## **2023 ROAD PROGRAM**

Base Repairs and a Mill and Overlay process will be applied to the following roads in the early part of the summer, 2023:

- W. Beil Avenue from Rose Inn Avenue to bridge
- Highland Avenue from Sycamore Street to Rose Inn Avenue
- Blossom Hill Rd from crest of hill to Newburg Road.
- Newport Avenue from Municipal Building to Tewksbury Court
- Schoeneck Avenue from 191 to Upper Nazareth Township/ Bushkill Township border line



The Mill and Overlay is a process in which intersections, driveways, and curbs are milled to 2". Once this is done the entire road is overlayed with a top layer of asphalt. This will create a new wearing surface while maintaining curb and driveway reveals.

Further updates will be on Facebook and on the Upper Nazareth Township website.

## **RESIDENTIAL RECYCLING**

#### What You Need to Know

- Township Residents are allowed to contract their own trash and recycling service with the hauler of their choice.
- Haulers are required to collect both trash and recycling from a residence, recycling must be collected at least bi-weekly on the same schedule as trash pickup.
- Upper Nazareth Township requires that our residences utilize the Township's green and yellow recycling carts provided thanks to the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Proection grant. All recyclable should be placed inside the cart and there's no need to sort them out separately, this method is known as single-stream recycling. These carts or toters are for recycle materials only and cannot be used for trash. They are the property of Upper Nazareth Twp. and must stay with the house if you move.

#### CURBSIDE RECYCLING GUIDE

Recyclable materials that can go in your yellow and green cart include:



#### **Glass Bottles & Jars**

(NO Mirrors, drinking glasses, dishes, platters, cookware, bakeware, light bulbs, broken glass, etc.)



#### Plastics # 1-7

(NO Straws, plastic shopping bags, plastic video tapes or CDs, electronics, string lights, hangers, extension cords, any "tanglers", Styrofoam, packing, peanuts, packaging, blister packaging, foods or liquids.)



Newsprint, Advertisements, Junk Mail, Paper-bound Catalogs and Phonebooks, Magazines



## Office and Printer Paper, Folders, Envelopes

(NO Shredded paper or thermal receipts)



#### Corrugated Paper (Cardboard), Chipboard (Shoe and Cereal Boxes), Paper towel & Toilet Paper Rolls, Empty Cartons

(NO Frozen food boxes, carpet rolls, or coated cardboard, soiled pizza boxes, paper plates or cups)


(NO Scrap metal and Appliances)

#### **HELPFUL RECYLING HINTS:**

- **Don't trash a good thing**. Don't bag your recyclables. Place them directly into your recycling container. If bagged, they are considered trash!
- When in doubt, throw it out! If you are not sure it belongs in the recycling container, throw it in the trash. Contamination jeopardizes an entire truckload of recyclables.
- Empty and rinse out containers before recycling.
- Reuse packing peanuts or take them to the nearest participating postal/shipping store to reuse.
- **Donate useable items** such as clothing, shoes, linens, toys, etc.

#### Materials to Keep Out of your Recycling cart:

Batteries (household alkaline can go in trash, Lithium batteries can be recycled Home Depot or Lowes, car batteries can be recycled at the location of new purchase)



Light bulbs (CFLs can be taken to Home Depot or Lowes for free recycling)

Extension Cords (donate or trash)



## COMMERCIAL RECYCLING

Pennsylvania Act 101 states commercial, institutional and municipal establishments within the Township are required to keep separate from waste and recycle:

high-grade office paper
 aluminum
 corrugated paper
 leaf waste

In addition to the items required by the state, Township Ordinance No. 161 states that the materials listed below be kept separate from the waste stream and properly recycled.

glass
 plastics
 newsprint
 steel and bi-metal cans
 yard waste

PA Act 101 and the Township both require all commercial, institutional and municipal establishments to annually provide written documentation and certification to the Township of the total number of tons of materials and the type of materials recycled. At the end of each year, the Township mails an annual business report with instructions, to each business. That report must be completed and submitted back to the Township by January 31st. As per the State of Pennsylvanian and the Township, non-compliance may result in fines and failure to renew a business license.

Recycling material generated from Community Activities are also required to be separated, stored and collected by a private waste collector.

#### **Managing Your Grass**

#### Grasscycling

What it means: leaving grass clippings on the lawn when you mow, releasing valuable nutrients, adding water-saving mulch and encouraging natural soil aeration by earthworms. For those concerned about our landfills, grass cycling cuts down on the volume of material making that trip.

Grasscycling reduces the need for chemical fertilizers. Too much fertilizer can weaken the lawn by causing a shallow root system to develop.

If must use fertilizers, apply small amounts only two or three times during the growing season (mid to late May and early to mid-September are best in the Northeast region).

## Street Sweeping - MARCH 27, 2023 – MARCH 31, 2023

Upper Nazareth Township will be cleaning and sweeping the dedicated streets of Upper Nazareth Township from March 27 – March 31, 2023.

