TOOELE COUNTY UDOT CONSTRUCTION PROJECTS

FUNDED PROJECTS:

Mid-Valley Highway - \$75M

UDOT recently awarded the Mid-Valley Highway project. This is a new highway extending from SR-138 near Sheep Lane up to I-80. Construction is anticipated to begin late summer of 2019 and will be a two year construction project.

Benefits: Shifts 15-20% of traffic from SR-36 to Mid-Valley Highway, which reduces congestion on SR-36. Provides a close alternate route to I-80 if SR-36 has a closure or incident.

I-80 at Blackrock & SR-36 Bridges - \$45M

This project is reconstructing three bridges along I-80 as part of our commitment to provide safe and efficient travel for the growing communities in Tooele County. As part of this project, a third southbound lane will also be constructed on SR-36 from Hardy Rd. to Sunset Rd.

Benefits: This will remove the queue on I-80 occurring from the signal at Saddleback Blvd. and improve safety.

I-80 Westbound Auxiliary Lane - \$3M

UDOT recently funded a project to build a westbound auxiliary lane from the SR-201 ramp to the SR-36 interchange. UDOT is currently designing this project with construction to begin summer of 2020.

Benefits: This project will add capacity to this critical freeway segment, improves the weaving traffic between I-80 and SR-201, and reduces I-80 WB vehicles being blocked by traffic exiting onto SR-36

***In the past three years, UDOT has invested \$30 million in Tooele County.

In addition to the projects mentioned; there will also be another \$33.5 million spent to repave SR-36, 73, 138, and 112 between 2019 and 2021.

UNFUNDED PROJECTS:

SR-201 to SR-36 Extension - \$200M

As a long-term project, UDOT has developed a conceptual design to extend SR-201 to SR-36. This project will provide an alternate route for I-80 commuters during closures due to a crash.

I-80 Eastbound Auxiliary Lane - \$4M

UDOT is also currently developing a conceptual design to add an eastbound auxiliary lane from SR-36 to

Here are a few of the projects we have been working on this year:

- Repaved 1400 East
- Repaved 100 East
- Replacing 980 North
- Replacing water lines on 1400 East, Coleman, and on 500 North
- Adding new storm drain on Broadway from 400 North to Utah Avenue and on Droubay Road from Vine Street to 400 North (Smelter Road)
- Demolition of old, obsolete structures at the old sewer plant.
- Demolition of old, obsolete water tanks.

TRASH/DEBRIS:

Per Tooele City Code Section 8-4-4 1(b) and (e) of Tooele City code states these will be deemed a nuisance if: (b) the accumulation of garbage, refuse, or unsightly or deleterious objects or structures upon real property, unless contained in connection with an association lawfully situated and licensed for the same; (e) any other unsightly or deleterious condition that gives rise to a threat to human health or safety. Any garbage/debris/unsightly objects must be properly disposed of within a timely manner!

Tooele City provides a YEAR ROUND BULK WASTE PICKUP PROGRAM to help you dispose of items which do not normally fit into your trash container. The pick up day is once a month and there is no additional cost to use this program. You can find the pick up schedule and more information on our website tooelecity.org. Here are a few basic checklist items:

- ☐ You do not have to schedule a Bulk Waste Pick Up, just put your items on your curb the day before your pick up date.
- Bulk Waste MUST be bagged, boxed, or bundled (with rope or twine).
- Tree branches must be cut to less than 5 feet in length and can be no larger than 4 inches in diameter.
- Bulk Waste cannot exceed 75 lbs.
- □ Ensure that you do not have unacceptable Bulk Waste materials such as tires, rocks, dirt, sod, oils, paints, construction debris, or hazardous materials.
- Call ACE Disposal at 435-882-7009 if you have questions.

INOPERABLE/ABANDONED VEHICLES:

Tooele City Code Section 8-4-4 1(c) and (d) states that junked, wrecked, or inoperable vehicles may not be kept upon real property for longer than 72 hours. Only two inoperable motor vehicles may be kept upon real property if they are placed behind a screened fence, or in an enclosed building. Vehicle coverings are not considered in compliance with this code.
