




Oak Lawn continues to be one of the strongest communities in the state. We see strong and robust growth in our housing market with businesses opening all over town. One problem is finding locations for them as our village is almost completely developed. Often, it's required to tear down older properties to make way for the new. This is a good problem to have. The Oak Lawn Chamber of Commerce has over 350 members and continues to grow. Sometimes, I think my job as Mayor is cutting grand opening ribbons for new businesses, as I do so often.

Public safety is the primary responsibility of any government. I, along with the Village Board, recognize this responsibility and we continue our 100% support of our police and fire departments. We need them more than ever in these difficult times. These are truly professional organizations and I am proud to say I was once an Oak Lawn Police Officer. These men and women need to know that our community and Village leaders stand behind them.

Due to financial concerns caused by the Covid-19 global pandemic, Oak Lawn was forced to make cuts to services and personnel in response to the pandemic. Specifically, our senior bus services were discontinued during this period. After being elected Mayor, myself, Trustee Bud Stalker, and surrounding Mayors worked together with the Worth Township Supervisor, Patricia Murphy, to create a senior bus service that not only takes our seniors to Oak Lawn locations, but to locations throughout Worth Township. This was a major undertaking and Supervisor Murphy should be commended for her vision and hard work in restarting this vital service. Oak Lawn continues partnering with other Oak Lawn taxing bodies to find a new home for our senior services.

The summer 2023 will see several community events, including Concerts On The Green on Sunday evenings, our Oak Lawn Independence Parade, and our annual music festival in the fall. There are many Oak Lawn residents and employees who volunteer their time and I wish to thank them for making summer in Oak Lawn enjoyable for families year after year.

In closing, let me say, I'm deeply appreciative of your support and promise to do my best for you and your family in Oak Lawn.

With the April 2nd election behind us, I would like to thank the people of District 5 for allowing me to continue to serve them as their Trustee. Although it's true that neither I nor any of the other Trustees running were opposed, I hope that the lack of competition means that both myself and the rest of the candidates have done a good job serving the needs of our constituents and the Village. With that being said, I promise to continue to do my best to make District 5 and the remainder of the Village a great place to live, work, and shop. We have continued to make progress with the storm water detention in the Village. Thanks to the work of Village Manager, Tom Phelan, and District 6 Trustee, Ralph

Soch, agreements are being finalized to "dig down" the Polaris Fields at 107th and Kilpatrick.

The next goal is to continue to add detention and storage capacity by dredging and cleaning the Stony Creek watershed. This project has the capability to increase the rainwater detention to as much as five times that gained at the Polaris Field Project. Another positive note is that this work will clean up the area and possibly supply more open park space for future use. I will continue to pursue this option aggressively. On a less positive note, traffic flow through the district has increased significantly. In Eagle Ridge when school lets out and any time a train blocks Central Avenue, there has been reckless driving observed along 107th and Cook Ave. Traffic studies have been completed in that area and we are beginning to make plans to address this problem. The affected residents will be informed and will have the opportunity to explore a variety of options. A similar problem is now starting to develop on the east side of Stony Creek along 107th and Laramie Ave. We are continuing to watch those two areas to find the best solution to slow and reduce traffic and to ensure increased safety. One of the first things I learned as Trustee is that Oak Lawn residents care deeply about our community, and they want to know that the people they elect do also. As someone who has lived in the 6th District for more than 50 years, I can tell you that I do care. Big or small, every issue is important to me, and I try to treat them as such.

My top priority right now is keeping Oak Lawn SAFE, and it's the top priority of everyone I serve with on the board. American society is growing increasingly dangerous, and our board is committed to doing everything we can to reduce this danger. In the last 2 years I have served

as the board liaison to both the police and fire departments, and I have worked with them to invest in technology to make Oak Lawn safer. You can read about some of those things on page 10 of this newsletter.

