MAYOR'S MESSAGE

MAYOR MARESA MANZIONE

As we move into the warmer months, it's a great time to reflect on what makes our community such a special place to live. One thing that stands out is the pride we share in our City—our parks, our neighborhoods, and the spaces we all enjoy together.

Recently, we've seen an increase in graffiti and the use of bikes, e-bikes, and other motorized equipment on park grass. While these may seem like small actions, they can cause lasting damage to spaces that belong to

all of us. Taking care of our community means treating public property with the same respect we would our own homes. Let's continue to look out for one another and set a positive example, especially for our younger residents. Not every trend or social media challenge leads to something constructive—we can choose better.

If you're looking for a fun and positive way to get involved, I encourage you to check out the county-wide America250 scavenger hunt, "The Goose is on the Loose." Tooele City has been recognized statewide for our America250 programs and community participation, and it has been exciting to see several local teams enrolled and enjoying the healthy competition. It's a great opportunity to explore, learn, and connect with our community. You can participate by downloading the GooseChase app and entering FREEDOM250TC to join the adventure.

Another important focus this season is water conservation. While our wells are currently in good condition, that doesn't mean we can afford to be wasteful. Being mindful of how and when we water helps ensure long-term sustainability for everyone. The City is sharing helpful water-saving tips on social media each Wednesday, and you'll also find a voluntary watering guide included in this newsletter. Additionally, we're offering LocalScape classes to help residents learn more about water-wise landscaping and planting practices that work well in our environment.

Finally, we are entering budget season. The tentative budget was posted in May, and I want to express my appreciation for our City staff, who have worked diligently to identify efficiencies and ensure the budget reflects the needs of both our residents and our community as a whole. The City Council has also provided thoughtful input throughout this process.

Like many households, the City is navigating the impacts of inflation. As part of the proposed budget, we are considering a modest tax increase. This approach reflects our commitment to making small, gradual adjustments when needed rather than waiting and requiring a much larger increase all at once. The proposed increase would help address rising costs and support important needs, including stipends for our firefighters, an additional police officer, IT support, and required judgment levy obligations. These are not decisions we take lightly; they are made with the goal of maintaining the safety, service, and quality of life our residents expect and deserve.

Thank you for being part of what makes our community strong. When we work together—with pride, respect, and a shared vision—we continue to build a place we are all proud to call home.

THE COUNCIL'S CORNER

Tooele City continues to work diligently to provide high-quality services while remaining mindful of the financial impact on residents. The tentative budget was presented during the May 6, City Council meeting. As the City continues finalizing the upcoming fiscal year budget, the Council is evaluating a potential property tax increase of less than 5%, which would equate to an estimated \$2.26 per month for a median-valued home. This consideration is largely driven by the continued rise in inflation and increasing operational costs associated with maintaining essential city services, infrastructure, and public safety. The City remains committed to transparency throughout the budget process and will hold several public budget meetings to provide information, answer questions, and gather community input.

In addition to budget planning, Tooele City is closely monitoring current drought conditions and the long-term sustainability of our water resources. Residents are encouraged to remain water conscious and look for simple ways to conserve water throughout the summer months. One of the most effective ways to reduce water usage is to be mindful of outdoor watering practices. Adjusting sprinkler schedules, avoiding watering during the hottest parts of the day, and preventing overwatering can make a significant difference in overall community water consumption.

Tooele City continues to proactively plan for future water needs by drilling additional wells and improving water infrastructure to stay ahead of projected growth and demand. Long-term water sustainability requires ongoing conservation efforts not only during periods of drought, but also during years with stronger water supplies. The City continues to evaluate opportunities to reduce outdoor watering at city-owned buildings and facilities as part of its ongoing commitment to responsible water stewardship.

We value the input and involvement of our residents and encourage community members to continue reaching out with questions, concerns, and suggestions. Whether it involves city services, infrastructure, public safety, or neighborhood concerns, City staff and elected officials remain committed to listening and doing our best to resolve issues. Working together helps ensure Tooele City remains a strong and vibrant community for everyone.

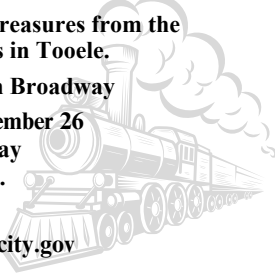

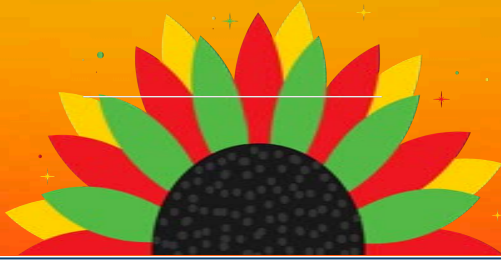

Anyone offering a "Service" from their home, for compensation, requires a Tooele City Business License. DOOR-TO-DOOR SOLICITORS

All solicitors in Tooele City must obtain a license and visibly wear a **2026 GREEN ID BADGE**. If someone is not wearing a badge, call Dispatch at 435-882-5600. Provide a full description and direction of travel.

FILE A POLICE REPORT ONLINE

File non-emergency reports using our new online reporting system. Available 24 hours a day. Incidents must have occurred within Tooele City limits.

What can be reported online?

A FRIENDLY REMINDER ABOUT WEEDS:

It's been dry, and that means weeds can quickly become more than just an eyesore — they can pose real fire and safety risks. Tooele City asks everyone to help keep our community safe and looking great by trimming and maintaining weeds and tall grass.

Under Tooele City Code 8-4-4, it's unlawful to allow weeds or grass to grow in ways that create hazards or obstructions, including:

- In public rights-of-way where tall weeds block visibility for drivers or pedestrians.
- On lots under one acre where weeds can become a fire hazard or attract vermin.
- Within 30 feet of property lines on larger parcels (one acre or more), where weeds must be kept under 6 inches.
- In commercial and industrial areas, where weeds taller than 6 inches are not allowed.

Keeping weeds trimmed helps prevent fires, improves visibility, and keeps Tooele looking its best.

Let's all do our part to stay safe and keep our City shining this summer.
