### POLICE CHIEF'S REPORT

Chief Jon Lape was present and provided a summary report of Police Department activities for the month of March 2021. A copy of the report is on file at the Township Building.

- Mrs. Jordan thanked Jennifer Borczyk for organizing the Blood Drive Event and Recycling Event.
- Chief Lape summarized the grant application process for the Police body cameras.
  - Mrs. Jordan asked if only \$7,000 of the Township budgeted funds would be used for the cameras.
  - Chief Lape explained the two-year cost for the body cameras is \$25,000, and that with the \$18,800 approved grant there would be excess budgeted funds.
- Mr. Forbes thanked Chief Lape, Police Officers, and Mr. Payne for handling and resolving the animal complaint on Deer Creek Road.

### PUBLIC WORKS FOREMAN'S REPORT

Mr. Kevin Olar provided a summary report on the Public Works Department for the month of March 2021. A copy of the report is on file at the Township Building.

### **ENGINEER'S REPORT**

The Board received the Engineer's Report submitted by Shoup Engineering, Inc. Mr. Scott Shoup represented Shoup Engineering, Inc., and summarized the details of his formal report:

### **Projects**

- 2021 Road Improvement Project
  - 2021 Road Improvement Project Bid documents and specifications have been prepared and bids have been let for the year's road improvement project. Contracts have been awarded for the hot mix asphalt and bituminous seal coat projects. Bids were opened for cold mix asphalt paving project and bid results will be provided to the Board for possible consideration at their meeting on 21 April 2021.
  - Bairdford Park Preliminary design and cost estimating was performed for various features and improvements to the park for a DCNR Grant application.

### Development/Subdivision Review

- The following subdivision and land development plan projects had been reviewed, and review letters were issued to the Township as noted:
  - Moretti Plan of Lots No. 3 A review of this preliminary and final subdivision was performed and a review letter was issued to the Township on 23 March 2021.

Mr. Shoup spoke of the DCNR Grant for improvements to the Park. He reported the renovation is to upgrade the basketball and tennis court area. He added that this includes the addition of pickleball nets, deck hockey, new pavilion, new parking lot, new bleachers, and adding to the B1 Ballfield where the previous retaining wall was built.

Mrs. Jordan voiced her excitement for the Township potentially receiving this grant to improve the area for the children to use. She thanked Mr. Shoup and his sister for their assistance with the grant process.

Mr. Karpuzi asked for the park renovation investment total for the 2021 year.

Mr. Mator answered for this year total amount is \$300,000 but next year 2022 – with grant approval – would be a total of \$800,000.

### BUILDING INSPECTOR/CODE ENFORCEMENT OFFICER'S REPORT

Mr. Bill Payne was present and provided a summary report on Code Enforcement for the month of March 2021. A copy of the report is on file at the Township Building.

Mrs. Jordan asked if the February salvage yard issues have been resolved.

Mr. Payne responded half have been completed.

Mrs. Jordan requested the salvage yard updates be included in Mr. Payne's next monthly report.

### PARKS AND RECREATION BOARD REPORT

Mrs. Amy Stark, Chairwoman, provided a summary report on the Parks and Recreation Board. A copy of the report is on file at the Township Building.

Mrs. Stark thanked Mrs. Jordan and her son for their help with the Easter Bunny event. She reported Farmers Market events have been canceled due to the lack of interest from the local farmers. Mrs. Stark added that the Food Truck Event is 27 May 2021 with the following food trucks attending: ice cream, lobster, hotdog, smokehouse, and taco. She suggested that if this event is a big hit maybe Parks & Recreation could add this to the monthly or every other

month schedule. Mrs. Stark discussed Fall Festival Event with Chief Lape and Sergeant Loper, the event date was set for Saturday, October 16, 2021.

Chief Lape mentioned the plan was to still have the Cancer 5K Walk/Run in the morning with the festival following and then fireworks display to end the day. He added there was a need for pumpkins to be donated, possibly from a local farm for the pumpkin decorating contest.

Mrs. Stark commented there will be tables available for local crafters and local organizations to rent.

Chief Lape added the tables will be rented at a reduced rate to help the community members who are struggling financially.

Further discussion was held.

### **CDC STEERING COMMITTEE REPORT**

Mr. Karpuzi spoke for Mr. Majernik and reiterated the Committee report from last month.

Mr. Forbes gave kudos to all involved with the process of reviewing the Township Pension Plans. He reported that even with maintaining the same investment firm the re-evaluation of the plans resulted in lowering the fee cost to the Township and receiving nice presentations from the advisors.