Another priority of mine is to end the flooding problem in Oak Lawn that has affected our community for decades. We are partnering with HS District 218 and the MWRD on a massive water detention project at the Polaris Fields on 107th and Kilpatrick, a project that could keep almost 20 million gallons of water out of homes and streets and yards during heavy storms.

To close, I would like to direct your attention to page 14 of this newsletter which talks about property taxes. Prices today are 40% higher than in 2010 due to inflation, yet incredibly the Village's property tax levy is lower today than it was in 2010. This is something I never paid much attention to before I became Trustee, but now that I see how hard people work here to keep our taxes low, I felt the need to point this out.

To close I want to assure everyone that I will continue to do my best job for the residents of District 6, and I hope everyone has a great summer!

Taxes

As this newsletter goes to print, the US Congress is still fighting over the debt ceiling. In 2020 the US Treasury (aka the IRS) took in \$3.4 trillion. In 2022, just 2 years later, the number grew to \$4.9 trillion, a \$1.5 TRILLION increase. Yet Congress can't pay their bills and has to borrow more money? The ability to SPEND money is the easiest thing in the world to do. It requires no skill, nor intelligence, nor discipline. And it's the reason our country is spiraling down financially. OVERSPENDING. Thankfully the Oak Lawn Village board thinks and acts differently, as evidenced by the incredible job they have done with our property taxes (see page 14 for more information).



Also, at the time of this newsletter we are seeing further evidence of societal decline, with violent flash mobs overtaking suburban carnivals and 13-year-olds committing carjackings and other violent crimes. Again, thankfully, the Oak Lawn Village board has established a zero-tolerance policy on crime, and we have invested millions in crime-fighting technology. They are equally strong when it comes to supporting our first responders who work to keep us safe.

The strength of any police department is its officers. With the village board's commitment to public safety, we have hired 28 officers since the fall of 2020. This has been accomplished in a time when police recruitment and retention is at its lowest. We have also welcomed K9 Thor to the department. He and his partner Officer Carroll completed their training together last fall.

Our officers have also made some noteworthy accomplishments. Lt. Steve McNeela graduated from the F.B.I. National Academy. This academy was established in 1935 to provide advanced investigative, management, and fitness training to senior officers who are proven leaders within their organizations.

Detective Todd Gross received the Investigator of the Year Award from the Illinois Chiefs of Police Association for 2022. This was the first year this award was given by the association.

The department has also invested in the latest technology. We recently installed a network of Flock license plate readers throughout the village. These have resulted in the recovery of stolen automobiles and multiple arrests. Our camera sharing program, Fusus, has created a website exclusively for the Oak Lawn Police Department. You can go to www.connectoaklawn.org and register your home or business security cameras with the police department. There is no cost for residential systems. Partnering with the Village will allow detectives to better solve crimes by having access to this database. You can also text crime tips or videos to (708) 613-8477.

Thank you to everyone who purchased a "Support Oak Lawn Police" yard sign. The proceeds will benefit a local scholarship fund in honor of Officer Ruben Flores, who sadly lost his battle with cancer. I hope everyone has a great summer and look forward to seeing you all at National Night Out on August 1st. We have partnered with the Oak Lawn Special Events Committee to have more attractions for the younger kids.

Our Economic Development team has been very busy all year, and the Village continues to see solid increases in building permits for residential and commercial construction. This growth is consistent with our department's motto "We believe business goes where it's invited". Many new businesses are under construction or signing leases in Oak Lawn, including Pasians Pizzeria, Dunkin' Donuts, Taco Bell, Panda Express, and Birdies Car Wash on 95th St. There has also been a lot of activity with our car dealers with several changing hands and many undergoing significant renovations. Northwestern College also decided to make Oak Lawn their new home and have relocated to the property formerly occupied by Fifth Third Bank near 95th and Cicero.

