


# **2019 Road Program**

The Mill and Overlay process will be applied to the following roads in the early part of the summer, 2019:

- Cameron St. All
- Kessler St. All
- Monroe St. All
- Hoch Ave. 191 to Schoeneck Ave.
- Wayne St. Hoch Ave. to El Reno Ave.
- Newport Ave. 191 to Tewksbury
- Blossom Hill Rd. Georgetown Rd. to crest of hill heading west.
- Alms Alley Almshouse Rd. to Christian Springs Rd.

The Mill and Overlay is a process in which intersections, driveways, and curbs are milled to 2". Once this is done the entire road is overlayed with a top layer of asphalt. This will create a new wearing surface while maintaining curb and driveway reveals.

# **Residential Recycling**

# What Goes Into Our Recycling Cart?

PA Act 101 and Upper Nazareth Township require residents to recycle the following materials:

- CANS: Aluminum, tin, steel, bimetallic and aerosol cans; formed aluminum containers (such as pie pans). Rinse.
- **GLASS:** Clear, green, and brown food and beverage jars and bottles. Rinse. Trash lids. No drinking glasses, window panes, light bulbs, mirrors, ceramic, china, or porcelain.
- PLASTIC: Plastic bottles and containers. Check with your hauler to see which recycling numbers they collect. Many collect all #1-7 plastics, while some do not accept #3 or #6; see the bottom of the container. Includes soda, water, milk, juice, liquor, shampoo, detergent, condiments, salad dressing, yogurt, margarine, etc. Rinse. No caps, Styrofoam, plastic bags, film, or plastic toys.
- <u>MIXED PAPER:</u> Office paper, phone books, junk mail, newsprint, magazines, catalogs, corrugated cardboard, and food boxes such as cereal and pasta boxes, as well as gift boxes. No waxy coatings (i.e. frozen food boxes). Cut and flatten if needed to provide easy release from your cart. Shredded paper is not recyclable.

NO GREASY PIZZA BOXES, PLASTIC BAGS, OR FOOD WASTE BELONGS IN YOUR RECYCLING CART

Listed above are basic recycling guidelines. Please check with your hauler regarding their specific recycling options and rules. Apartments may have different procedures – so check with your landlord or apartment manager.

# **STORMWATER MANAGEMENT**

#### MS4 Good Housekeeping

Did you know that the waterways in the Delaware River Watershed provide clean drinking water to over 60,000 people? Upper Nazareth Township is included in that number and although it may be a group effort to clean our waterways, every action no matter how small will make a difference.

#### What happens when our waterways become polluted?

Overall, freshwater ecosystems have received the highest levels of pollution that degrades the environment and reduces biodiversity. Pollution affects organisms all the way down to microscopic levels. Although small, microorganisms are some of the most vital creatures to our waterways, because they are producers within the aquatic food web. Without a large producer group, we would no longer see fish in our creeks, streams, and rivers. Most fish are planktivores at one point in their life, which means their primary food source is plankton. If the species does not survive on plankton, they may survive off eating planktivores. As we continue to pollute our waterways, fish biodiversity and density will decrease and will ultimately affect our recreational anglers.

#### Where do pollutants originate?

Pollution can be caused by two sources, a point source or nonpoint source. The difference between the two is where the pollution originates. Point source pollution is any pollution site that is localized and stationary, such as factory or a wastewater treatment plant. Nonpoint source pollution can either be rainfall or snowmelt that travels over the ground washing away any natural and or human-made pollutants. Nonpoint source pollution includes runoff from your yard, streets, agricultural fields and animal waste through farming practices.

Upper Nazareth Township will be cleaning and sweeping the dedicated streets of Upper Nazareth Township from April 1 to April 5, 2019. The Township requests that you please keep your vehicles, basketball hoops, and other objects off the roads during this week.

# SPRING CURBSIDE YARD WASTE COLLECTION April 22-26, 2019

The Township will be collecting curbside during the week of April 22-26, 2019. This collection will follow the same collection pattern as the fall leaf collection. Visit the Upper Nazareth Township website www.uppernazarethtownship.org for details.