Mr. Karpuzi asked how much the Township will be saving.

Mr. Mator responded that the rate of return for this year will save the Township \$30,000.

MOTION BY Supervisor Forbes and SECONDED BY Supervisor Hollibaugh to adopt Resolution No. 2021-6 appointing Manning & Napier Advisors, LLC, to provide Asset Management and Investment Advisory Services for the Township's Police Pension Plan and Municipal Employees Pension Plan. Motion carried unanimously 5-0.

Mr. Karpuzi summarized the HR Personnel Policies and Procedures agreements.

Mr. Forbes thanked Mr. Mator for organizing and the Board for the approving the reviewing of these policies and procedures.

MOTION BY Supervisor Forbes and SECONDED BY Supervisor Jordan to adopt Resolution No. 2021-9 approving and authorizing the execution of a Human Resources Consultant Agreement with East Coast Risk Management to review and update the Personnel Policies and Procedures Manual. Motion carried unanimously 5-0.

Motion carried unanimously 5-0.

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE TOWNSHIP OF WEST DEER, COUNTY OF ALLEGHENY, COMMONWEALTH OF PENNSYLVANIA, APPROVING AND AUTHORIZING THE EXECUTION OF A ZONING CODE REVIEW CONSULTANT AGREEMENT WITH ENVIRONMENTAL PLANNING & DESIGN, LLC.

Mr. Karpuzi summarized the reason for the Zoning Code Review.

Mrs. Jordan added it was worth noting that a lot of the codes are out of date so review is not just regular housekeeping but it is necessary.

MOTION BY Supervisor Forbes and SECONDED BY Supervisor Jordan to adopt Resolution No. 2021-13 approving and authorizing the execution of a Zoning Code Review Consultant Agreement with Environmental Planning & Design, LLC. Motion carried unanimously 5-0.

### AUTHORIZATION: ADVERTISEMENT OF ORDINANCE NO. 446 (POLICE POLICIES AND PROCEDURES)

### **ORDINANCE NO. 446**

AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF WEST DEER TO APPROVE AND ADOPT NEW AND REVISED POLICE POLICIES AND PROCEDURES, AND TO AUTHORIZE THE IMPLEMENTATION AND ENFORCEMENT OF SAID POLICIES AND PROCEDURES BY THE CHIEF OF POLICE AND TOWNSHIP ADMINISTRATION AND PROVIDING SEVERABILITY.

Mrs. Jordan thanked Chief Lape for taking the time – along with Sergeant Loper – to complete this Ordinance.

Motion by Supervisor Jordan and SECONDED BY Supervisor Hollibaugh to authorize the advertisement of Ordinance No. 446 as presented. Motion carried unanimously 5-0.

### **AUTHORIZATION: STREAMBANK ENGINEERING**

As part of the Township's MS4 Stormwater Program, the Board of Supervisors budgeted funds for Streambank Restoration. As this project requires separate accounting and tracking, Township Engineer Shoup Engineering provided a separate proposal for this specific project.

Mr. Shoup summarized the MS4 Stormwater Program.

MOTION BY Supervisor Jordan and SECONDED BY Supervisor Forbes to authorize the Streambank Restoration Project Engineering to Shoup Engineering in the amount of \$9,250.00. Motion carried unanimously 5-0.

### AWARD: 2021 ROAD PROGRAM

Plans, specifications, and bid documents were prepared by Shoup Engineering for the 2021 Road Program.

The project was advertised, and sealed bids were received until 1:30 p.m. on Wednesday, 14 April 2021, at which time they were opened and read aloud.

<u>Contract 21-02</u> – work will consist of the installation of cold mix FB modified binder leveling course with CMS-2 emulsion, base repair and other miscellaneous work on three (3) Township roads totaling approximately 21,640 feet. Alternate bids for similar work will also be received for two (2) other Township roads. (A portion of Logan Road and Shuster Road)

Mr. Shoup reiterated the reason for rebidding Contract 21-02. He recommended to award the contract to Youngblood Paving Inc.

Mr. Mator reported that Mr. Olar requested to extend the portion of Logan Road being repaired. He added that the request could possibly be on the May agenda.

Mrs. Jordan acknowledged Logan Road needing repaired.

Mr. Karpuzi requested an estimate of when all the Township roads will be completed.

Mr. Shoup responded that March 2020, a map was prepared but due to the pandemic the map never made it to the Board.

Mr. Karpuzi asked for the map to be added to May agenda discussions.