The Township requests that you please keep your vehicles, basketball hoops, and other objects off the roads during this week.

## <u>SPRING CURBSIDE YARD WASTE COLLECTION</u> APRIL 24 – 28, 2023

The Township will be collecting curbside during the week of April 24 – 28, 2023. This collection will follow the same collection pattern as the fall leaf collection. Visit the Upper Nazareth Township website <a href="https://www.uppernazarethtownship.org">www.uppernazarethtownship.org</a> for details.

ACCEPTABLE MATERIALS include unlimited amounts of yard waste (leaves, branches, twigs, roots, bushes, flowers, house plants, garden clippings) that will be collected curbside and composted instead of placed in a landfill. Place your yard waste in a clean open-top container. \*\*\*\* NO PLASTIC BAGS \*\*\*\*. Branches must be tied with cotton or hemp twine in bundles no larger than 12" x 12" x 6' and weighing no more than 40lbs. Leaves must be bagged separately in compostable bags. (Available at various hardware and grocery stores)

**UNACCEPTABLE MATERIALS** will not be collected and includes: grass clippings, tree stumps, loose soils, sod, food waste, plastics and synthetic fibers, lumber, any wood or tree limbs over 4" diameter; human or animal excrement, soil contaminated with hazardous substances, plastic bags, plastic pots, rocks, litter, trash or glass.

## **DROP-OFF YARD WASTE FACILITY**

#### Location: 155 Friedenstahl Ave.

Permitted: Upper Nazareth Township Residents Only. Proof of residency is required in order to use the site. Note: The Yard Waste Site is not available for commercial or business use. Improper or fraudulent use will result in suspension of usage and or fines.

Opening/Closing Dates: April 29, 202through November 18, 2023

Days and Hours of Operation: Wednesdays 12pm-6pm, Saturdays 10am - 2pm

Accepted Material: Hedge Trimmings, Shrubs, Garden and plant residue, Twigs, Branches 4" in diameter or smaller. Leaves must be kept separate for processing, do not mix with other yard waste.

#### All plastic bags and containers must be emptied and taken back with resident.

Unacceptable Material: grass, bamboo, tree parts or stumps, loose soil, sod, lumber, pressure-treated wood, railroad ties, food waste, hay, straw, any type of plastic or synthetic fibers, pieces of wood bigger than 4" in diameter, human or animal excrement, contaminated soil, garden pots, rocks, glass or trash.





# **MS4 NEWS**

## **UPPER NAZARETH TOWNSHIP'S POLLUTANT REDUCTION PLAN PROJECT UPDATES**



The Township is working through the **Pollutant Reduction Plan** (PRP) projects it is obliged to complete by the March 31, 2026 deadline of our current 5-year MS4 (**M**unicipal **S**eparate **S**torm **S**ewer **S**ystem) permit. The status of each project is as follows:

1. Farmview Extended Detention Basin Retrofit (Location: Farmview Rd and Tatamy Rd):

The first of our projects is currently under construction. Passersby will see a metal baffle system with aluminized coating used for a 50-yr design life. The baffles increase the flow length between the inflow pipes and the outlet control structure to give time for suspended particles to settle out before leaving the basin. This project is anticipated to be complete by Summer 2023.

- 2. Fieldview Extended Detention Basin Retrofit (Location: Between SR 946 and Fieldview Dr) The Public Works Department has recently begun a major maintenance effort on this basin to clear out accumulated vegetation, debris and sediment. Detailed design of the retrofit project is underway. This project is anticipated to start as early as Summer 2023 but may be completed in 2024.
- **3.** Sycamore Park Bioretention Swale (Location: Between Sycamore St and Willowdale Ave) The PRP project at Sycamore Park is being coordinated with an overall re-design of the park. The PRP project will construct a bioretention swale that will become a prominent feature in the park in addition to new plantings along the stream bank running through the park to limit erosion. Construction is anticipated to start in 2024 or 2025 depending on the outcome of a grant application.
- **4. Tewksbury Extended Detention Basin Retrofit (Location: Between Tewksbury Ct and Leibert Park)** This project is similar to the Farmview basin project and was bundled with the Sycamore Park grant application for funding. The Public Works Department will be starting maintenance work on the basin to remove accumulated vegetation and sediment between now and Summer 2024.
- **5.** Bushkill Creek Watershed Pathogen Risk Investigation (Location: east end of Township along SR 191) Investigatory testing will be performed this Spring to determine if there may be any possible sources of pathogenic pollution (e.g. fecal coliform) from inside the boundaries of the Township.

