Residents and visitors can now receive life-saving emergency alerts and advanced warning of severe weather directly to their Android or Apple iOS device, or receive a call, text, email or call to your home phone with AlertSense.

Alerts include public safety alerts such as crime, active shooter, imminent danger, hazardous materials, wildfire, floods, immediate evacuations, road closures, and power outages.



Scam artists in the U.S. and around the world defraud millions of people each year. They use the phone, email, postal mail, and the internet to trick you into sending money or giving out personal information. Here are 10 ways to avoid fraud:

(1) Know who you're dealing with; (2) Know that wiring money is like sending cash; (3) Read your monthly statements; (4) After a disaster, give to only established charities; (5) Talk to your doctor before you buy health products or special treatments; (6) Remember, there is no sure thing in investing; (7) Don't send money to someone you don't know; (8) Don't agree to deposit a check and wire money back; (9) Don't reply to messages asking for personal or financial information; (10) Don't play a foreign lottery.