Our Property Maintenance team has also been holding landlords and property owners accountable for problem properties and acquiring and demolishing vacant and dangerous structures. The mission of our Property Maintenance team is to ensure that every resident and business maintains their property. With the warm weather here, we need everyone to do their part. Please take a look at the FAQs on pages 8 and 9 of this newsletter for information about some common problems and issues that people experience in the summer. This is a very busy time for our Public Works Department, as many of our annual programs are about to start. The Village Board and Manager have made it very clear that addressing the flooding problems in Oak Lawn continues to be a high priority. We just hosted our first public meeting to discuss the Polaris Field Project. This project will help eliminate street flooding issues during heavy rains. We also will be lining village sanitary sewers later this year which helps to combat basement back-up problems for our residents.

Our Water Division is making improvements to our pumping stations that will address security and improve communication to keep our water safe and clean. Remember to sign up for the Village's "Water Smart" software which helps homeowners identify potential leaks and other cost-saving measures. Please look at the FAQs on page 8 in this newsletter for instructions on how to register.

This year our Regional Water System has two large water main projects in Oak Lawn, one at the intersection of SW Hwy and Cicero, and the other at 95th and SW Hwy. These projects will help us continue to deliver potable drinking water not only to Oak Lawn but also to our 12 municipal customers and their 270,000 residents.

Finally, and as we do every summer, we have an aggressive street resurfacing plan underway. We will invest more than \$5 million to resurface 32 different streets totaling almost 6 miles of roadway. Please be mindful of all this work and be patient while trying to get around town. Our goal is to continue to make Oak Lawn a great and safe place to live and work.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS (FAQs)



FAQ: We would like to plant a new tree in our parkway. Can the Village help?

Answer: Yes, you can take advantage of our parkway tree planting program: Our next planting will occur this Fall (Oct/Nov), and applications are due by September 15th. For more information contact our Forestry Department at 708-499-7098.

FAQ: How do I dispose of large items in my home, like couches, appliances, dressers, mattresses, rugs, etc?

Answer: Our waste hauler can take them, except appliances with freon (like air conditioners). To schedule a pick-up call Republic Services at 708-385-8252 three (3) days in advance of your normal garbage day.

FAQ: We have been getting sewage in our home during heavy rains. What can we do?

Answer: You may qualify for the Villages 50/50 cost share program (see page 13 for more info). Call 708-499-7748 for more information.

FAQ: I may have a water leak. What should I do?

Answer: The majority of the time the problem is a leaky toilet which a plumber can easily fix. Our new water meters (installed over the last 3 years) can detect leaks and send you notifications, and you can monitor your usage and get helpful tips on how to conserve water. To sign-up for this service go to www.oaklawnil.watersmart.com.



FAQ: Why was my recent water bill so high?

Answer: If you don't have a leak, your bill is likely higher due to increased usage and/or increases in rates from the City of Chicago, which just raised rates by 5% effective June 1st.



FAQ: What can I do about rats/rodents near our home?

Answer: The best ways to eliminate rats/rodents are to eliminate their food sources and harborages. Avoid feeding wildlife, clean up after pets, and bag garbage and put in tightly covered containers. Also remove items outside your home where rodents may harbor like overgrowth, wood piles, bricks, etc.

FAQ: How can I get new/replacement garbage/recycling bins?

Answer: Contact our Public Works Department at 708-499-7750 to arrange for an inspection and, if warranted, the bin will be replaced.

FAQ: My neighbor's tree limbs/branches overhang my property line. Can I trim them?

Answer: Yes. By law, you have the right to trim branches and limbs that extend past the property line. However, the law only allows tree trimming and tree cutting up to the property line. You may not go onto the neighbor's property or destroy the tree.

FAQ: When is the next electronic waste disposal event?

Answer: Saturday, October 14th, from 9 am until 12 noon, at our Public Works facility at 5500 W. 98th St. Acceptable items include TVs, computer monitors, VCRs, DVDs, printers, keyboards, inkjet/toner cartridges, laptops, video game consoles, cameras, cell phones, speakers, stereos, microwaves, and holiday lights. Prohibited items include air conditioners, smoke detectors, batteries, and

fluorescent lights. This is a drive-through service for Oak Lawn residents only (proof of residence is required), and there is a \$35 charge per TV and computer monitor (debit/credit cards accepted). For more info call (708) 499-7756.