ACCEPTABLE MATERIALS include: unlimited amounts of yard waste (leaves, branches, twigs, roots, bushes, flowers, house plants, garden clippings) that will be collected curbside and composted instead of placed in a landfill. Place your yard waste in a clean open-top container. \*\*\*\*NO PLASTIC BAGS\*\*\*\*\*. Branches must be tied with cotton or hemp twine in bundles no larger than 12' x 12' x 6, and weighing no more than 40lbs. Leaves must be bagged separately in compostable bags. (Available at various hardware and grocery stores)

**UNACCEPTABLE MATERIALS** will not be collected and include: grass clippings, tree stumps, loose soils, sod, food waste, plastics and synthetic fibers, lumber, any wood or tree limbs over 4" diameter; human or animal excrement, soil contaminated with hazardous substances, plastic bags, plastic pots, rocks, litter, trash or glass.

# YARD WASTE COLLECTION FACILITY Saturday, April 27, 2019

The yard waste collection site at 155 Friedenstahl Avenue will be open on Saturdays from 10:00 a.m. until 2:00 p.m. and Wednesdays from 12:00 noon until 6:00 p.m. beginning Saturday, April 27, 2019. The facility is for **RESIDENTS** only(proof of residency is required).

- Please separate your leaves from your yard
  waste
- Branches must be limited to four (4) inches in diameter.
- There is an area to drop off scrap metal.

**UNACCEPTABLE MATERIALS:** grass clippings, tree stumps, loose soils, sod, food waste, plastics and synthetic fibers, lumber, any wood or tree limbs over 4" diameter; human or animal excrement, soil contaminated with hazardous substances, plastic bags, plastic pots, rocks, litter, trash or glass.

# ODO'S & ODON'TS



The best time to fertilize is before a light rainfall; otherwise wait until after a heavy rainfall. If you fertilize right before a heavy rainfall, all the materials you used will be washed off your yard and will wash into the storm drains. Be careful to not apply to impervious surfaces.







Instead of bagging your grass clippings or blowing them into the street, allow them to lie on top of your lawn. It provides extra moisture to the grass along with a natural food source. This also allows you to cut back on extra expenses for fertilizing.

**Township Real Estate Tax Bills:** If you recently moved into the Township and did not receive a 2019 Upper Nazareth Township Real Estate tax bill, please contact the Tax Collector. It may have been forwarded to the previous owner.

Real Estate Tax bill Instructions: Please include a phone number on all Real Estate Tax payment checks. This number will only be used if there is a problem with your check (i.e. not signed, wrong amount, numbers & written line do not match) and will not be shared or published.

Online Bank payment: If you use your banks "Online

Bill Pay" to pay your real estate taxes, please include the <u>current bill number</u> of the bill you are paying on your payment. This number changes each year and for each tax cycle.

**Payments with cash:** Please have <u>exact change</u> if paying a tax bill with cash.

**Credit Card payments:** You can pay your Upper Nazareth Township Real Estate Tax bill online with a credit or debit card (additional fees do apply) or an e-check (\$1.50 fee).

**Mortgage Escrow:** If you receive an <u>Escrow Overage</u> refund, check with the Tax Collector to be sure all of your real estate taxes have been paid. This is especially a concern for a new construction home.

**Interim Real Estate Tax bills:** Interim or supplemental real estate tax bills are generated when the assessment of your property increases either due to new construction or improvements. These bills are only sent to the property owner. If your mortgage company pays your real estate taxes through an escrow account you must send them a copy of this bill. However this does not guarantee it will be paid by them. You must verify this bill will be paid separately from your regular real estate tax bills.

The Real Estate Tax Office is open for walk-in tax payments every Tuesday 9am-12pm and Thursday 12pm-3pm, unless otherwise posted. Additional walk-in payment hours for the Township discount period are: Wednesday, March 20 & 27, 12pm-3pm.

