East and 50 West to access local businesses. Please plan ahead, use alternate routes and anticipate the additional traffic and potential delays.

SOURCE PROTECTION

Drinking Water Source Protection Plan for Tooele City is available for your review. It contains information about source protection zones, potential contamination sources, and management strategies to protect each of our drinking water sources. Potential contamination sources common in our protection areas include sanitary sewer lines, septic tanks, roads, residential, commercial and industrial areas, etc. These sources of potential contamination are typically classified as a low susceptibility. Sources which are classified as medium susceptibility include buried fuel storage tanks, accidental spills of potential contaminants, or other similar conditions. The City has developed management strategies to further protect all of our sources from contamination. Contact the Public Works Dept. at 435-843-2130, for questions or concerns about our source protection plan.