MOTION BY Supervisor Jordan and SECONDED BY Supervisor Forbes to award the 2021 Road Program cold mix asphalt paving contract No. 21-02 to Youngblood Paving, Inc. in the amount of \$811,895.00 for the base bid, and in the amount of \$320,602.50 for the two alternate bids. Motion carried unanimously 5-0.

### TOTAL OF 2021 ROAD PROJECT APPROVED: \$1,294,858.50

### **DISCUSSION: COMMUNICATIONS CONSULTANT**

Mr. Karpuzi explained that previously the delivery of Township issues was focused more on the push method for delivery instead of the pull method. He felt that slowly the Township is going to the push method. Mr. Karpuzi reported the current Township communication is delivered by social media, Township website, and the emergency text service.

### **DISCUSSION: ENVIRONMENTAL ADVISORY COMMITTEE**

Mr. Karpuzi reported this subject is not ready to be discussed.

### DISCUSSION: ZONING HEARING BOARD ALTERNATE

Mr. Payne reported the proposed gas wells will be brought to the Board for discussion. He stated there is talk of needing variances, which may cause conflicts of interest with some Zoning Hearing Board members. Mr. Payne stated he discussed the matter with Mr. Robb, who agreed to advertising for two more alternate Zoning Hearing Board members.

Mr. Karpuzi asked if the Board supported to continue pursuing Zoning Hearing Board alternates.

Mr. Robb recommended being open to filling the alternate positions instead of waiting for a variance application to come in.

More discussion was held.

### **OLD BUSINESS**

- Mrs. Jordan reported there were no dumpsters at Nike Site.
- She added that she spoke with the baseball and softball organizations. They would be holding an opening day parade, and she advised them to park by the Public Works Building instead of volleyball area since the ground was wet. Mrs. Jordan requested that the Public Works block off any areas that no one should park on.
  - o Mr. Mator responded that he had Mrs. French reach out to have dumpsters delivered prior to any sporting events, and that he would discuss the parking situation with Mr. Olar.

- Mr. Karpuzi requested an update on Cohen Law Group.
  - o Mr. Mator responded that the Township entered into an agreement with Cohen Law Group to extend broadband service and telecommunications in the Township. He added that in his last report to the Board of Supervisors, he stated that Mr. Cohen sent letters to three carriers AT&T, Verizon and T-Mobile and two companies that put up the towers. Mr. Mator informed the Board that as of the time of the meeting, four of them have responded. Mr. Mator explained the Township will be receiving stimulus funds from the American Rescue Plan that can be used for broadband service. He mentioned a meeting will be scheduled with Chairman Karpuzi, Mr. Cohen, and himself to discuss the recommended approach.




#### **Coal-Tar Sealants**

Did you know up to 85 million gallons of coal tar sealant are applied to pavements each year?

- Pavement sealant is a black liquid applied to pavement surface to beautify and extend its life. One type of sealant often used, but harmful to human health is coal tar.
- Coal tar is a byproduct from the coking of coal. The distillation of coal tar creates coal-tar pitch, which is considered a human carcinogen by the National Toxicology Program.
- Coal-tar-based sealant is comprised of 20 to 35 percent coaltar pitch.
- Coal-tar sealants contain a large concentration of polycyclic aromatic hydrocarbons (PAHs), a suspected human carcinogen.
- Coal-tar-based sealants contain 1,000 times the concentration of PAHs than asphalt-based sealants.
- Friction grinds pavement sealant, including coal-tar, into fine particles which can be tracked indoors by shoes, blown offsite by wind, washed off by rain, etc.
- Coal tar-based sealants are one of the primary sources of contamination in urban lake sediment.
- Studies show residences across parking lots with coal-tar sealants have 25 times the concentration of PAHs in house dust compared to homes not near parking lots with coal-tar.

#### WHAT CAN I DO?

- To determine if a product contains coal tar, look for the Chemical Abstracts Service (CAS) number 65996-93-2 on the product Material Safety Data Sheet (MSDS). "Coal tar," "refined coal tar," or similar terms may appear on the product container or MSDS.
- Educate municipalities, store managers and school officials about the dangers of coal-tar sealants, and provide them with safer alternatives such as asphalt-based sealants, which are comparably priced.
- Tell family members and guests to take of their shoes when entering the house, as shoes can track in PAHs.
- Leave windows closed for a few days after a fresh coal-tar sealant has been applied near your home, school or workplace.
- Talk to your municipality about a coal-tar ban; many cities and states have passed a ban.
- Coat coal-tar sealant with asphalt sealant to prevent leaching.

