Tooele County residents and visitors can now receive life-saving emergency alerts and advanced warning of severe weather directly to the Android or Apple iOS device, or receive a call, text, email, or call to your home with TooeleAlerts.

Alerts may include information about imminent danger such as active shooter, health hazards, HAZMAT, wildfire, floods, immediate evacuations, major road closures, earthquakes, and major power outages.

Please visit tcem.org and click on the TooeleAlerts—Get Notified button to verify that your information is in our system and it is up-to-date so you can receive text messages, calls, or emails to your phone! During our most recent, "Do Not Drink" order, many residents were not aware that they must be in this system in order to receive notifications or they did not have their most up-to-date and current information in the system.

Outdoor watering is not permitted on Sundays.

The City encourages residents not to water during the hottest hours of the day, between 10 am and 6 pm. If there are special circumstances that require a modified schedule for residents or businesses—such as newly planted sod or lawn, contact Tooele City at 435-843-2150. City parks and schools have been placed on a modified schedule because of the size of their lawn areas. Thank you for your help in conserving water—a precious resource!

WEEDS:

City Code Per Tooele Section 8-4-4(1): It shall be unlawful for any person association owning, otherwise occupying, or exercising control over real

property in Tooele City to allow, permit, cause, or maintain a nuisance, including the following:

- (a). weeds and/or grass in excess of 6 inches in height located:
 - in the public right-of-way between the property line and the edge of street pavement;
 - (ii). on any land less than 5 acres in size; or
 - (iii). within 30 feet of the property line of any land of 5 or more acres in size.

The full text of the above referenced City Code can be found on our website tooelecity.org. You may also contact the Tooele City Code Enforcement Officer at 435-843-2132 if you have questions or for more information.

During the month of June, our Code Enforcement Department was busy working on enforcement—they opened 120 new cases and closed 40 cases.





Keep lids on your plastic bottles and jugs!



To leave on or throw out? That is the question relating to the plastic lids on plastic bottles. Originally, people were told to remove the lids of bottles and jugs because they are made from a different plastic than the container they are on. That has now changed with today's technology, as there are now more efficient ways for recyclers to separate the lids from the containers at the plastics recycling facility. That now means that if you leave the lid on the bottle, it can now be recycled! However, if you remove the lid and still toss the lid in the recycling bin by itself, it will not be recycled! The lid by itself is too small to be captured during the recycle@acedisposal.com.

Tooele City Water Consumption Rate Schedule

The Tooele City rate schedule for water consumption promotes conservation for our customers. Water is billed monthly on an increasing rate schedule (provided below).

<u>Water Charges</u> - The water bill charge is a combination of two fees on your monthly billing:

- Base fee dependent upon meter size.
- 2. Water usage fee per unit (One unit of water equals 100 cubic feet or approx. 750 gallons).

3"	\$37.50	71-90 units	\$1.75 per unit
4"-6"	\$45.00	91 + units	\$2.00 per unit



Watering tip: Check all hoses for leaks or damage. Use a shut-off nozzle for your hose to avoid wasting water.
