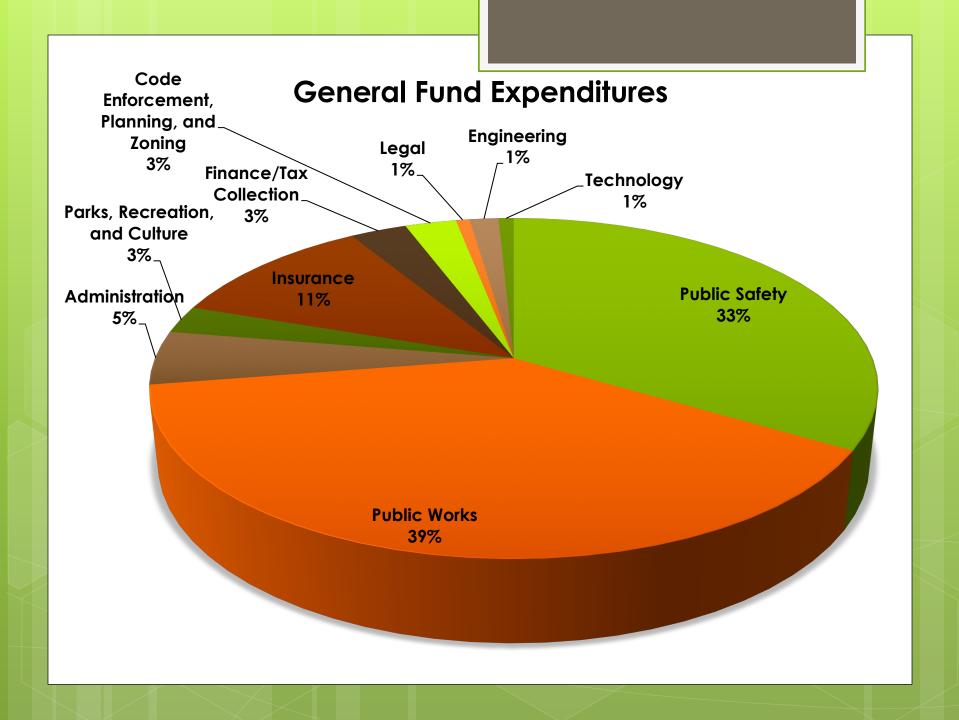

- Stormwater Program set at \$250,000
- Over \$600,000 of park improvements
- Operating Reserve Fund increased to 10% of General Fund
- Designated capital projects funding to nearly \$1.4 million
- Every Supervisor and Departmental "Wish List" Item Included