FAQ: Our neighbor's property is in terrible condition and possibly vacant. Who should I contact?

Answer: If the grass is longer than four (4) inches and/or the property is not being maintained, you can call 708-499-7843 and an inspector will look into it. We never reveal the identity of people who make these reports, and they help keep our Village looking beautiful.

FAQ: When are the next street-sweeping dates for 2023?

Answer: July 10th through July 21st, October 16th through the 27th, and November 27th through December 8th.

FAQ: I'd like to install a new fence and do some other light construction at my house. What should I do?

Answer: Contact our Building Department at 708-499-7800 or email them at permits@oaklawn-il.gov.

Share Your Security Camera Information

Registering your security cameras allows our department to quickly and efficiently investigate incidents that may have occurred in and around your location. You can register your Ring or other video security systems, at no cost, and we will only contact you if a crime occurs in your area.

We recently contracted with a company called "Flock Safety" that operates an automated license plate reader system which has become useful in preventing and solving crime. The shooters in the 2022 high-profile killings in Highland Park and Morris, IL were captured with the help of LPRs, which scan the license plates of vehicles coming into and leaving Oak Lawn. This real-time information is sent directly to our 911 communications center and then to our police vehicles which greatly increases our ability to catch criminals and solve crimes. The data that is captured on these cameras automatically is deleted after 30 days of non-use.

Lifesaving Tips

Always check to ensure that both your smoke and carbon monoxide alarms are plugged in, have batteries, and are fully functional. These low cost alarms save lives and are worth your time and investment. Practice your family's fire escape plan because seconds count when you are exiting a burning structure. Lastly, make sure that your bedroom doors are closed at night to prevent the spread of smoke and fire throughout your home. This simple action can save your family's lives by decreasing smoke and heat, and keeping carbon monoxide out of and oxygen in your bedrooms if a fire ever happens in your home. FLOODING REMEDIATION

DO YOU GET RAW SEWAGE IN YOUR HOME DURING STORMS? Take Advantage of the Village's 50/50 Plumbing Improvement Cost-share Program


The Village has a program in place where homeowners who are experiencing raw sewage back-ups into their homes may be eligible for a 50/50 cost-share on plumbing repairs, with the Village paying half the cost of the repairs up to a cap of \$5,000.

What are the primary causes of raw sewage backing up into homes?

One of the biggest causes is rain water entering the sanitary sewers via improper connections in Oak Lawn homes.

"Improper Connections"? What are those?

Clear water (e.g., non-sewage rainwater and groundwater) enters the sanitary sewer system via improper connections in homeowner's plumbing and this clear water overloads the sanitary sewer system and causes raw-sewage to back-up into basements.



What else does the Village have planned to reduce the problem with raw sewage back-ups?

Residents who plan to sell their homes will need to pass a plumbing inspection from the Village to verify that the plumbing is not improperly connected. The results of the inspection will be included with the Village's real estate transfer stamps so both the seller and the buyer will be made aware of any problems.


So I should probably take advantage of that 50/50 cost-share program to fix my improper hook-up? Yes, absolutely.

UNDERSTANDING YOUR PROPERTY TAX BILL

For many people their property tax bill is a confusing document of government mumbojumbo about levies and funding levels and pension obligations. Most people just want to know, "Where is my money going?" Many wrongly assume that most of their taxes go to the Village of Oak Lawn, which only receives about 10% of your property taxes. The piechart to the right shows the percentage of taxes that were paid to the various taxing bodies in 2021 for a typical home in Oak Lawn. This typical home is in Elementary School District 126 (Alsip, Hazelgreen, Oak Lawn) and Community High School District 218 (Richards H.S.) but the conclusions will also hold true for homes in other parts of Oak Lawn.



Did You Know? The Village of Oak Lawn's property tax levy is **LOWER** today than it was in 2010.
