September is National Preparedness Month!

It is a time to prepare yourself and those in

your care for emergencies and disasters. If you've seen the news recently, you know that emergencies can happen unexpectedly in communities just like ours, to people like us. We've seen tornado outbreaks, river floods, flash floods. historic earthquakes, tsunamis, and even water main breaks and power outages in U.S. cities affecting millions of people for days at a time.



Police, fire and rescue may not always be able to reach you quickly in an emergency or disaster. The most important step you can take in helping your local responders is being able to take care of yourself and those in your care; the more people

who are prepared, the quicker the community will recover.

This September, please prepare and plan in the event you must go for three days without electricity, water service, access to a supermarket, or local services for several days. Just follow these four steps:

*Stay Informed: Information is available from federal, state, local, tribal, and territorial resources. Access Ready.gov to learn what to do before, during, and after an emergency.

*Make a Plan: Discuss, agree on, and document an emergency plan with those in your care. For sample plans, see Ready.gov. Work together with neighbors, colleagues, and others to build community resilience.

*Build a Kit: Keep enough emergency supplies on hand water, nonperishable food, first aid, prescriptions, flashlight, and battery-powered radio - for you and those in your care.

*Get Involved: There are many ways to get involved especially before a disaster occurs. The whole community can participate in programs and activities to make their families, homes and places of worship safer from risks and threats. Community leaders agree that the formula for ensuring a safer homeland consists of volunteers, a trained and informed public, and increased support of emergency response agencies during disasters.

Dear Tooele City Resident,

Tooele City has entered into negotiations with Ace Disposal to provide our citizens with a curbside recycling program. Participating citizens will receive a blue recycling receptacle which will allow for plastics, metals, paper products, and cardboard to be recycled. These items will need to be empty but will not have to be rinsed, cleaned, or sorted prior to placing them in the recycling receptacle. Green waste, electronics, plastic bags, styrofoam, and glass will not be recycled through this program. The cost of this service will be approximately \$4.75 to \$6.00 per month, depending on the level of citizen participation. The pick-up of the recycling receptacle will be every other week on the same day as your waste service.

The opt-in period will be from September 1, 2016 through October 31, 2016. In order to be a viable program for both the City and Ace Disposal, at least 20% of the Tooele City utility accounts must opt-in to this program. The projected start date for this service is January 2, 2017. After the opt-in period ends and service begins, citizens will only be allowed to opt-in or opt-out on an annual basis between January 1st and January 31st of each year.

The Tooele City Council will discuss the curbside recycling program at their business meetings on September 21, 2016 and October 19, 2016 at 7:00 p.m. These meetings are open to the public.

If you choose to opt-in, please return the bottom portion of this letter by mail or in person to the Finance Department at Tooele City Hall located at 90 North Main Street, Tooele, Utah 84074. You may also email the form to <u>utilities@tooelecity.org</u>, fax it to (435) 843-2159 or submit the form online by clicking on the "recycling" link at <u>www.tooelecity.org</u>.
