# **2020 ROAD PROGRAM**

Base Repairs and a Mill and Overlay process will be applied to the following roads in the early part of the summer, 2020:

Kurt Drive	From Schoeneck Ave. to Rose Inn Ave.
E. Beil Avenue	From Schoeneck Ave. to Rose Inn Ave.
Newport Avenue	From the Municipal Building to Tewksbury Ct.
	And from Kingsbury Ct. to Kurt Dr.
E. Allen Street	From Newport Ave. to Rose Inn Ave.
E. St. Elmo Street	From Newport Ave. to Rose Inn Ave.
El Reno Avenue	From East Lawn Rd. to Allen Street
Silvercrest Road	From Bridge at Park to Township Line Road

The Mill and Overlay is a process in which intersections, driveways, and curbs are milled to 2". Once this is done the entire road is overlayed with a top layer of asphalt. This will create a new wearing surface while maintaining curb and driveway reveals.

# SPRING CURBSIDE YARD WASTE COLLECTION April 13 – 17, 2020

The Township will be collecting curbside during the week of April 13 – 17, 2020. This collection will follow the same collection pattern as the fall leaf collection. Visit the Upper Nazareth Township website www.uppernazarethtownship.org for details.

**ACCEPTABLE MATERIALS** include unlimited amounts of yard waste (leaves, branches, twigs, roots, bushes, flowers, house plants, garden clippings) that will be collected curbside and composted instead of placed in a landfill. Place your yard waste in a clean open-top container. \*\*\*\* NO PLASTIC BAGS \*\*\*\*. Branches must be tied with cotton or hemp twine in bundles no larger than 12' x 12' x 6 and weighing no more than 40lbs. Leaves must be bagged separately in compostable bags. (Available at various hardware and grocery stores)

**UNACCEPTABLE MATERIALS** will not be collected and include: grass clippings, tree stumps, loose soils, sod, food waste, plastics and synthetic fibers, lumber, any wood or tree limbs over 4" diameter; human or animal excrement, soil contaminated with hazardous substances, plastic bags, plastic pots, rocks, litter, trash or glass.

# YARD WASTE COLLECTION FACILITY Saturday, April 18, 2020

The yard waste collection site at 155 Friedenstahl Avenue will be open on Saturdays from 10:00 a.m. until 2:00 p.m. and Wednesdays from 12:00 noon until 6:00 p.m. beginning Saturday, April 18, 2020. The facility is for RESIDENTS only. (proof of residency is required)

- Please separate your leaves from your yard waste.
- Branches must be limited to four (4) inches in diameter.
- There is an area to drop off scrap metal.

**UNACCEPTABLE MATERIALS:** grass clippings, tree stumps, loose soils, sod, food waste, plastics and synthetic fibers, lumber, any wood or tree limbs over 4" diameter; human or animal excrement, soil contaminated with hazardous substances, plastic bags, plastic pots, rocks, litter, trash or glass.

# Why Can Stormwater Runoff Be a Problem?

Poorly managed stormwater runoff can cause many problems. These include:

- **Flooding.** As stormwater runs off roofs, driveways, and lawns, large volumes quickly reach streams, causing them to rise and flood. When more impervious surfaces exist, flooding occurs rapidly and can be severe, resulting in damage to property and harm to people.
- **Pollution.** Stormwater running over roofs, driveways, roads, and lawns will pick up pollutants such as oil, fertilizers, pesticides, dirt/sediment, trash, and animal waste. These pollutants "hitch a ride" with the stormwater and flow untreated into local streams, polluting our waters.
- Stream Bank Erosion. When stormwater flows into streams at unnaturally high volumes and speeds, the power of these flows can cause severe stream bank erosion. Eroding banks can eat away at streamside property, create dangerous situations, and damage natural habitat for fish and other aquatic life. This erosion is another source of sediment pollution in streams.
- Threats to Human Health. Stormwater runoff can carry many pollutants, such as toxic metals, organic compounds, bacteria, and viruses. Polluted stormwater, especially coming from combined sewer overflows, can contaminate drinking water supplies and hamper recreational opportunities as well as threaten fish and other aquatic life.

#### What Can I Do to Help?

As a homeowner, you can help avoid the problems associated with stormwater runoff by:

- reducing impervious areas (hard surfaces like roofs, paved areas) so that rain soaks into the ground
- planting native trees and plants which help infiltrate stormwater and increase evaporation and transpiration
- managing stormwater on-site with rain gardens, rain barrels, and similar practices
- following lawn care practices:
- Instead of bagging your grass clippings or blowing them into the street, allow them to lie on top of your lawn. It provides extra moisture to the grass along with a natural food source. This also allows you to cut back on extra expenses for fertilizing.
- The best time to fertilize is before a light rainfall; otherwise wait until after a heavy rainfall. If you fertilize right before a heavy rainfall, all the materials you used will be washed off your yard and will wash into the storm drains. Be careful to not apply to impervious surfaces.

By doing many small things on your property, you can have a big impact on improving stormwater management and water quality in our region.





# **Residential Recycling**

#### PA Act 101 and Upper Nazareth Township require residents recycle the following items:

- CANS: Aluminum, tin, steel, bimetallic and aerosol cans; aluminum containers. Rinse.
- **GLASS:** Clear, green, and brown food and beverage jars and bottles only. Rinse. Trash lids.
- PLASTIC: Plastic bottles and containers only. Most haulers collect all #1-7 plastics, while some do not accept certain numbers. Acceptable items include soda, water, milk, juice, liquor, shampoo, detergent, condiments, salad dressing, yogurt, margarine tubs, etc. Rinse. Plastic bags are accepted in collection receptacles at most grocery stores. No Styrofoam, plastic bags, film, cords, or plastic toys.
- MIXED PAPER: Office paper, phone books, junk mail, newsprint, magazines, catalogs, corrugated cardboard, and food boxes such as cereal and pasta boxes, and gift boxes. Cut and flatten to provide easy release from your cart. No waxy coatings (i.e. frozen food boxes) or hard cover books. Shredded paper is not recyclable and must go into the trash.