#### **BACKGROUND**

Pavement sealcoat is a commercial product marked for use primarily on parking lots and driveways and is rarely used on public roads. Most sealcoat products are either coal-tar or asphalt emulsion. Coal tar and coaltar pitch, both used in sealcoat products, have extremely high concentrations of PAHs, and both are classified as known human carcinogens. Coal-tar-based sealcoat products typically are 20 to 35 percent coal tar or coal-tar pitch. Asphalt and asphalt-based sealcoat products have much lower concentrations of PAHs.

For historical and economic reasons, coal-tar-based sealcoat is more common east of the Continental Divide (except in those states, counties, and municipalities where its use is prohibited), and asphalt-based sealcoat is more west of the Continental Divide. Coal-tar-based pavement sealcoat typically contains 35,000 to 200,000 mg/kg (parts per million, or ppm) PAHs, about 100 times more PAHs than in used motor oil and about 1,000 times more PAHs than in sealcoat products with an asphalt (oil) base. Levels of PAHs in dust swept from sealed parking lots to the east and west of the



polycyclic aromatic hydrocarbons

Continental Divide reflect this difference in use, with PAH concentrations in sealed-pavement dust the East about 1,000 times higher than concentrations in the West.

#### What are coal tar and coal-tar pitch?

Coal tar is a byproduct of the coking, liquefaction or gasification of coal. Coal-tar pitch is the residue that remains after the distillation of coal tar, that is, the thick black liquid remaining after various oils are removed from coal tar for use in the manufacture of industrial and consumer products. Coal-



tar pitch is the residue that remains after the distillation of coal tar. Coal tar and coal-tar pitch are used in coal-tar-based sealcoat products, although use of coal-tar pitch is more common than use of coal tar. Both coal tar and coal-tar pitch are known human carcinogens. Learn more about coal-tar-based sealcoat here.

Coal tar is a byproduct of the coking of coal, and coal-

separated, or "refined", into 12 grades of viscosity. The most viscous grade, RT-12, is used in coal-tar-based sealcoat. The primary use of coal-tar pitch is in electrode manufacturing for the aluminum industry and for steel arc furnaces.



PAHs are a group of chemicals created by heating or burning material that contains carbon. There are many sources of PAHs to the environment, representing a wide range of PAHs concentrations, including asphalt (2-9) milligrams per kilogram, or mg/kg), tire particles (84 mg/kg), used motor oil (730 mg/kg), and coal-tar-based sealcoat (34,000-202,000 mg/kg). PAHs cause cancer, mutations, birth defects, and/or death in fish, wildlife, and invertebrates. Several PAHs are photoactivated, meaning that their toxic effects are greatly intensified when exposed to sunlight. The EPA has classified seven PAHs as probable human carcinogens, and 16 PAHs as Priority Pollutants.

#### AS SEALCOAT WEARS OFF, WHERE DOES IT GO?

Abraded dried sealcoat particles containing high concentrations of PAHs and related chemicals can be transported by rain, wind, car tires, and even our feet to surrounding areas, including our homes. Concentrations of PAHs in runoff, sediment, soils, and dust near coal-tar-sealcoated pavement are substantially higher than concentrations in those media near concrete pavement, unsealed asphalt pavement, and asphalt pavement with asphalt-based sealcoat.



Coal-tar-based sealcoat is a potent source of PAHs and related chemicals. Worn particles of coal-tar-based sealcoat are transported by rain, wind, tires, and even our feet from pavement to other environmental settings. Sealcoat product (A), after it dries, gradually abrades to a powder and becomes part of the dust on the pavement (B). Pavement dust is transported by rainfall runoff (C) to stormwater-management devices (D) or to receiving streams and lakes (E). Pavement dust also adheres to tires (F) that track it onto unsealed pavement, and wind and runoff transport the dust to nearby soils (G). #### POTENTIAL RISKS TO HUMAN HEALTH

PAHs from coal-tar-based sealcoat contaminate house dust. House dust is an important pathway for human exposure to many contaminants, including PAHs. This is particularly true for small children, who spend time on the floor and put their hands and objects into their mouths. In a study of 23 ground-floor apartments, PAH levels in house dust in apartments with parking lots sealed with a coal-tar-based product were 25 times higher than in house dust in apartments with parking lots with other surface types (concrete, unsealed asphalt, and asphalt-based sealcoat). No relation was found between PAHs in house dust and other possible indoor PAH sources such as tobacco smoking and fireplace use.

The pre-schooler living in a residence adjacent to coal-tar-sealed pavement who has relatively low hand-to-mouth activity consumes about 2.5 times more PAHs from house dust than from their diet. For the more active pre-schooler, whose hand-to-mouth activity is higher, the PAH intake from house dust is nearly 10 times more than the PAH intake from their diet. These findings upset the paradigm that diet is the greatest source of PAHs for small children.

