
could so we wouldn't have to raise taxes all at once. We appreciate your support!

Tooele City Code 3-1-29 BURNING OF SOLID WASTE; RECREATIONAL FIRES



- (2) Exception. Recreational or cooking fires are allowed by persons on their own property so long as:
- (a) the recreational or cooking intention for the fire is evident:
- (b) the fire pile height does not exceed 12 inches above the bottom of the fire ring, fire pit, or other fire containing structure at any time;
- (c) the fire is contained within a non-combustible fire ring, fire pit, or other fire containing structure no larger than 36 inches in diameter;
- (d) fire extinguishing items are immediately on-hand (e.g., hose, shovel, water bucket, fire extinguisher); and,
- (e) the fire does not become a smoke or fume nuisance to neighboring properties. (Ord. 93-18)

8-3-16. Penalty.

Any person, firm or corporation who violates the terms of this Chapter by any act of omission or commission shall be deemed guilty of a class C misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof may be sentenced to pay a fine not exceeding \$750.00 and to imprisonment in the Tooele County Jail not exceeding 90 days, or by both such fine and imprisonment. Every violator of the provisions of this Chapter shall be deemed guilty of a separate offense for each day such violation shall continue and shall be subject to penalty imposed by this Section for each and every such separate offense. (Ord. 93-18, 10-01-93)

- Burning of yard waste (branches, leaves, etc.) is illegal in Tooele City. See Code 3-1-29 on this page.
- Fall is a great time to declutter and dejunk, and as you do, please help keep neighborhoods clean! Don't put bulk waste out on the curb too soon! We recommend you put bulk waste items out on the curb no earlier than 1 week before your pickup date. If you notice items are left out for an extended period of time in your neighborhood, please contact our code enforcement officer to help mediate the situation. See additional Bulk Waste information on Page 4.
- Fall is a great time to feed your lawn. Free Soil Conditioner will be available from Tooele City on October 20th (See page 3).



As the temperatures start to cool down don't forget adjust the timer on your automatic irrigation / sprinkler systems. Lawns and gardens do not need as much water in the Fall as they do

in the Summer. Shorter watering intervals conserves water for all of us and saves you money!



FREE SOIL ADDITIVE FOR LAWNS, PLANTS, & GARDENS!

Tooele City is giving away biosolids to anyone interested! Several years ago the City constructed upgrades to its wastewater treatment facility to create a state of the art treatment facility using a process unparalleled in this country. The facility is a full reuse facility meaning nearly every drop that enters the facility is treated and can be reused. Now you have an opportunity to benefit further from this effort. On Saturday, October 20, 2018, the City will make its biosolids available to the public at NO COST from 8:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. The only limit is the size of the container you bring with you. Biosolids are not what you think. Biosolids are not human waste. Biosolids are the residual byproduct of the treatment process. Since it is made up of organic matter as well as beneficial levels of nitrogen, phosphorus and potassium, it makes an excellent soil addition. The City's state of the art treatment process produces Class "A" biosolids which is the highest quality product available, making it viable for general purpose use without the need for mulching or mixing with other material to help lawns, plants, and gardens grow stronger. Anyone interested in getting biosolids can do so on October 20th at the Tooele City Water Reclamation Facility, 3300 North 1200 West. To get to the facility go west on Erda Way from SR-36 for approximately 2 miles, turn south on 1200 West and go approximately one mile. The Water Reclamation Facility is on the left next to the City Animal Shelter. Staff will be available on-site to direct you to the biosolids for loading. TRASH/DEBRIS:

Per Tooele City Code Section 8-4-4 1(b) and (e) of Tooele City code states these will be deemed a nuisance if: (b) the accumulation of garbage, refuse, or unsightly or deleterious objects or structures upon real property, unless contained in connection with an association lawfully

situated and licensed for the same; (e) any other unsightly or deleterious condition that gives rise to a threat to human health or safety. Any garbage/debris/unsightly objects must be properly disposed of within a timely manner!

Tooele City provides a **BULK WASTE PICKUP PROGRAM** to help you dispose of items which do not normally fit into your trash container. The pick up day is once a month and there is no additional cost to use this program. You can find the pick up schedule and more information on our website **tooelecity.org.** Here are a few basic checklist items:

- ☐ If you have Bulk Waste items, please call ACE Disposal at 435-882-7009 and let them know you have a pickup, prior to your pickup day.
- □ Bulk Waste MUST be bagged, boxed or bundled (with rope or twine).
- ☐ Bulk Waste MUST be cut to less than 5 feet.
- ☐ Bulk Waste cannot exceed 75 lbs.
- ☐ Ensure that you do not have unacceptable Bulk Waste materials such as tires, rocks, dirt, sod, oils, paints, construction debris, or hazardous materials.

INOPERABLE/ABANDONED VEHICLES:

Tooele City Code Section 8-4-4 1(c) and (d) states that junked, wrecked, or inoperable vehicles may not be kept upon real property for longer than 72 hours. Only two inoperable motor vehicles may be kept upon real property if they are placed behind a screened fence, or in an enclosed building. Vehicle coverings are not considered in compliance with this code.

Curbside Recycling Program for Tooele City Residents (Updated September 2018)

Tooele City entered into negotiations with Ace Disposal in February 2017 to provide our citizens with a bi-weekly curbside recycling program for residential customers who have a utility account with Tooele City. If you have already opted-in to this service, please read the notice of changes below.

Once opted-in, residents are delivered a blue recycling receptacle which allows for plastics, metal, paper products and cardboard to be recycled. These items must be free of foods and liquids prior to placing them in the recycling receptacle. Green waste and glass will not be recycled. Recently there have been some changes in recycling policies. As you may have read, China's recent import policies are affecting what we can put in our blue recycling bins. Here in Utah, recyclers are being much more particular about what materials they take, and we all need to work together to recycle better. Most importantly, we cannot accept food waste or plastic bags! When your recycling is picked up, it is taken a sorting facility and any sort of stretchy plastic jams up their machinery. If you use a plastic liner in your home's recycling bin, please dump the contents into the recycling bin and then put the plastic bag into the trash. Food, yard waste, Styrofoam and glass are a big problem and cannot go into the recycling bins! Please help us keep our recycling program clean and affordable! If you have any further questions, you may contact customer service at ACE Disposal at (801) 363-9995 or visit www.acedisposal.com.

The cost of this service is \$5.65 per receptacle per month. The pick-up of the recycling receptacle will be <u>every other week</u> on the same day as your waste service.

Residents may opt-in to the service at any time. Once service begins, residents will only be allowed to opt-out on an annual basis. A pick-up schedule and a list of items that may be put in your recycling receptacle will be provided with delivery of your receptacle. A pick-up schedule and a list of acceptable and unacceptable items is also available on our website, www.tooelecity.org.

If you choose to opt-in, please return the bottom portion of this letter by mail or in person to the Finance Department at Tooele City Hall located at 90 North Main Street, Tooele, UT 84074.