#### NO GREASY PIZZA BOXES, PLASTIC BAGS, OR FOOD WASTE



Listed above are basic recycling guidelines.

Please check with your hauler regarding their specific recycling options and rules. Apartments may have different procedures – so check with your landlord or apartment manager.

#### Recycling and Contamination – What does it mean for us?

Contamination means higher costs for waste and recycling services. When our curbside carts contain items such as those listed below, the value of our recyclables goes down and our costs go up!



#### Please Keep These Items Out of Your Curbside Recycling Cart:

No plastics bags, film, or sheeting packaging No paper napkins, plates, cups or tissues No food or liquids No electronics of any kind No textiles, bedding, rugs or carpet No hoses, holiday lights, or extension cords **No** tires, auto parts, or scrap metal **No** concrete, wood, cabinets or other construction debris

**No** yard waste

**No** non-recyclable rigid plastic (kiddie pools, large toys)

No Styrofoam No ceramics or dishes No motor oil containers No light bulbs, windows or mirrors

When in doubt, throw it out!

The library strives to serve the community in traditional and contemporary ways. The library continues to be a hub for digital intelligence, civic engagement, and a space for people to meet, read, work, and play. The library is proud to continue to build community partnerships like those we have with the Nazareth Business Council, Nazareth YMCA, Joshua Tree, Nazareth Rotary, AARP, St. Luke's Hospital & Health Network, the Nazareth Food Bank, Stone Soup, and many others. These partnerships make our goals attainable.

The library is clearly at the core of the community as it hosted over 1,000 visitors during Christmas in Nazareth, the beloved community-wide event. This special day at the library included Santa Claus, NASME train display, Polar Express Engineer, crafts, food and refreshments. In January, the library hosted the Nazareth Business Council and fire chiefs from Vigilance Hose Co. #1 and Hecktown Fire Company for a community conversation on fire safety. 
## ZONING

# TAXES

#### **REAL ESTATE TAX**

**Township Real Estate Tax Bills:** if you recently moved into the Township and did not receive a 2020 Upper Nazareth Township Real Estate tax bill, please contact the Tax Collector, Tracy Adamski at 610-442-1653. It may have been forwarded to the previous owner.

**<u>Real Estate Tax bill Instructions:</u>** Please include a phone number on all Real Estate Tax payment checks. This number will only be used if there is a problem with your check (i.e. not signed, wrong amount, numbers & written line do not match) and will not be shared or published.

**Online Bank payment:** If you use your banks "Online Bill Pay" to pay your real estate taxes, please include the current bill number of the bill you are paying on your payment. This number changes each year and for each tax cycle.

**<u>Payments with cash:</u>** Please have exact change if paying a tax bill with cash.

<u>Credit Card payments:</u> you can pay your Upper Nazareth Township Real Estate Tax bill online with a credit or debit card (additional fees do apply) or an e-check (\$1.50 fee).

**Mortgage Escrow:** If you receive an Escrow Overage refund, check with the Tax Collector to be sure all of your real estate taxes have been paid. This is especially a concern for a new construction home.

#### Interim Real Estate Tax bills:

Interim or supplemental real estate tax bills are generated when the assessment of your property increases either due to new construction or improvements. These bills are only sent to the property owner. If your mortgage company pays your real estate taxes through an escrow account you must send them a copy of this bill. However this does not guarantee it will be paid by them. You must verify this bill will be paid separately from your regular real estate tax bills.



The Real Estate Tax Office is open for walk-in tax payments every Tuesday 9am – 12pm and Thursday 12pm-3pm, unless otherwise posted. Additional walk-in payment hours for the Township discount period are: Wednesday, March 25 & April 1, 12pm-3pm.

#### **OFFICE CLOSINGS:**

For security reasons the Tax collector does not advertise on your bills when the office will be closed, a sign will be posted on the front door and a message is recorded on the real estate tax phone number for further instructions.

\*If Upper Nazareth Township has declared a "Snow Emergency" on a scheduled walk-in hours day, the Real Estate Tax office will be closed. The office is located on a snow emergency route.

CodeRED is a FREE emergency notification service provided by the Northeast Task Force within Northampton County and Upper Nazareth Township. Please take the time to download the CodeRED Mobile Alert app to be more informed about emergencies within Upper Nazareth Township and Northampton County. If you are in need of police assistance, please use the appropriate number listed above.

### E-FILE YOUR LOCAL EARNED INCOME TAX RETURN

On average, about 40% of Upper Nazareth residents currently report their local taxes online. If you are still mailing in a paper form, you may want to consider using Keystone's fast and friendly e-file to file your 2019 annual local earned income tax return.

If you are anticipating a refund this year, e-file is the fast way to get your money.

Keystone still mails paper tax returns, but, increasingly, more and more residents are turning to e-file.

e-file automatically adapts to any platform, so filing on your smart phone is a breeze.

You only need to provide a minimum amount of information, such as your wages, local tax withholding and where you lived during the year. You don't have to worry about most forms or calculations – e-file does the work for you.

Did you move during the year? e-file will apportion your earned income and tax liability for each municipality where Keystone serves as the Tax Officer.

Did you work outside of Pennsylvania? e-file will apply your out-of-state tax credits to your local liability.

If you owe tax, you can file your return today and schedule payment to arrive on or before the April 15 due date.