#### Office closings:

For security reasons the Tax collector does not advertise on your bills when the office will be closed, a sign will be posted on the front door and a message is recorded on the real estate tax phone number for further instructions.

\* If Upper Nazareth Township has declared a "Snow Emergency" on a scheduled walk-in hours day, the Real Estate Tax office will be closed. The office is located on a snow emergency route.

## Notice of Fair Housing Officer and Complaint Process for Upper Nazareth Township

This notice will serve to advise all residents of Upper Nazareth Township that the following actions, if based on race, color, sex, national origin, religion, familial status (families with children), or handicap (disability) is prohibited by Title VIII of the Civil Rights Act of 1968 (Federal Fair Housing Act) and the Pennsylvania Human Relations Act adds the additional protected classes of age, ancestry and use of guide or support animals because of the blindness, deafness or physical handicap of the user or because the user is a handler or trainer of support or guide animals are considered discriminatory:

- Refusing to sell or rent to, deal or negotiate with any person.
- Discriminating on terms or conditions for buying or renting housing.
- Discriminating by advertising that housing is available only to persons of a certain race, color, religion, sex, national origin, familial status, handicap (disability), age or ancestry.
- Denying that housing is available for inspection, sale or rent when it really is available.
- Blockbusting-for profit, persuading owners to sell or rent housing by telling them that minority groups are moving into the neighborhood.

• Weekly programs include Wee Build, Toddler Shake 'n Boogie, and a variety of story times!



# **Upper Nazareth Police - Crime Prevention Tips:**

- Most home burglaries occur between 10 am and 3 pm.
- A burglar typically spends an average of 8 to 12 minutes in your home.
- 65% of all burglaries are residential.
- 34% of burglars will use the front door to access a residence.
- A home without a security system is three times more likely to be a target of a burglar.
- Burglars will look for a home which appears to be unoccupied. A car in the driveway, motion lights, a tv or radio on a timer inside the home gives the impression that someone is there.
- Burglars can hide in shrubs and trees. Keep plants low enough around your home so they do not block points of entry or conceal a burglar.
- Lock doors and windows. Use deadbolt locks on the doors of your residence. A typical burglar only takes 60 seconds breaking into a home.
- Leave a spare key with a neighbor or trusted friend instead of hiding them around the outside of your home. Burglars typically know the hiding spots and will look for a key.
- At night use lighting around your home. Dark and unlit areas around your home are used by a burglar for concealment.
- When you are home if it is possible keep your vehicles in your garage. If you do keep your car outside don't leave any valuables in it. Also lock your car doors.
- If you are traveling and away from your home limit placing items on social media networks until you are home. You may be telling friends, and burglars, that you are on vacation.
- Place your address numbers boldly on your home to ensure first responders can quickly locate your home.
- If you do take a trip let the Upper Nazareth Police know. We will provide vigilance checks of your residence when you are away. Please contact our office at 610-759-7448 or stop and see us at 100 Newport Avenue, Nazareth Pa.

This past year was another busy one for the fire department and 2019 looks to follow suit. Upper Nazareth Fire Dept. ended the year of 2018 with record call volume. The fire dept. responded to 404 calls in 2018, which is 121-call increase over the previous year. With this emergency call trending upwards, we would like to remind everyone to check some of the obvious hazards that sometimes we overlook in our homes. Keep snow and leaves away from sewer vents and natural gas meters. The meters have a gas relief valve that sometimes release gas and to prevent gas from possibly releasing into your home please keep them clear. We also are reminding you to please check your smoke, carbon monoxide detectors and fire extinguishers. We recommend one on each floor level of your home.

This question has been asked several times and I thought it would be good to advise our residents in case you too were wondering. How much does it actually cost to outfit one firefighter with personal protection gear? Well the cost is astonishingly at over \$10,000 per firefighter to protect us from the elements of a fire. This includes full turnout gear and breathing apparatus to enable us to breathe in a fire and protect us from the heat and smoke. The safety of our firefighters is priority one as is our residents of Upper Nazareth Township. In closing please be safe and enjoy the warmer weather that is coming.


