REGULAR MEETING MINUTES #22-07

Commissioner Rolence called the meeting to order at 6:30 p.m.

Roll call was taken. PRESENT: Alan Moyzis (District 1)

The Board reviewed the minutes from their last meeting. Commissioner Moyzis moved, seconded by Commissioner Henehan to approve Regular Meeting Minutes 22-06 dated June 15, 2022. Roll Call: All voted aye. Passed unanimously.

The Board reviewed Life Saving Awards for Sgt. Sean Heilig and Officer Matthew Atkinson of the Oak Lawn Police Department. The Board congratulated these gentlemen on their heroic actions on May 10, 2022, and directed the commission secretary to place them in their personnel folders.

The Board reviewed the following invoices:

- A. Trans Union Corporation Invoice No. 06200285 dated June 25, 2022 in the amount of \$95.00 for credit reports and our regular monthly fee.
- B. Stanard & Associates Invoice No. SA000051032 dated June 30, 2022 in the amount of \$3,600 for pre-employment psychological exams on eight (8) fire department candidates.
- C. Proven Invoice No. 00012 dated July 6, 2022 in the amount of \$5,326 for pre-employment medical exams on nine (9) fire department candidates.

Commissioner Cook moved, seconded by Commissioner Crosby, to approve the above listed invoices. Roll call: All voted aye. Passed unanimously.

The Board discussed the status of hiring in the fire department. Chief Riddle had a request to hire six (6) firefighter paramedics at a prior meeting. Commissioner Baker moved, seconded by Commissioner

Cook to ratify the hiring of Keith Miller, Alex Zwick, Rafael Gonzalez, Edwin Flores, David Onate and Brian Maldonado effective July 5, 2022. Roll call: All voted aye. Passed unanimously. The Board reviewed pre-employment reports for two additional candidates. Commissioner Baker moved, seconded by Commissioner Henehan to remove these two candidates from further consideration. Roll call: All voted aye. Passed unanimously.

The practical exam for fire engineers was held on June 13, 2022 for two eligible candidates. The written examination is scheduled for Wednesday, July 27, 2022. Due to potential construction on the lower-level alternate locations will be explored.

Chief Vittorio recently had a request for eight (8) additional officers. The Commission was able to hire four (4) before exhausting the current eligibility list. The four (4) remaining vacancies will be filled from a new list once established.

Thirty-nine (39) applications were recently received for the position of police patrol officer. Out of the thirty-nine (39) applications received twenty-nine (29) were eligible and invited to the written exam held earlier in the day. A total of twenty-four (24) candidates attended the exam. Oral interviews will be held on Wednesday, August 17th for candidates who receive a passing score on the written.

A report was given by Attorney Horvath on an Unfair Labor Practice claim filed with the Labor Board on July 19, 2022.

The next regular meeting of the Board was scheduled for Wednesday, August 17, 2022 at 6:30 p.m.

There being no further business to come before the Board, Commissioner Henehan moved, seconded by Commissioner Crosby, to adjourn the meeting. Roll call: All voted aye. Passed unanimously.

The meeting was adjourned at 7:29 p.m.