#### POTENTIAL RISKS TO AQUATIC LIFE

Runoff from coal-tar-sealcoated pavement is acutely toxic to aquatic biota.

Exposure to runoff from coal-tar-sealed pavement collected as much as 42 days after sealcoat application resulted in 100 percent mortality to two commonly tested laboratory organisms: day-old fathead minnows (*Pimephales promelas*) and water fleas (*Ceriodaphnia dubia*). In contrast, minnows and water fleas exposed to runoff from unsealed pavement experience no more than 10 percent mortality. When the minnows and water fleas were also exposed to simulated sunlight, which intensifies the toxicity of some PAHs, runoff collected 111 days (more than 3 months) after sealcoat application caused 100 percent mortality to both species, and caused 100 percent mortality to water fleas even when diluted to 10 percent of its original strength. These results demonstrate that runoff from coal-tar-sealcoated pavement continues to be toxic from aquatic organisms long after the 24- to 48-hour curing time.

A subsequent collaborative study by researchers at the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Adminstration (NOAA), U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, and University of Washington reported that coal-tar-sealcoat runoff is acutely lethal to juvenile coho salmon (*Oncorhynchus kisutch*) and causes a wide spectrum of abnormalities to zebrafish (*Danio rario*) embryos. The study also reported that filtration of the runoff through a bioretention system substantially reduced toxicity.

# COAL-TAR-BASED SEALCOAT, PAHS, AND STREAM AND LAKE SEDIMENT

Dust on coal-tarsealed parking lots contains bits of abraded sealcoat particles, and measured concentrations of PAHs in the dust swept from coaltar-sealed pavement typically are in the thousands of milligrams per kilogram. In some cases, stormwater runoff

PAH pavement dust to a stormwater management device, such as a retention pond, leading to high costs of disposal. PAH-contaminated dust that is not trapped by management devices can be transported to streams and lakes, where it settles in the stream or lake bed. Application of a wide range of "forensic" methods has indicated that, in areas where it's used, coal-tar-based sealcoat is the primary source of PAHs to <a href="stream">stream</a> and <a href="lake">lake</a> sediment.

Analysis of lake sediment cores demonstrates that coal-tar-based sealcoat is a major contributor to upward trends in PAHs in urban lakes across the U.S. In Austin, Texas, coal-tar-sealcoat was banned in 2006—sediment cores collected in 2012 and 2014 from Lady Bird Lake, the primary receiving water body for the Austin area, showed a 58 percent decrease in PAH concentrations since the peak prior to the ban.

Other studies have used different approaches to determine the source of PAHs to urban stream and lake sediment and come to a similar conclusion regarding source. Those approaches include a <u>land-use-based analysis</u> and <u>organic petroscopy</u>. Those studies concluded that coal-tar-based sealcoat was the source of 70 to 80 percent of the PAHs in the sediment of the water bodies studied.

#### **AIR QUALITY CONCERNS**

Although unseen, releases of PAHs to the atmosphere (volatilization) from freshly coal-tar-sealed pavement are tens of thousands of times higher than from unsealed pavement. Volatilization is a potential human-health concern because inhalation is an important pathway for human exposure to PAHs. Volatilization of sealed surfaces is highest just after application and decreases rapidly over the following weeks. Nonetheless, volatilization continues long after application—PAH releases to the atmosphere from parking lots sealed from 3 to 8 years prior to sampling were on average 60 times higher than PAH releases from unsealed pavement. The results suggest that PAH emissions from new coal-tar-based sealcoat applications each year nationwide (~1000 Mg) are larger than annual vehicle emissions

of PAHs.



The provisions of this Ordinance and of the Policies approved and adopted hereby are severable, and if any clause, sentence, subsection, section, article, chapter or part thereof or any individual Policy or part thereof shall be adjudged by any court of competent jurisdiction to be illegal, invalid or unconstitutional, such judgment or decision shall not affect, impair or invalidate the remainder thereof but shall be confined in its operation and application to the clause, sentence, subsection, section, article, chapter or part thereof rendered illegal, invalid or unconstitutional. It is hereby declared to be the intent of the Board of Supervisors that this Ordinance and the Policies would have been approved and adopted if such illegal, invalid or unconstitutional clause, sentence, subsection, section, article, chapter or part thereof had not been included therein.

#### § 1-5. Effective date.

All provisions of this Ordinance and of the Polices approved herein shall be in force and effect on and after 19 May 2021.