  - If washing a car at home, put the car on the grass to prevent soapy water entering the storm system
  - Never put automobile fluids down a storm drain

#### COMMERCIAL

- Paved Areas Dirt, Oil and Debris
  Sweep up litter and debris from sidewalks, driveways and parking lots, especially around storm drains.
- Cover grease storage containers and dumpsters
- Report any chemical spill to the County Emergency Management/911 Center
- Grease/Oil Waste
  - Restaurant/food services cooking oils and grease must be captured in a grease trap and not sent into a central sewer or on-lot septic system.
  - All forms of oil, grease, chemicals and other hazardous materials must be disposed of in accordance with all applicable state regulations – these substances must never be disposed of into the environment.



#### CONSTRUCTION

- **Erosion and Sedimentation Pollution** This is the single greatest pollutant of PA Streams.
  - Divert stormwater away from disturbed or exposed areas of the construction site
  - Install silt fence or compost filter sock along the downslope perimeter of the construction site
- Use vegetative cover and other erosion and sediment controls to stabilize the site
- Properly maintain erosion and sediment control measures, especially after rainstorms
- Prevent soil erosion by minimizing disturbed areas during construction projects
- Seed and mulch bare soil areas as soon as possible

April showers bring reminders on how to safely navigate thunderstorms, heavy rains and winds, and the threats of tornados. Safety during these type of events is very important because this weather is unpredictable and often times severe. Pennsylvania is the poster child for all four seasons in one day so we will take this opportunity to remind you of ways to be prepared, no matter what mother nature throws at us in the coming months.

Thunderstorms cause most of the severe spring weather. They often bring lightning, tornados, and flooding. Because spring weather is so unpredictable, most people are unprepared when this weather comes. When these types of weather hit unexpectedly, the risk of severe injury and even death increases. Planning ahead can save lives and prevent injury.

Advanced planning for all severe weather events requires many of the same safety precautions. First, keep an emergency kit on hand, and check the contents often. The kit should include some of the following items.

- A battery operated flashlight and NOAA Weather radio. Check the batteries often, replacing when you replace those in your smoke detector. Keep extra batteries in the kit as well.
- An emergency evacuation and shelter plan for each type of situation. Share this plan with everyone in your household, including children. Discuss plans with those that have mobility challenges.
- A written list of important personal information. Include telephone numbers of neighbors, family, and friends. Write insurance and property information, include policy numbers, along with the contact information for utility companies. Also, keep a list of medical information including all prescriptions.
- A well stocked first aid kit. Check the American Red Cross website for a checklist of items that should be included.
- A 3-5 day supply of bottled water and non perishable food. Don't forget a manual can opener and eating utensils.
- Personal hygiene items and appropriate clothing. Remember severe weather can come with unpredictable drops in temperature. Don't forget a warm jacket, hat, and gloves along with rain gear.
- Blankets and sleeping bags.

While it is important to be prepared inside, it's also important to prepare and maintain your property outside. As you plant your spring flowers, check trees for loose branches that could break off in strong winds and damage houses and vehicle. Check and clean gutters and make sure that garbage cans and patio furniture are kept in safe locations.

If you have a generator for use, there are a few safety tips to consider. Never use a generator inside the home or in partially enclosed areas. Partial ventilated areas, including garages, areas with windows open or fans will not prevent carbon monoxide build-up in the home. Always connect appliances using heavy duty extension cords and fuel outside of your home. Do not store fuel inside you home.

## **REAL ESTATE**

**TOWNSHIP REAL ESTATE TAX BILLS:** if you recently moved into the Township and did not receive a 2023 Upper Nazareth Township (& Library combined) Real Estate tax bill, please contact the Tax Collector at 610-442-1653 or **retaxes@uppernazarethtownship.org.** It may have been forwarded to the previous owner.

**PAYMENT INFORMATION:** The only information to include on your payment check (personal checks or online bill payment checks) is your phone number and the current bill number of the bill you are paying. Your Parcel & Deed numbers are not needed. **New this year; Phone number line on your payment coupons.** Phone numbers are only used if there is a problem with your check (i.e., returned, not signed, wrong amount, numbers & written line do not match) and will not be shared or published.

- Cash Payments: Are no longer accepted, please use a check or money order.
- Credit Card payments: you can pay your Upper Nazareth Township Real Estate Tax bill online with a credit or debit card (additional fees do apply) or an e-check (\$1.50 fee). (School Tax bills cannot be paid online)
- Mortgage Escrow: If you receive an Escrow Overage/refund, check with the Tax Collector to be sure all your real estate taxes have been paid. This is especially a concern for a new construction home.
- **Drop Box:** Located at the Township Office, 100 Newport Ave. Box is outside to the right of the front door. Your payment only needs to be put in one envelope. The envelopes are left at the box for those who may not have one, please only use one if necessary.

**INTERIM REAL ESTATE TAX BILLS:** Interim or supplemental real estate tax bills are generated when the assessment of your property increases either due to new construction or improvements. These bills are only sent to the property owner. If your mortgage company pays your real estate taxes through an escrow account, you must send them a copy of this bill. However, this does not guarantee it will be paid by them. You must verify this bill will be paid *separately* from your regular real estate tax bills.
